## Investment & Time Commitment

The cost to participate in the Leadership Chapel Hill-Carrboro program is \$825 for Chamber member organizations and \$925 for non-member organizations. This tuition includes the opening reception, the training retreat, refreshments, tour transportation, class materials, the graduation luncheon and staff time. Participants who sign up prior to August 22, 2008 are eligible for our Early Bird Special price, which is \$775 for members and \$875 for non-members.

Leadership Chapel Hill-Carrboro is a 10-week program starting in mid-September and concluding at the end of November. Participants will attend a half-day session each week with one full day retreat session.

## Participation and Attendance

A maximum of 25 registrants who either work or live in Chapel Hill or Carrboro will be selected on a first come, first served basis to participate in the Leadership program. Every effort will be made to choose people with a wide range of experience and interest. Participants are expected to attend all sessions. Any participant missing more than two (2) sessions, for whatever reason, will not graduate. Other mandatory elements of the Leadership program include the opening reception, the team-building retreat, the Small Miracles® project, and the Leadership "Passport."
