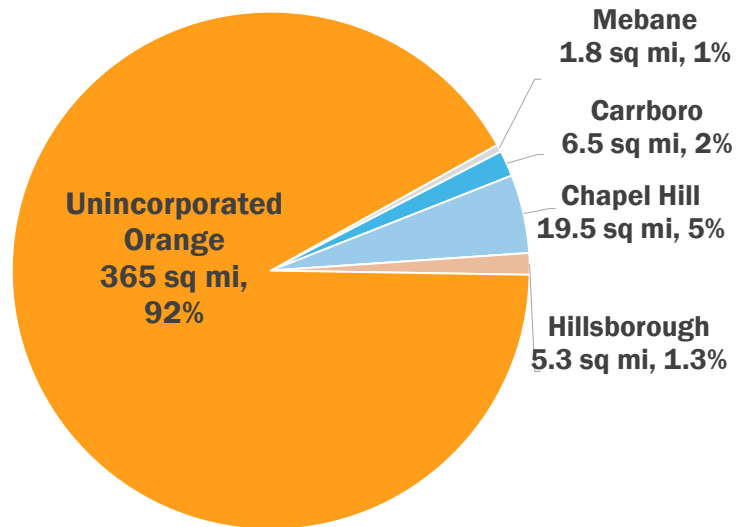
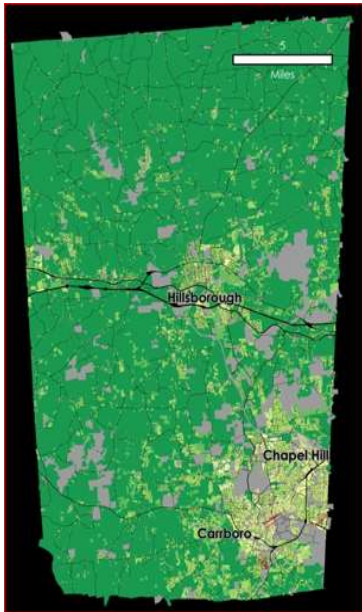
Durham-Chapel Hill MSA and Raleigh-Cary MSAs

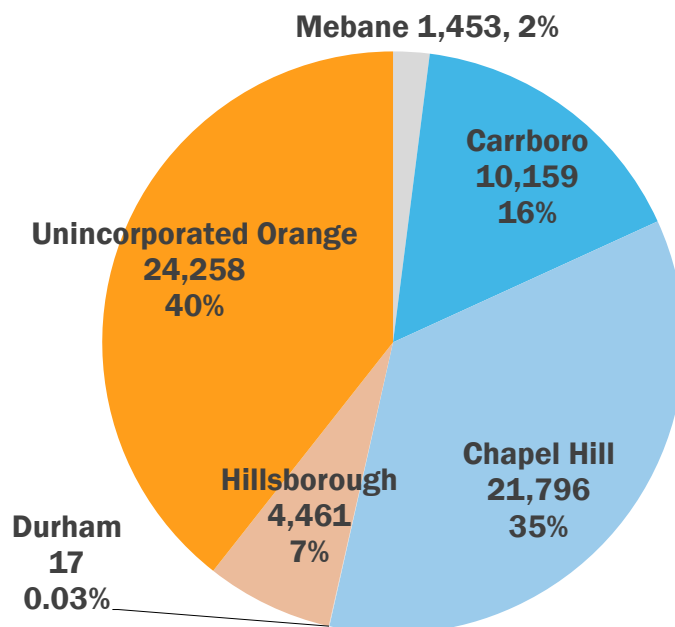

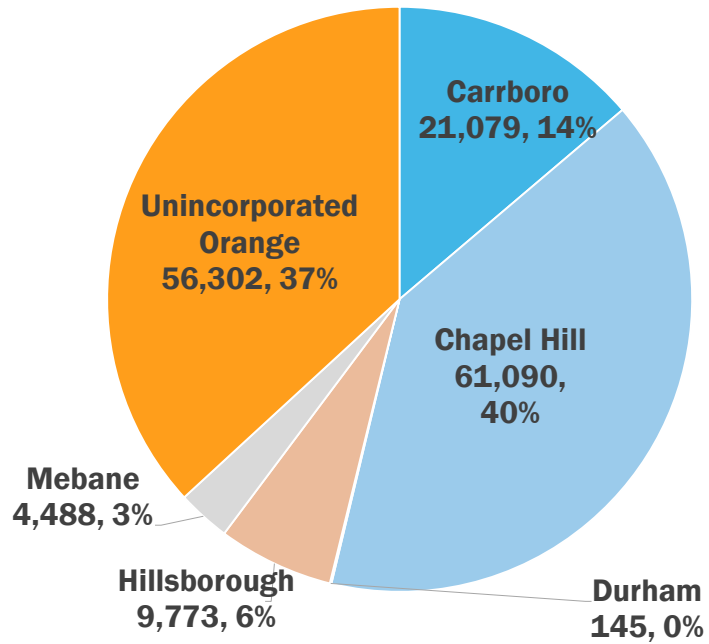

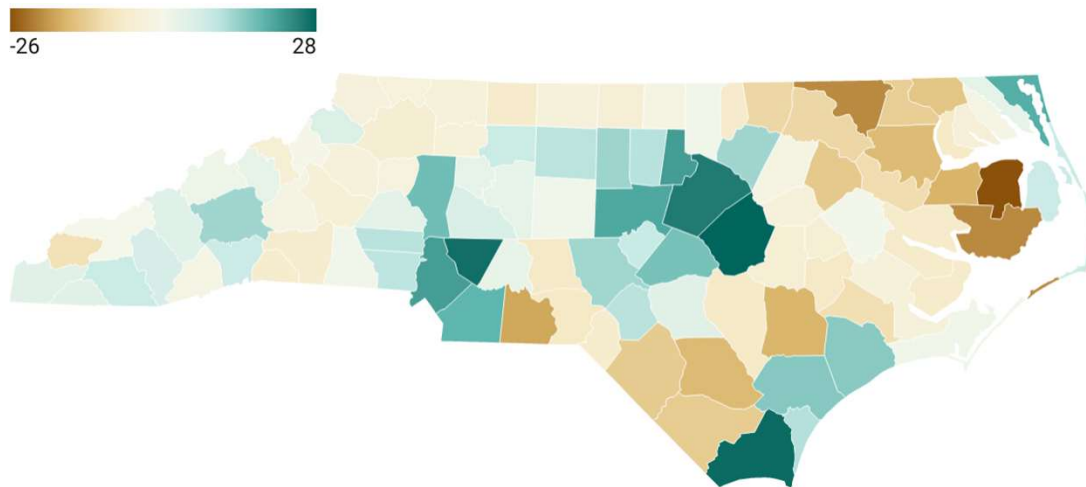

Numeric population growth by decade, 1930 to 2024

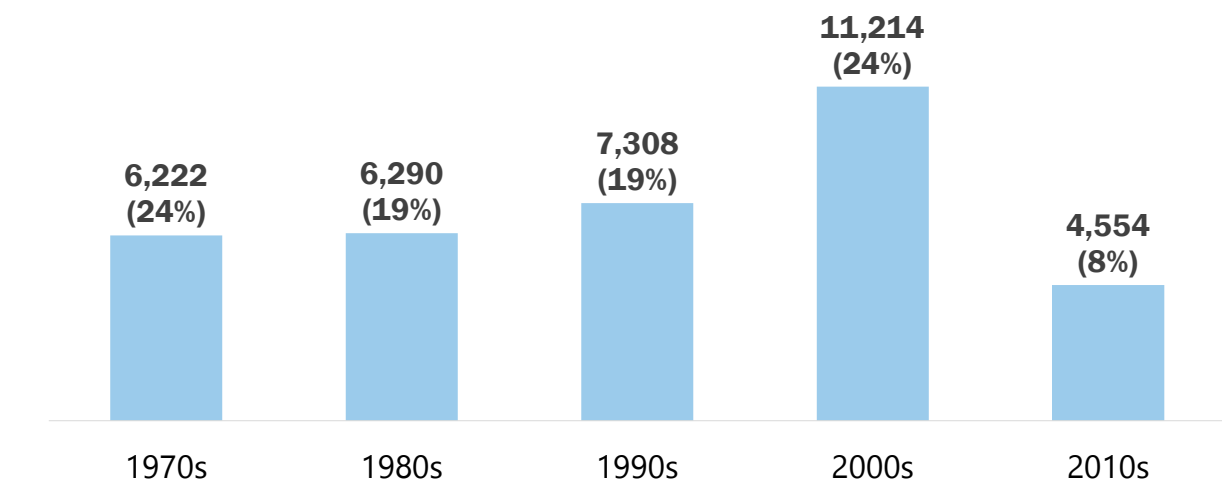

Numeric population growth by decade, 1970 to 2020



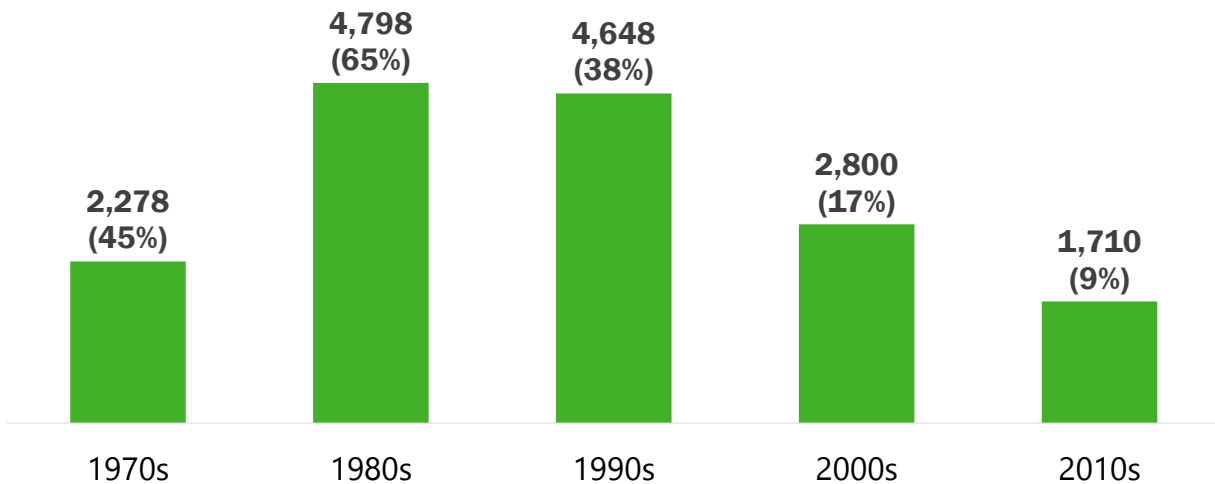

Numeric population growth by decade, 1970 to 2020

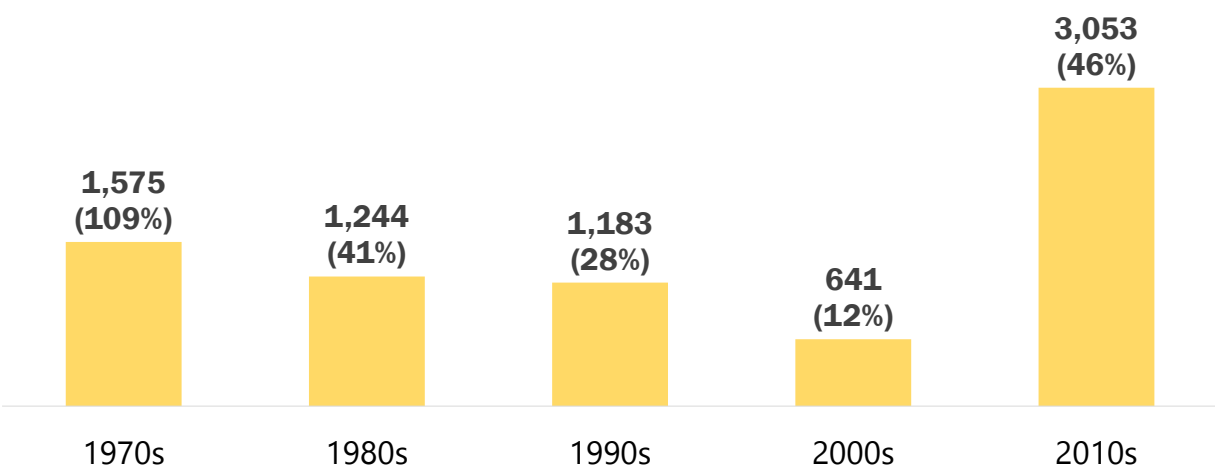

Numeric population growth by decade, 1970 to 2020

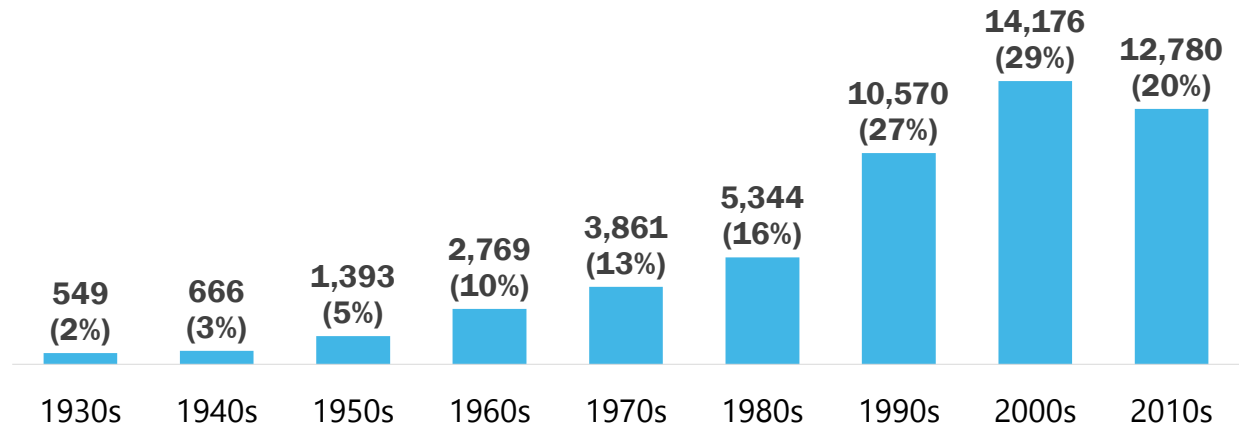

Numeric population growth by decade, 1930 to 2020

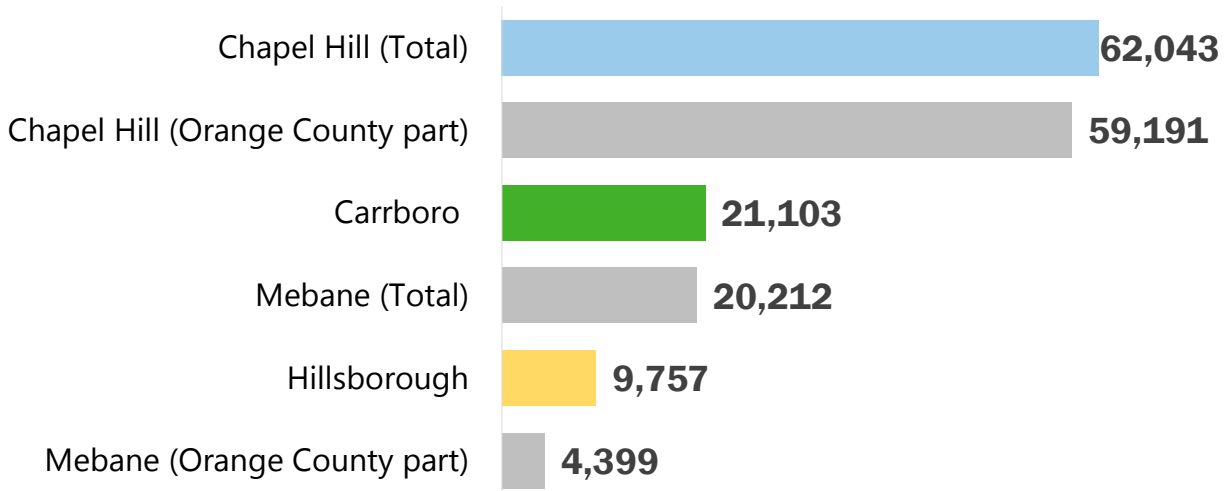

Population of local municipalities, 2023

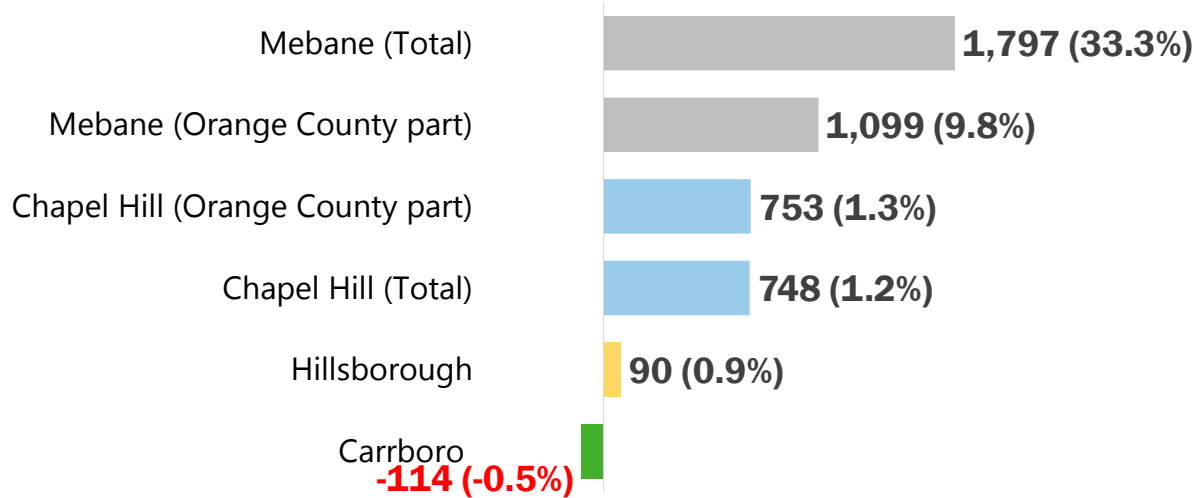

Numeric change in population of local municipalities, 2021 to 2023

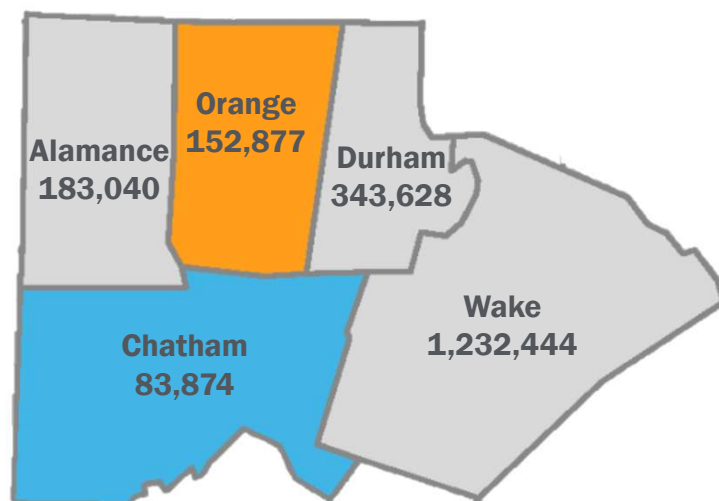

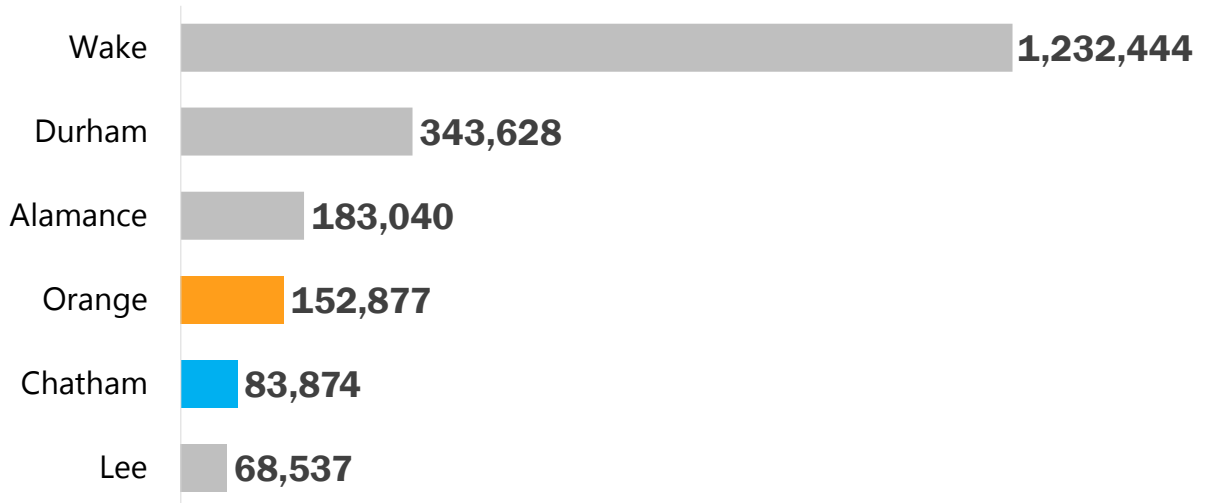

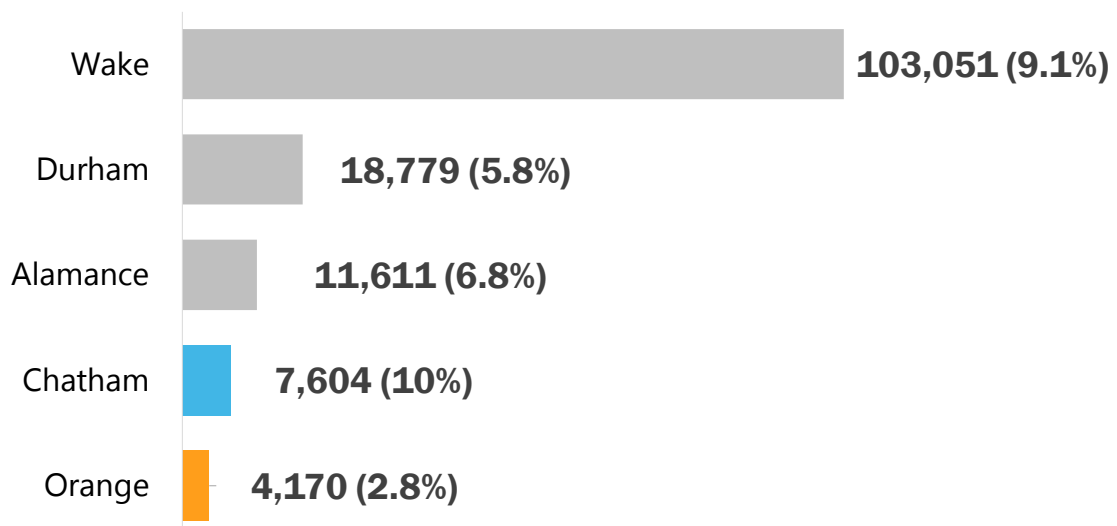
North Carolina 2024 population - 11,046,024

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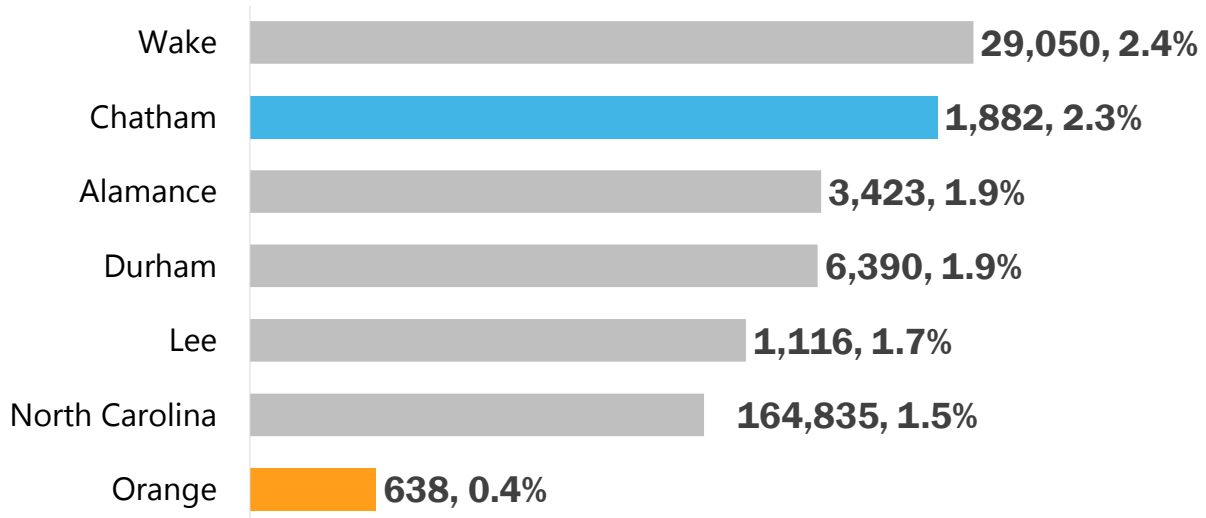
County Population Change from 2020 to 2024

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County Population Change from 2023 to 2024

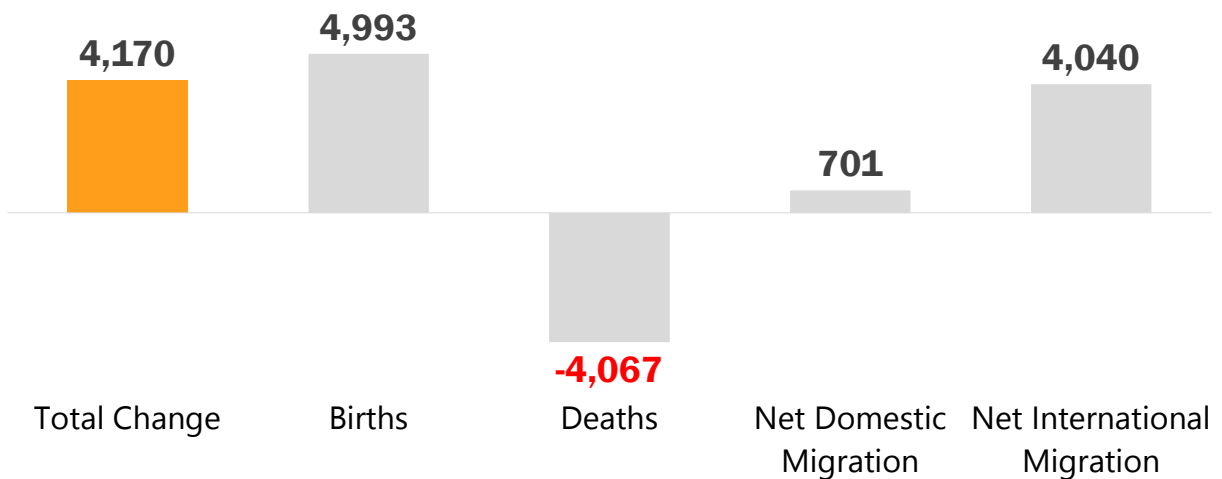

Components of Orange County's population change, from 2020 to 2024

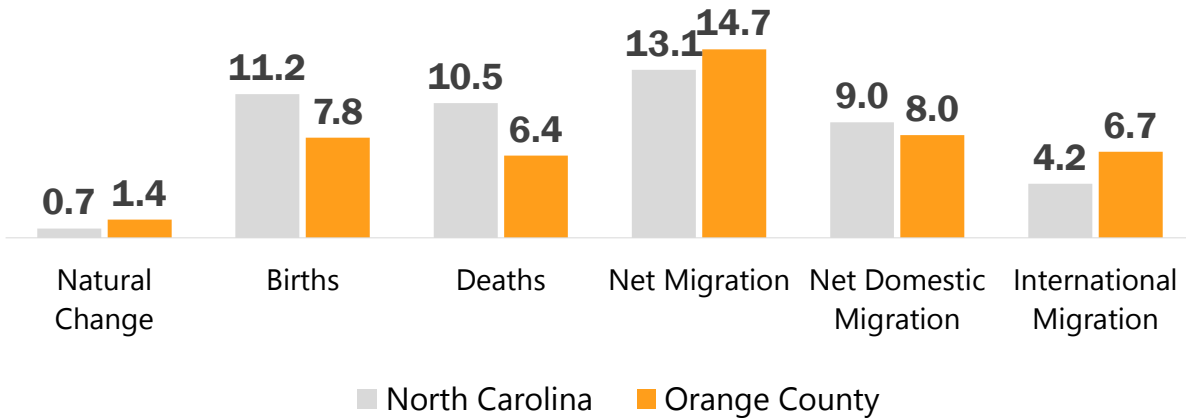

2020 to 2024

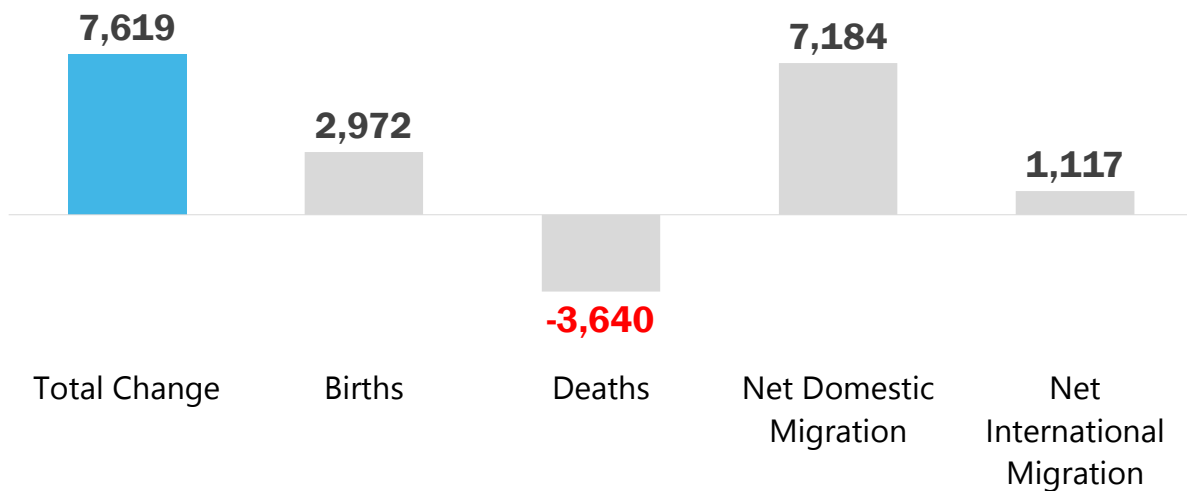

Components of Chatham County's population change, 2020 to 2024

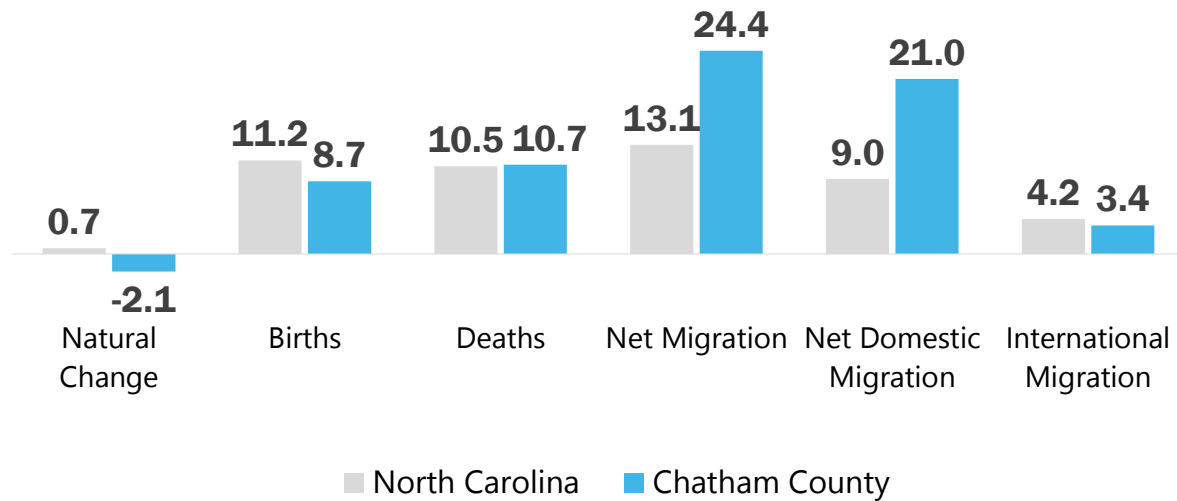

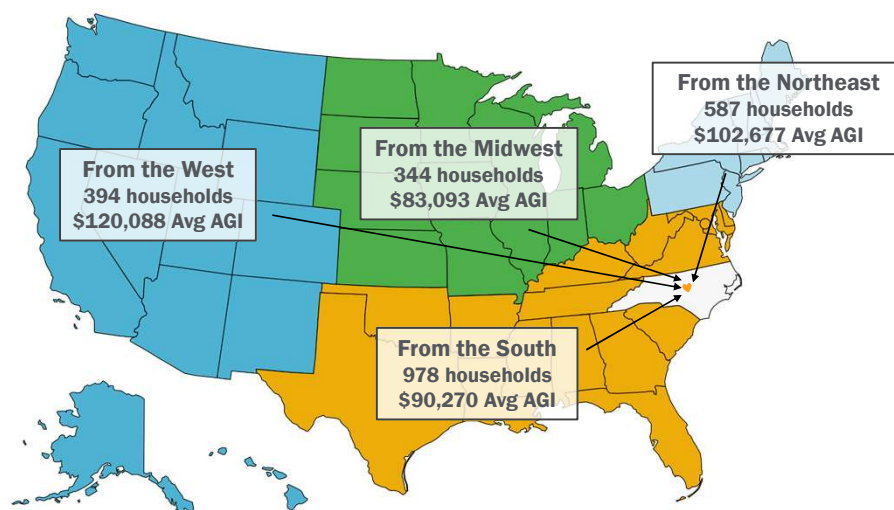

Household migration by region and average adjusted gross income (AGI), 2021 to 2022

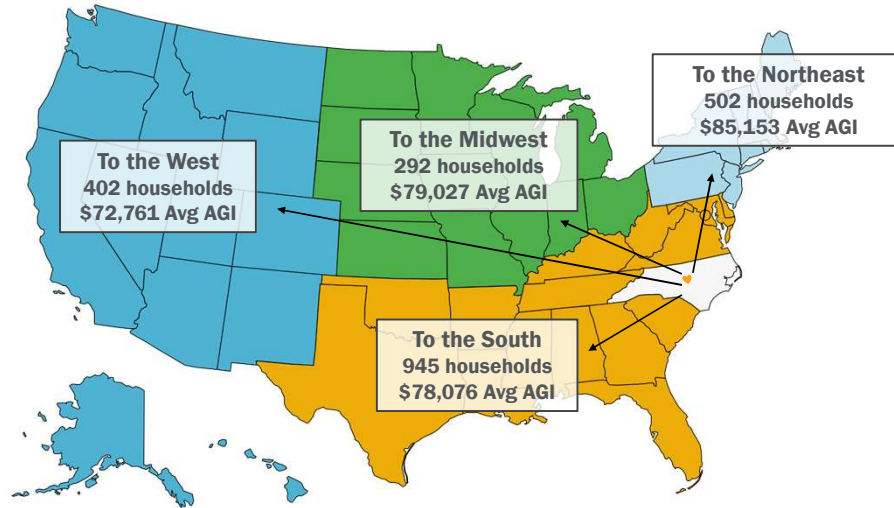

Household migration by region and average adjusted gross income (AGI), 2021 to 2022

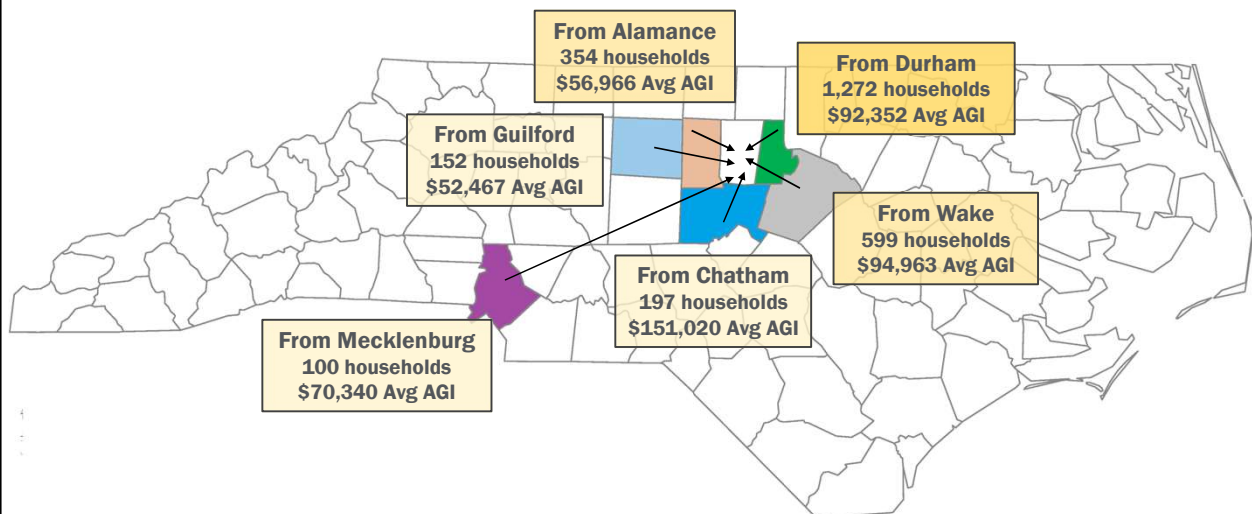

Household migration by county and average adjusted gross income (AGI), 2021 to 2022

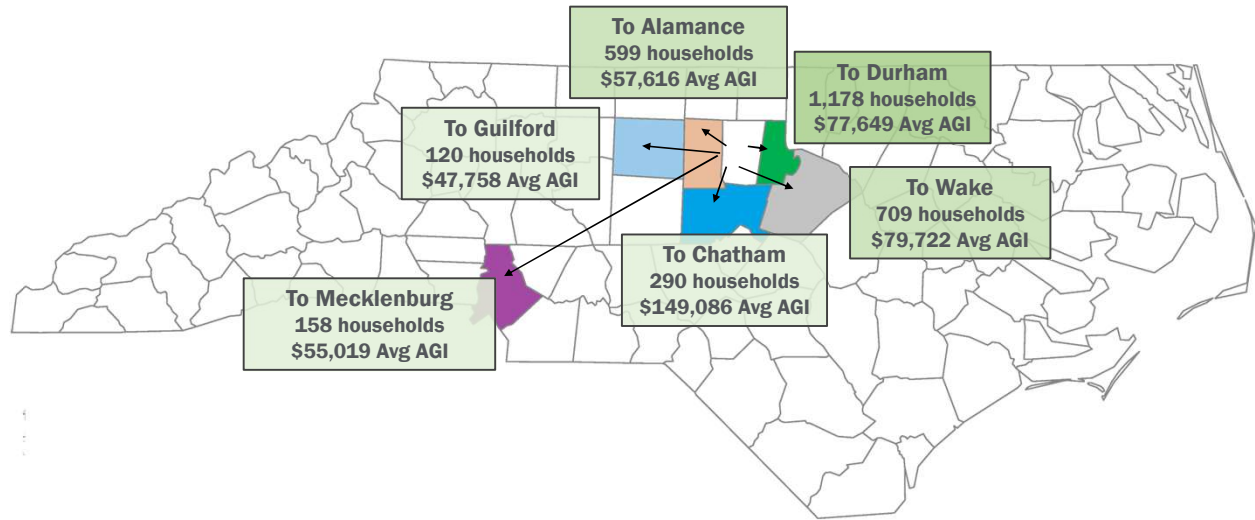

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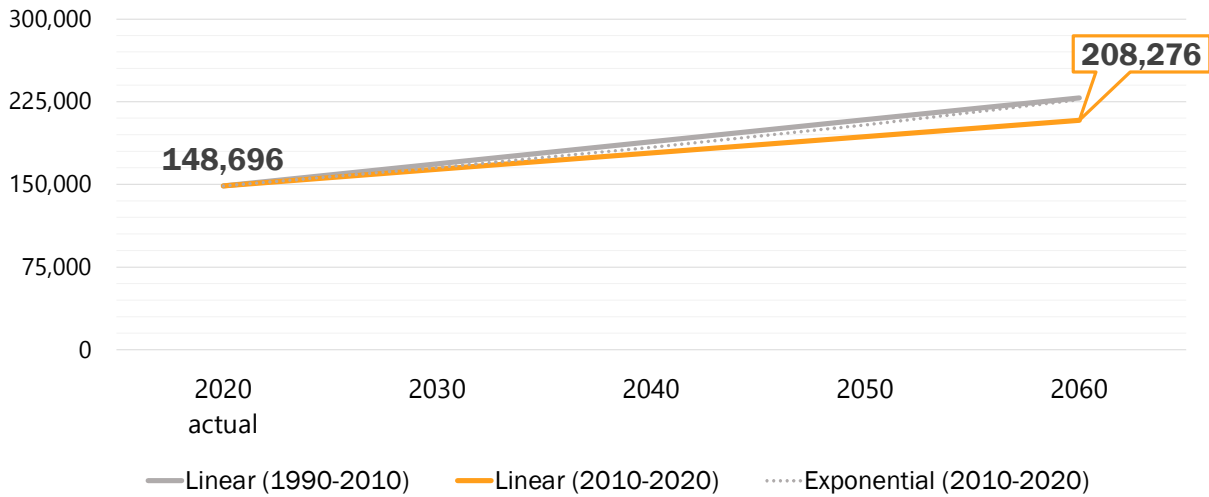

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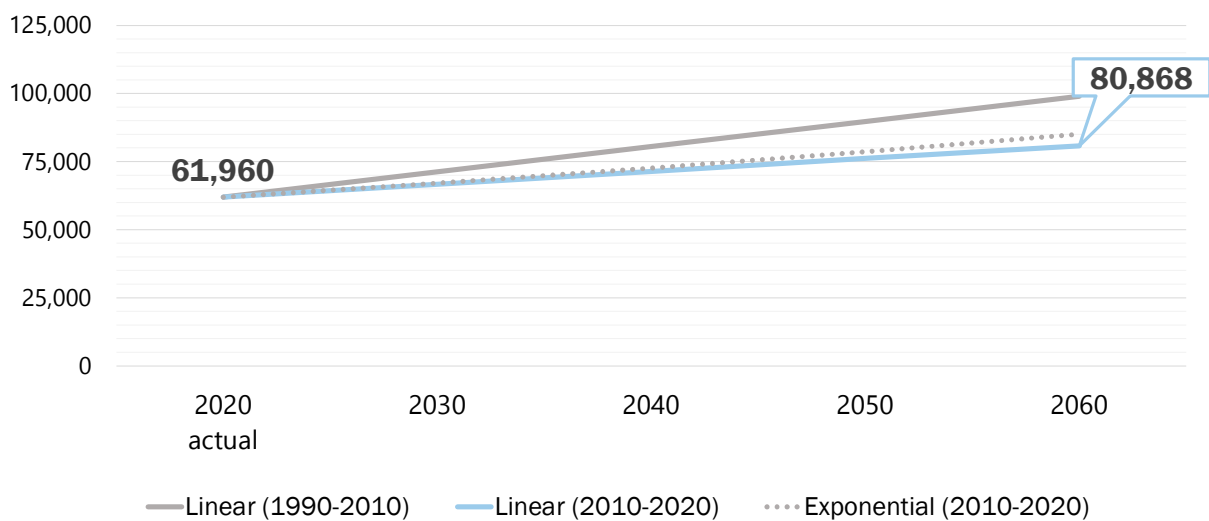
Orange County Population Projections

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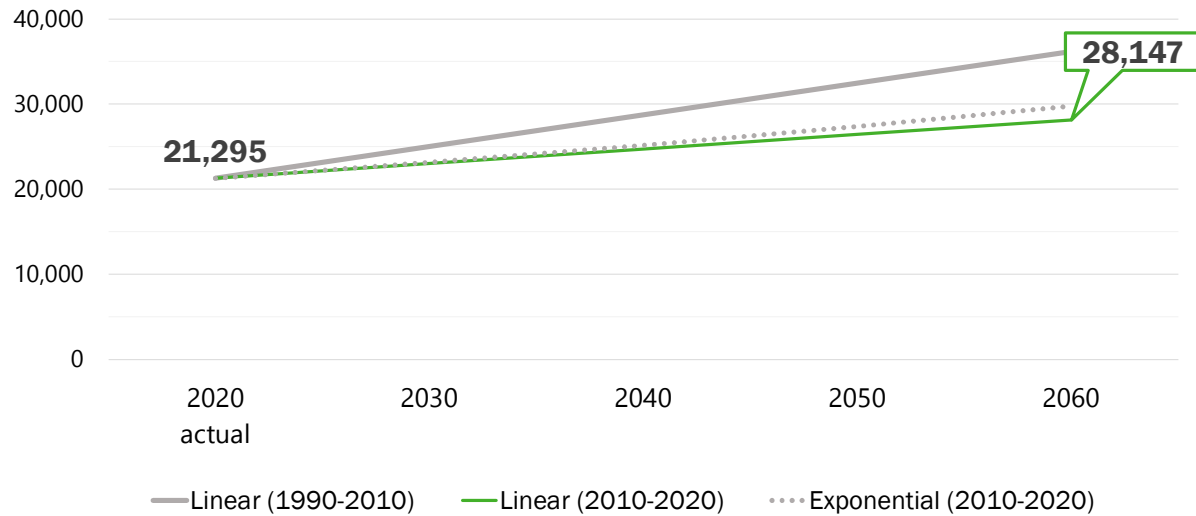
Chapel Hill Population Projections

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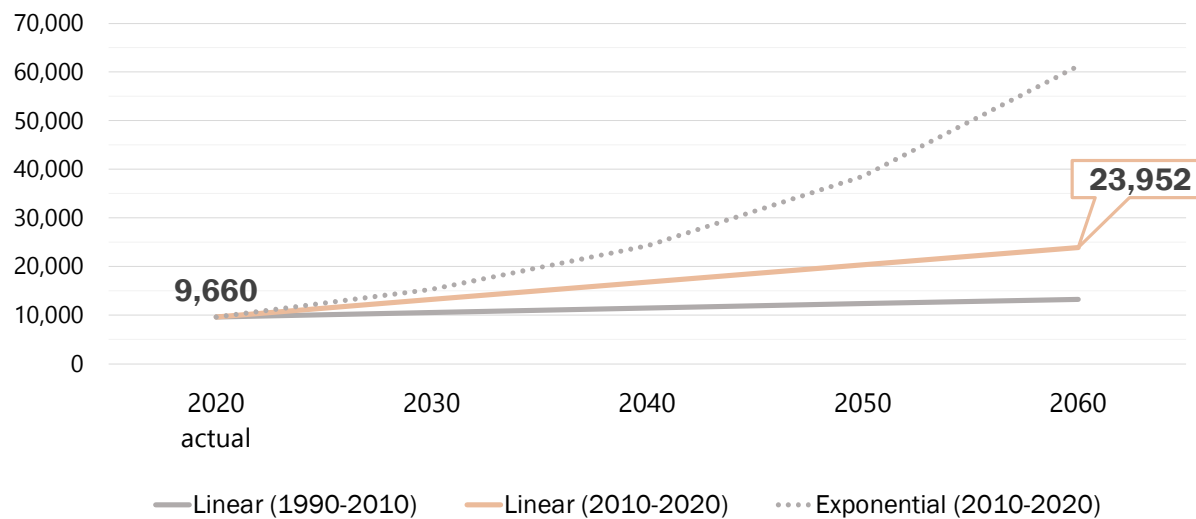
Carrboro Population Projections

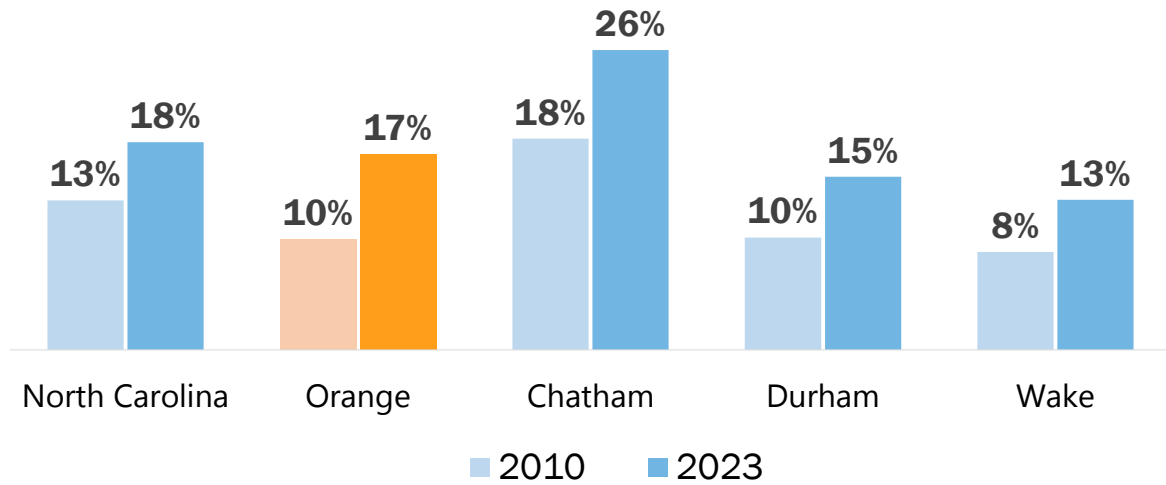

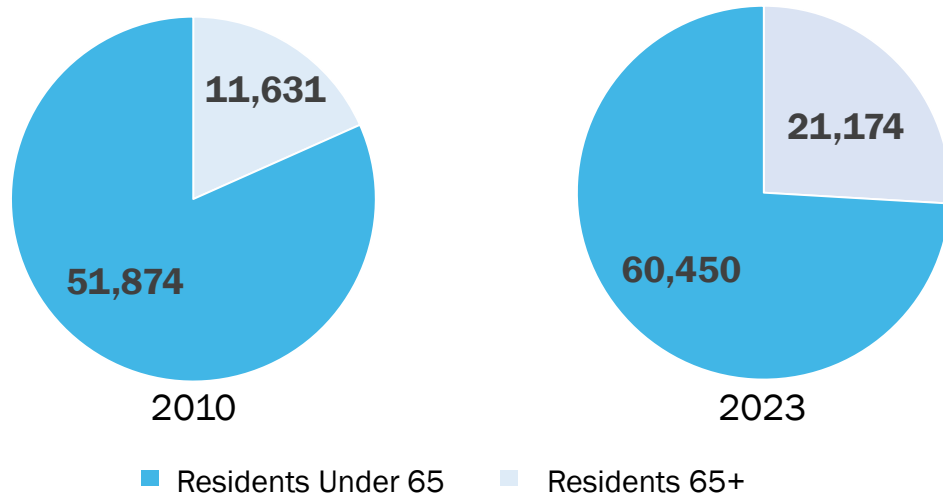

Chatham County has 9,543 more seniors in 2023 (July 1) than 2010 (April 1), now 26% of the county population

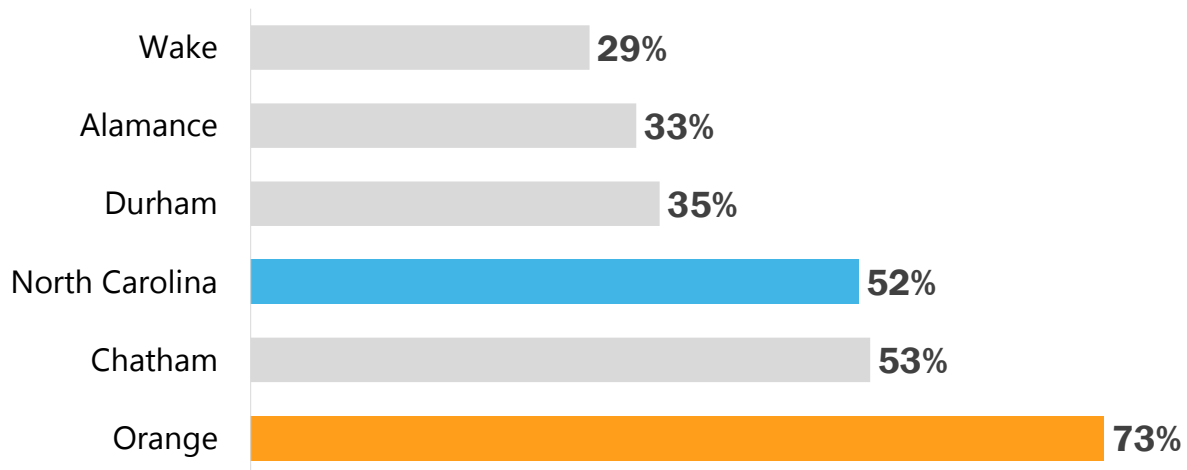

Share of 2010-2023 population growth due to 65+ growth

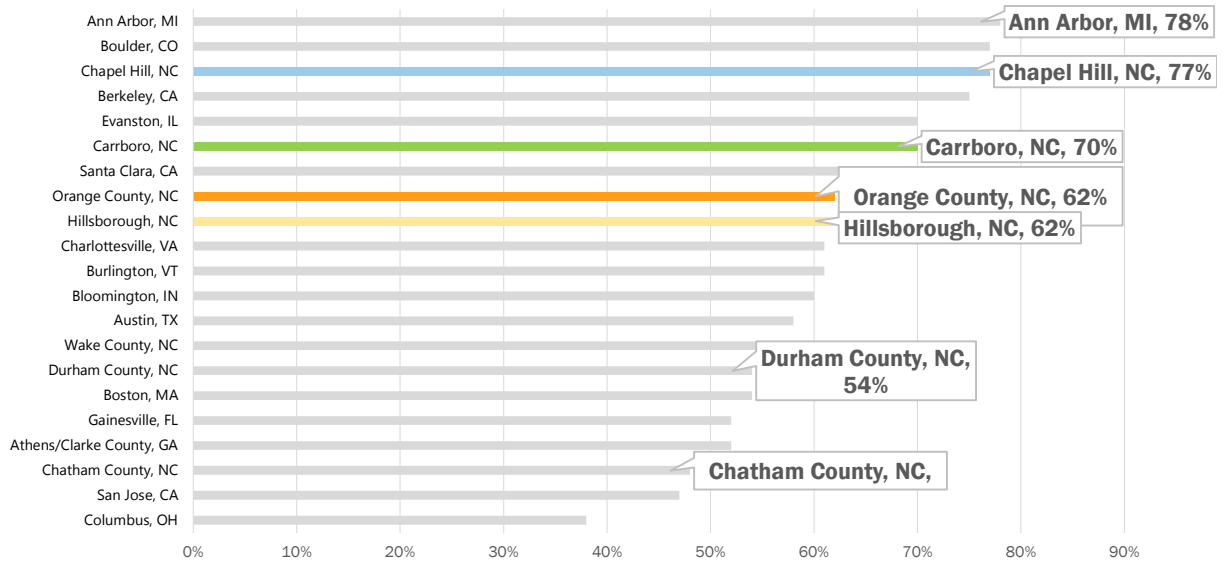

Percent of residents 25+ with a bachelor's degree or higher, 2023

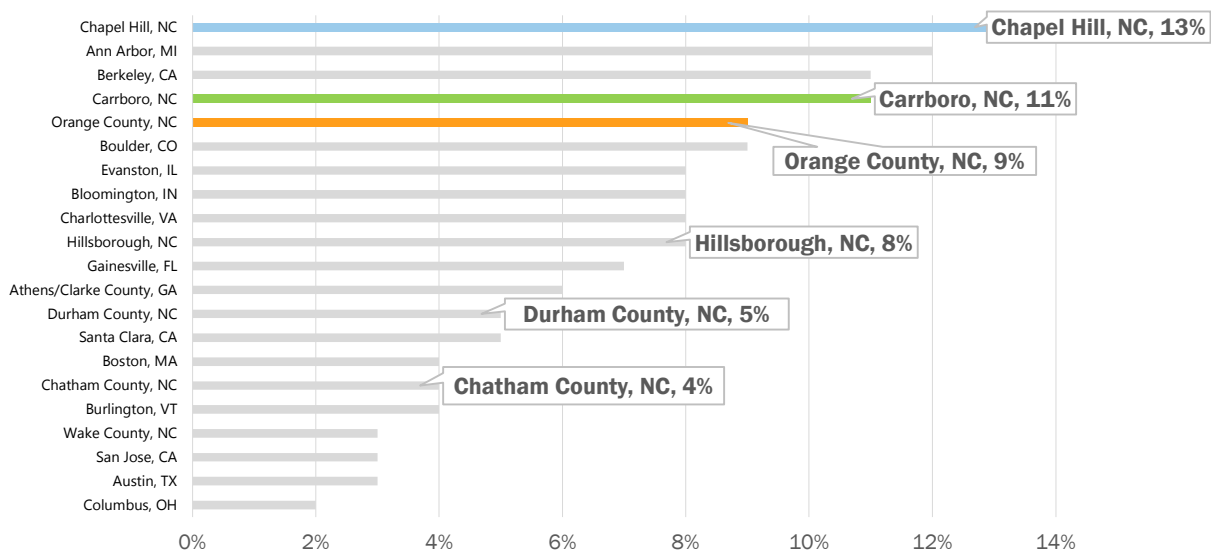

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Educational Attainment – Doctorate Degree

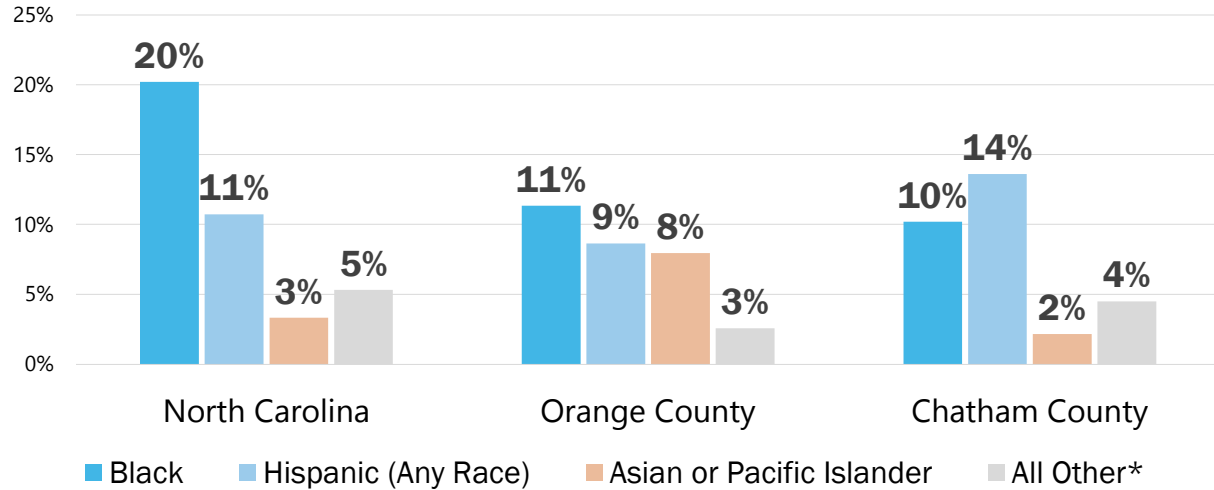
Percent of residents 25+ with a doctorate degree, 2023

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State & County Minority Makeup

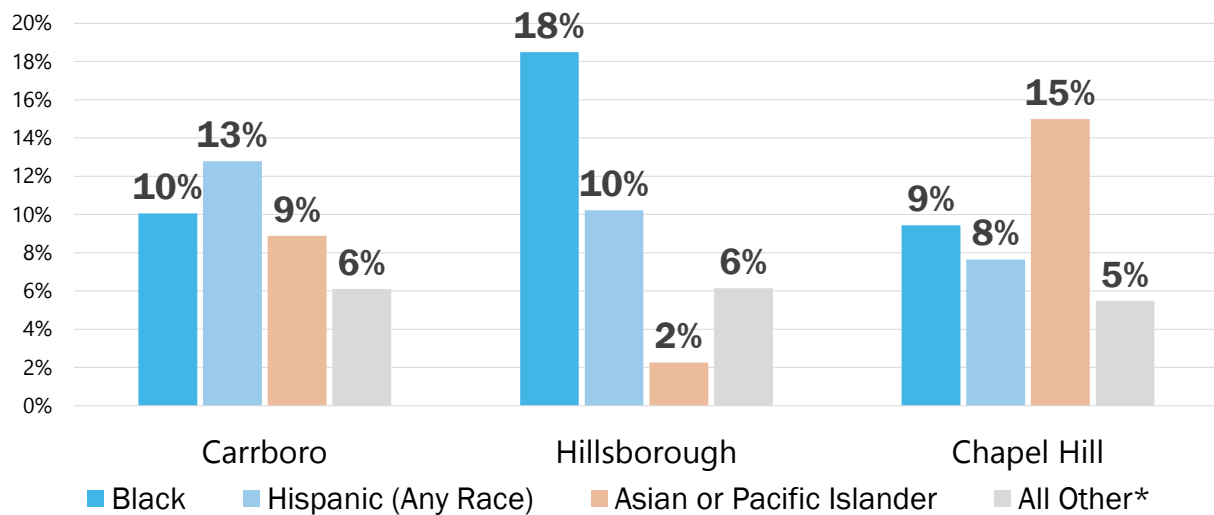

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Municipal Minority Makeup

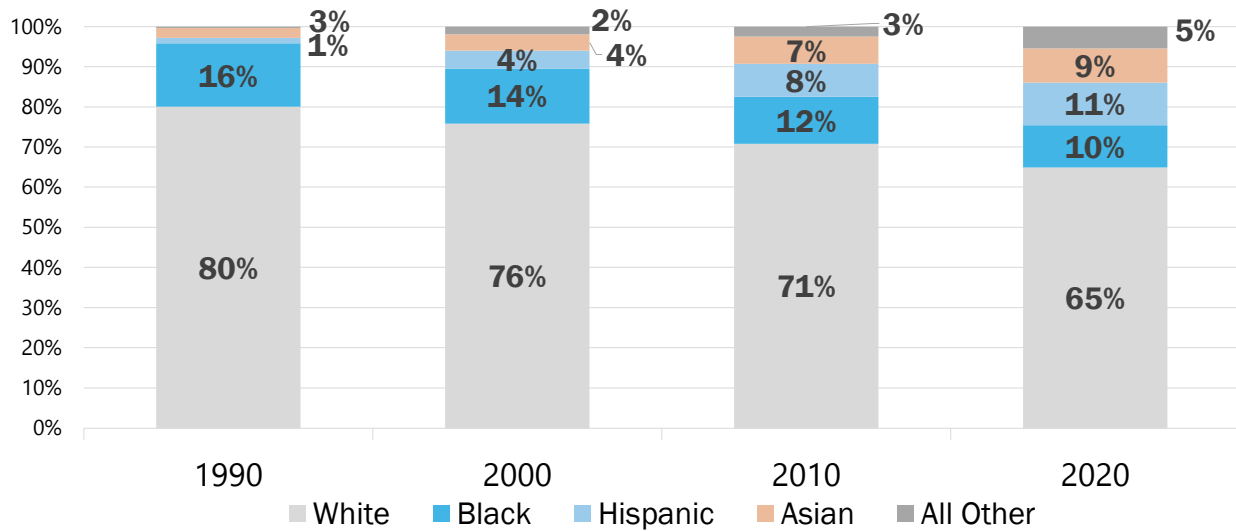

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Orange County Population by Race/Ethnicity



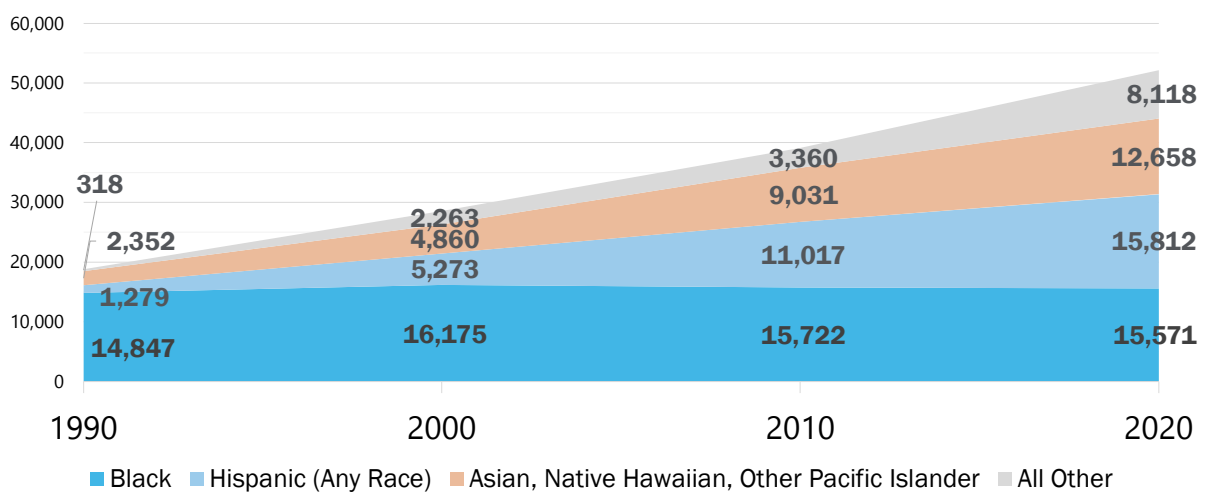

Changes in racial makeup by decade



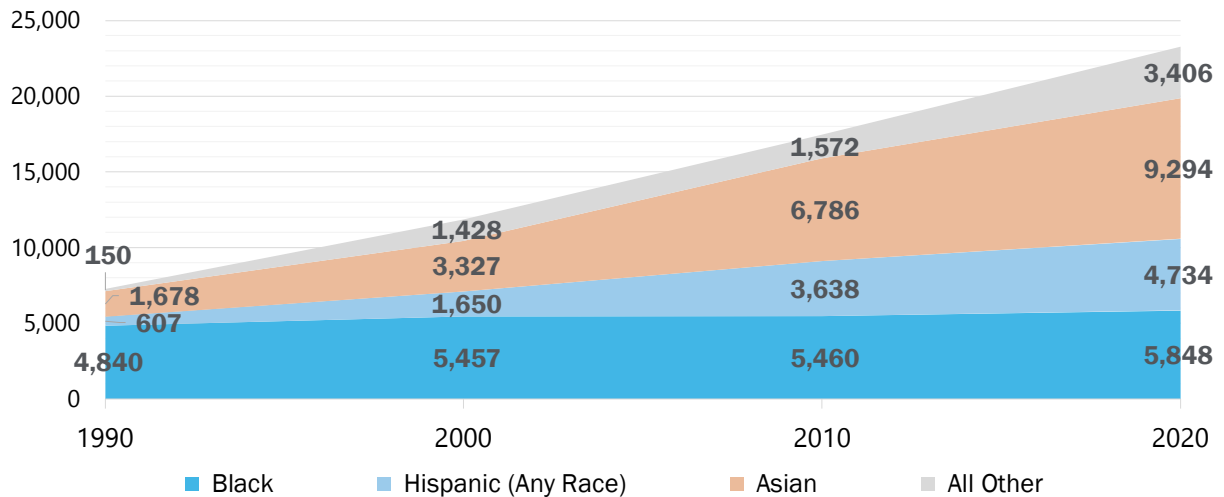

Changes in racial makeup by decade



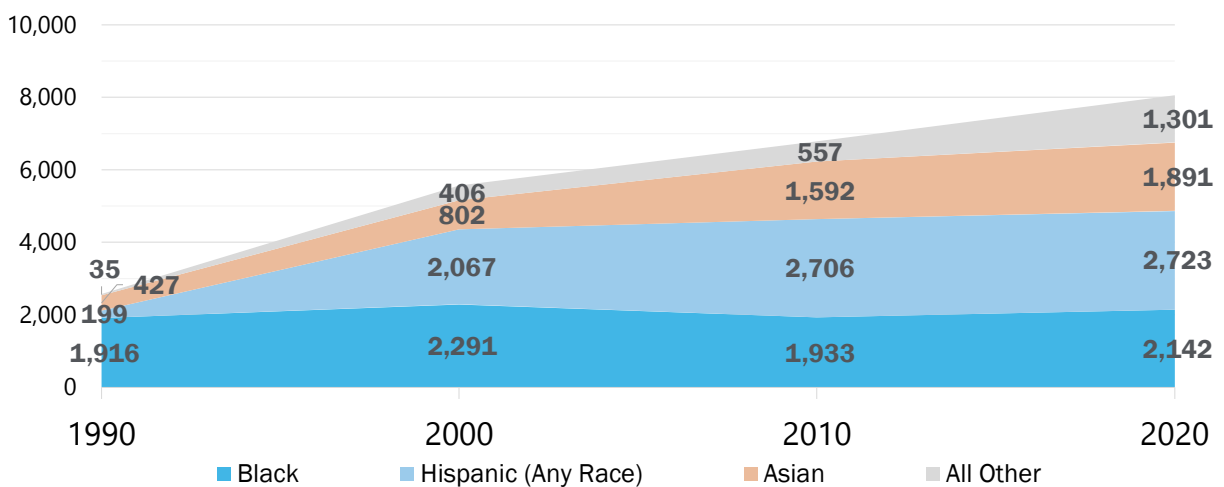

Changes in racial makeup by decade



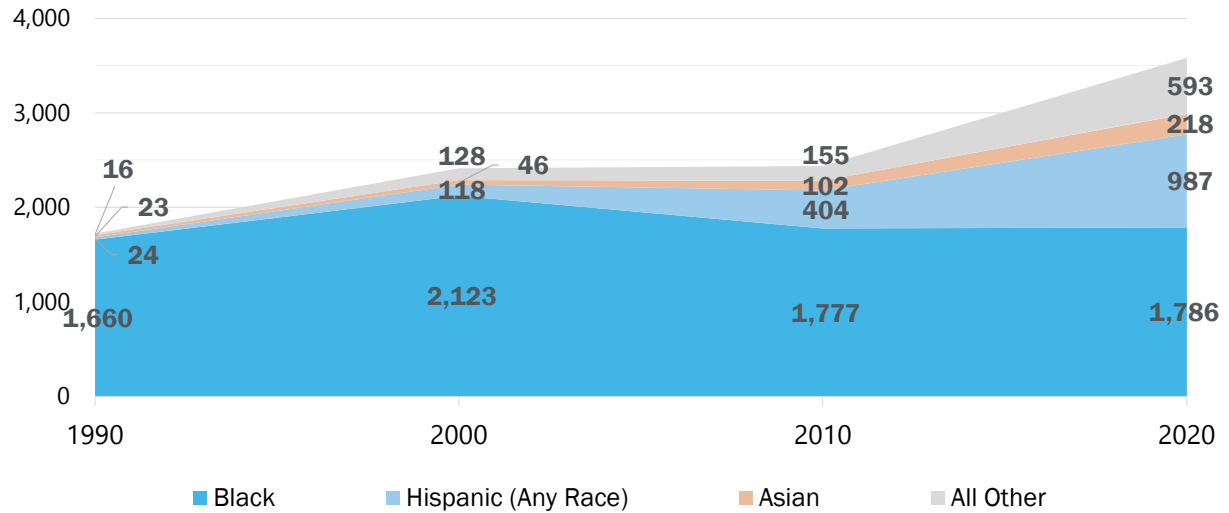

Changes in racial makeup by decade



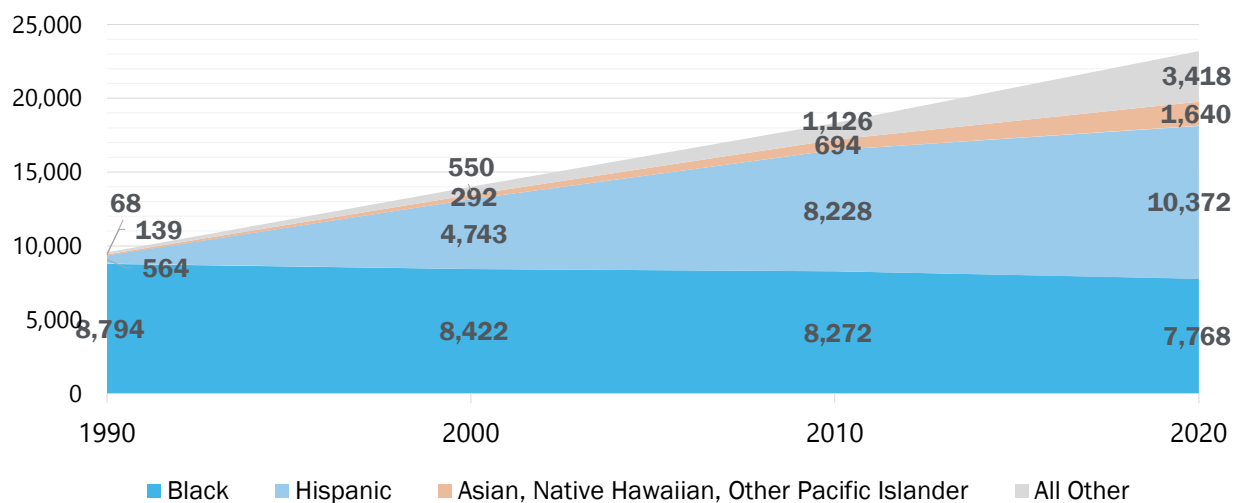

Changes in racial makeup by decade

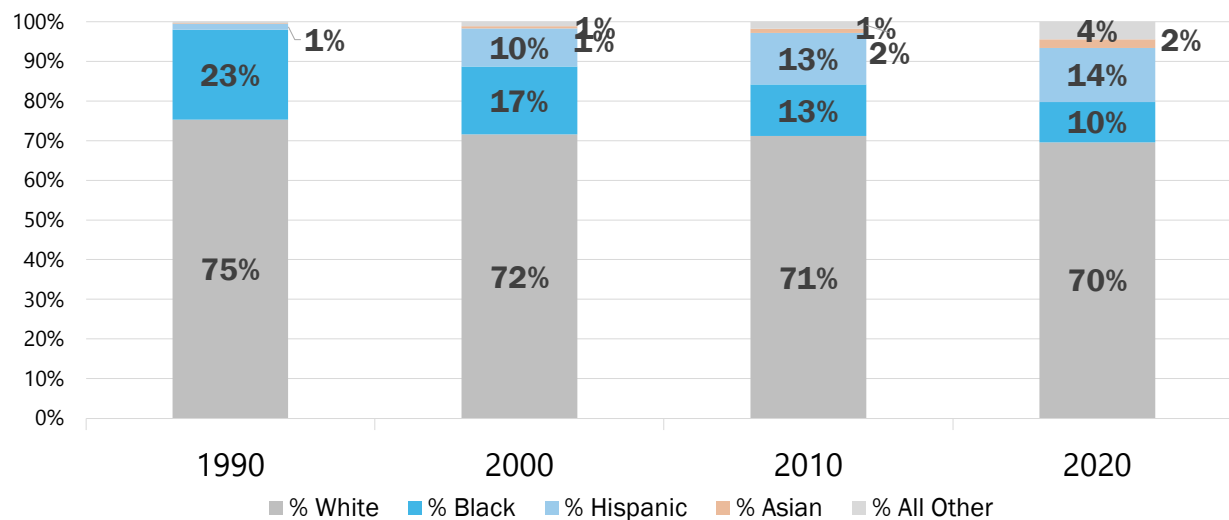

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Chatham County Population by Race/Ethnicity



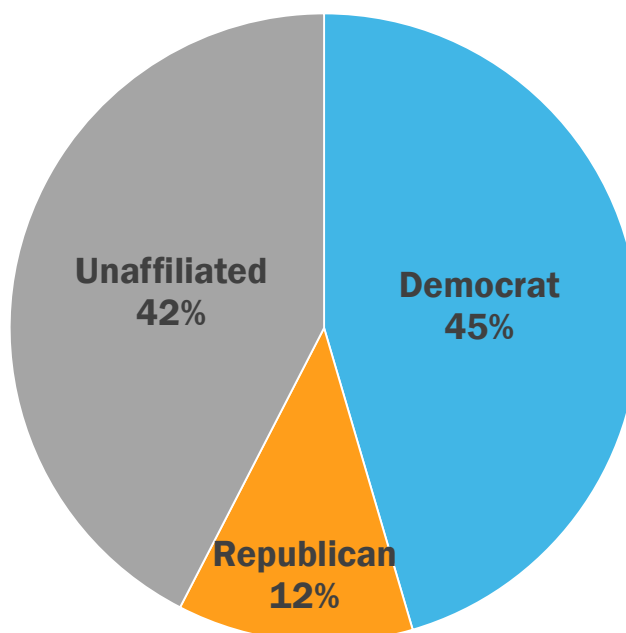

Voter registration by party as of April 25, 2025 (109,115 total voters)

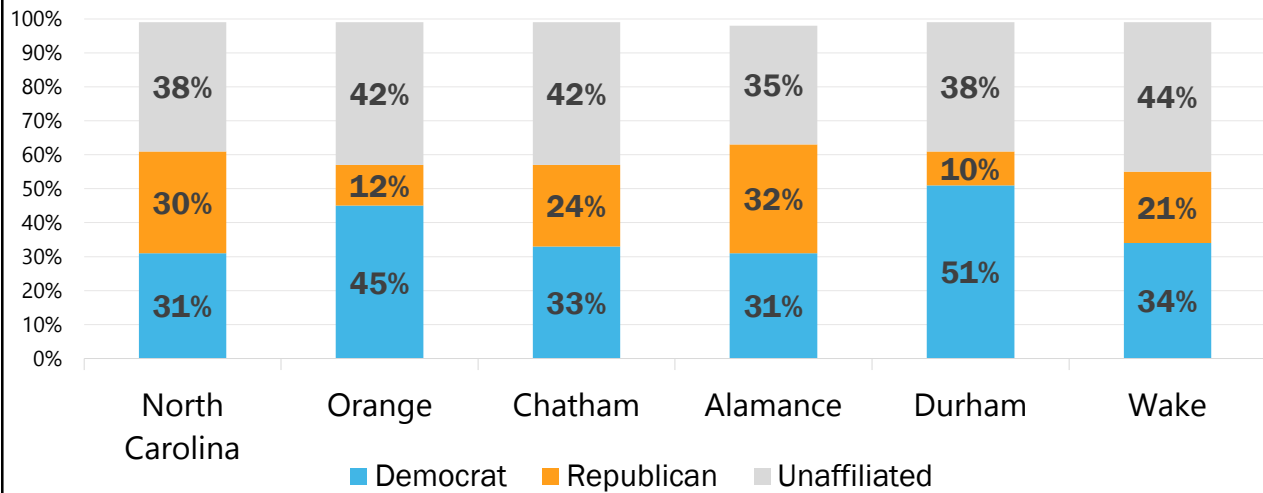

Voter registration by party as of April 2025

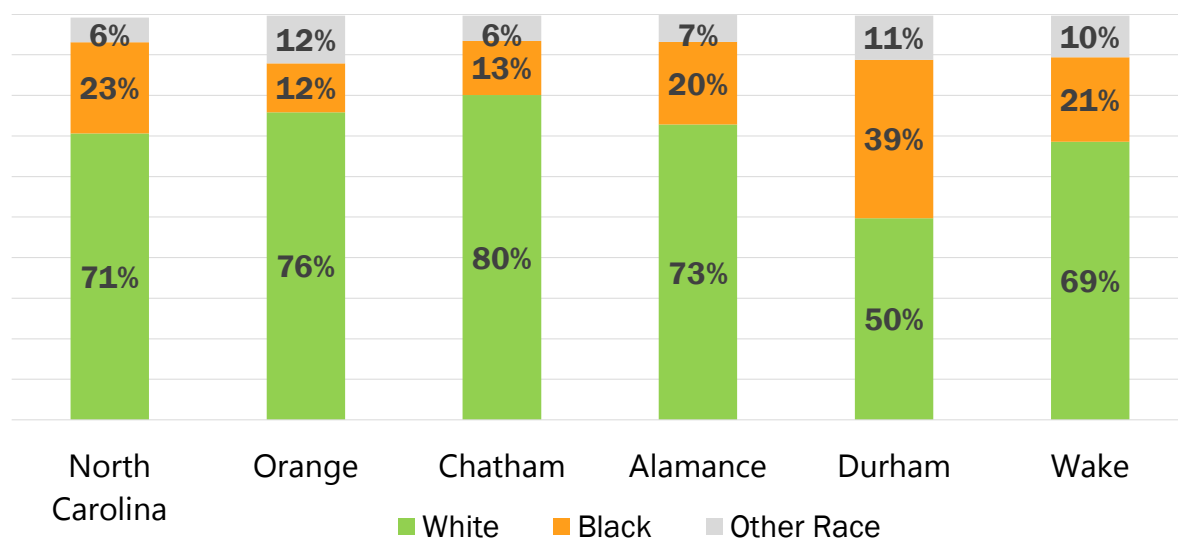

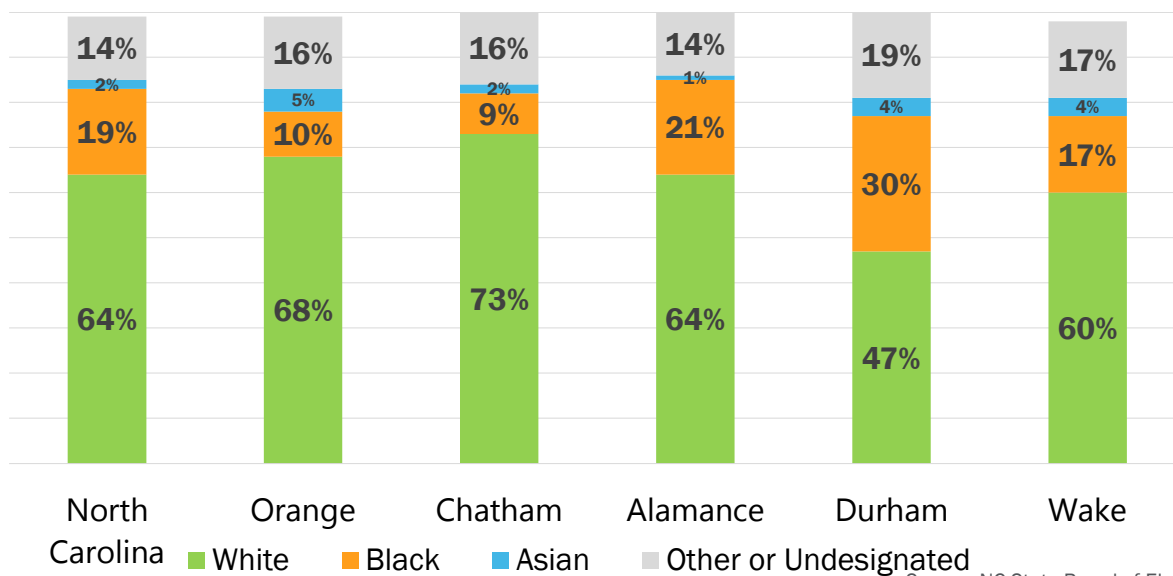

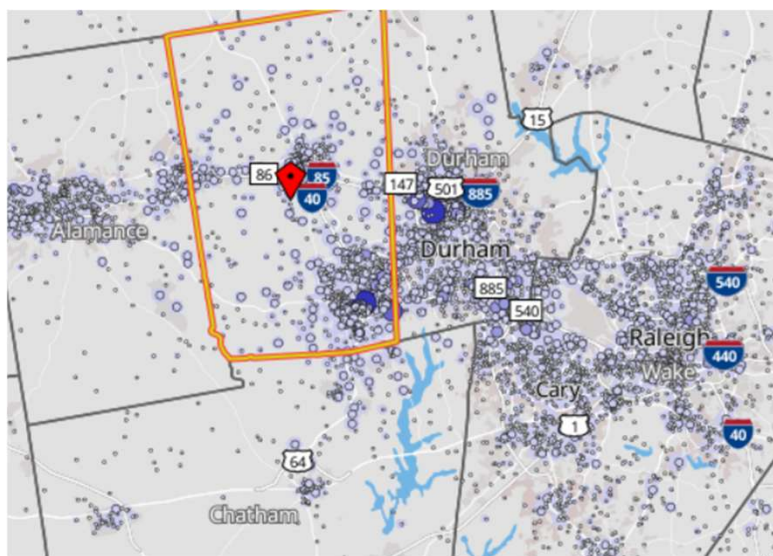

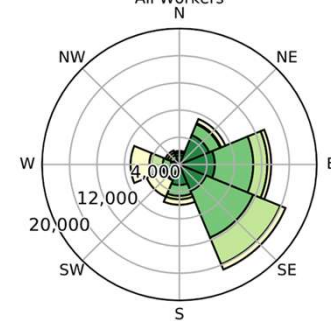

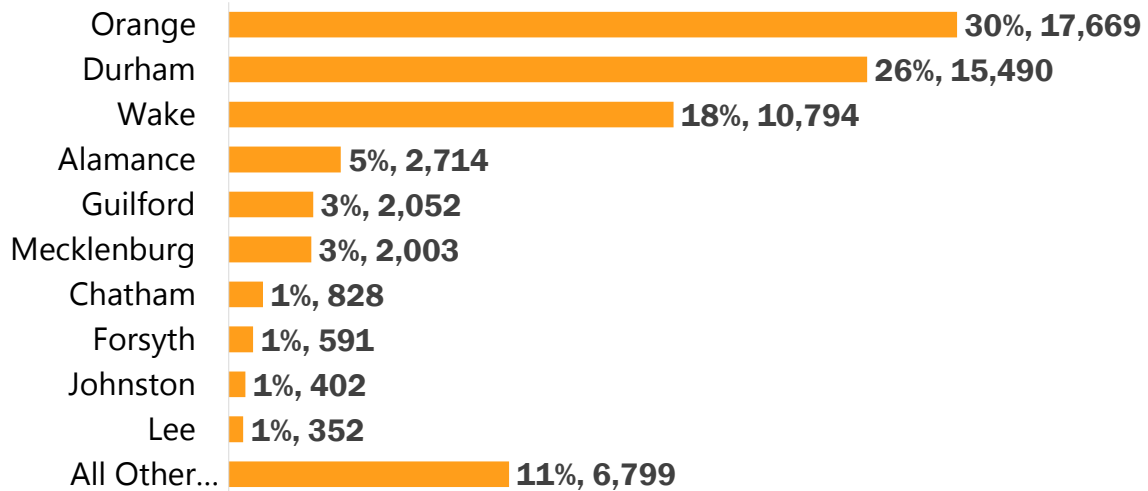

Location of primary job for residents of Orange County, 2022

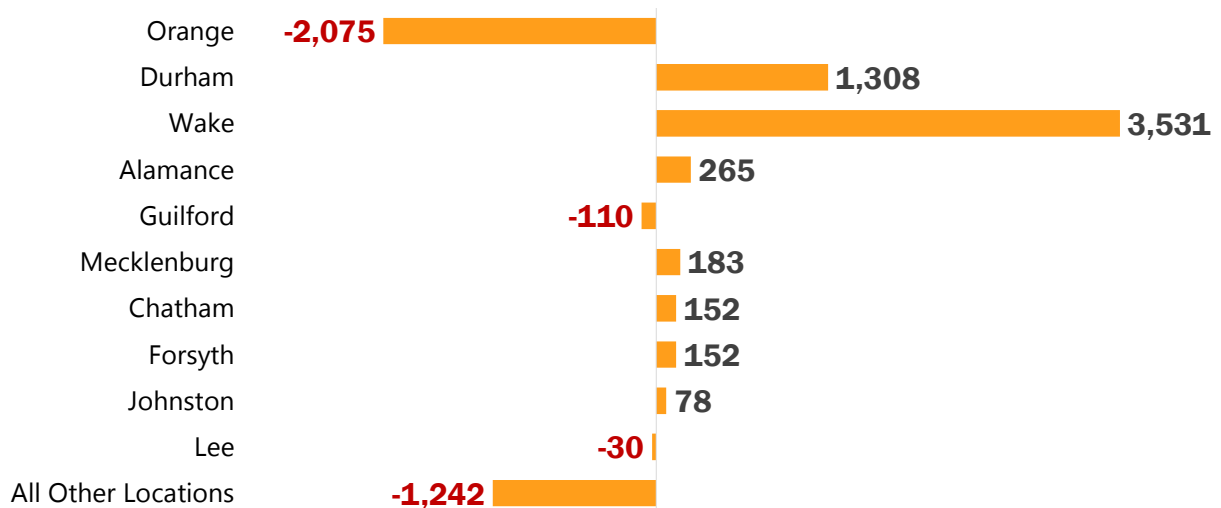

Change in Where Orange County Residents Work

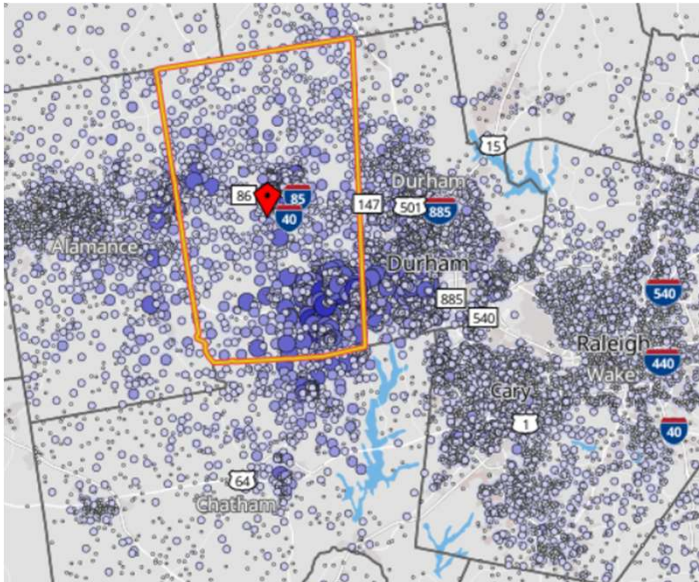
Change in location of Orange County residents' primary job from 2012-2022



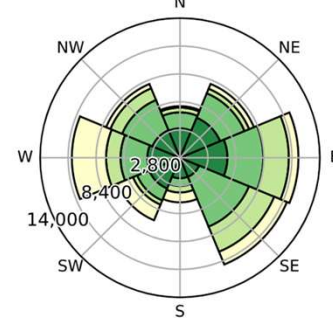

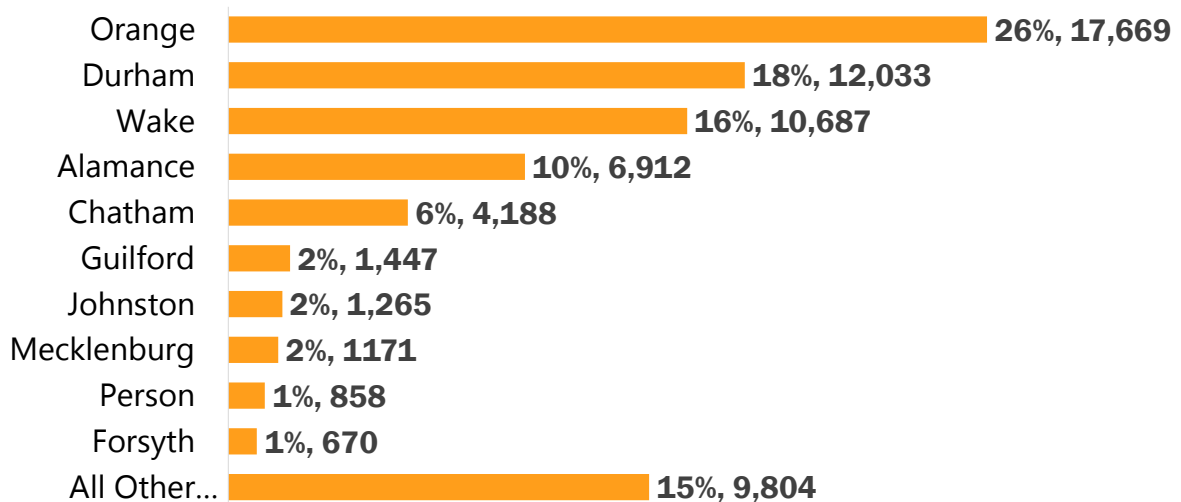

Orange County workers by county of residence, 2022

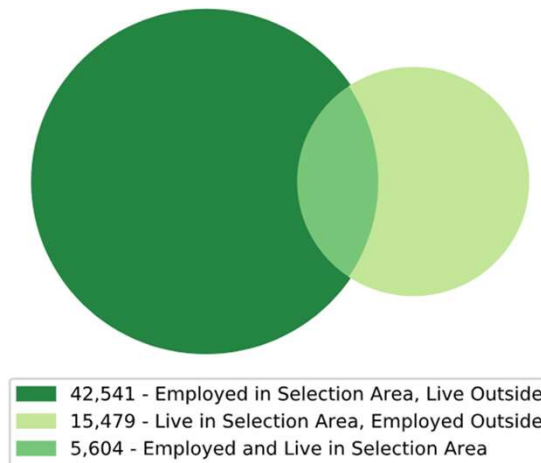

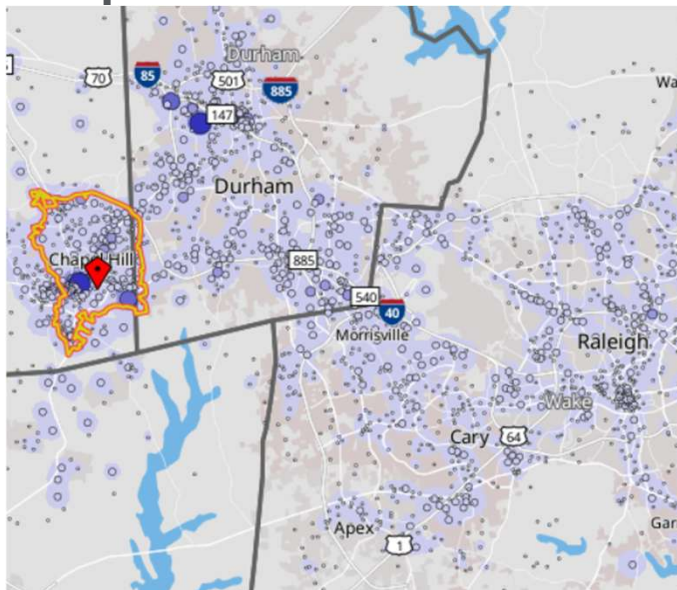

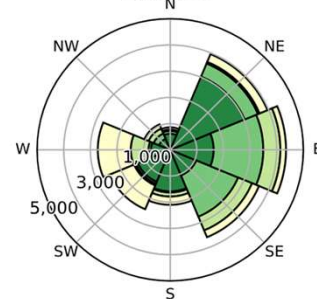

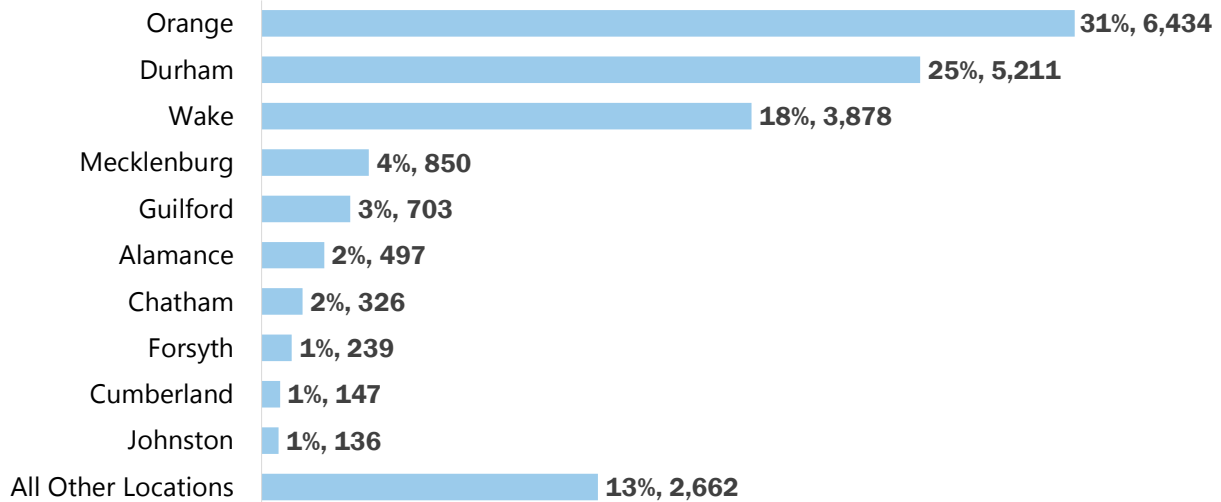

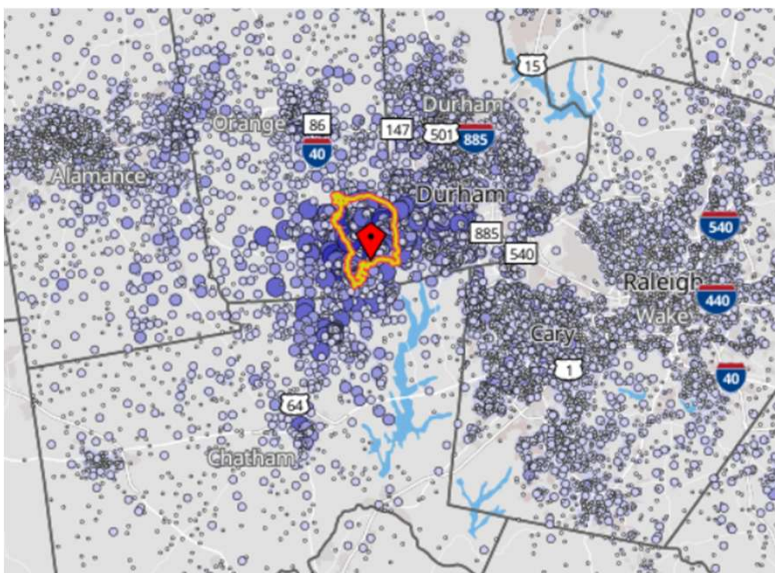
Location of primary job for residents of Chapel Hill, 2022



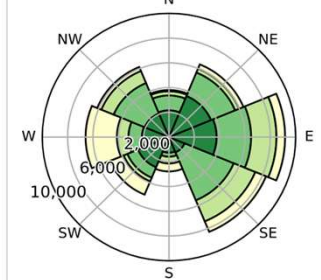

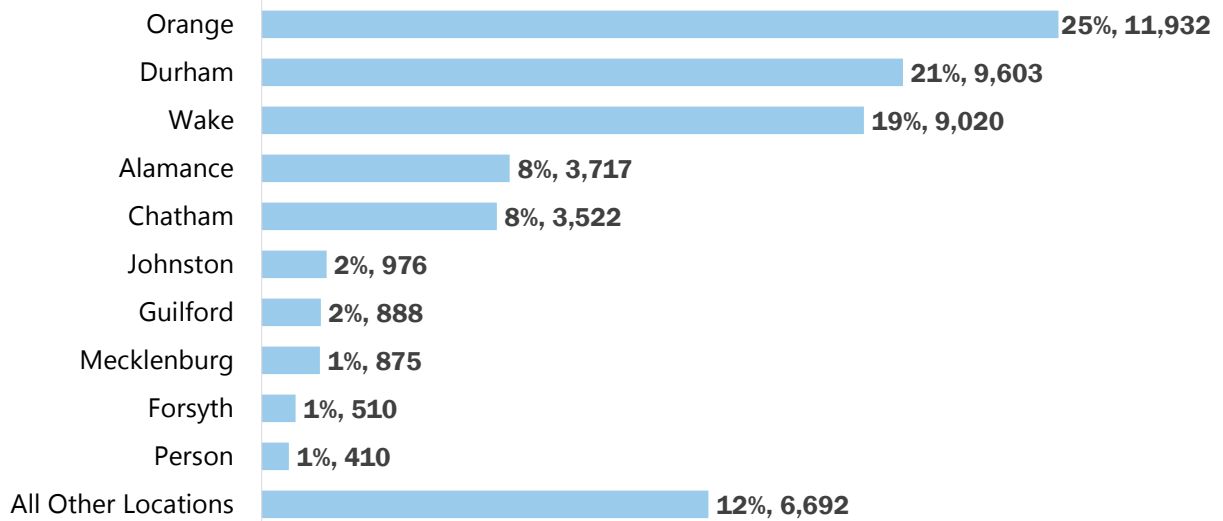

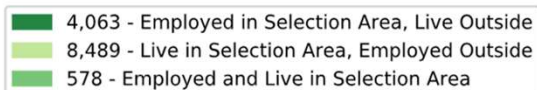

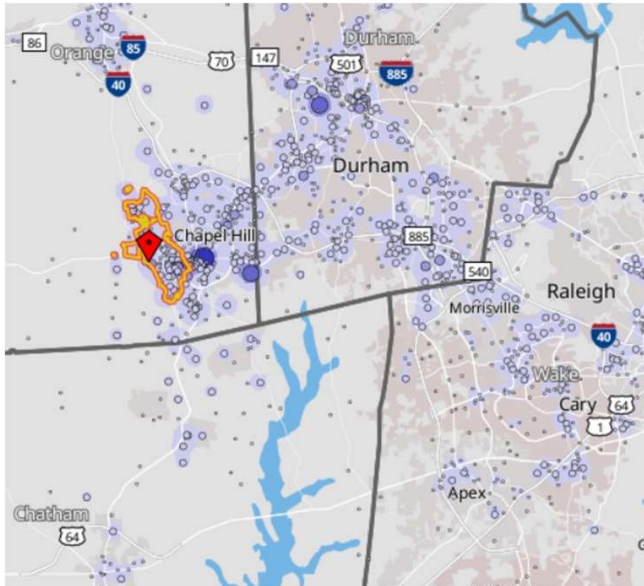

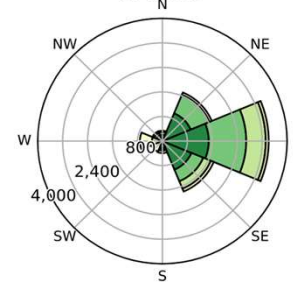

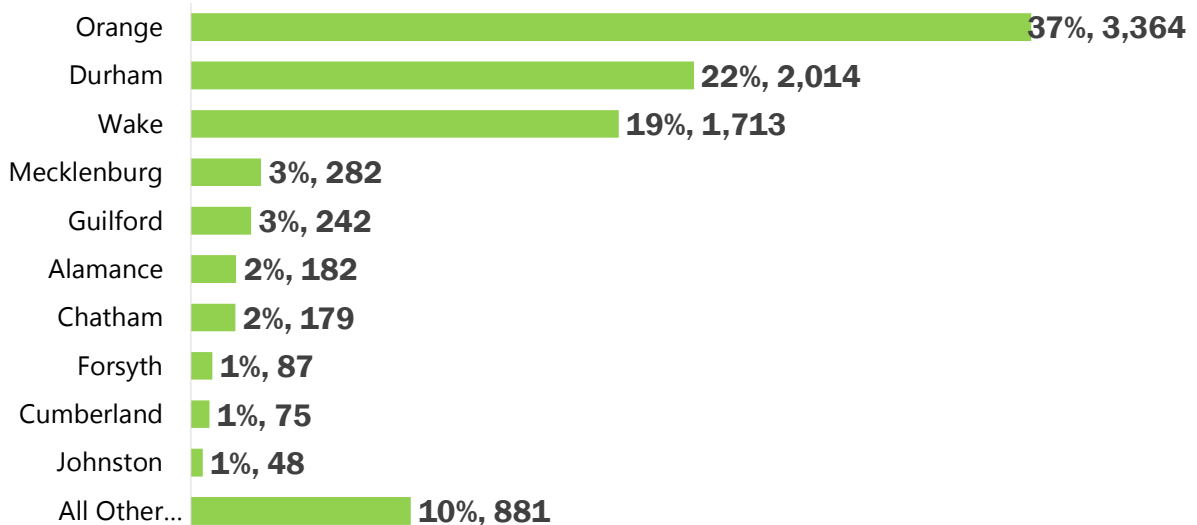

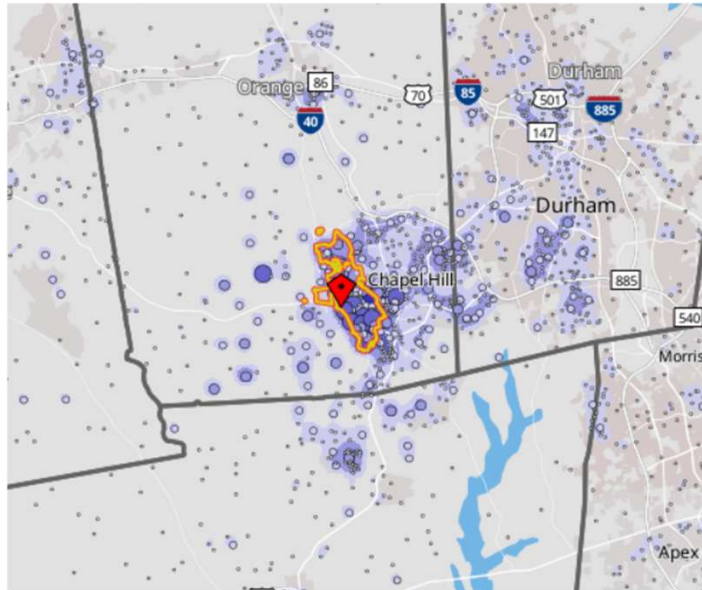
Location of primary job for residents of Carrboro, 2022



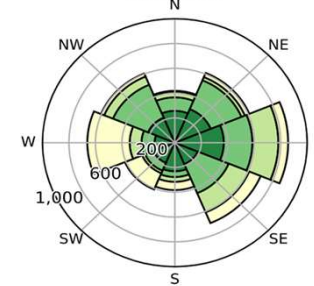

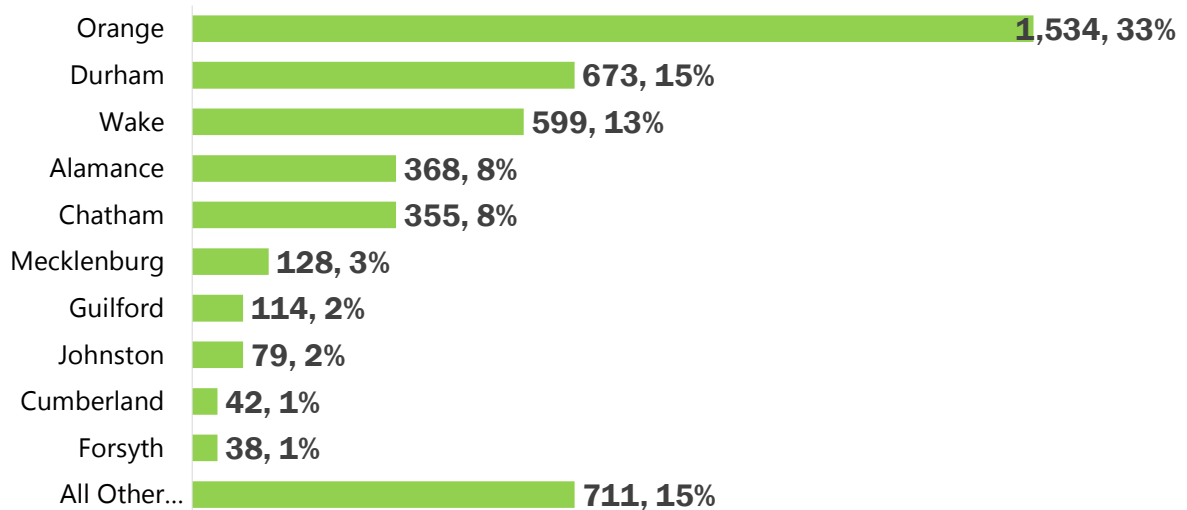

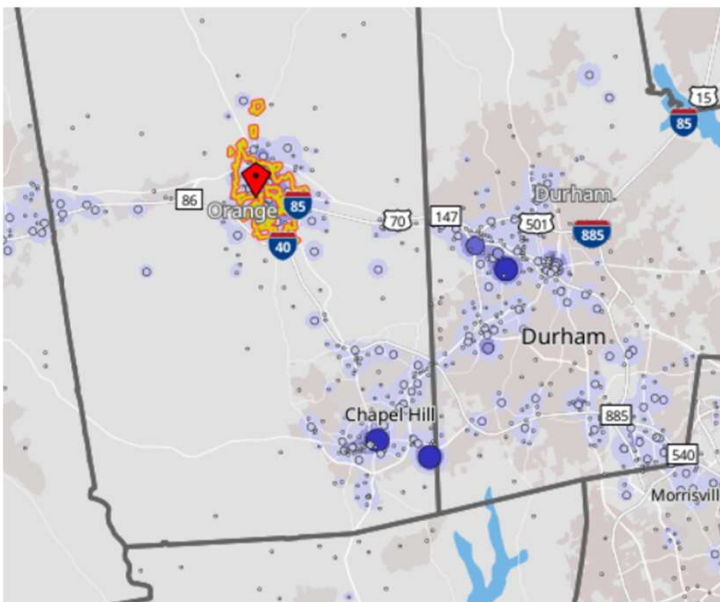

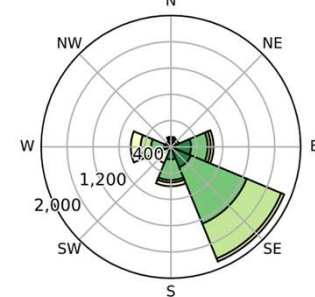

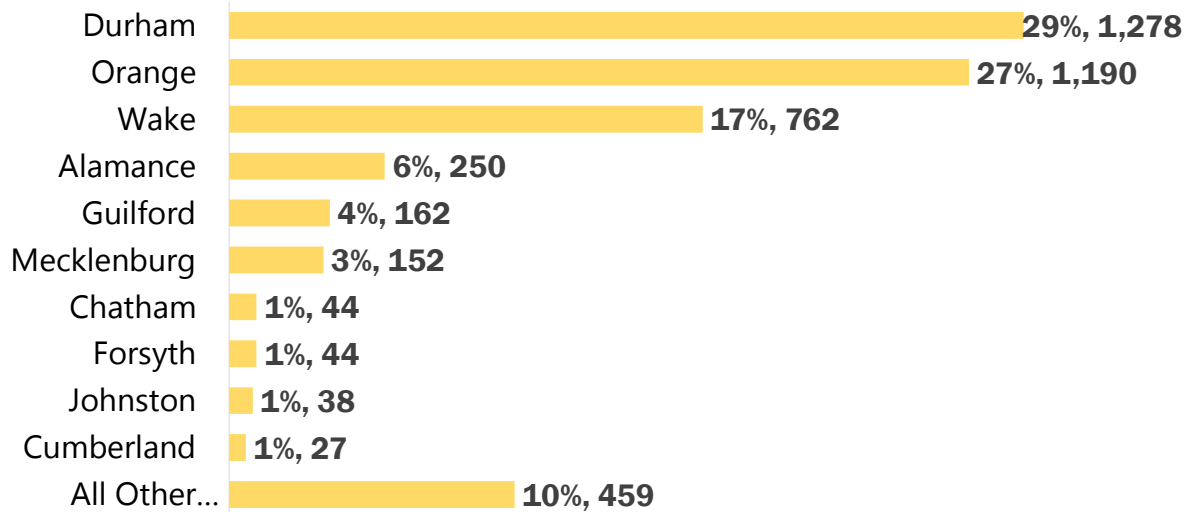

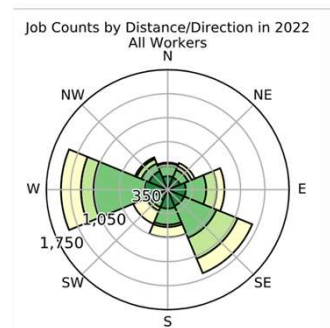
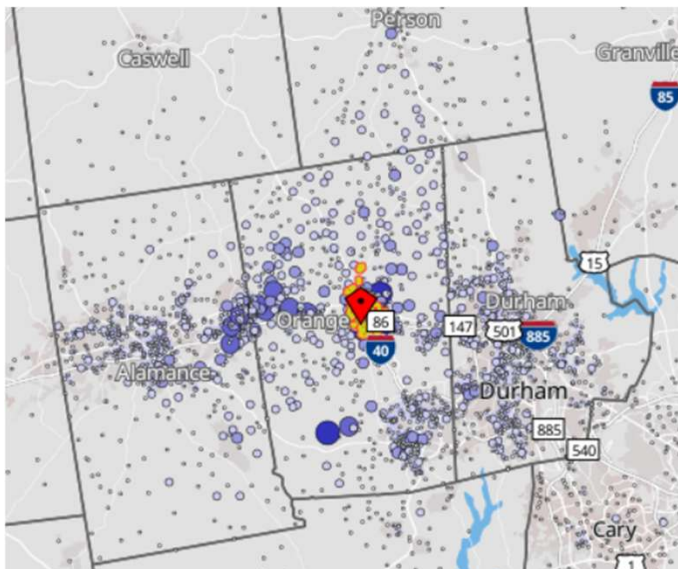
Location of primary job for residents of Hillsborough, 2022

Residential Location of the 6,232 People Who Work in Hillsborough



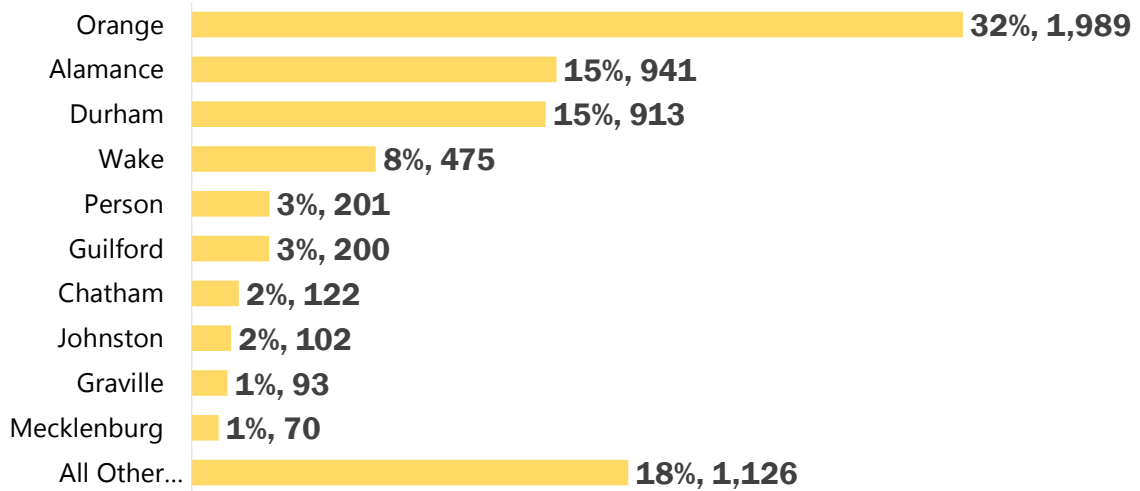

Hillsborough workers by county of residence, 2022

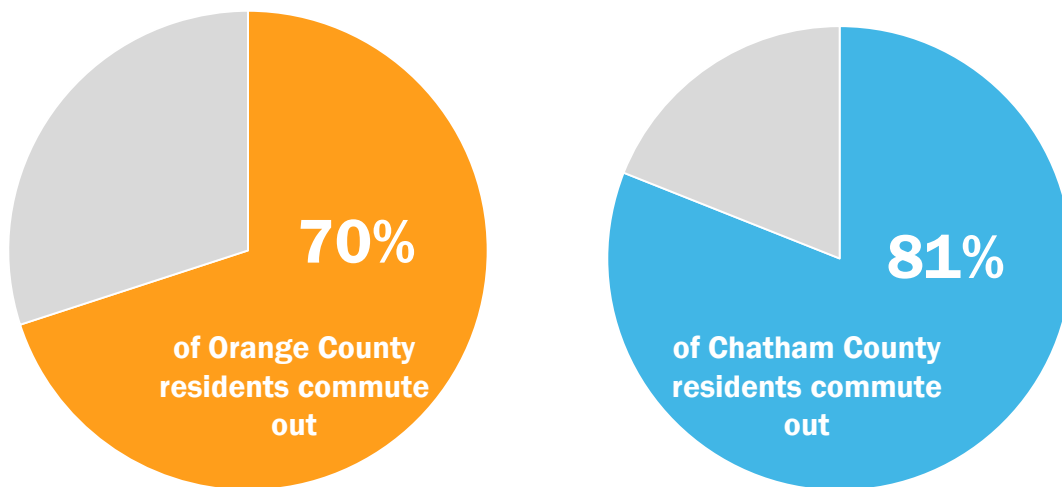

Percent of residents commuting outside of the county for work, 2022

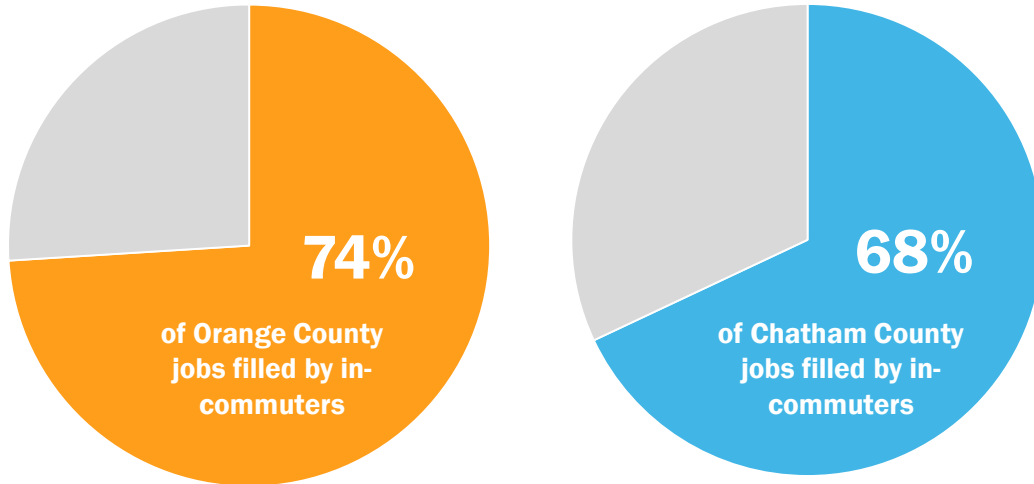

Percent of county jobs filled by in-commuters, 2022

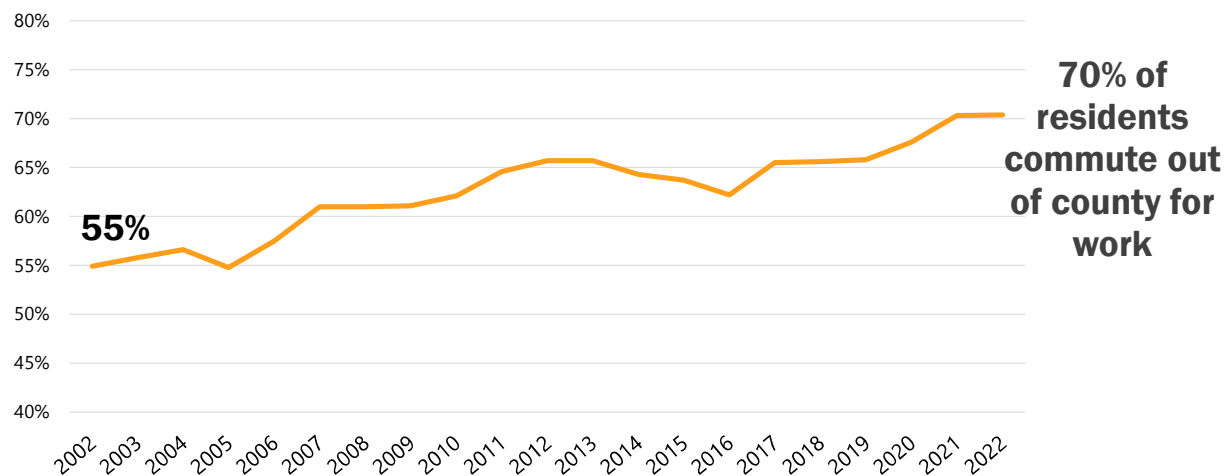

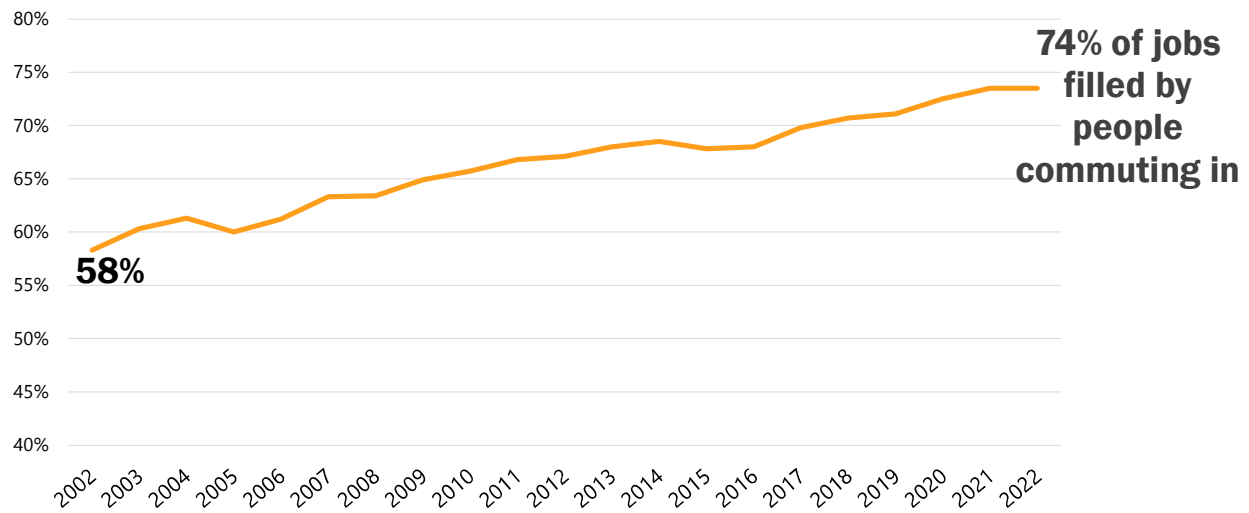
Percent of county residents that commute out of the county for work, 2002 to 2022

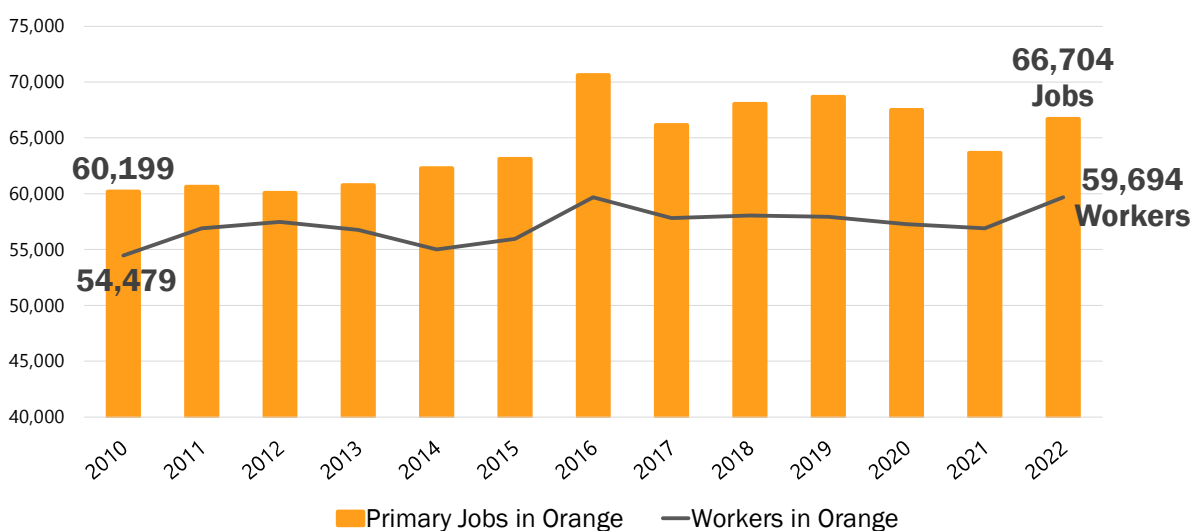
Percent of Orange Jobs Filled by Workers Commuting In 2002 to 2022

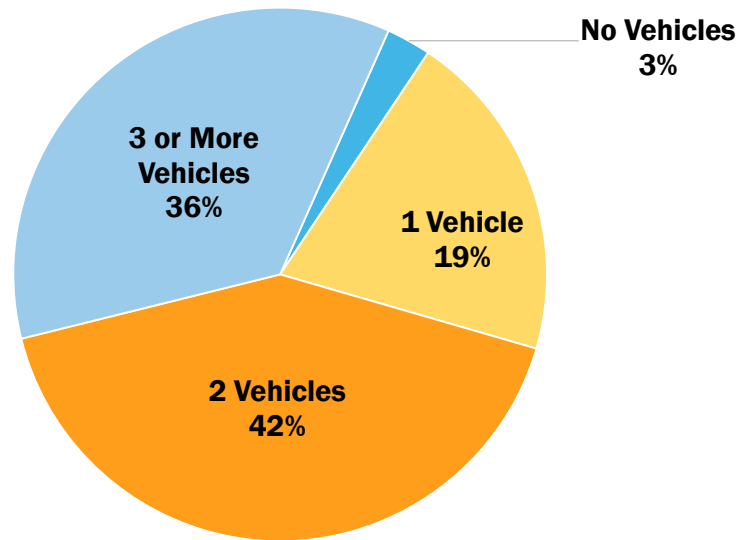
Number of Jobs vs. Number of Workers – Orange

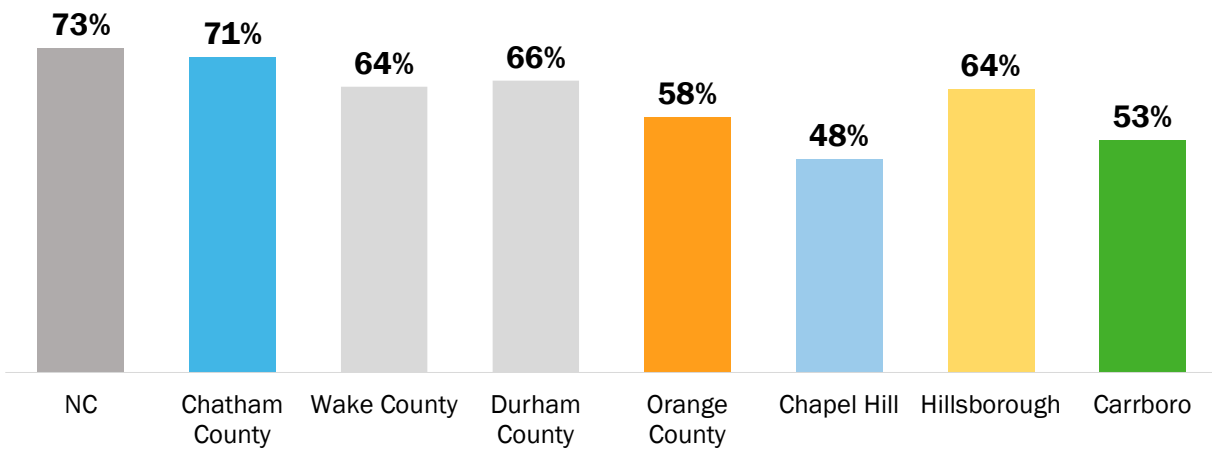

Percent of workers aged 16 and over driving to work alone

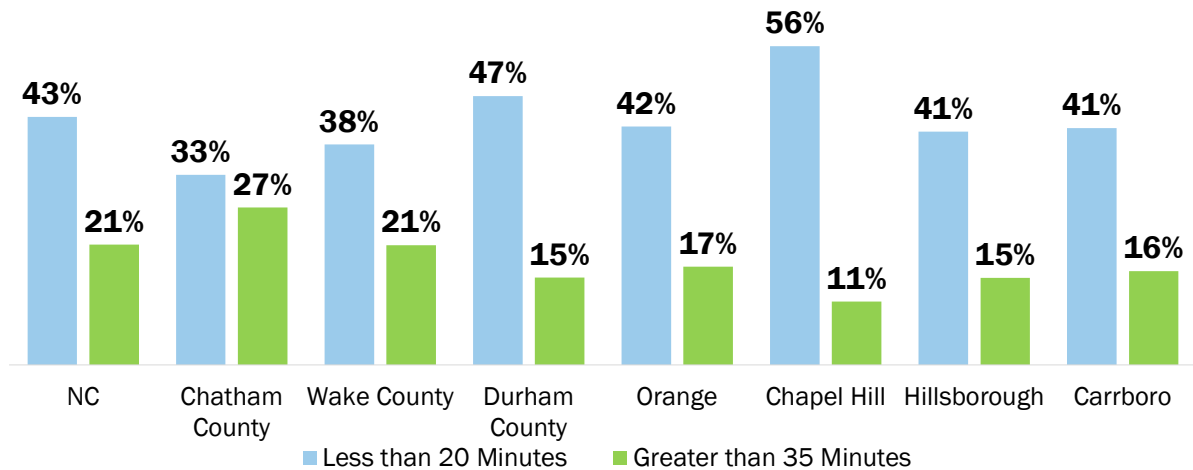

Percent of workers aged 16 and over commute time

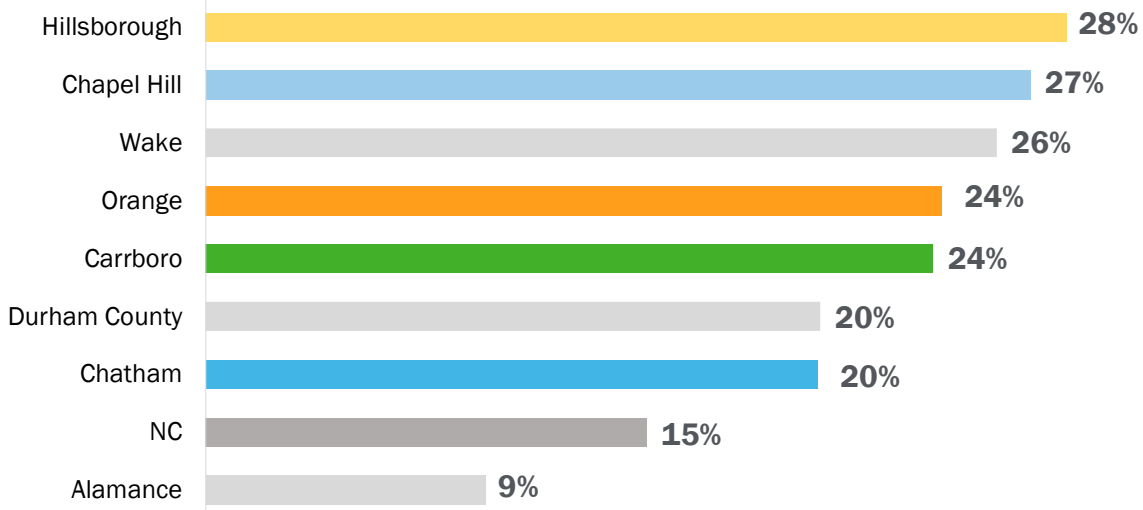

Percent of Workers Who Worked from Home

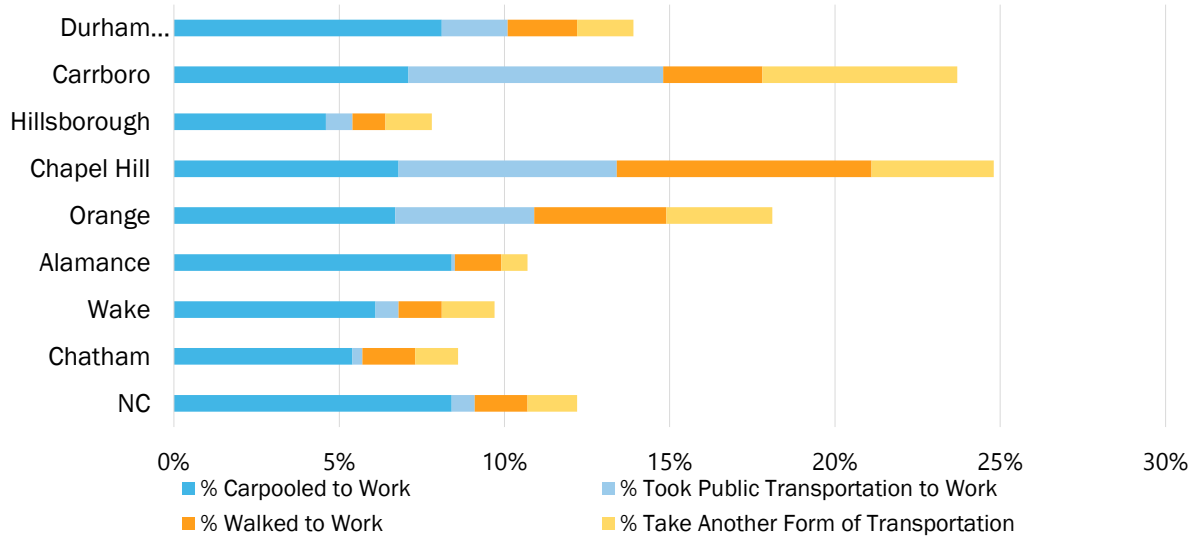
Percent of working residents who answered “worked from home” when asked how they got to work the previous week

How Workers Get to Work Other Than Driving Alone

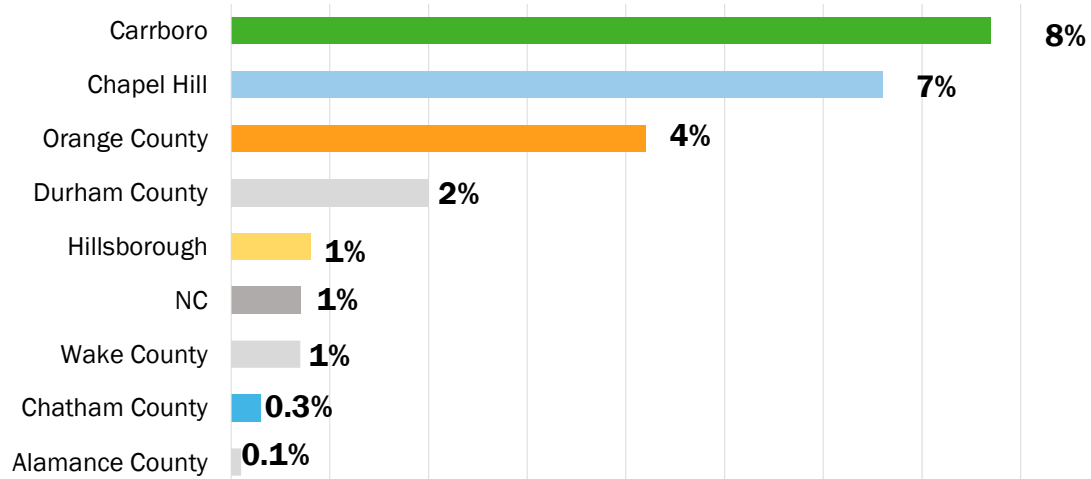

Percent of working residents who report taking public transportation to work

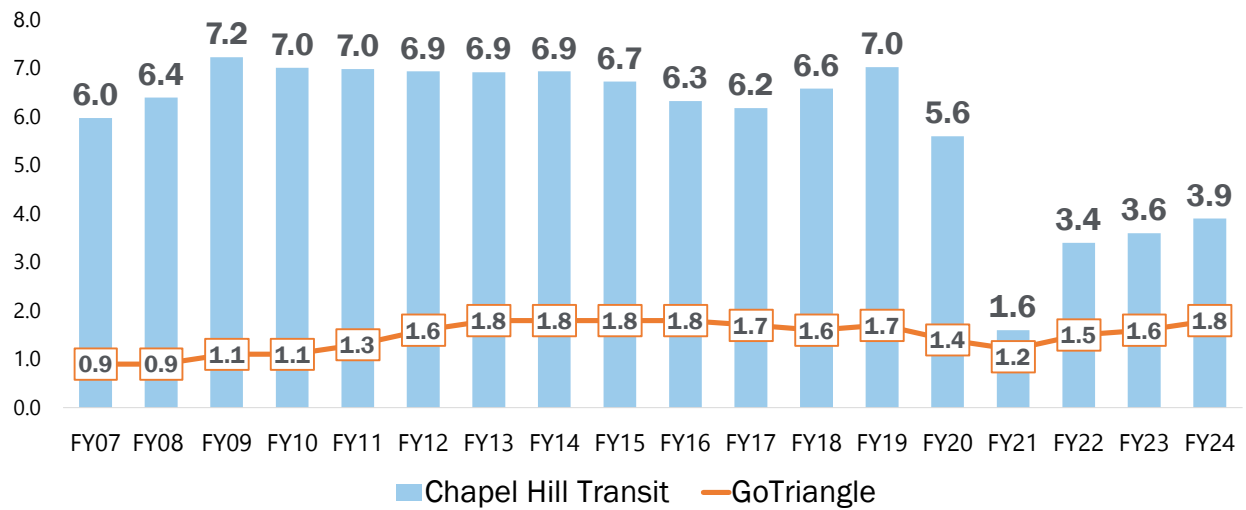

Annual Chapel Hill Transit ridership from FY2010 – FY2024 (in millions)

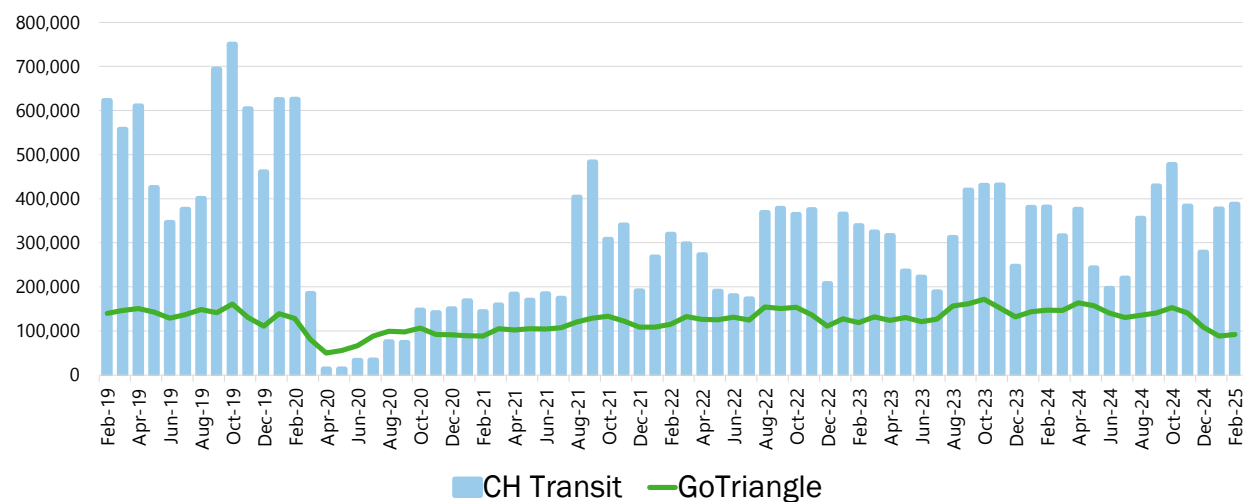

Monthly Chapel Hill Transit compared to Go Triangle Ridership Jan 2019 – Feb 2025

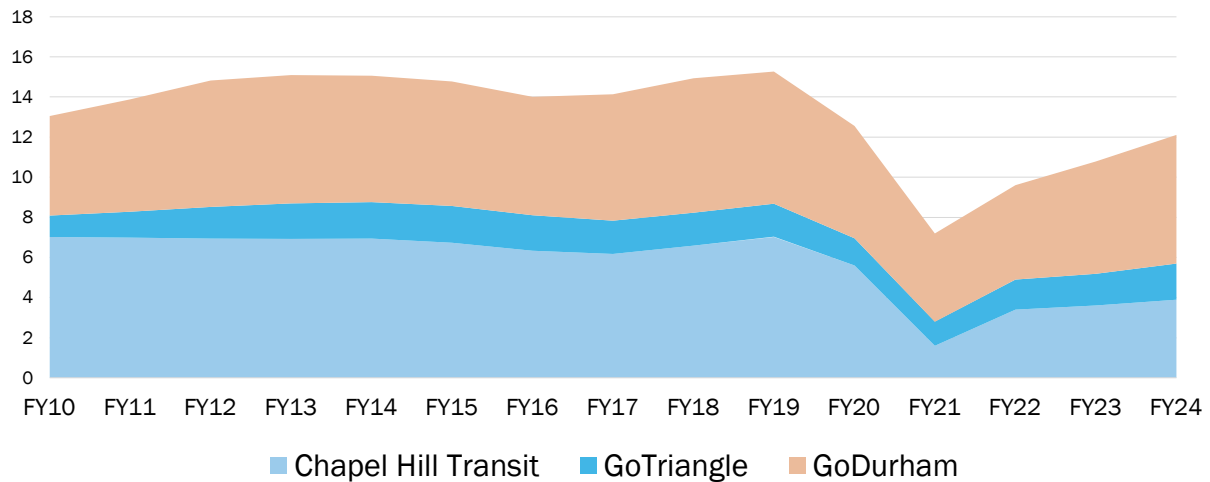

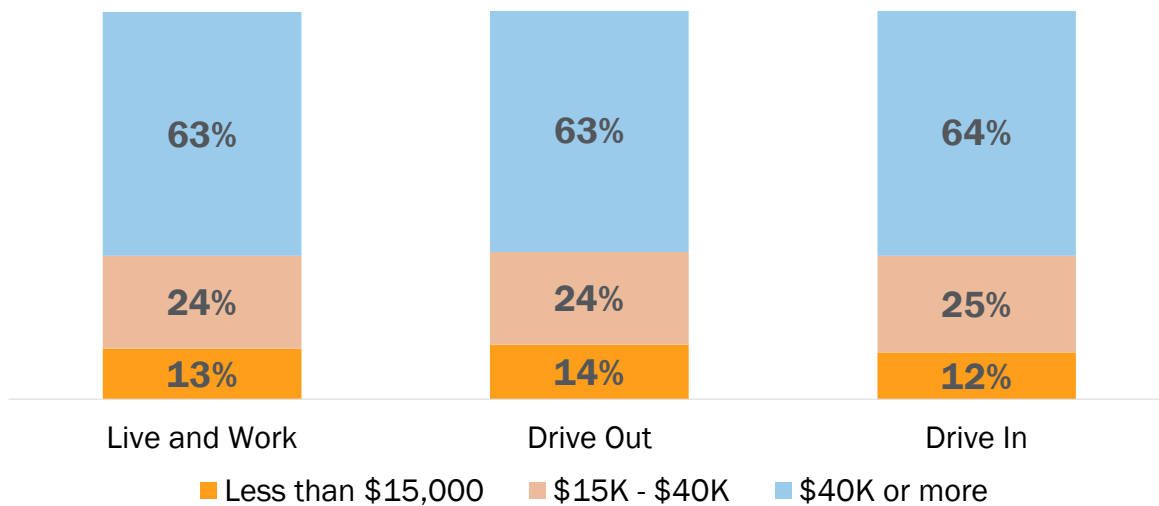
Annual transit ridership (in millions), FY2010 – FY2024

Income of Workers Driving in and Out of Orange County for Work

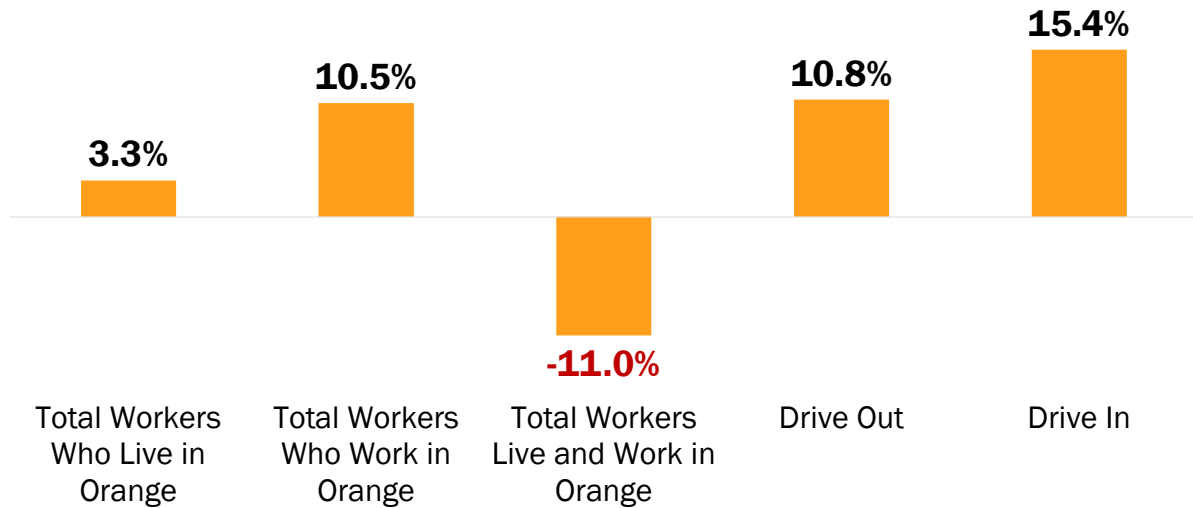

Change from 2012 to 2022

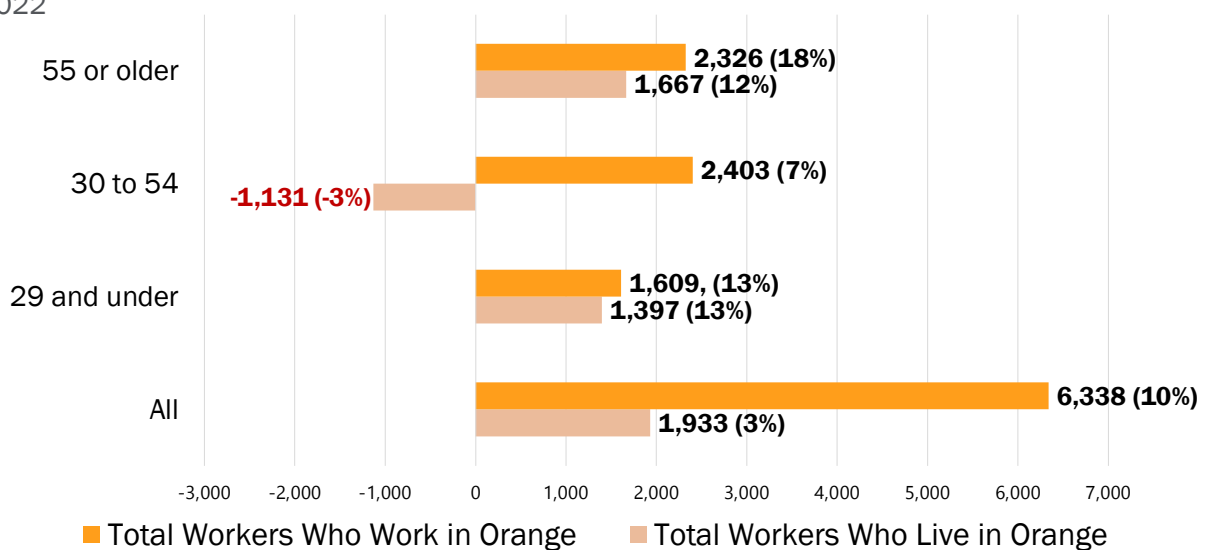

Change in number of workers living and working in Orange County, by age band, between 2012 and 2022

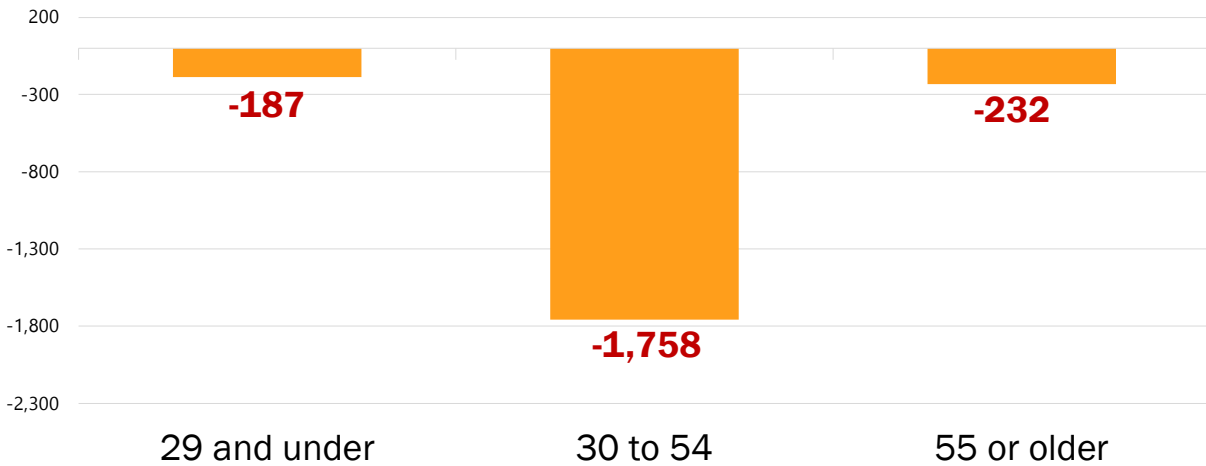

Components of the 2,177 fewer workers who live and work in Orange County between 2012 and 2022

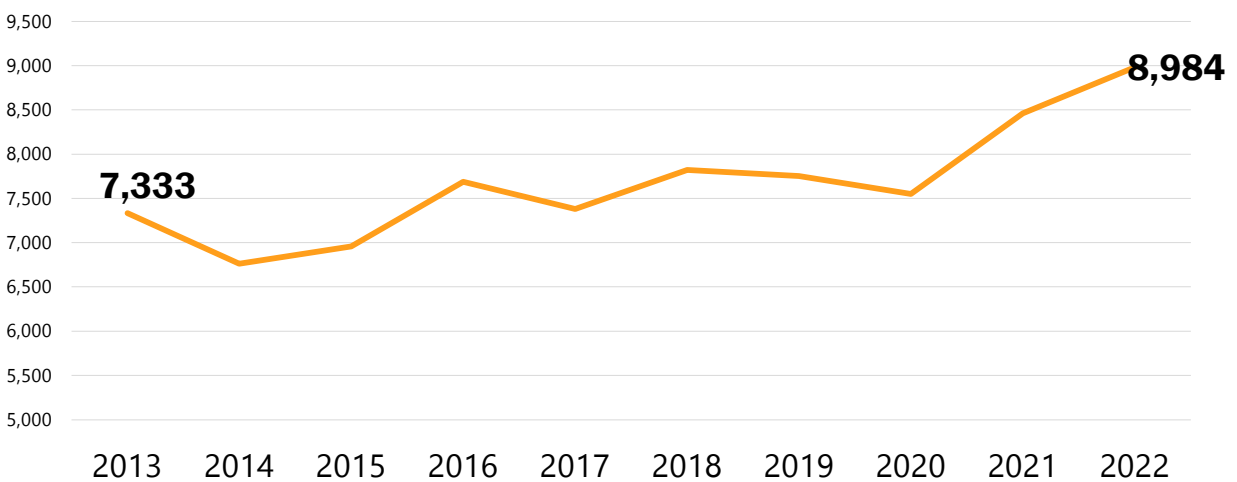

Number of young Orange County workers (<29 years old) who drive out to work

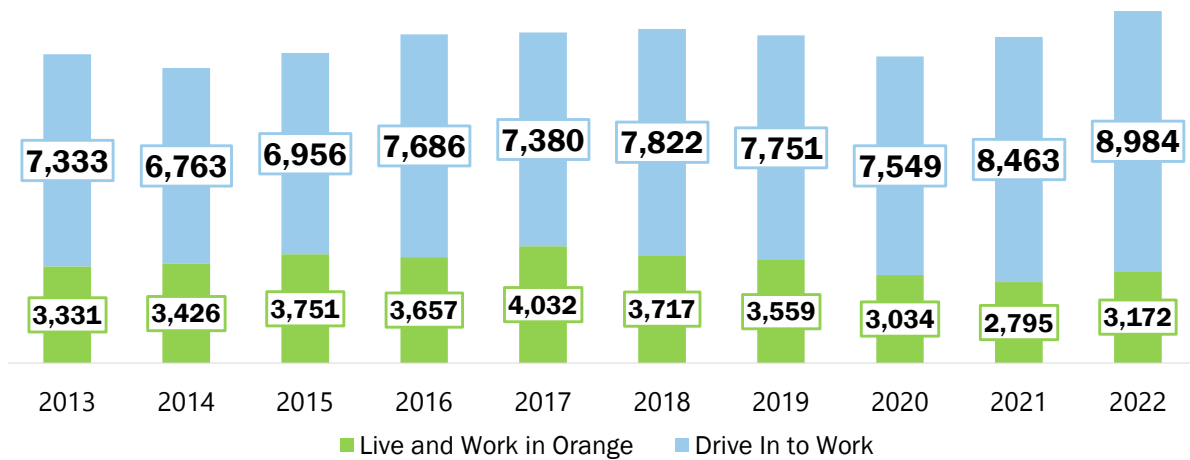

Number of young workers (<29 years old) living and working in Orange County

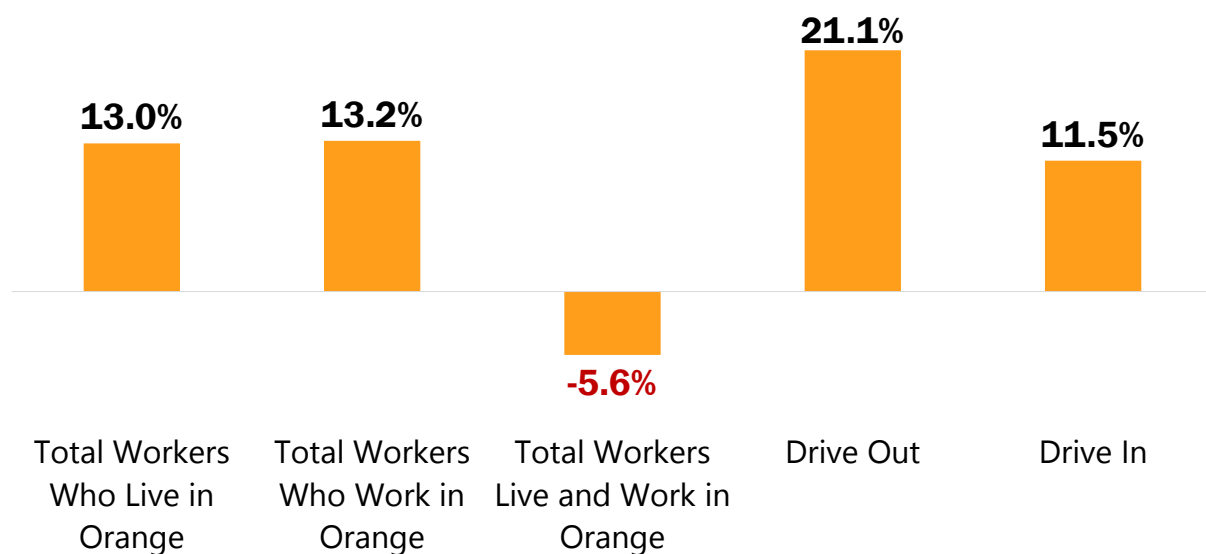

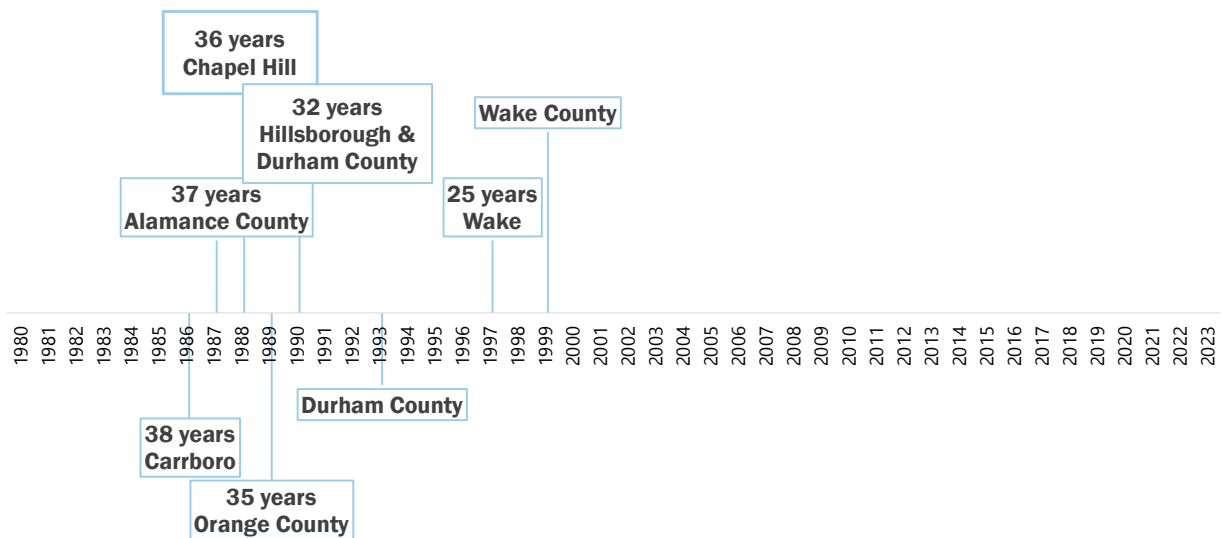

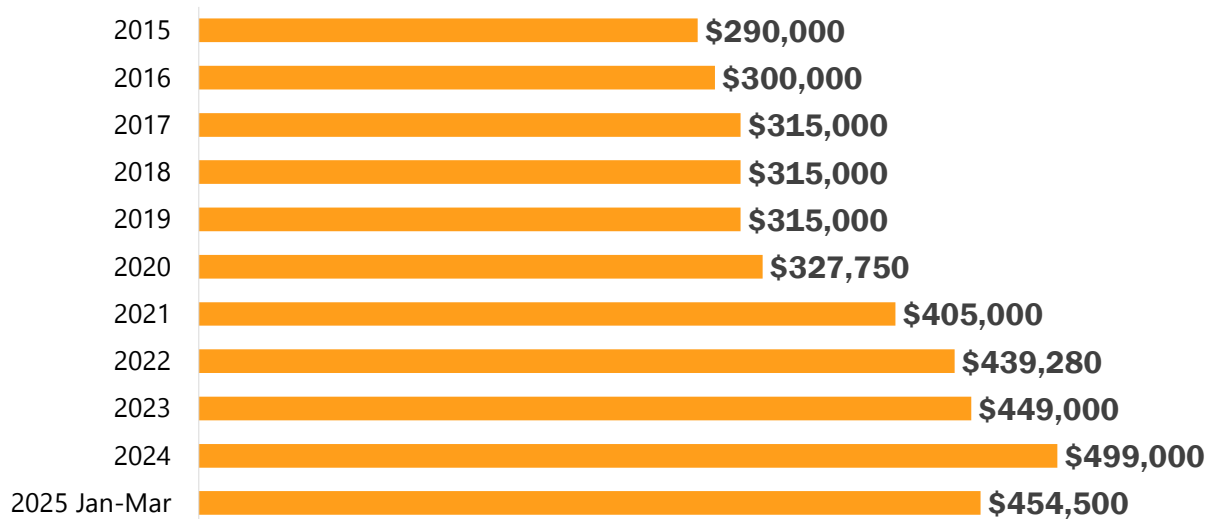

Orange County median home sales price, 2015 to March 2025

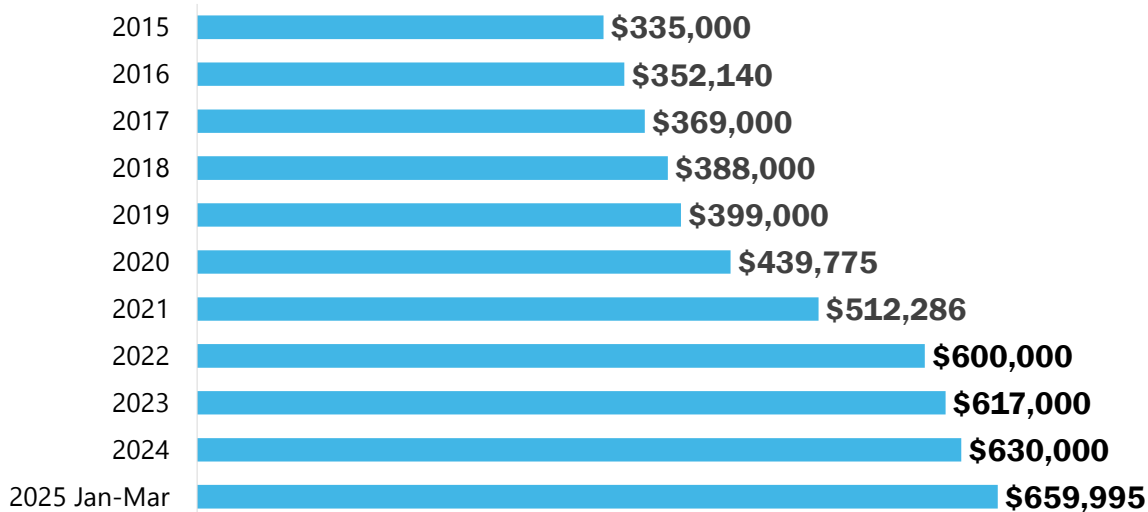

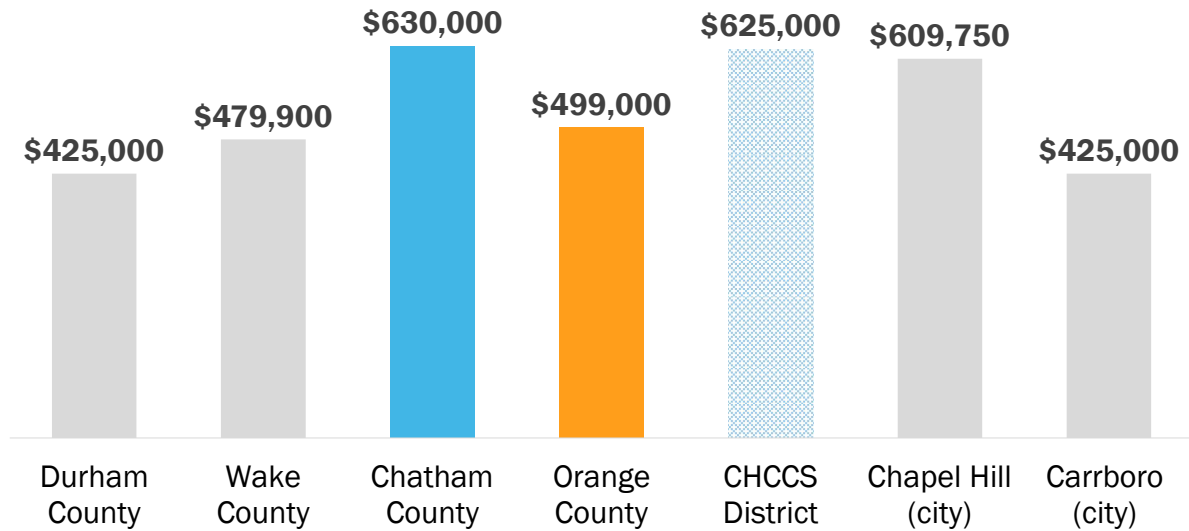
Chatham County median home sales price, 2015 to March 2025

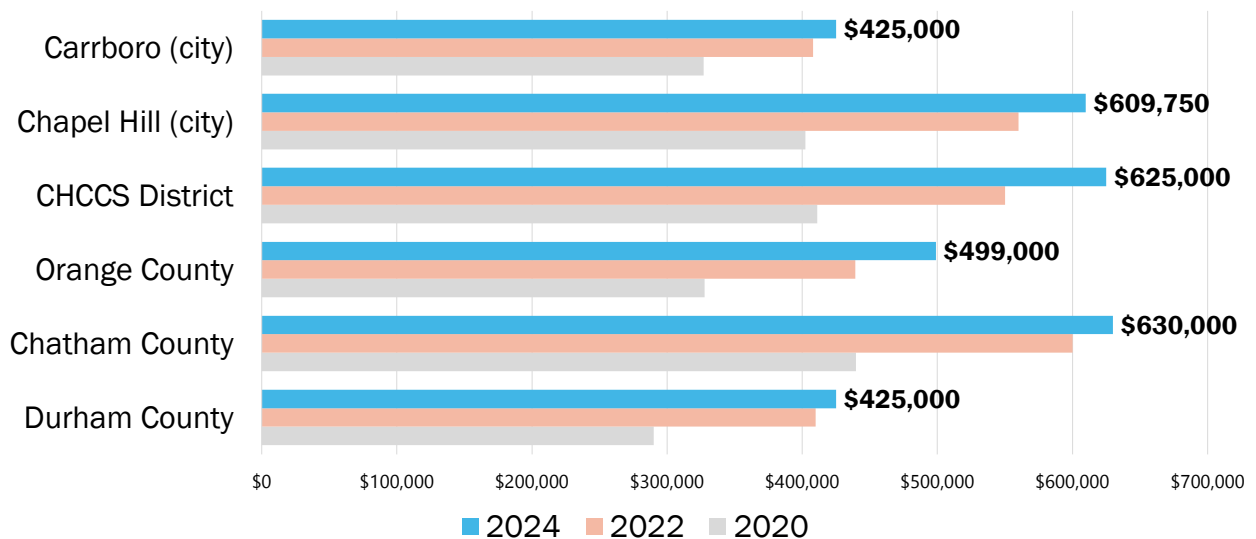

Median residential closing price (2020 vs 2022 vs 2024)

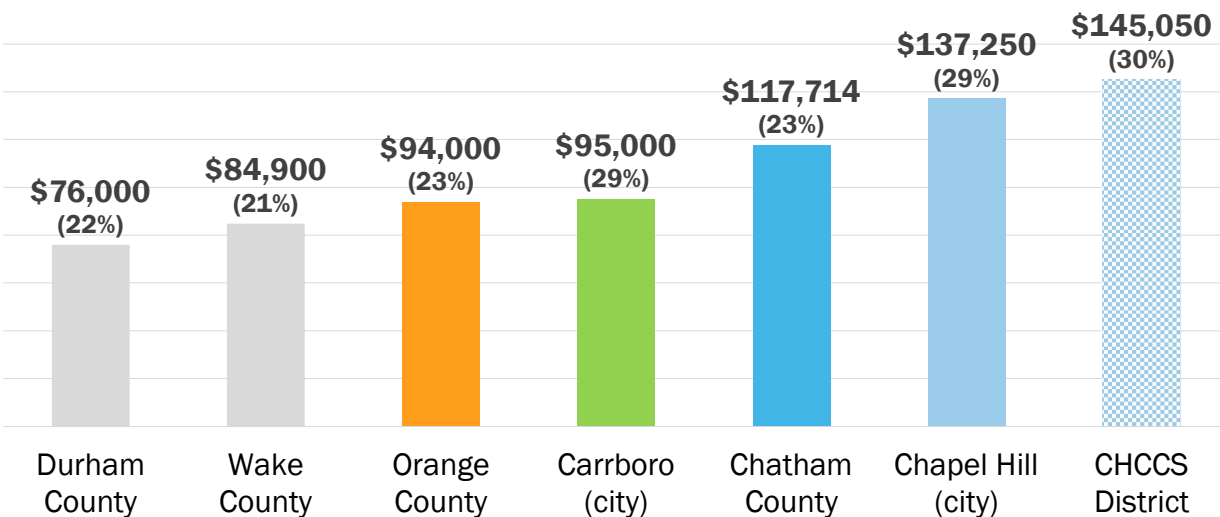

Change in median home sale price and percent change

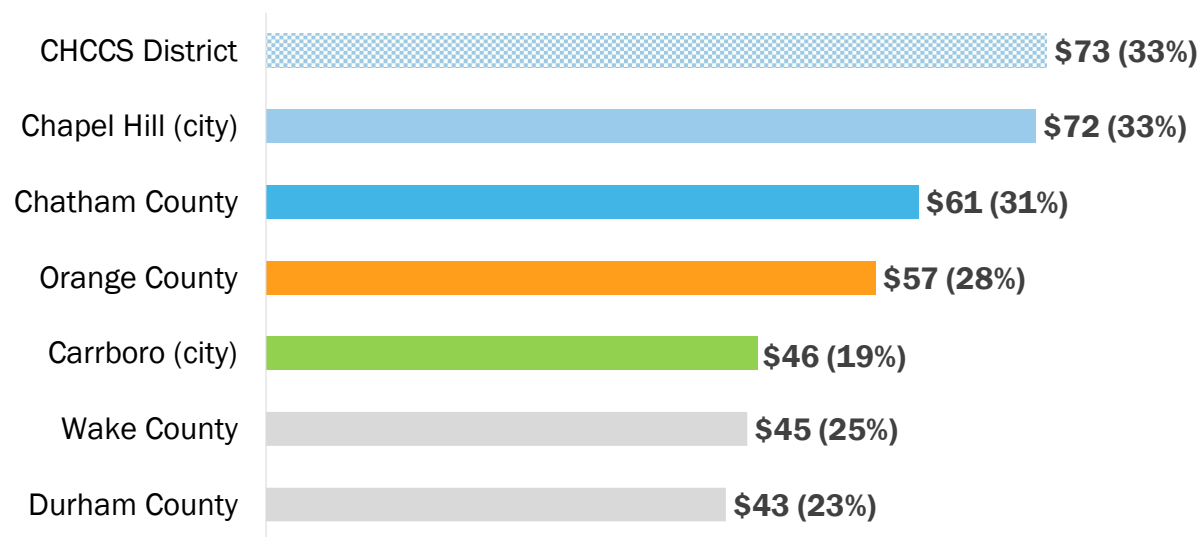

Change in median home sale price per square foot, 2021 vs 2024

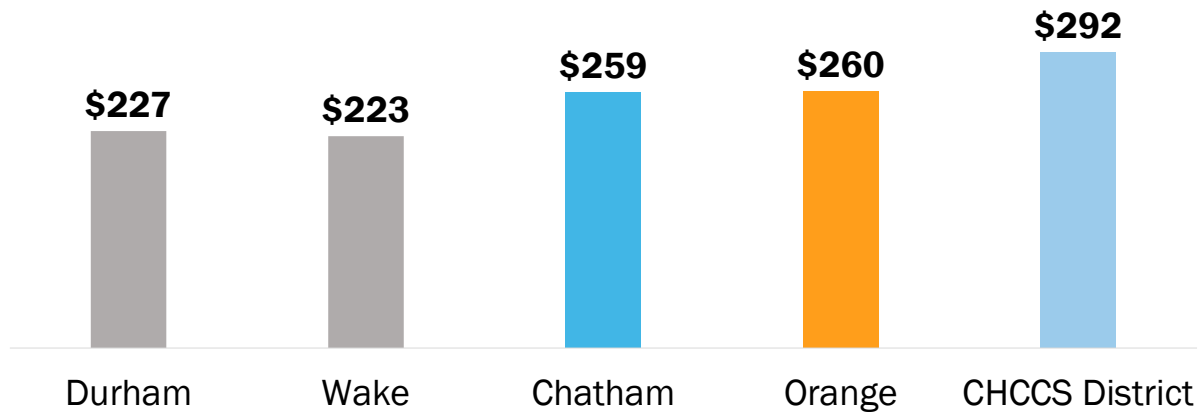

Residential Sales Price Per Square Foot, Q1 2025

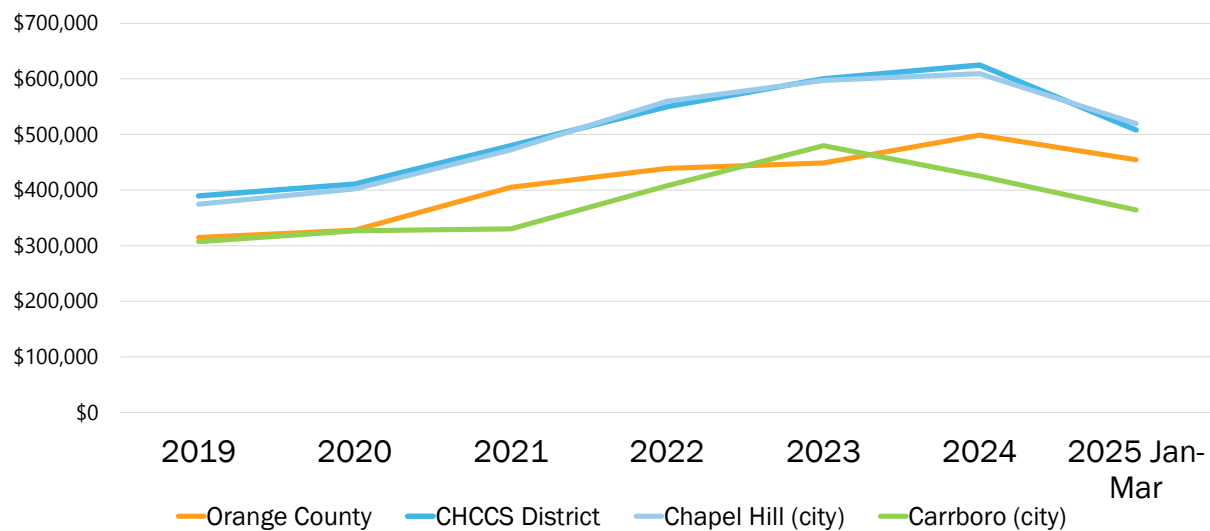
Median residential sales price per square foot

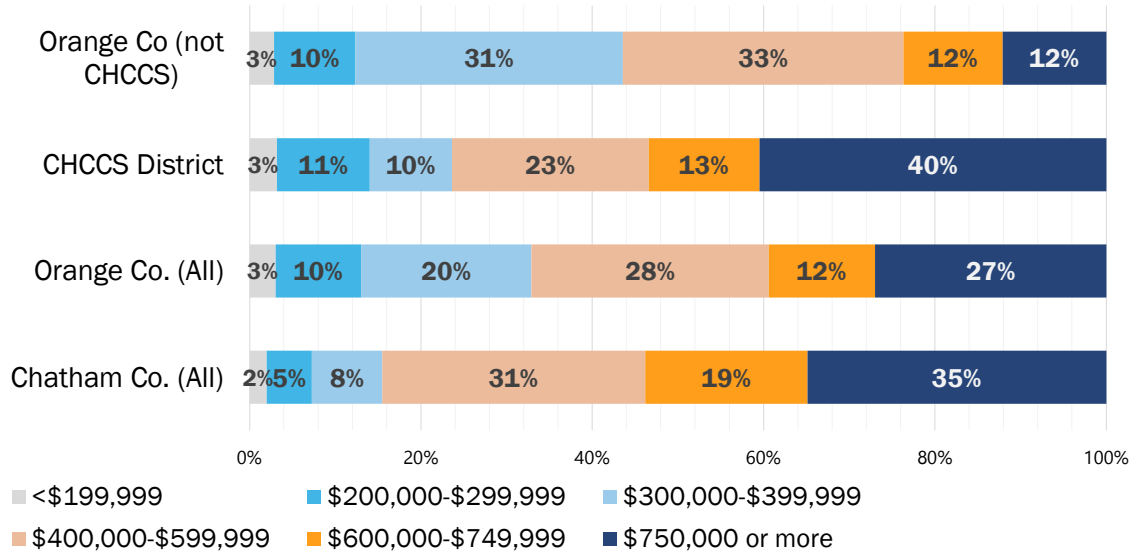

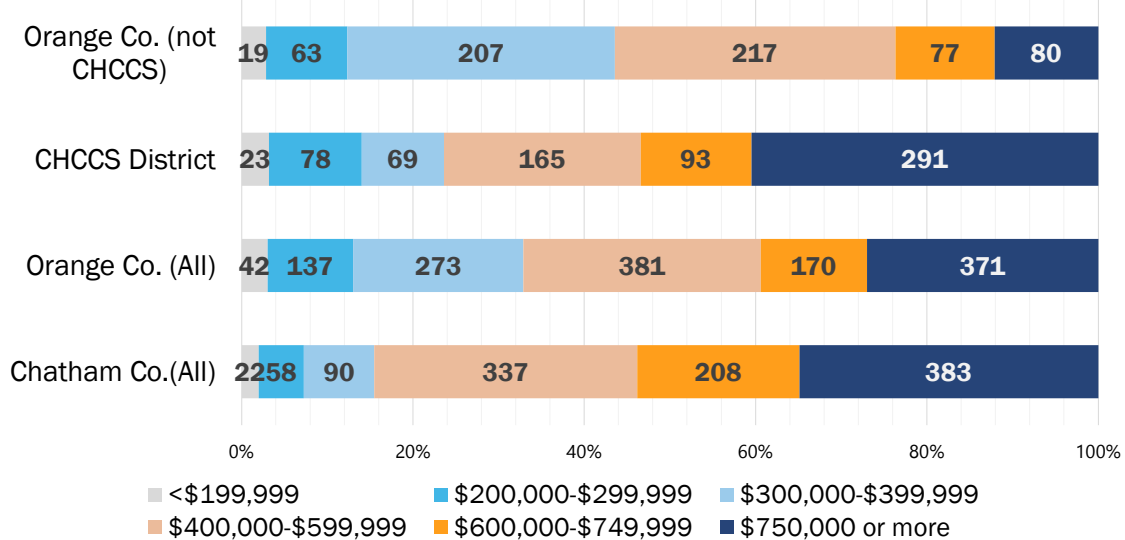
Share of 1,374 Orange and 1,098 Chatham home transactions by closing price

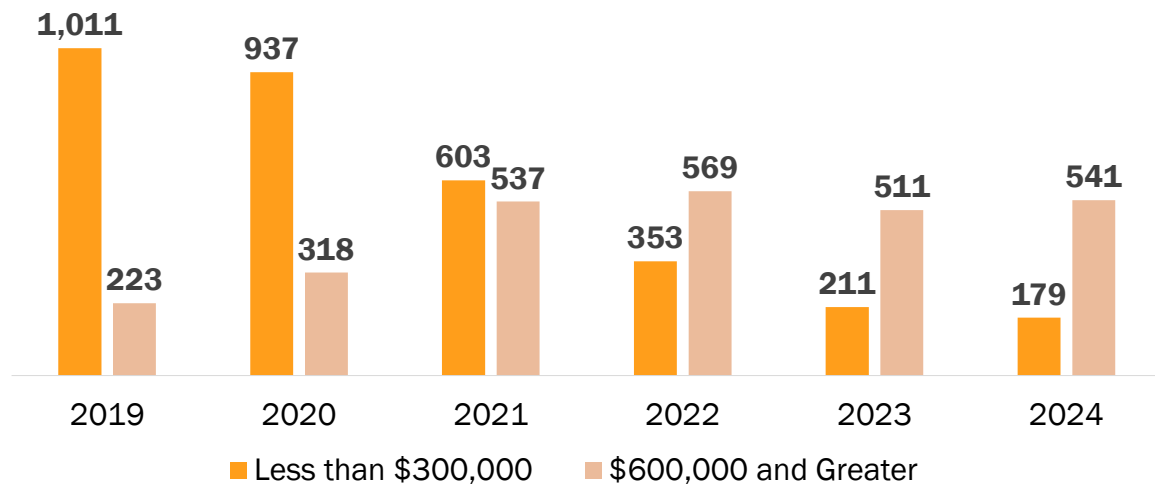

Number of home transactions by closing price range 2019 to 2024

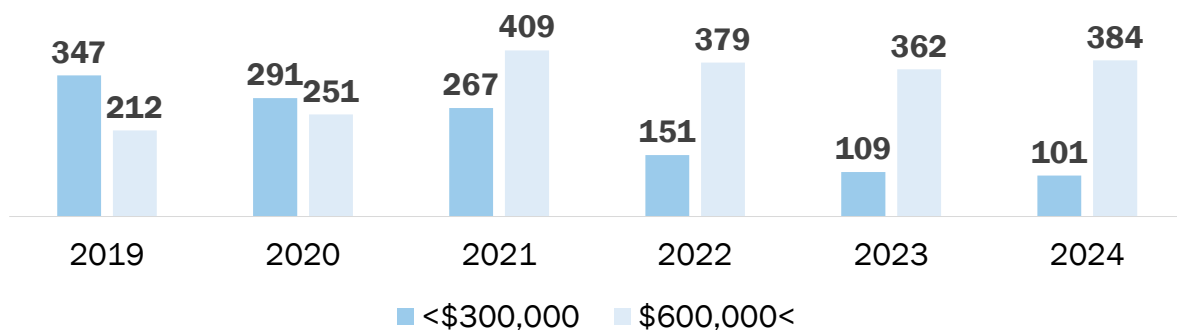

CHCCS District Median Home Price Shift

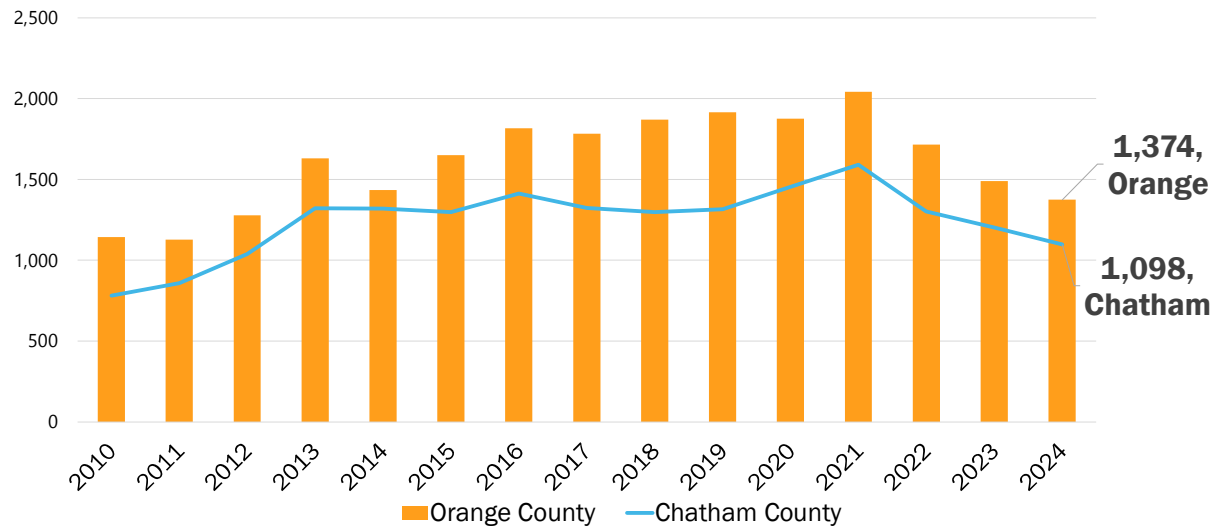
Number of home transactions by closing price range for 2019 through 2024

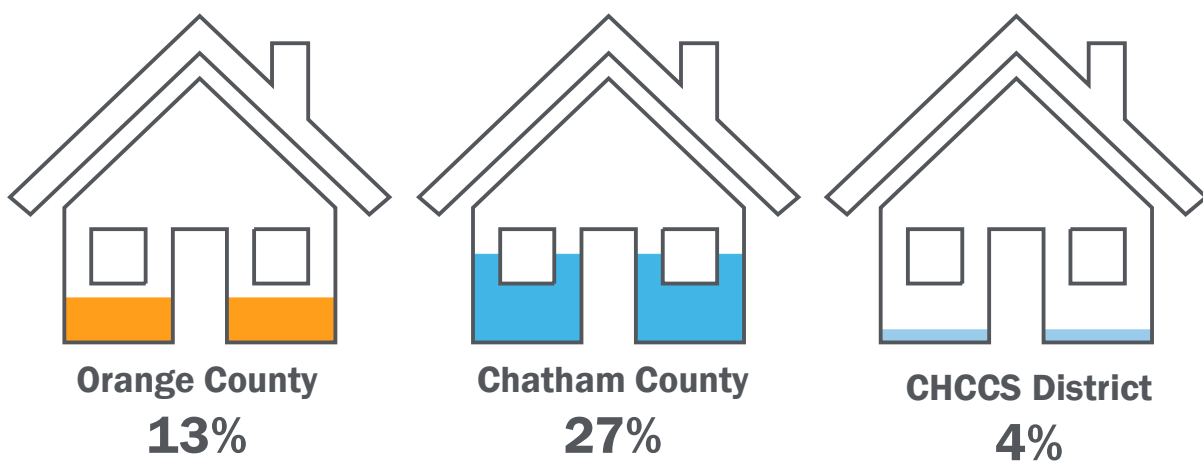

New housing units as percent of total sales, 2024

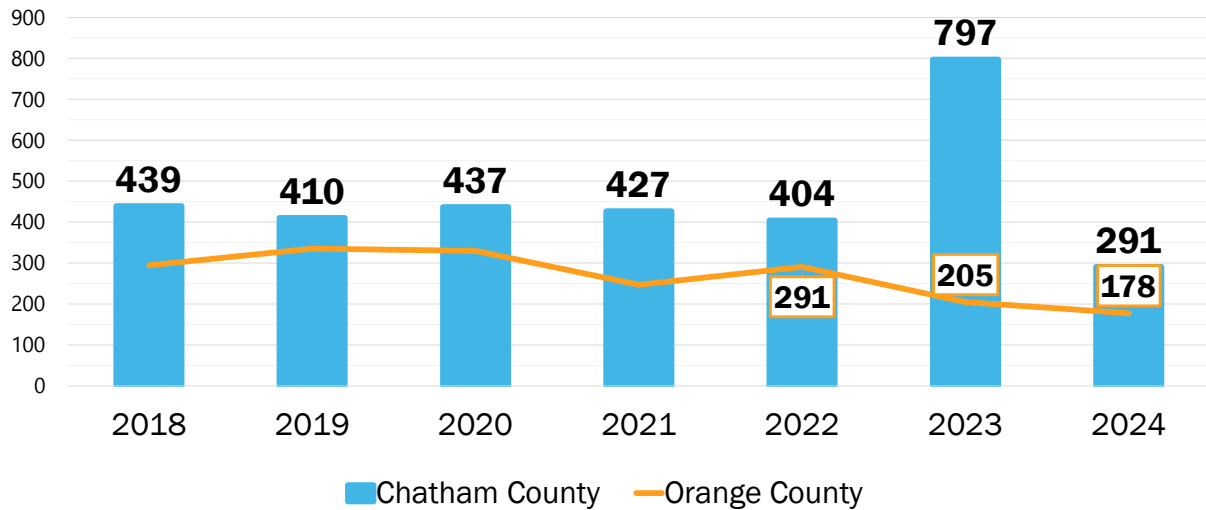

Total new construction home sales per year

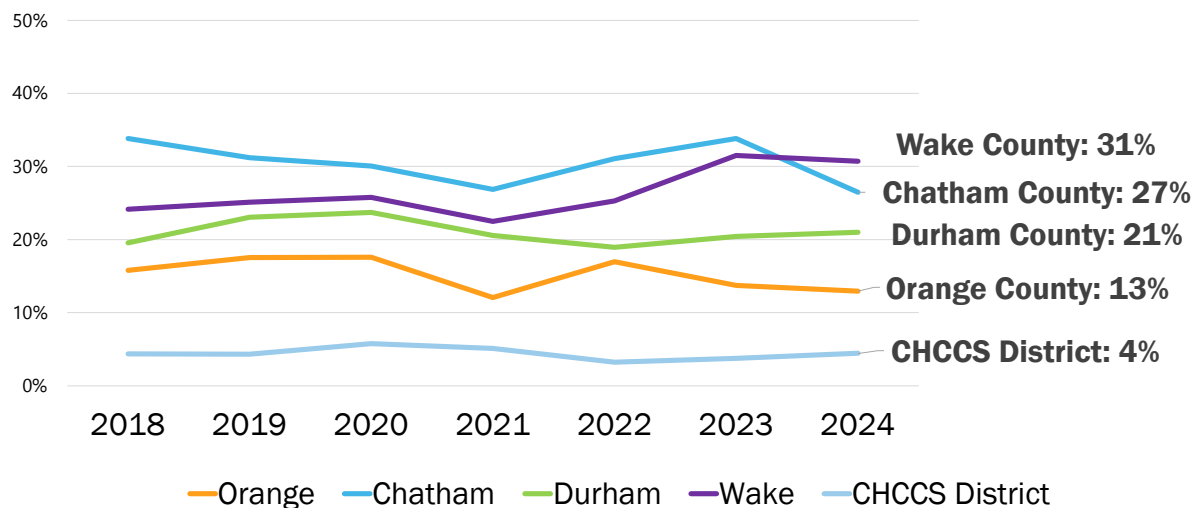

2018 to 2024

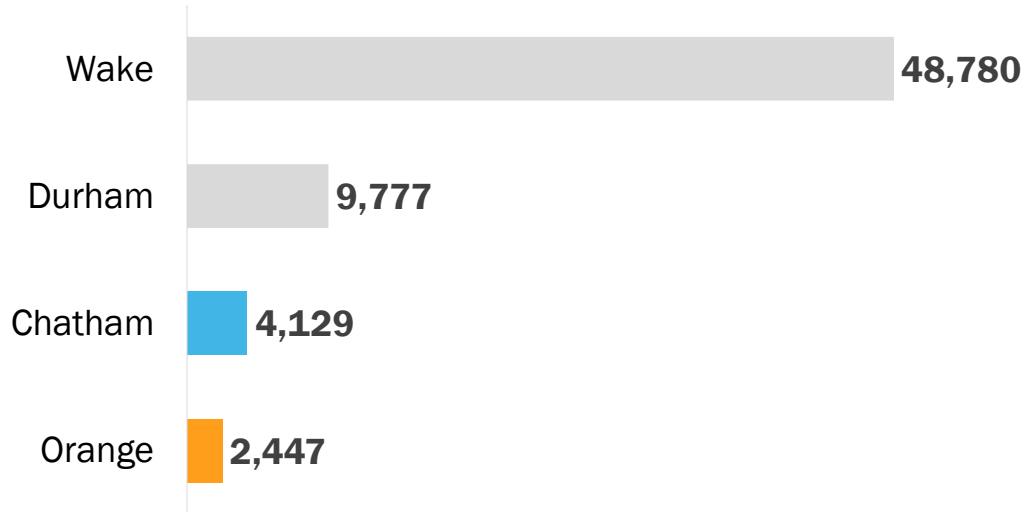

Number of new for-sale housing units built in the last 10 years (2015 to 2024)

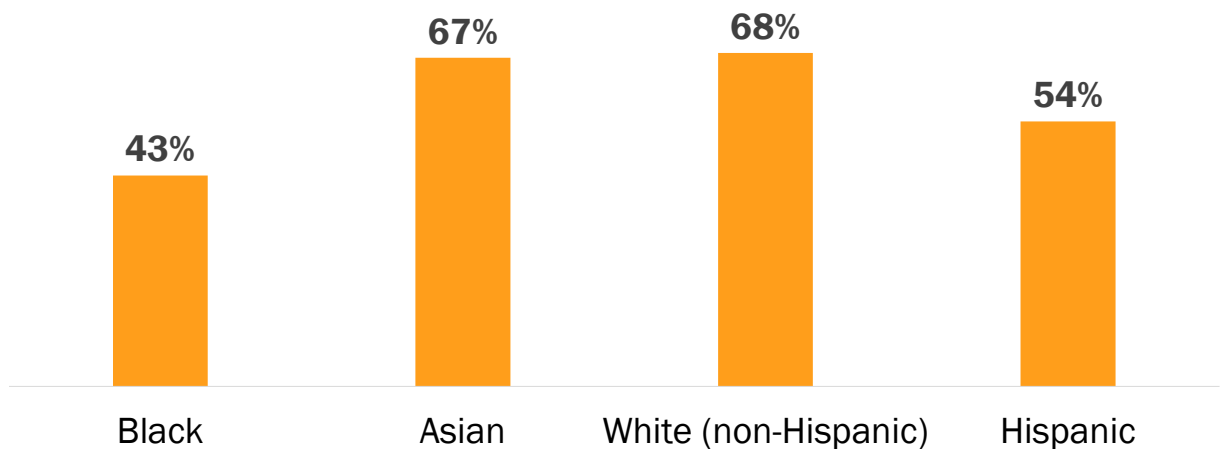

Percent of households living in owner-occupied housing by race/ethnicity. Race is determined by Head of Household.

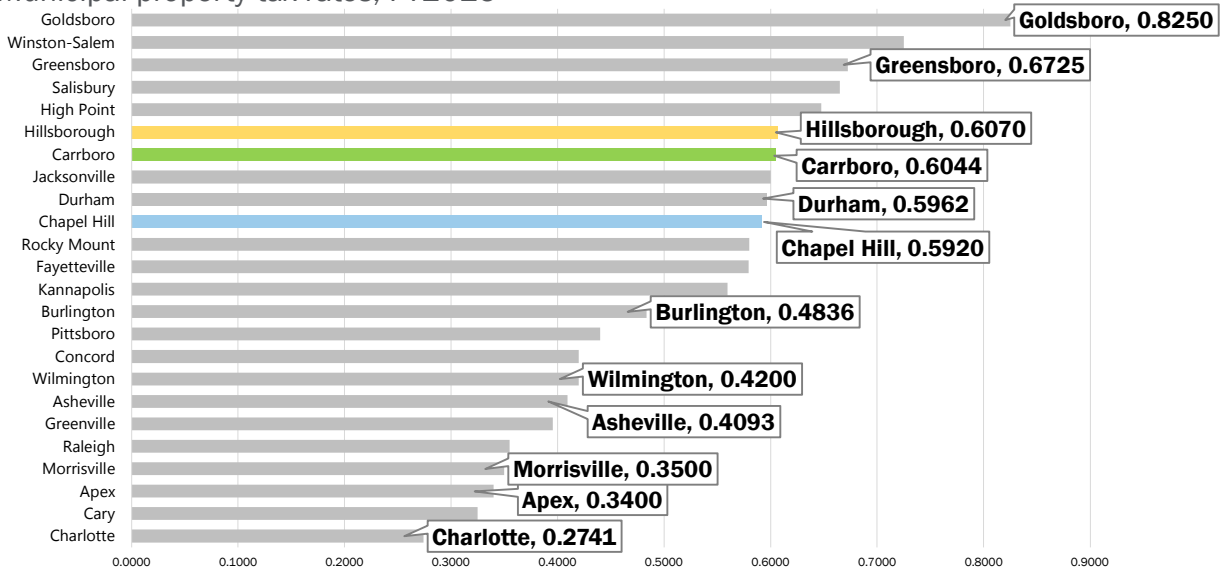

Municipal property tax rates, FY2025

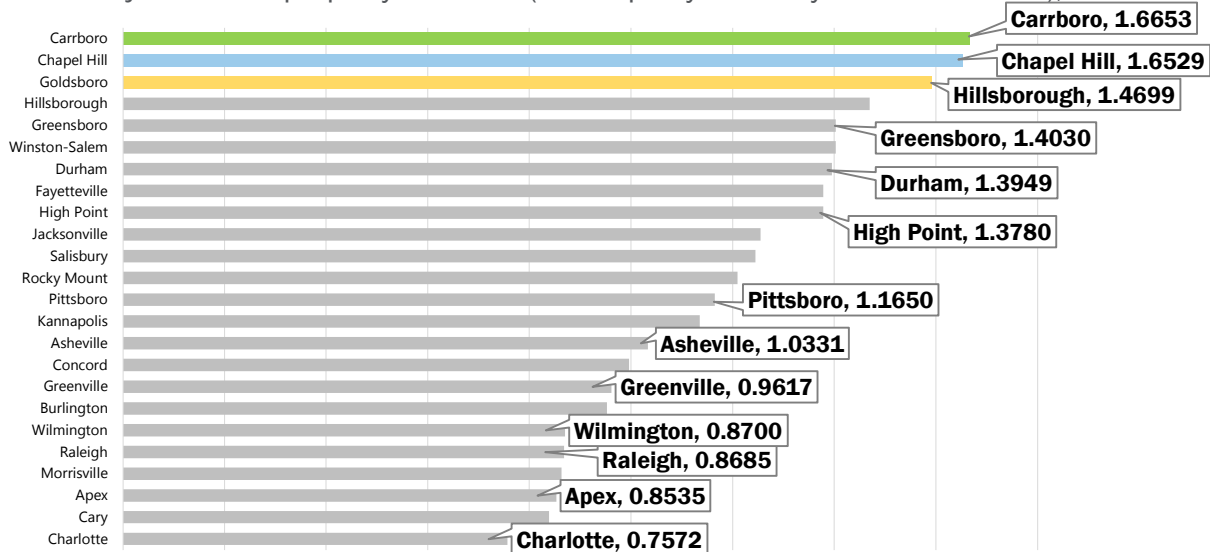

Combined jurisdiction property tax rates (municipality + county + school district), FY2025

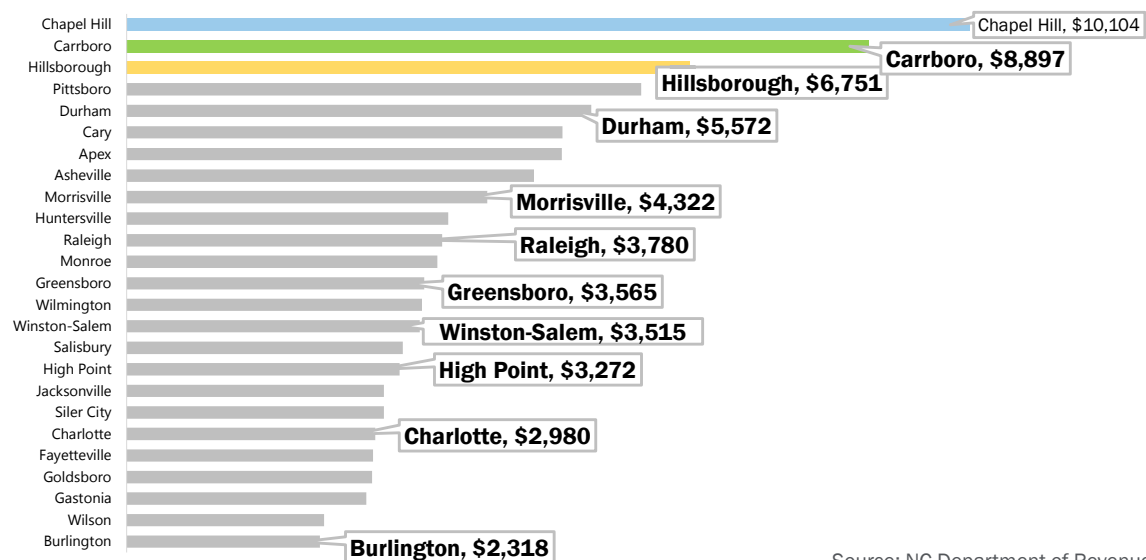

Combined local property tax rates (FY2024) assessed on local median home value, Feb 2025

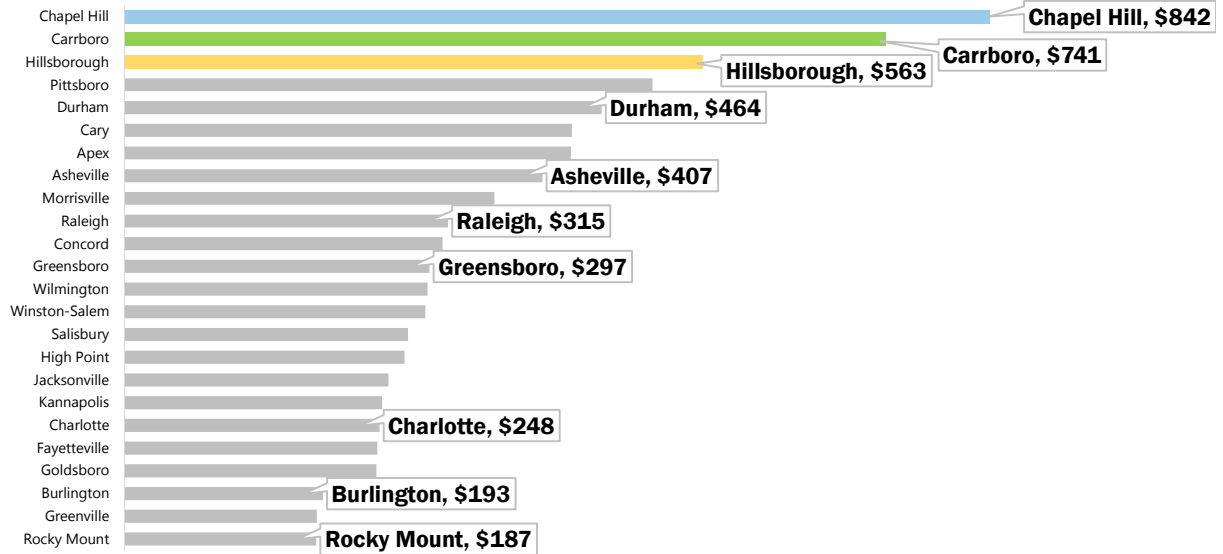

Combined local property tax rates (FY2024) assessed on local median home value, Feb 2025

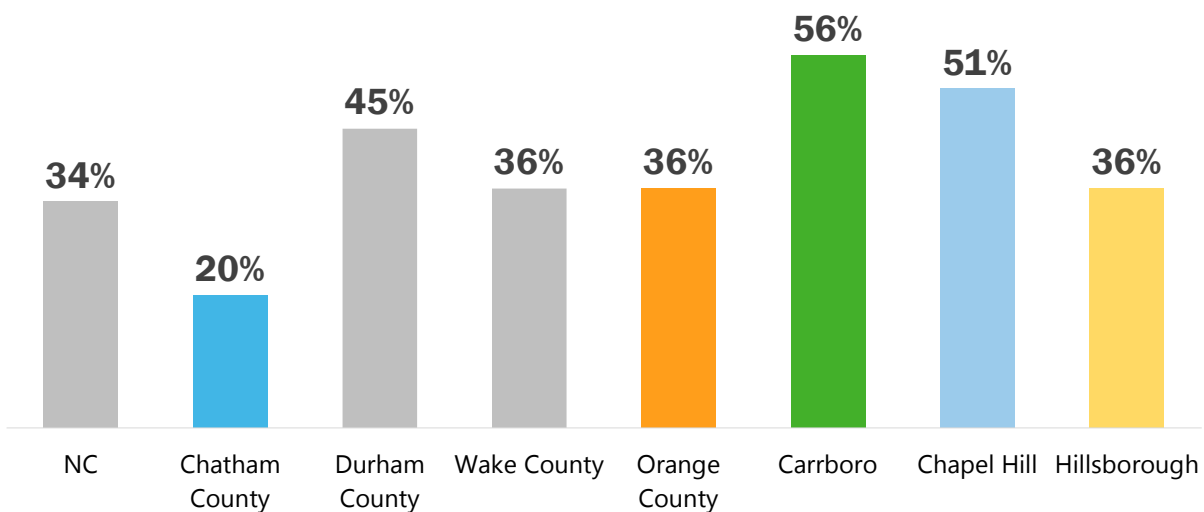

Share of renter-occupied households 2023

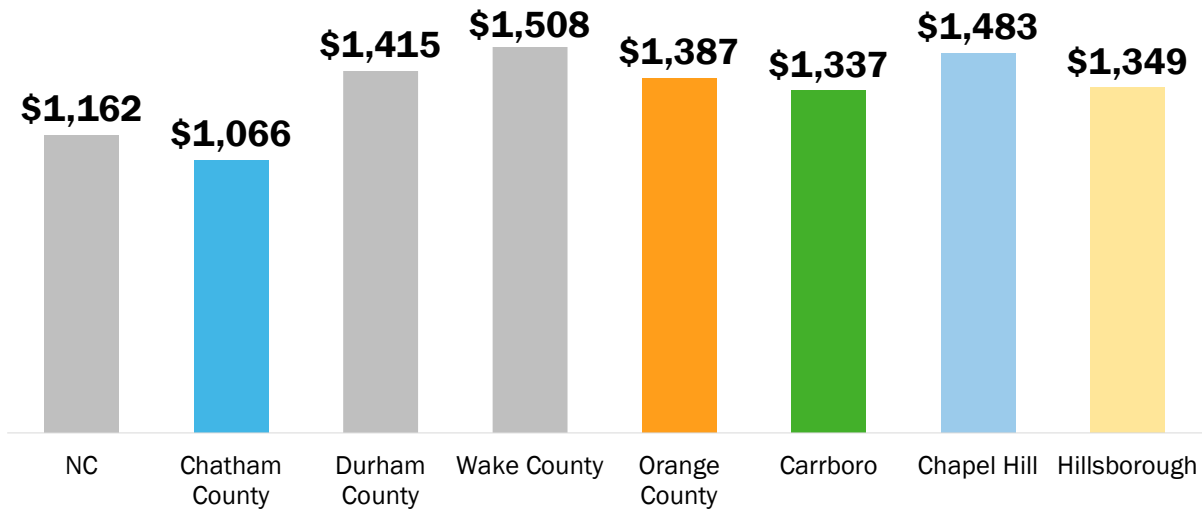

Median rent estimated by the American Community Survey, 2023

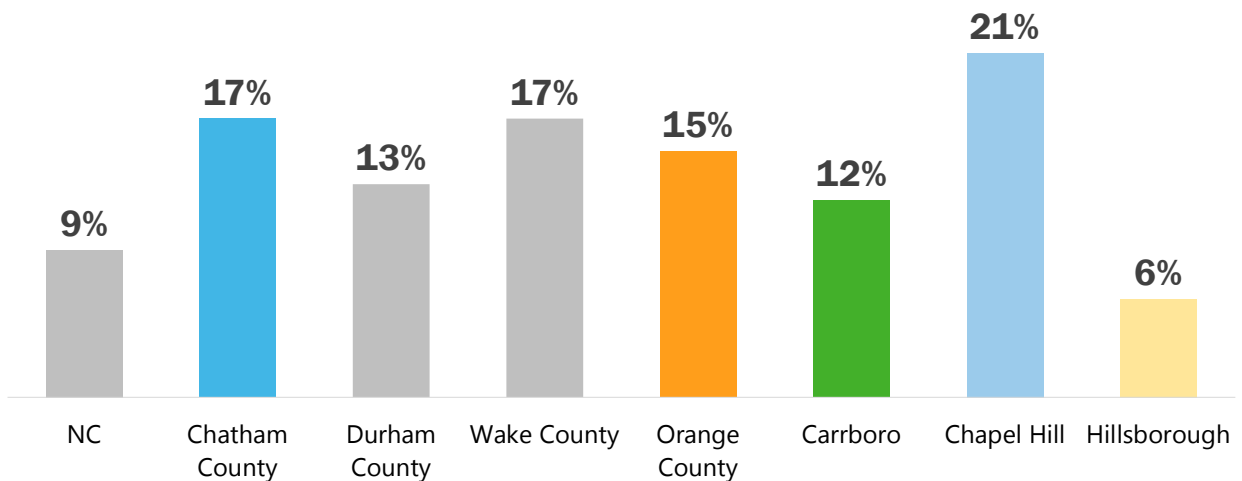

Percentage of renters paying more than \$2,000 per month in rent, 2023

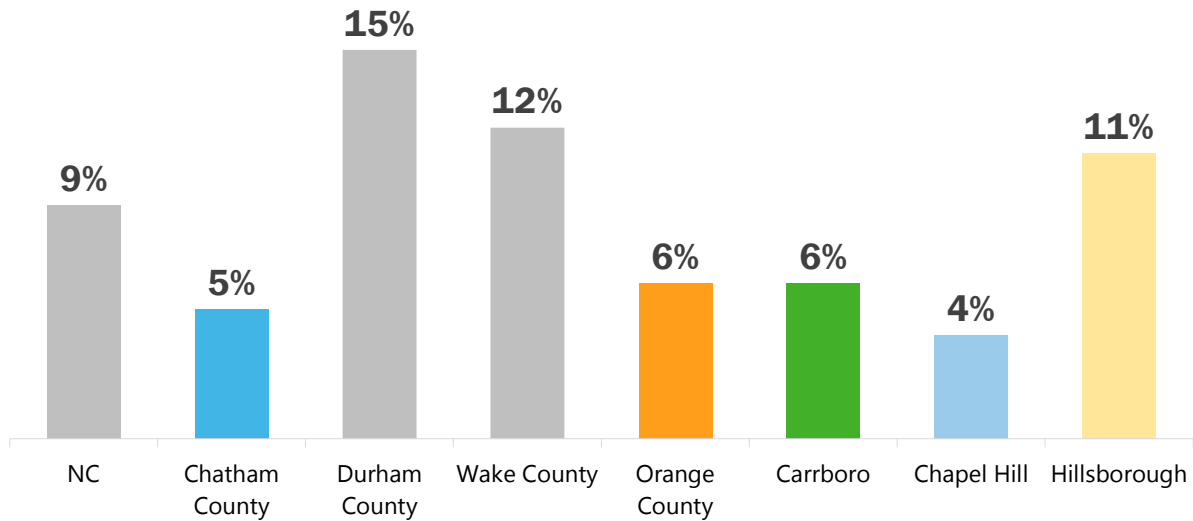

Change in median rent between 2018 and 2023 ACS five-year estimates

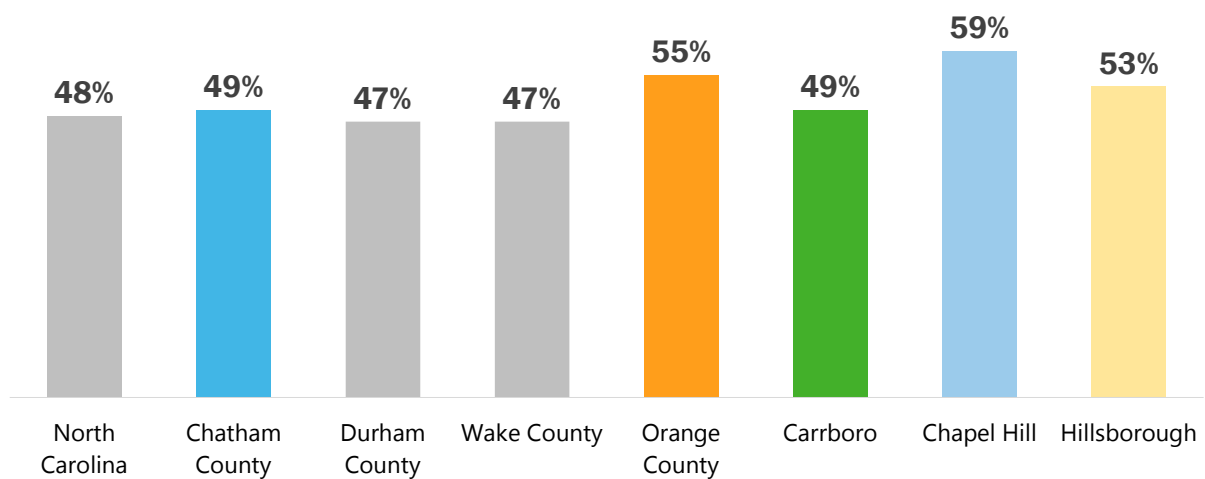

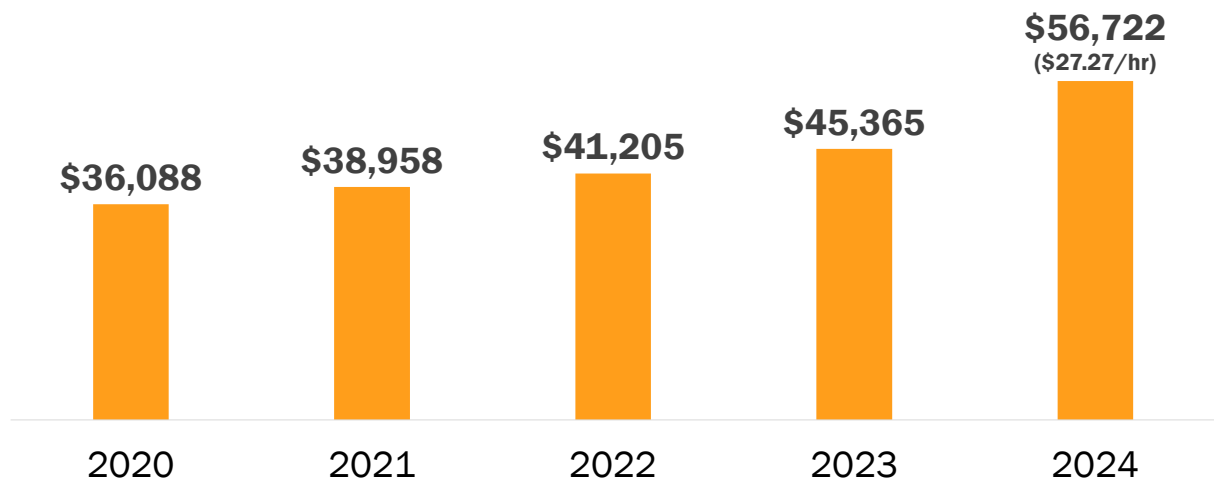

Annual Income needed to afford a 1- bedroom rental in Orange County and not spend more than 30% of your income on housing (Housing Wage)

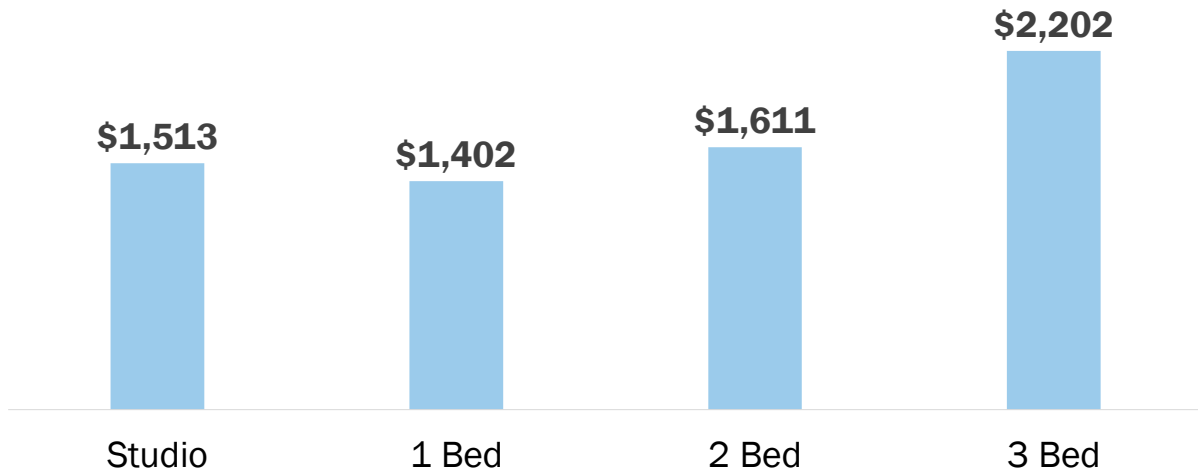

Chapel Hill-Carrboro multifamily average asking rent, Q1 2025

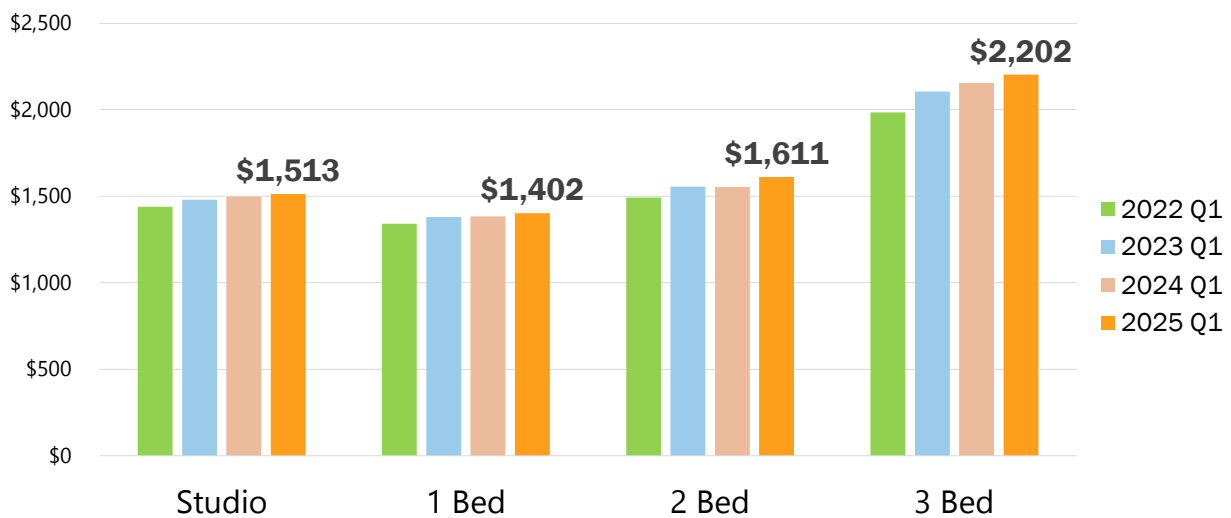

By unit size, Q1 2022, Q1 2023, Q1 2024, and Q1 2025

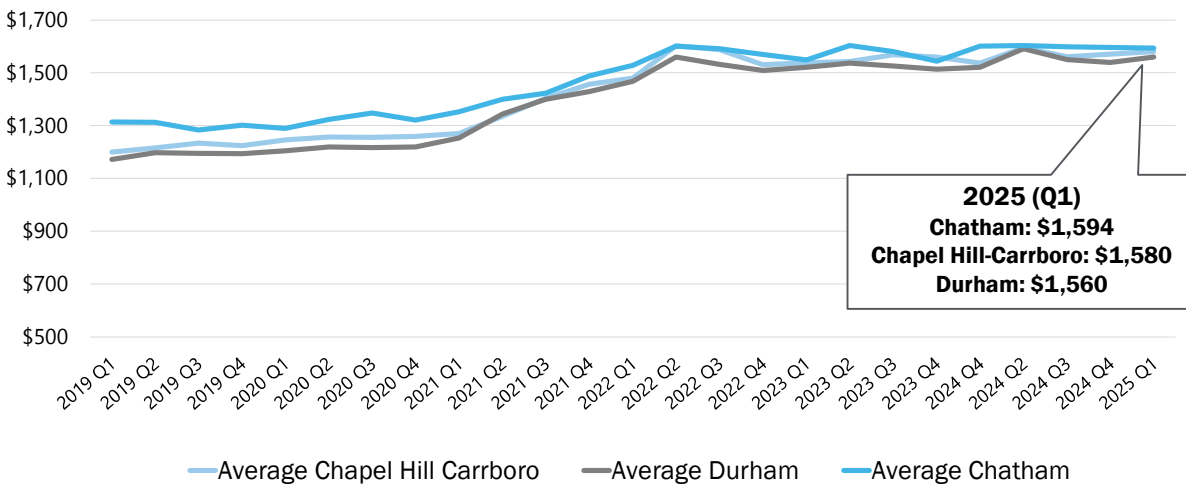

Average multifamily asking rent in Chatham, Chapel Hill-Carrboro, and Durham

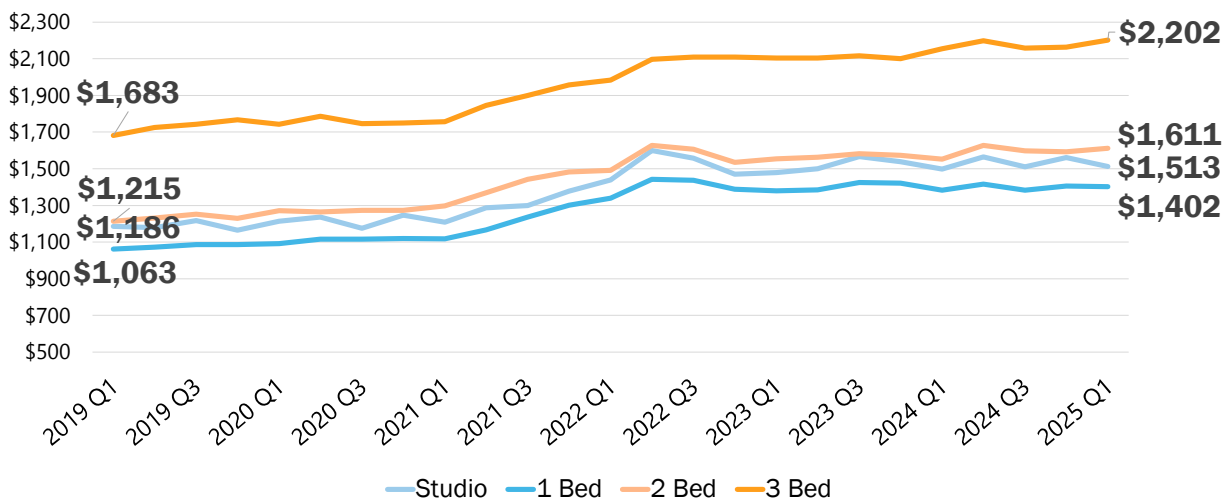

Multifamily asking rent in Chapel Hill-Carrboro by type of unit Q1 2019 – Q1 2025

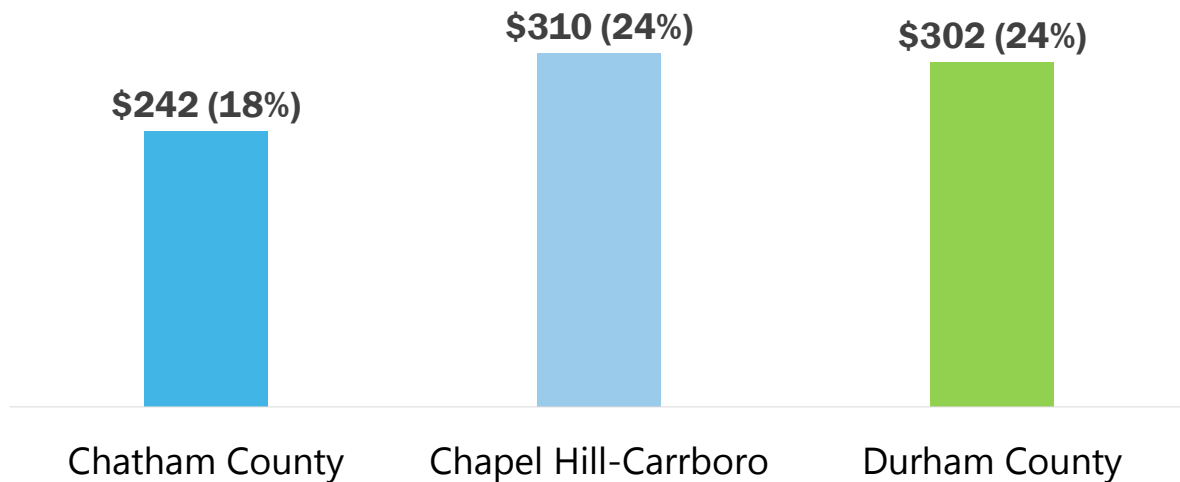

Change in multifamily average annual rent between Q1 2021 and Q1 2025

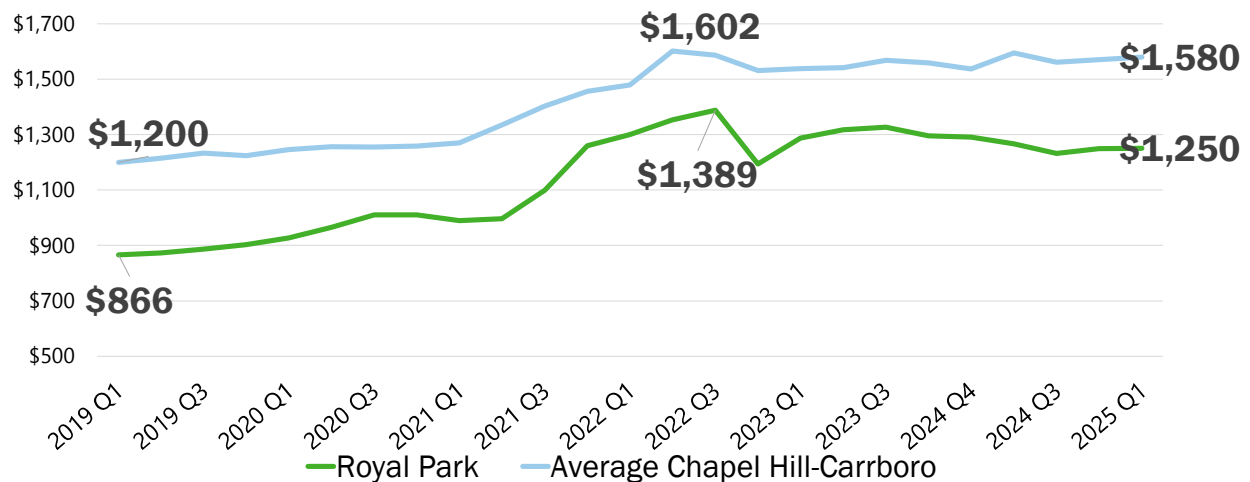

Change in average asking rent Q1 2019 through Q1 2025

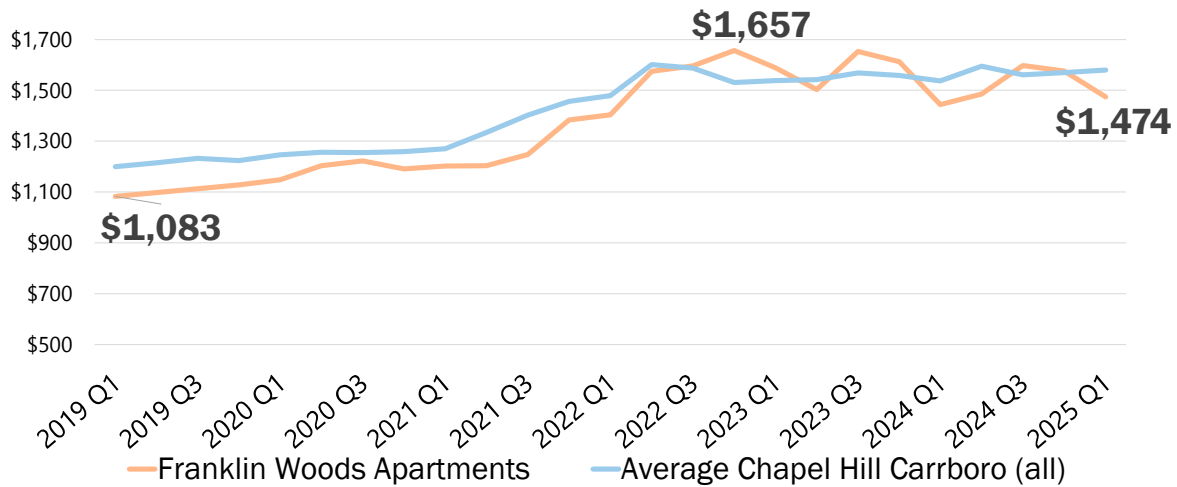

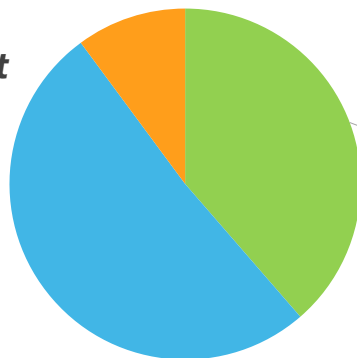

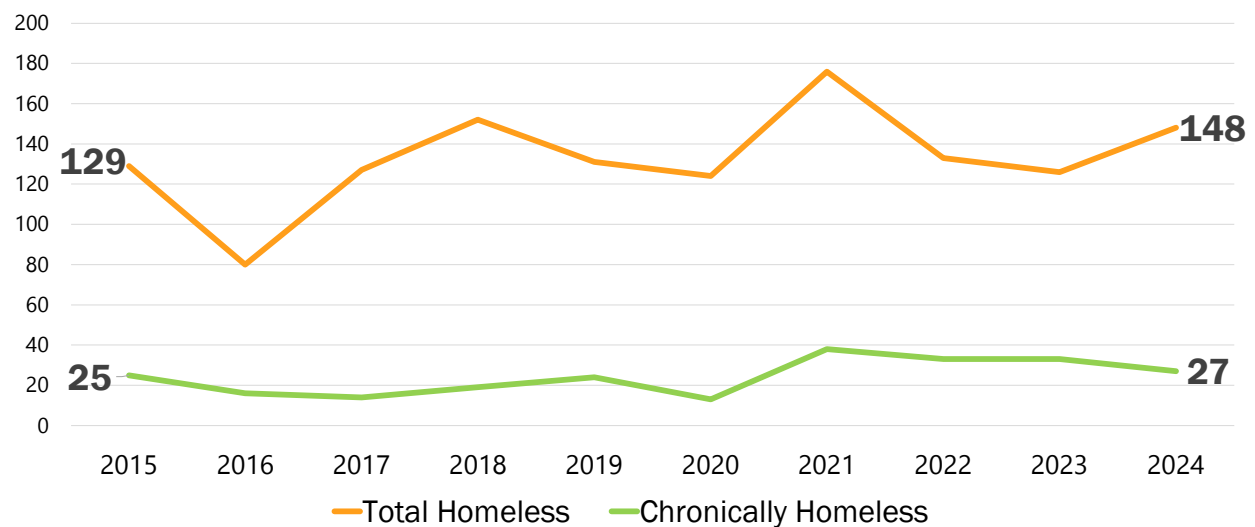

Annual number of individuals experiencing homelessness identified in the Orange County's annual point-in-time count, 2015 to 2024

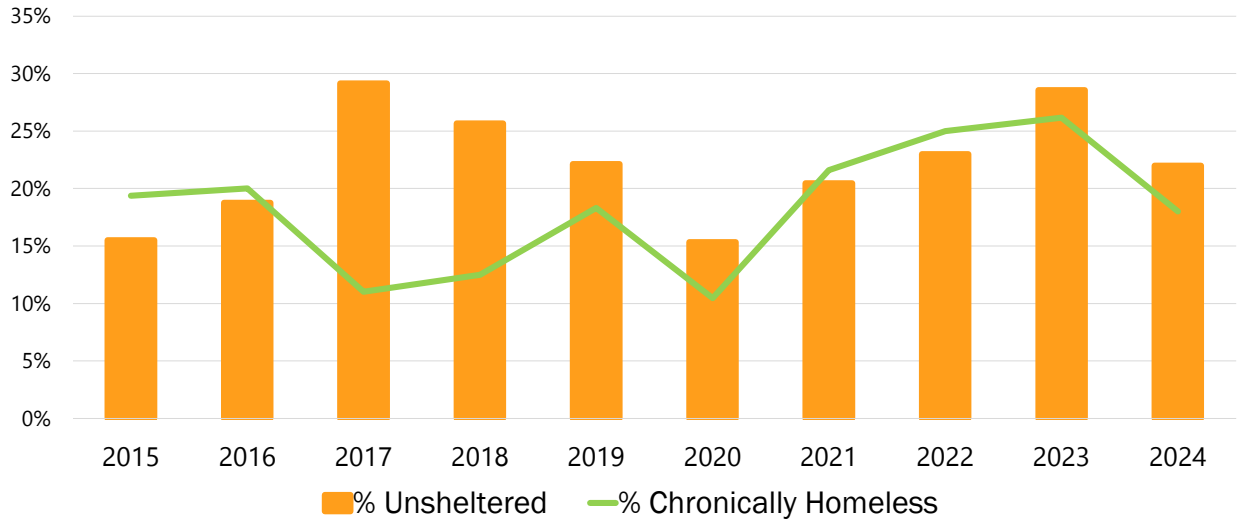

Annual number of individuals experiencing homelessness identified in the Orange County's annual point-in-time count, 2015 to 2024

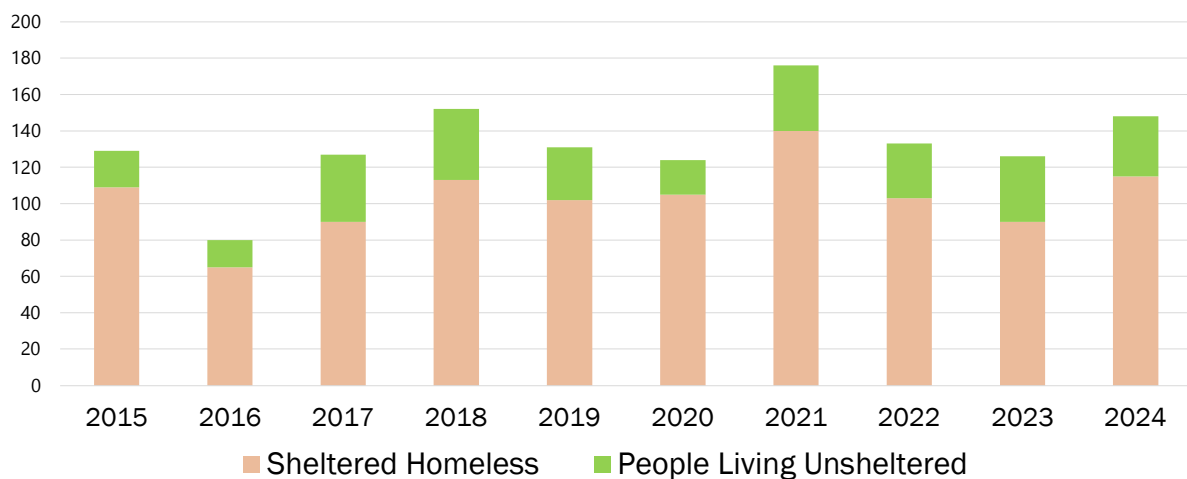

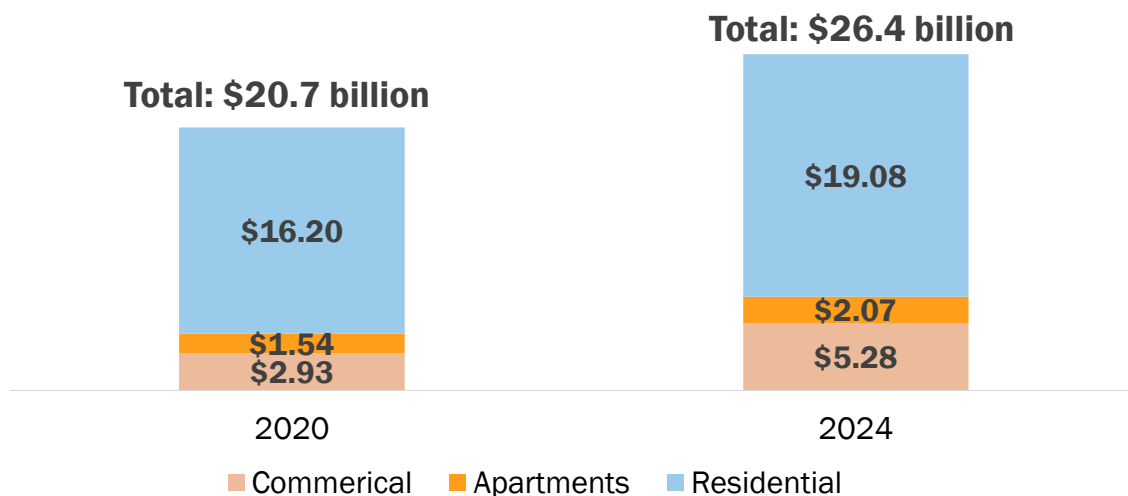

Assessed property value by sector (in billions), 2020 and 2024

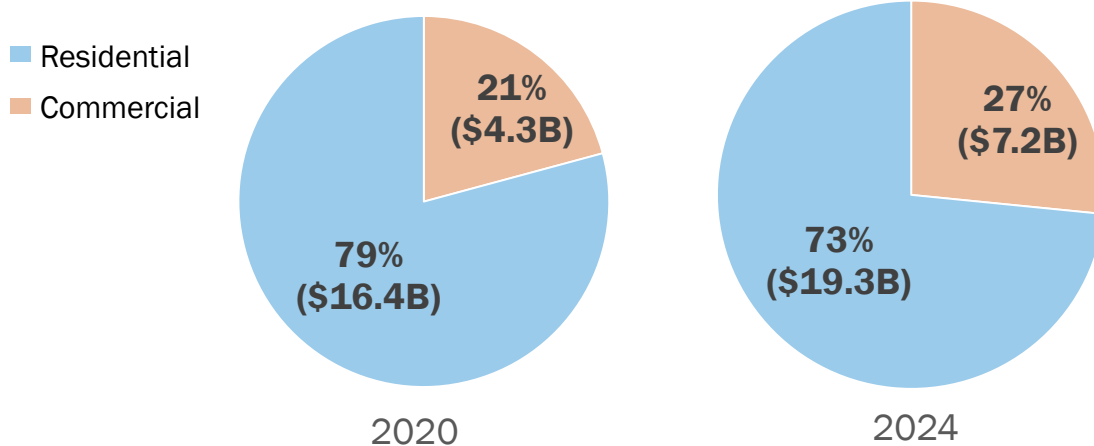

Percent of total assessed value (and value) of commercial and residential property in the jurisdiction



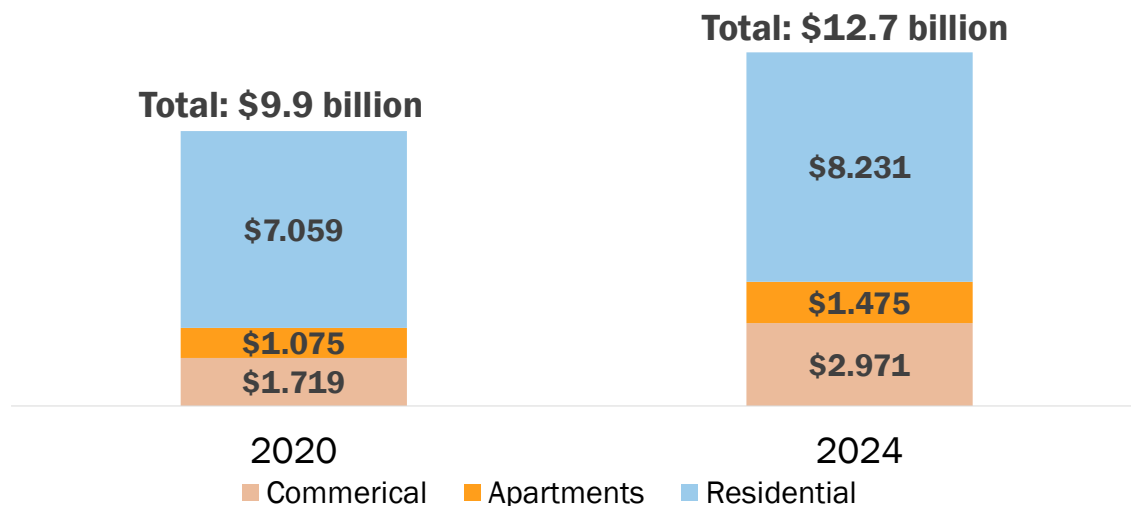

Assessed property value by sector (in billions), 2020 and 2024

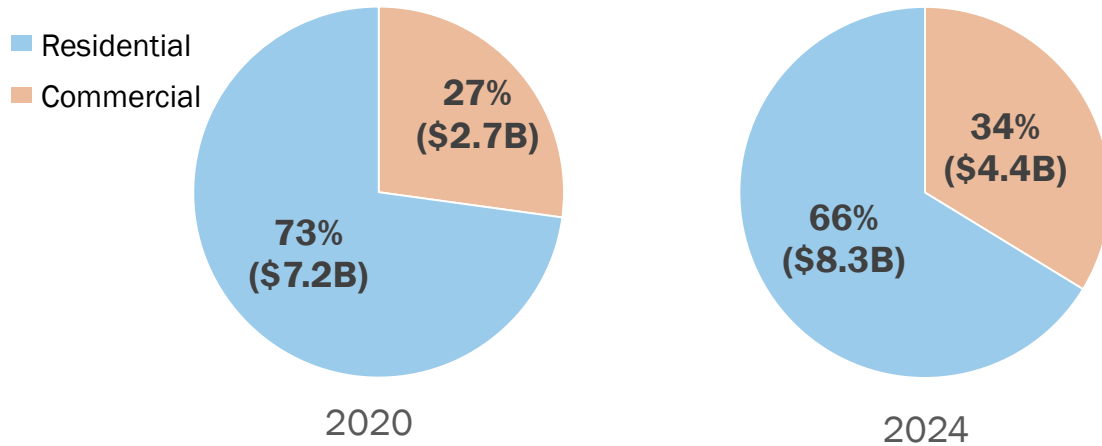

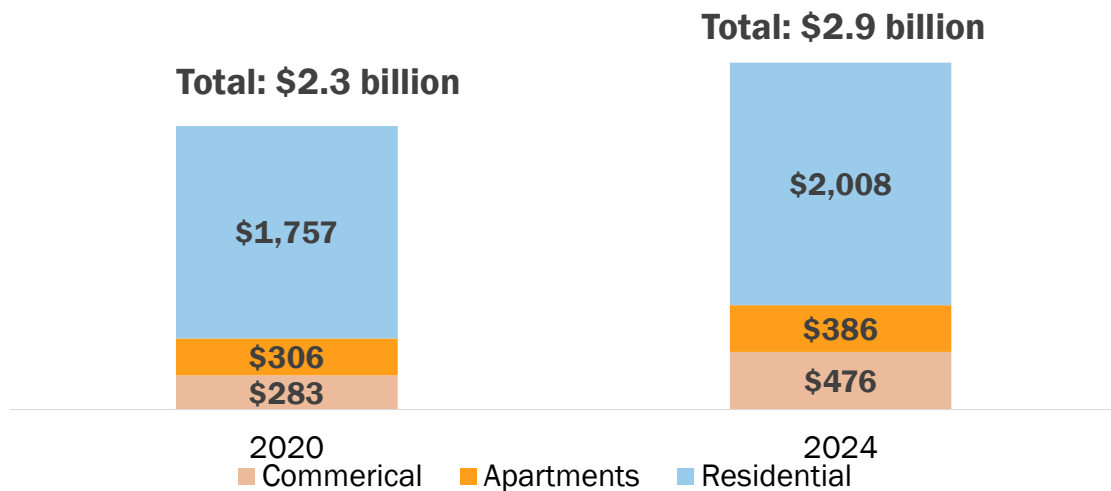

Assessed property value by sector (in millions), 2020 and 2024

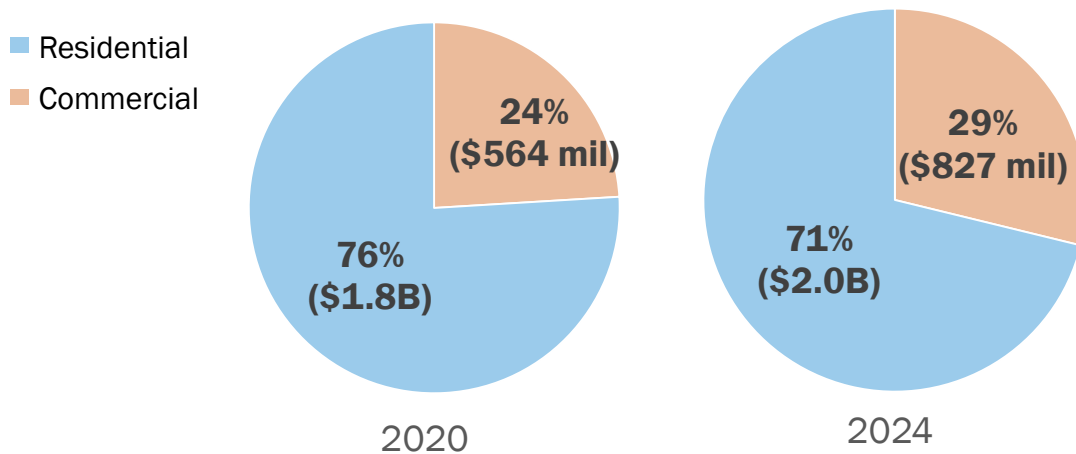

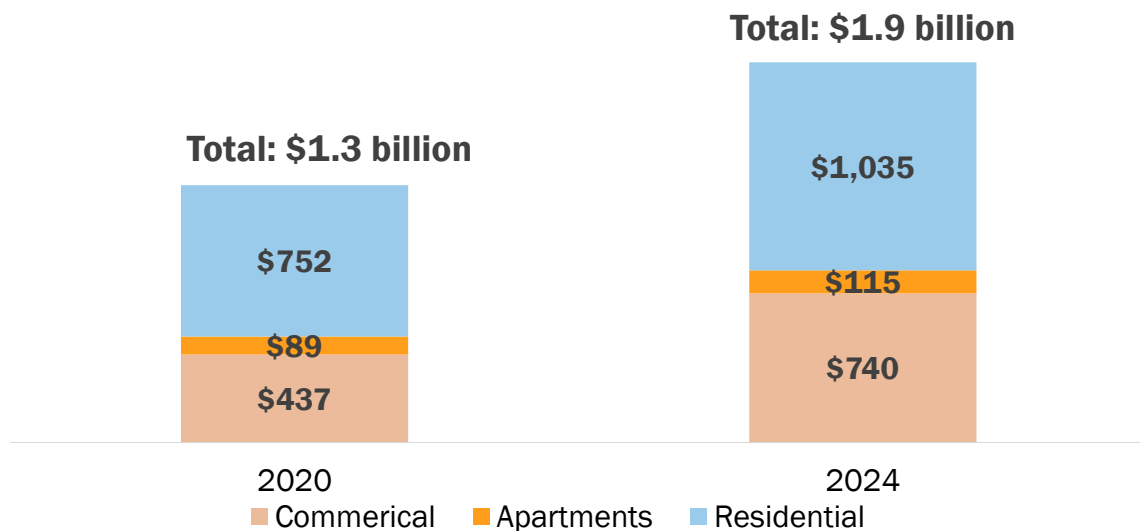

Assessed property value by sector (in millions), 2020 and 2024



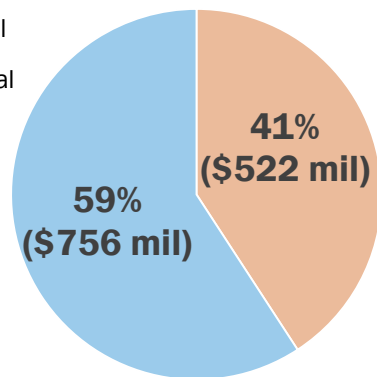

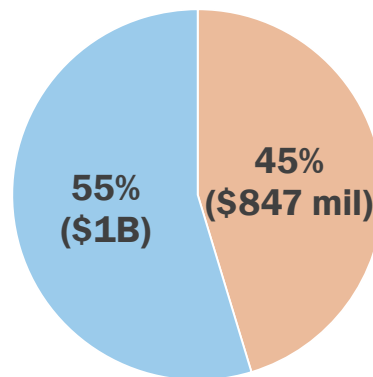
Hillsborough Residential/Commercial Property Value Percentages in 2020 and 2024

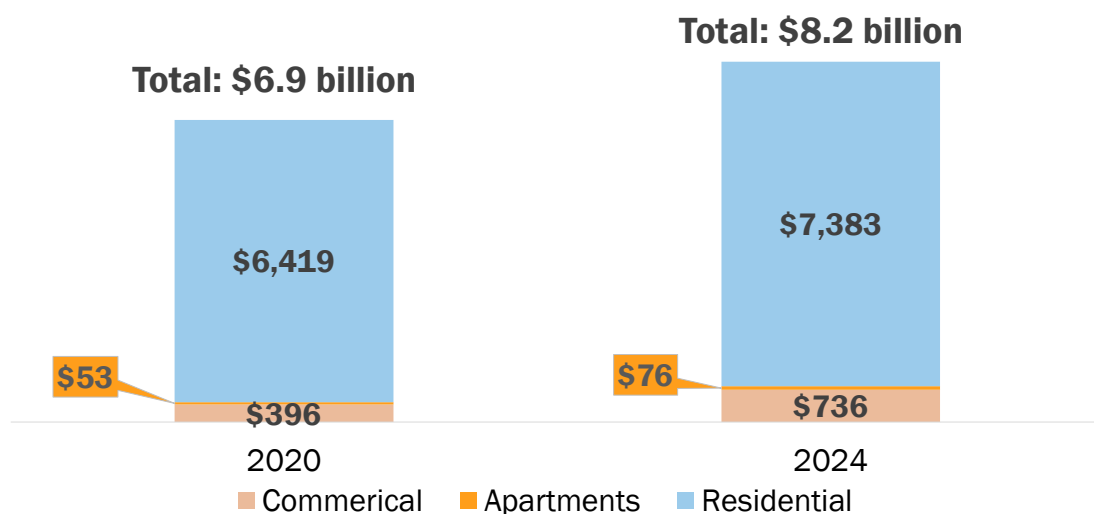

Assessed property value by sector (in millions), 2020 and 2024

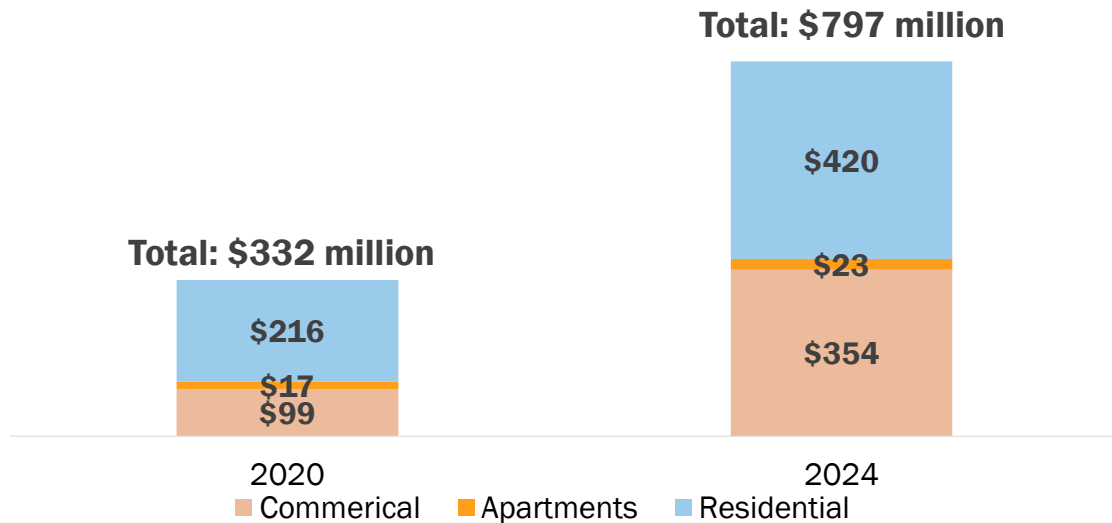

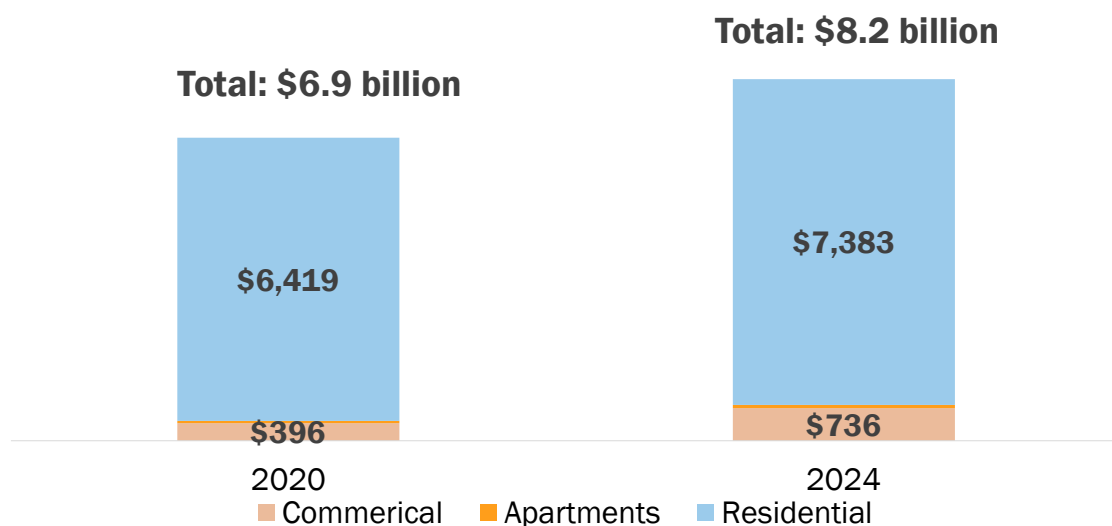

Assessed property value by sector (in millions), 2020 and 2024

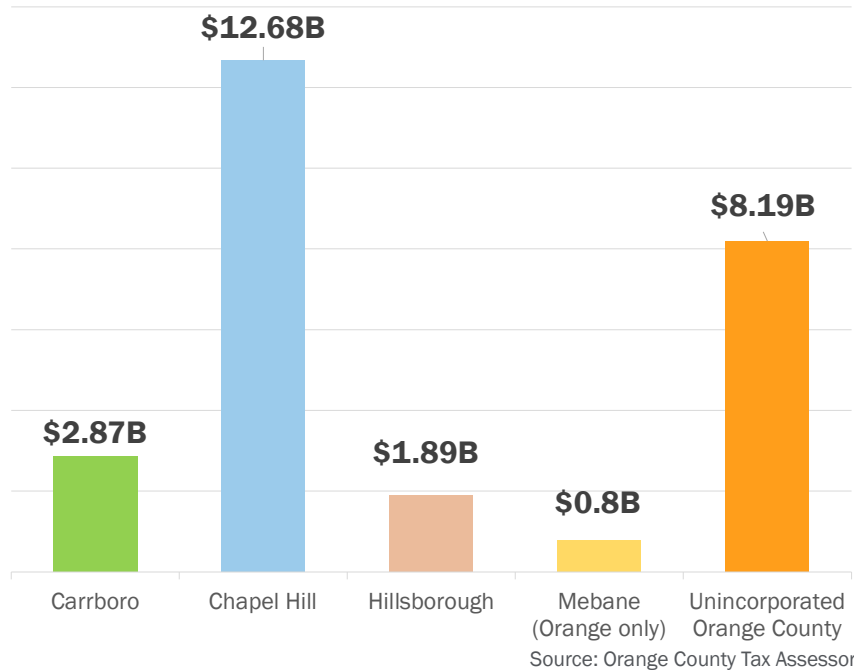

2024 Assessed Value of Orange County by Geography (in billions)

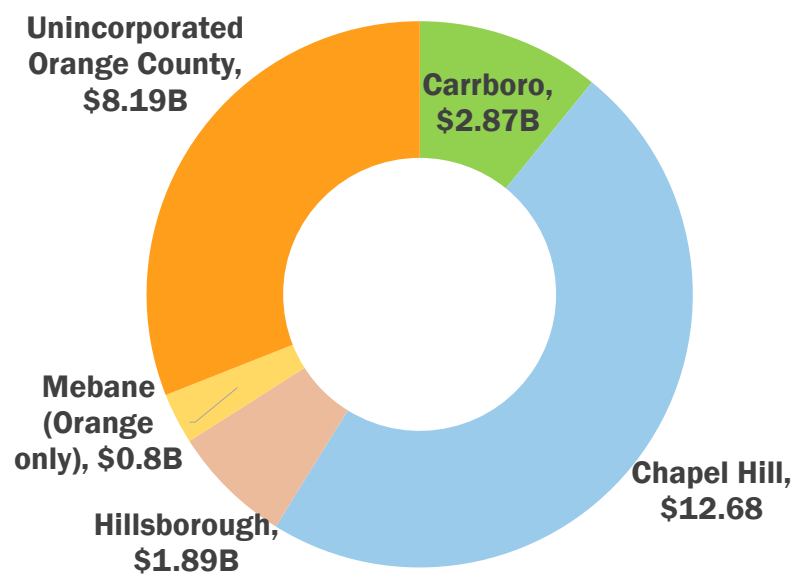

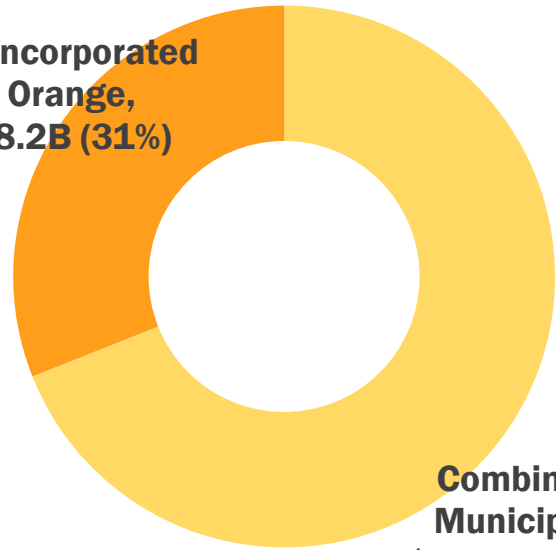

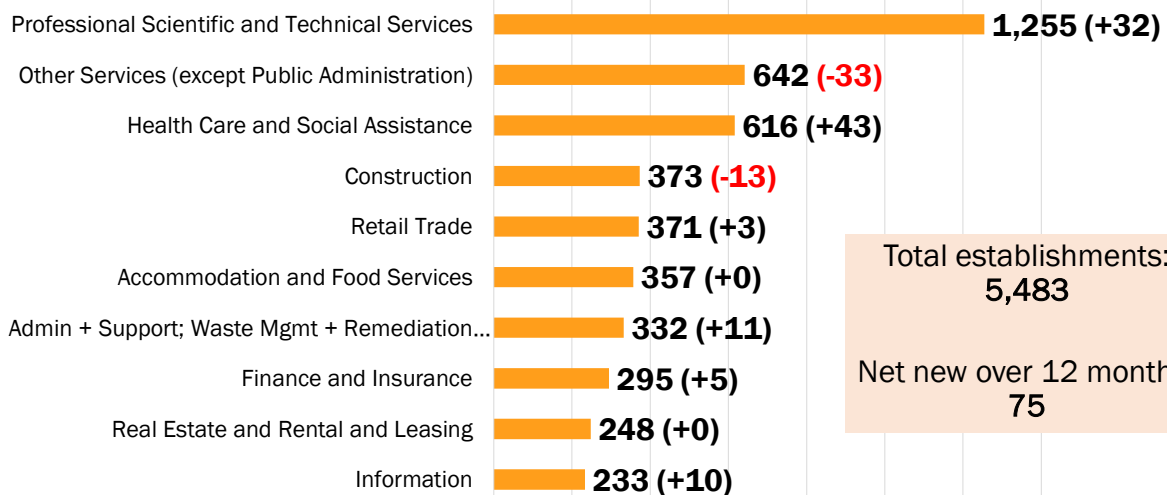

Total number of establishments in Orange County in Quarter 3, 2024 and change from Q3 2023 (by NAICS code)

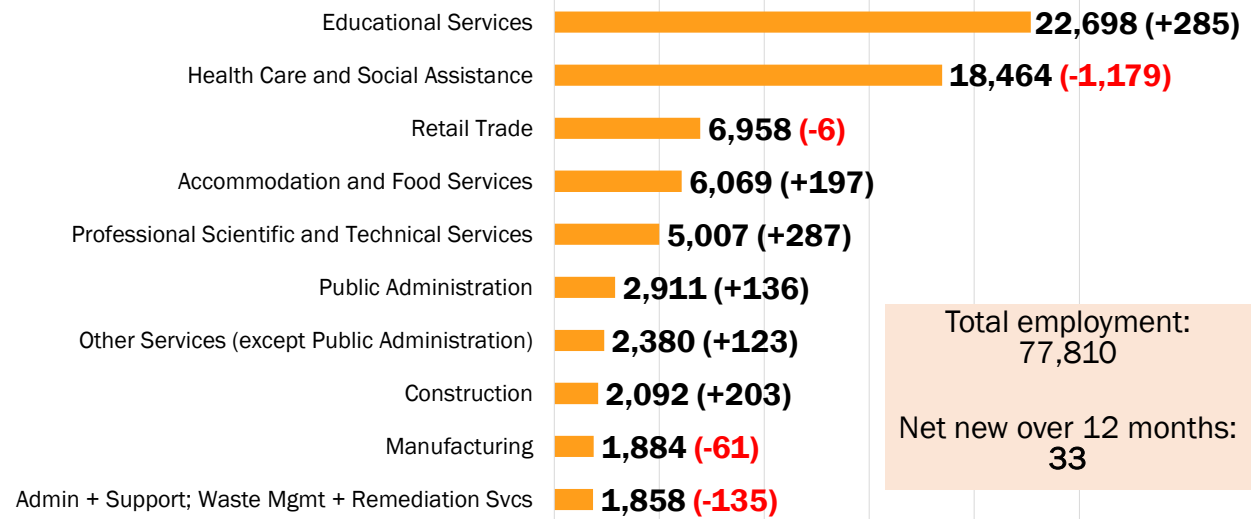

Average number of employees employed by industry in Quarter 3, 2024 and change from Q3 2023 (by NAICS code)

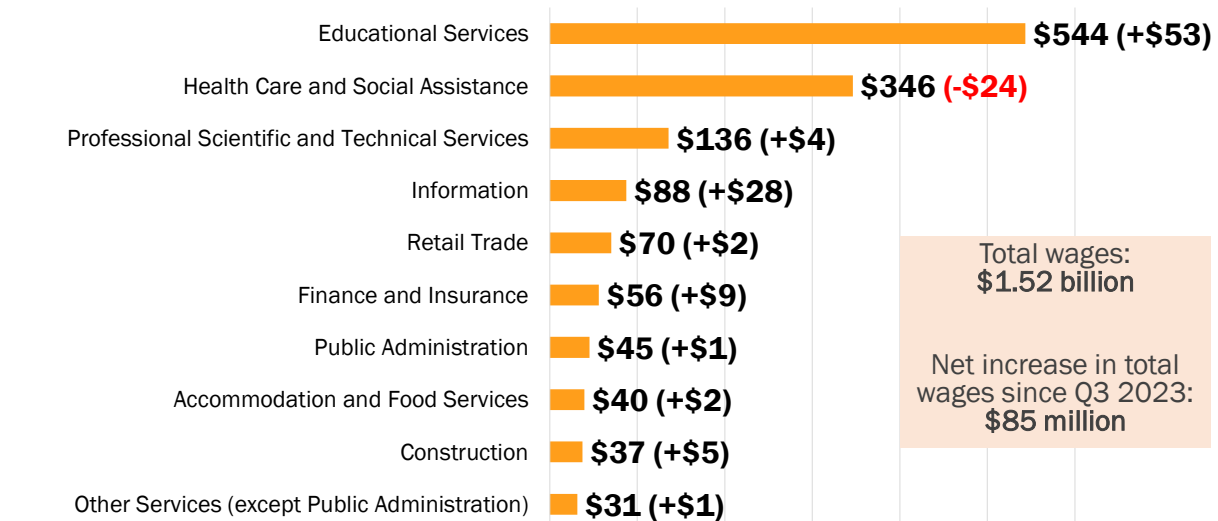

Total quarterly wages paid by industry in Quarter 3, 2024 and change from Q3 2023 (by NAICS code)

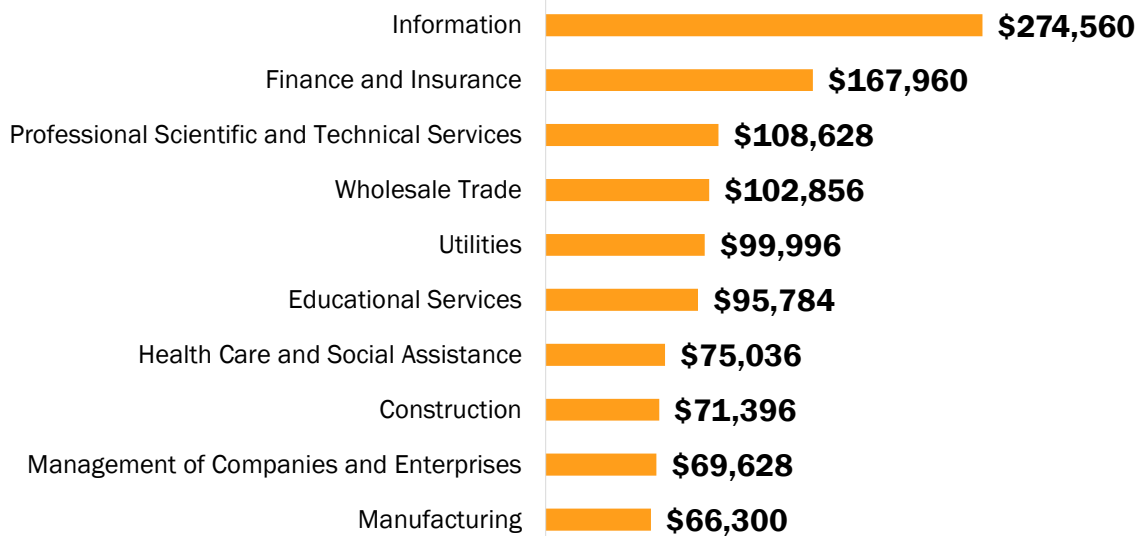

Calculated using average weekly wage data from Q3 2024 and multiplying by 52

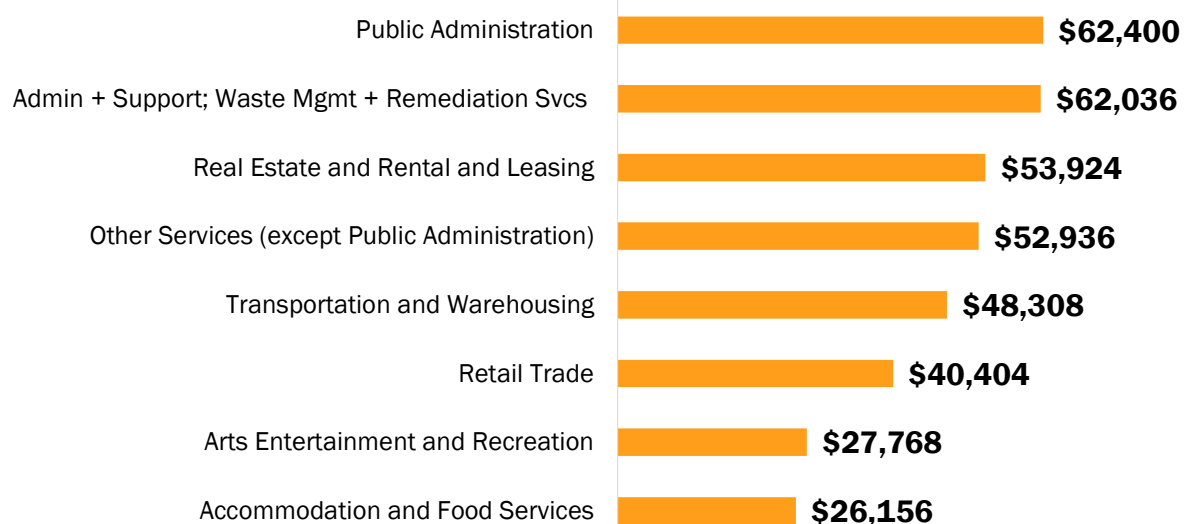

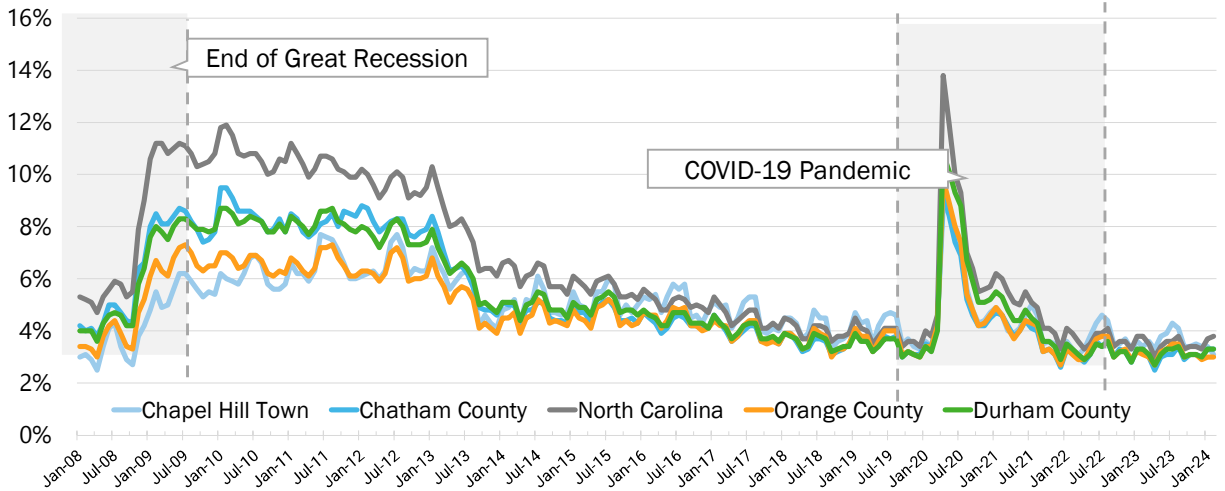

Monthly unemployment rate (unadjusted), Jan 2008 to Feb 2025

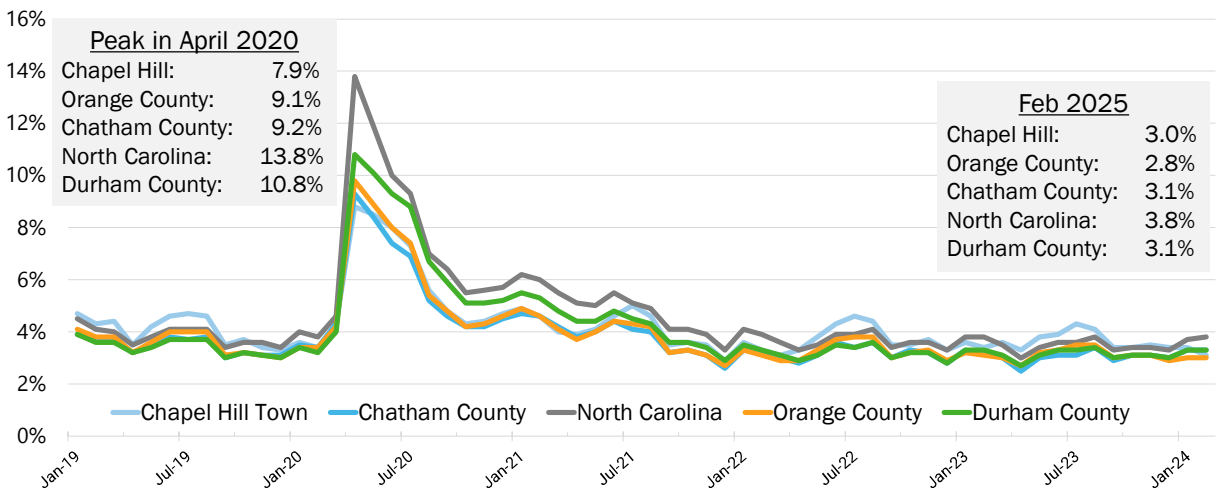

(unadjusted), Jan 2019 to Feb 2025

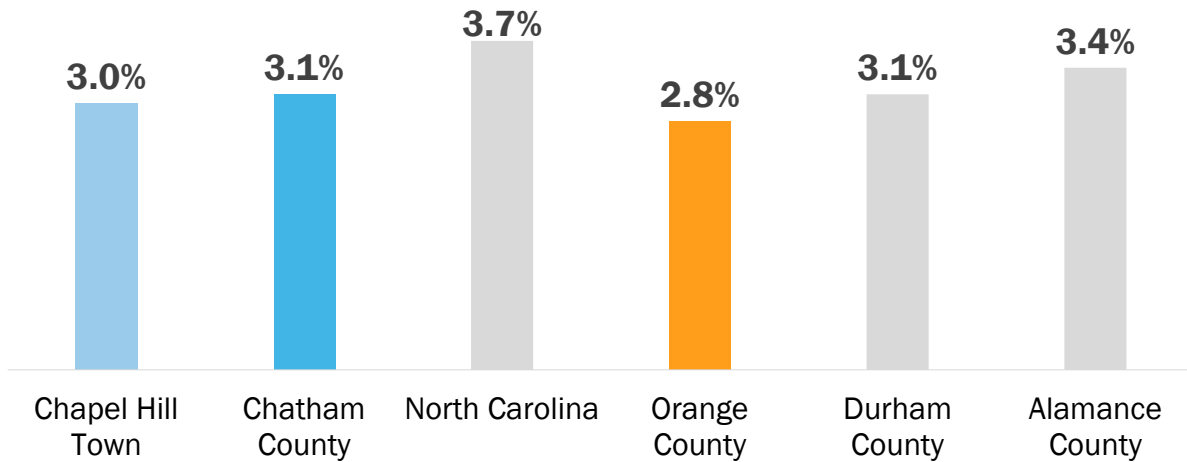

Local unemployment rate in February 2025, not seasonally adjusted

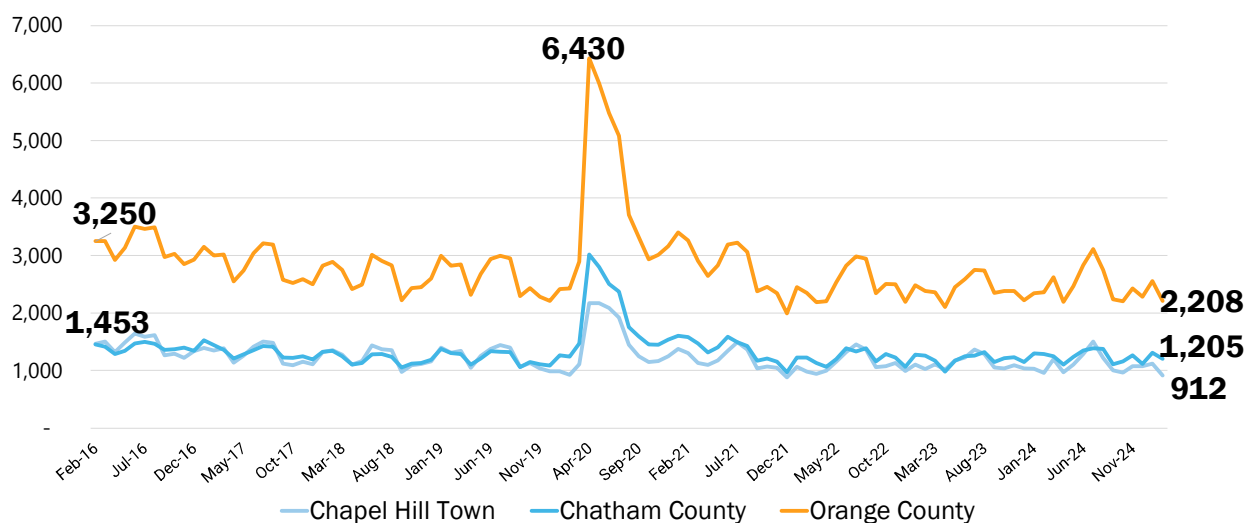

Unemployed individuals Feb 2016 to Feb 2025. Orange County total is inclusive of Chapel Hill Total

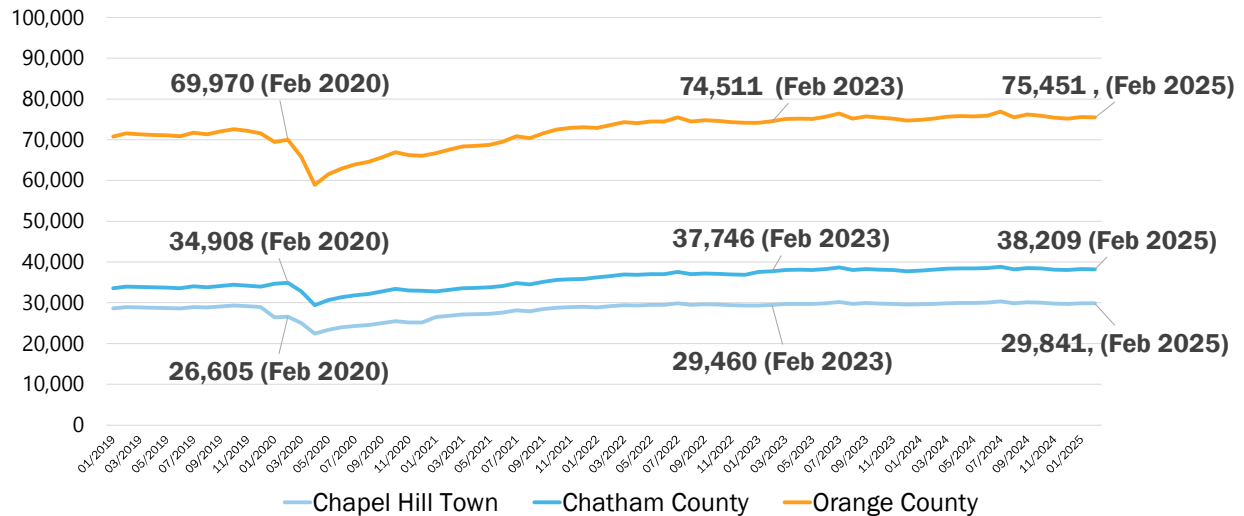

Monthly unemployed individuals Feb 2019 to Feb 2025, Orange total is inclusive of Chapel Hill total

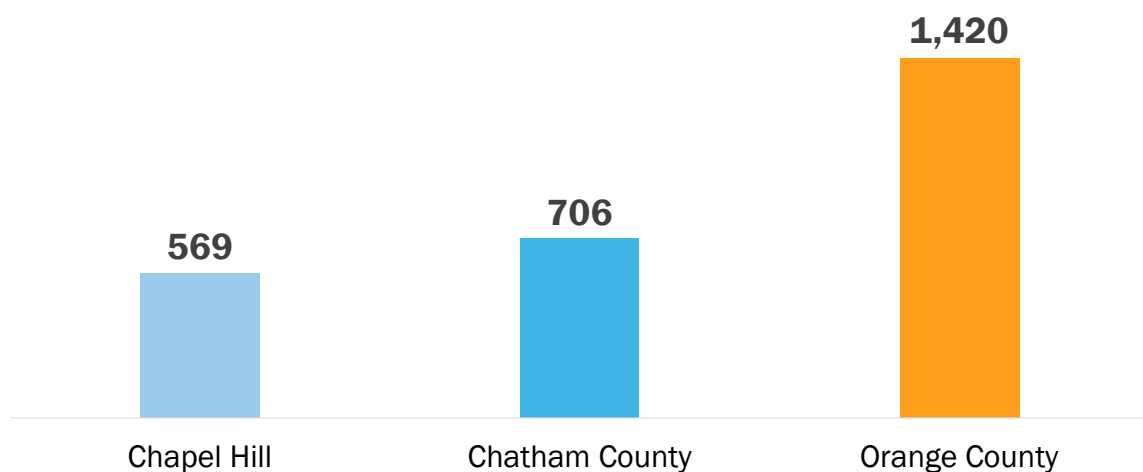

Percentage of adults (ages 18-65) who are either working or actively seeking a job, 2024

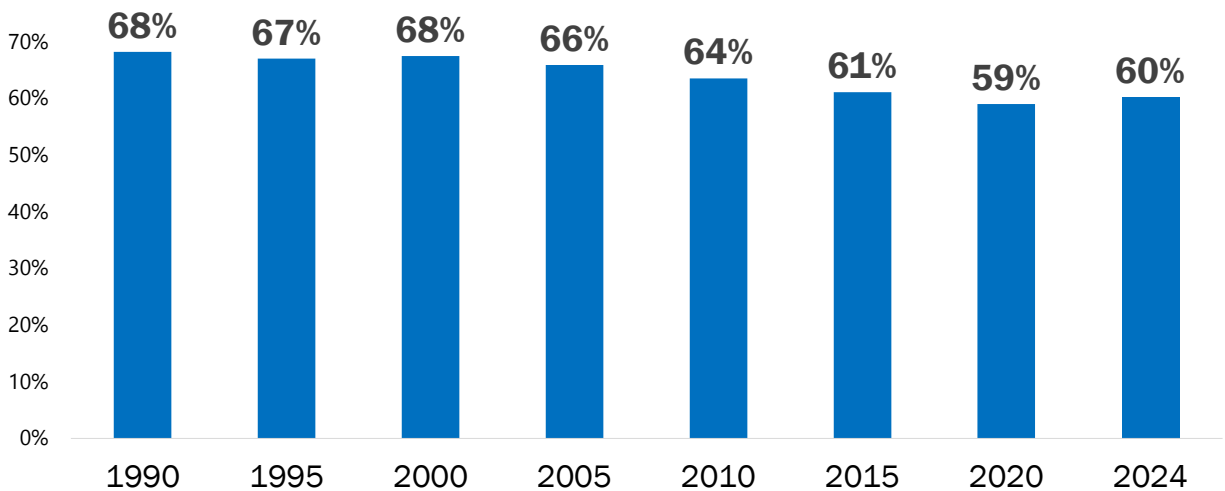

Percent of adults (ages 18-65) who are either working or actively seeking a job, 1990 to 2024

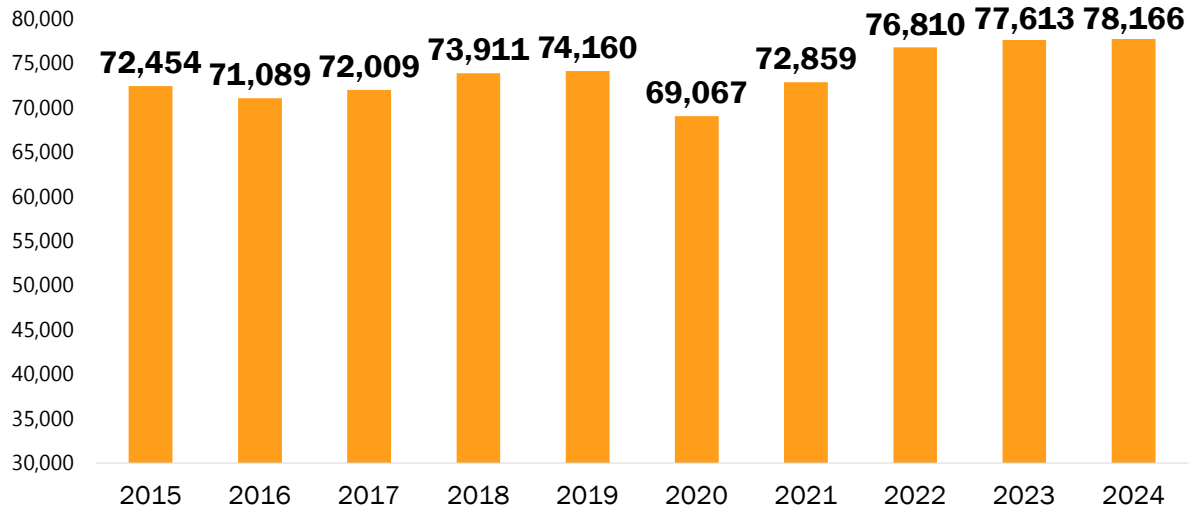

Number of adults (ages 18-65) who are either working or actively seeking a job, 2015 to 2024

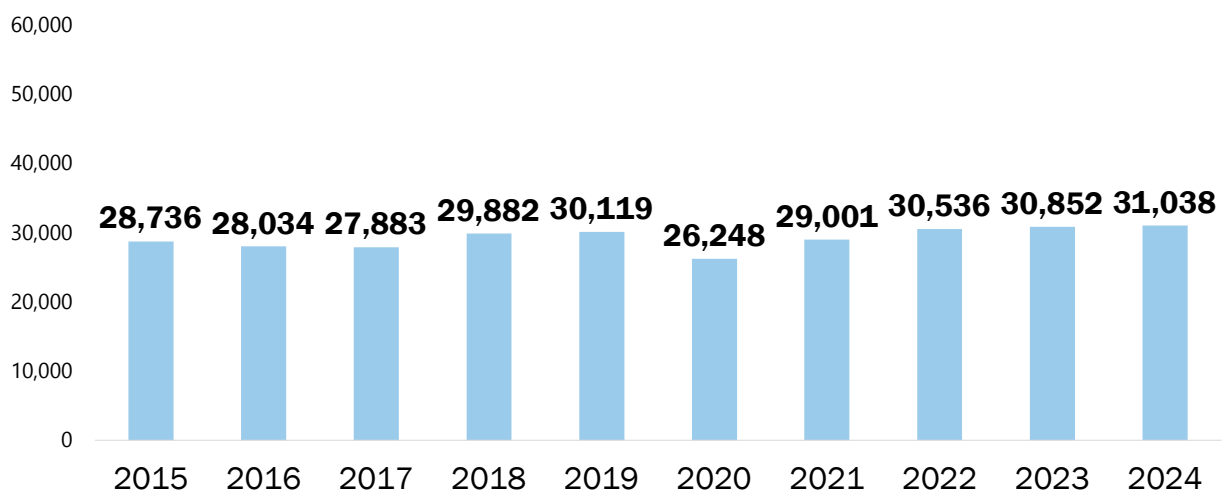

Number of adults (ages 18-65) who are either working or actively seeking a job, 2015 to 2024

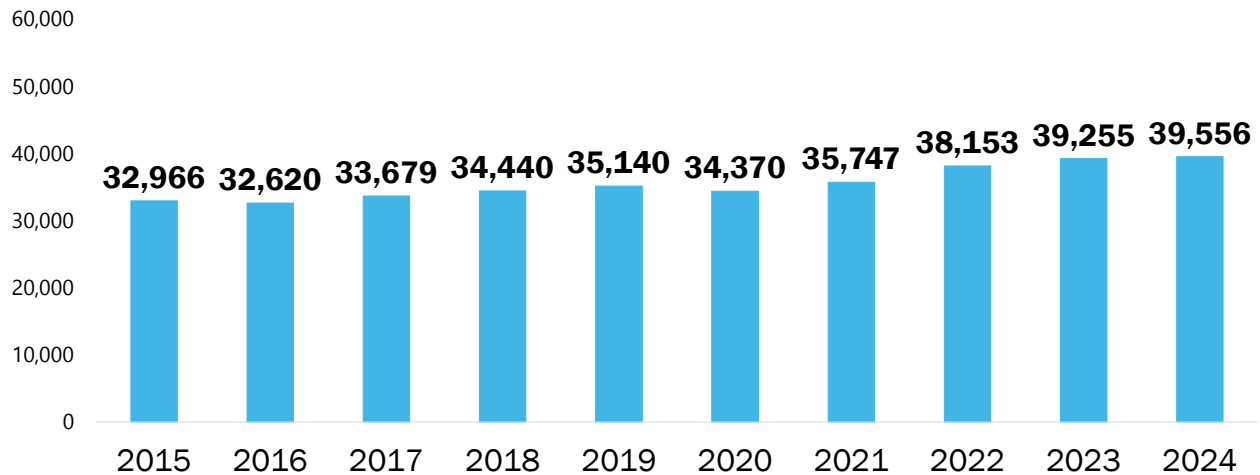

Number of adults (ages 18-65) who are either working or actively seeking a job, 2015 to 2024

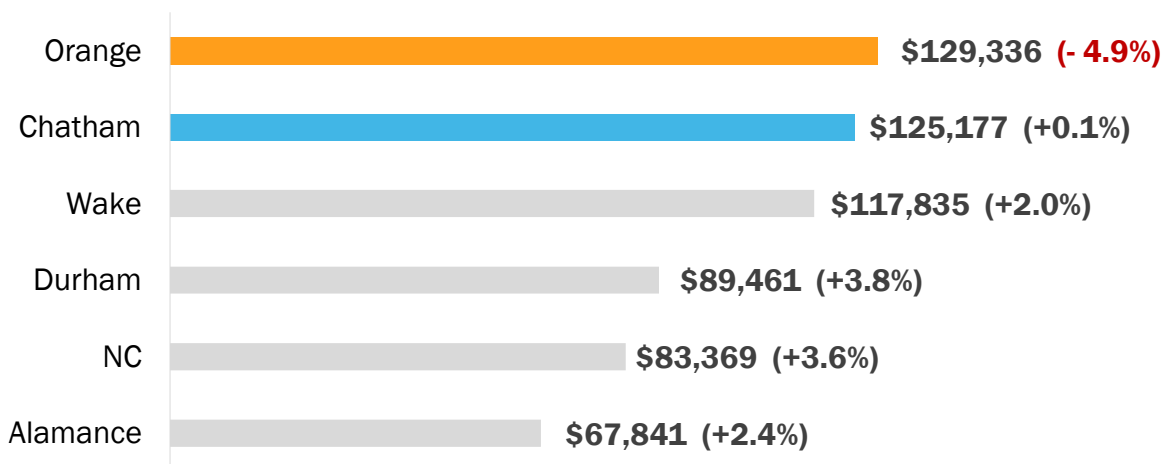

2022 Adjusted Gross Income (AGI), with percent change from 2021

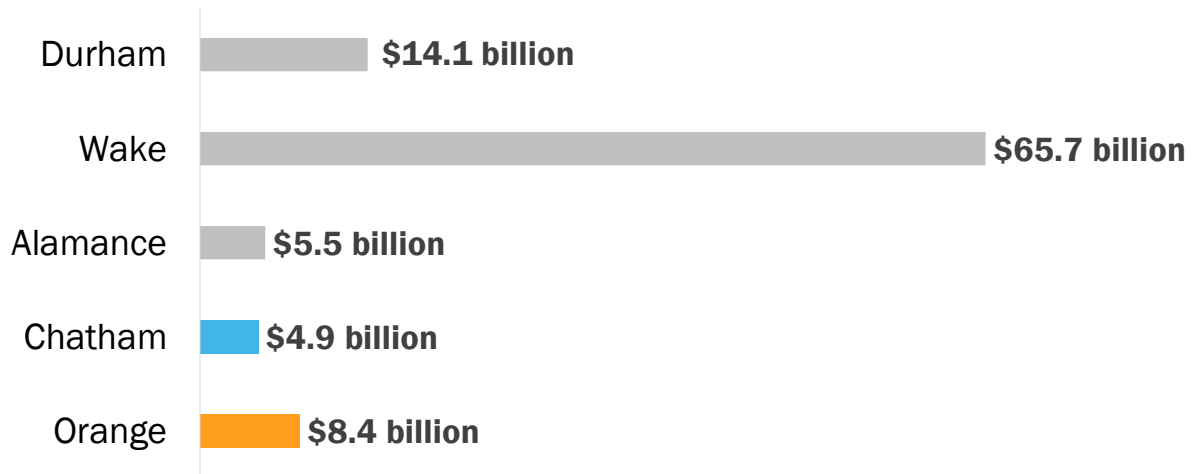

Total reported Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) for all residents of the county 2022

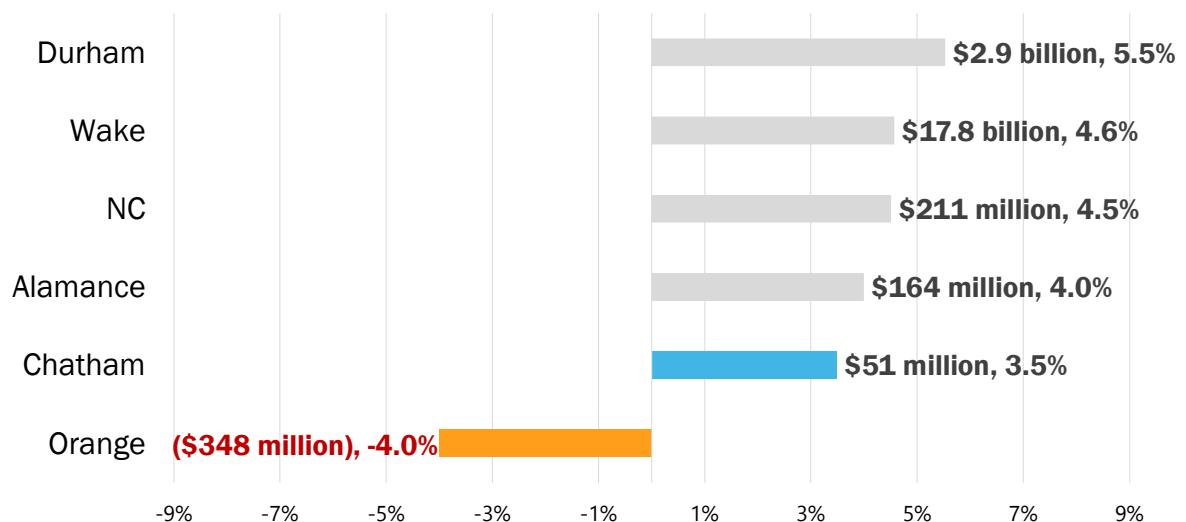

Percent and dollar change in reported Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) from 2021 to 2022

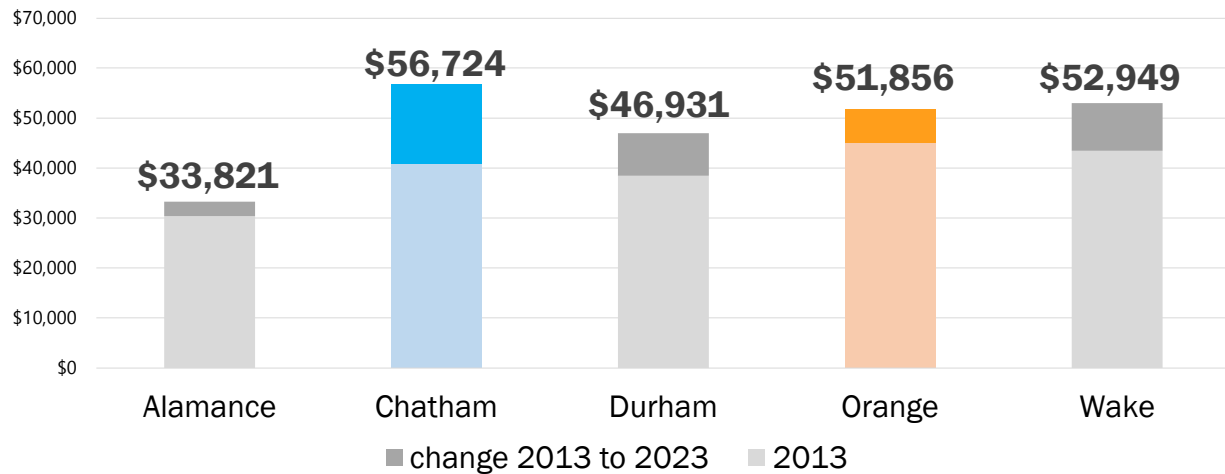

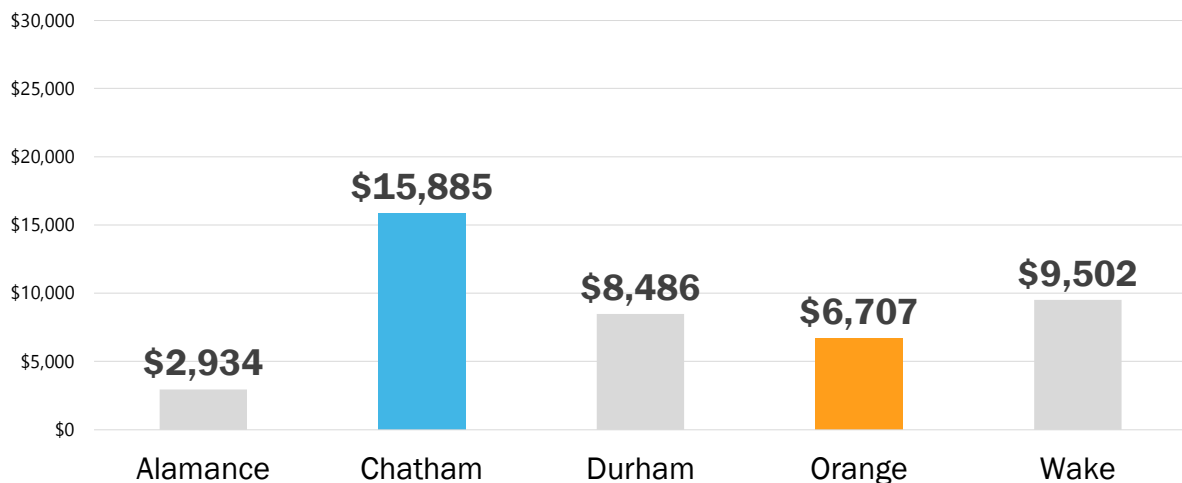

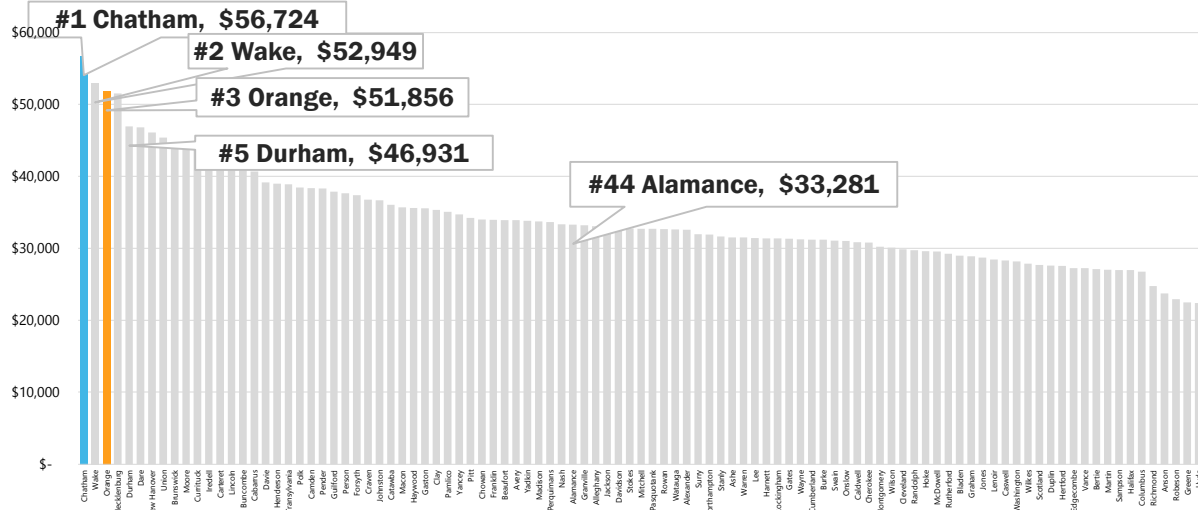

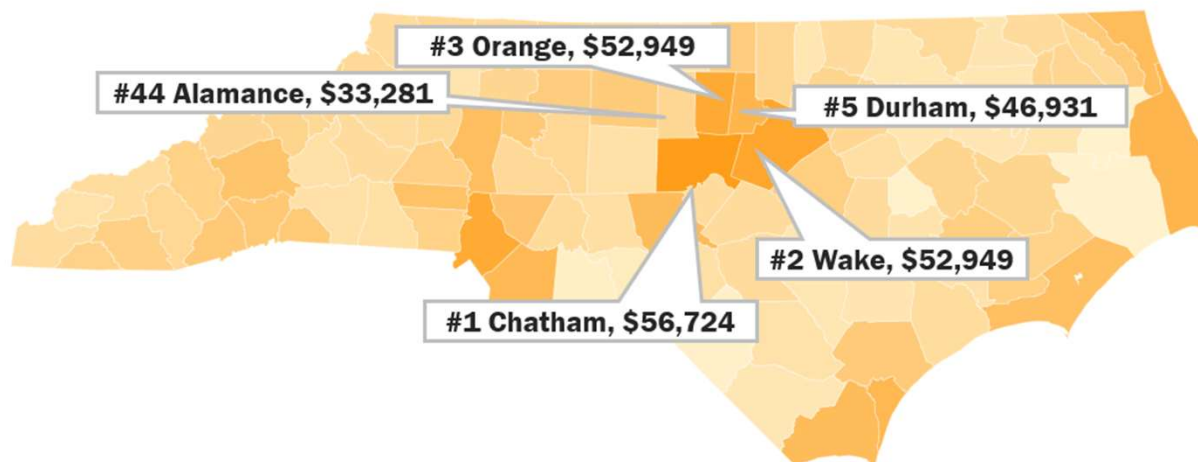

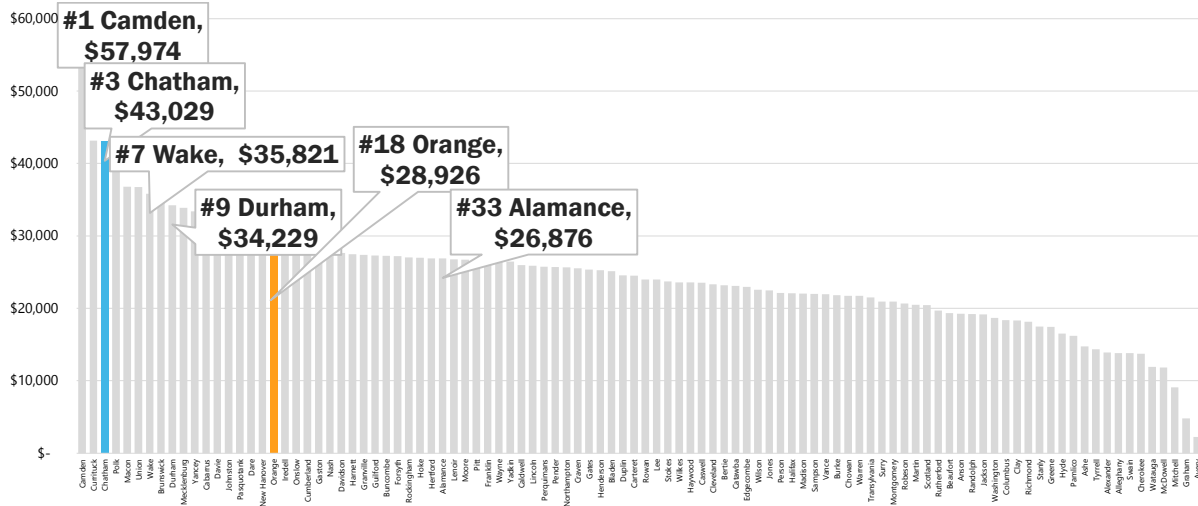

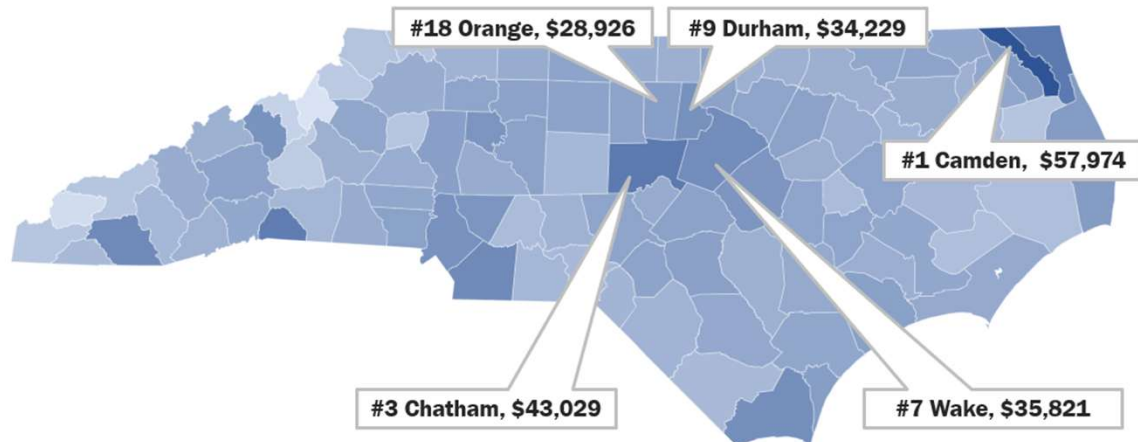

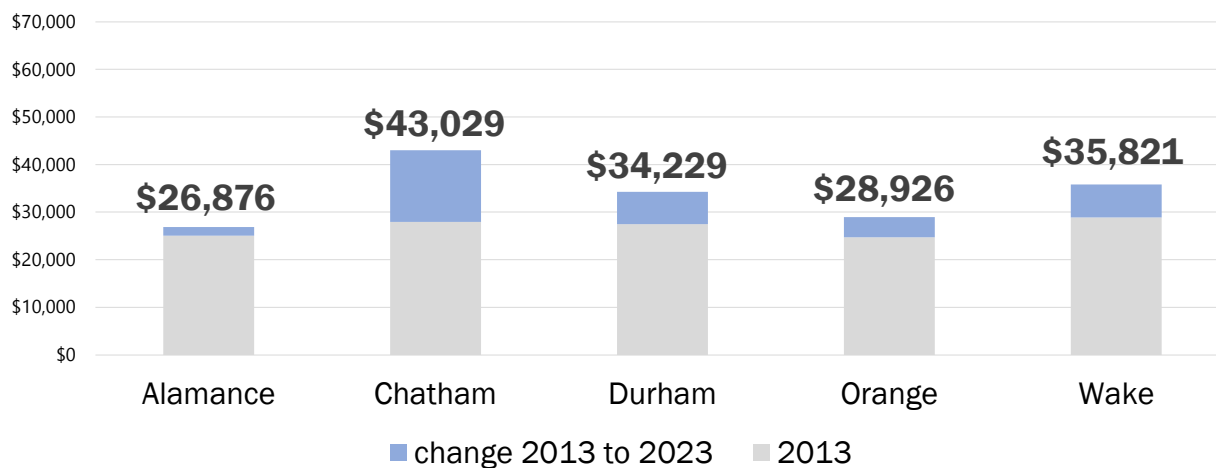

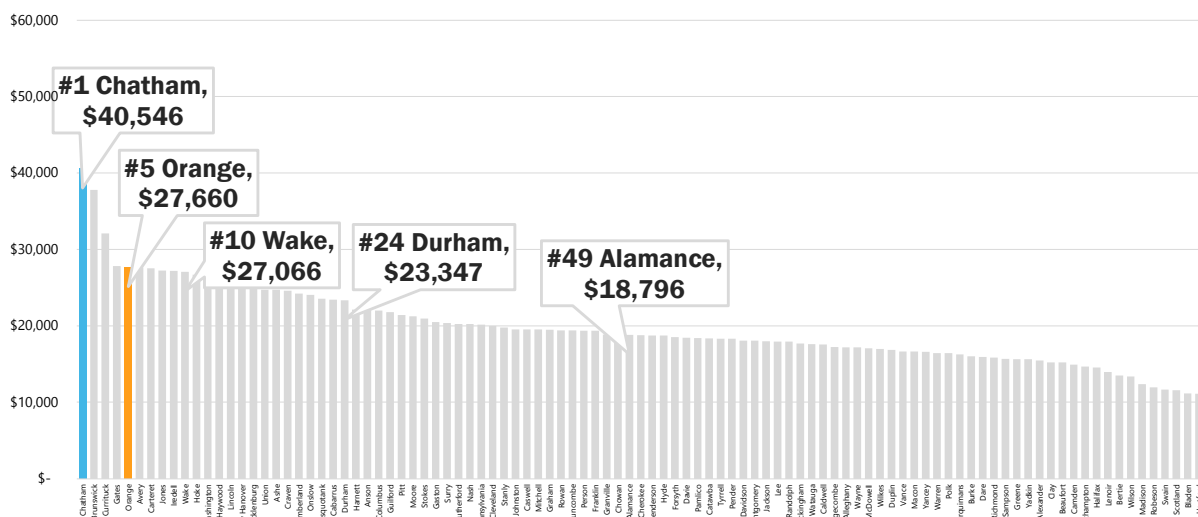

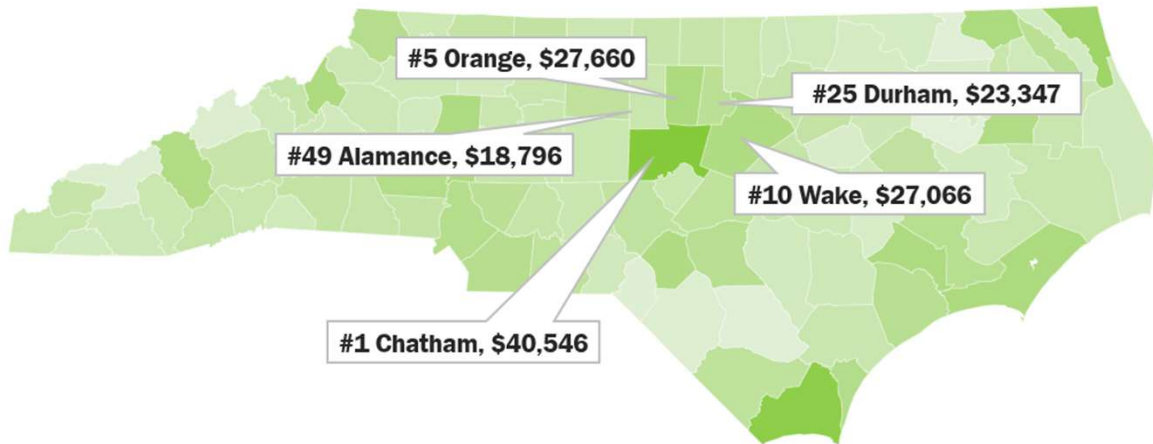

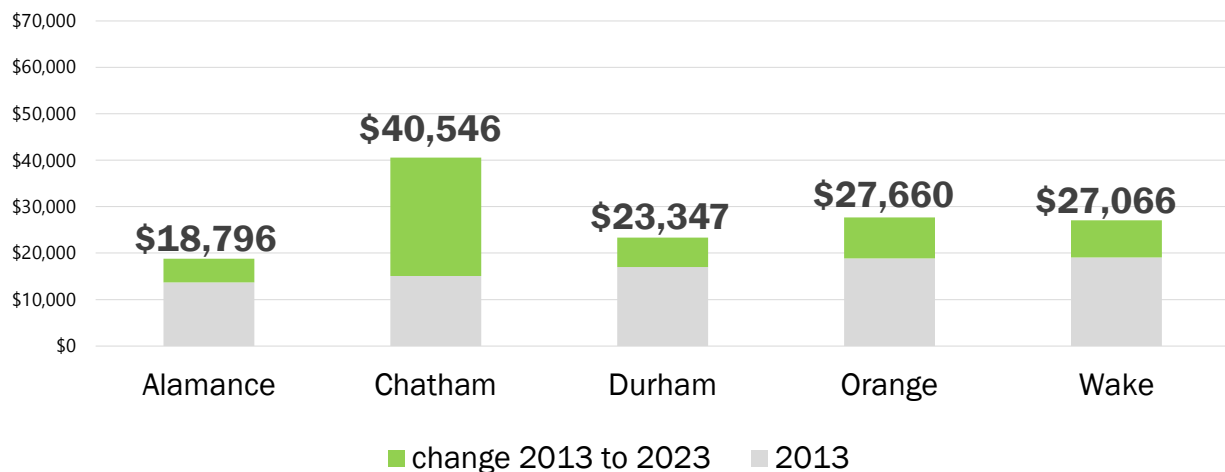

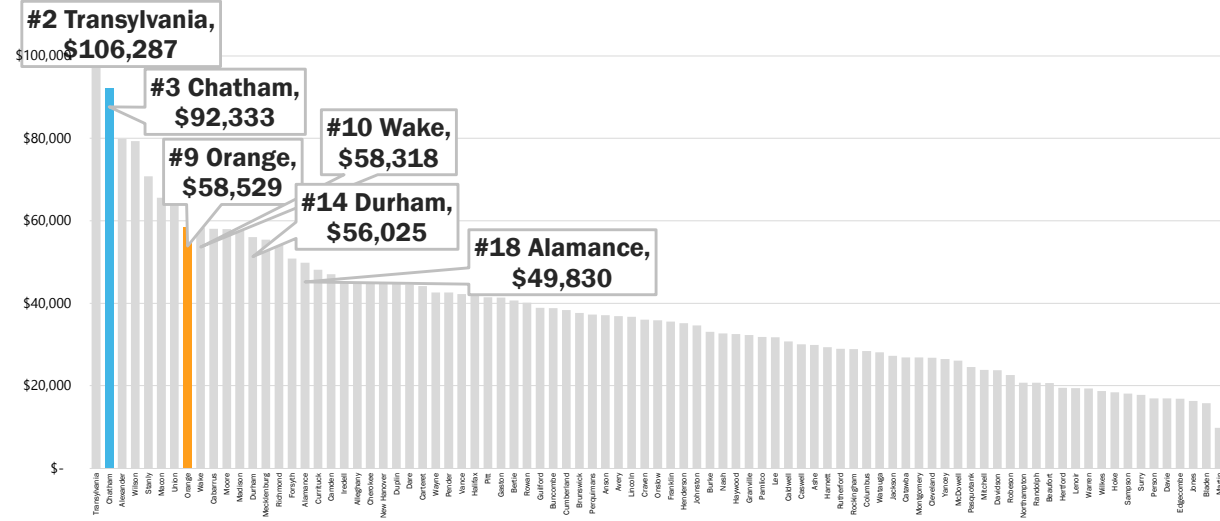

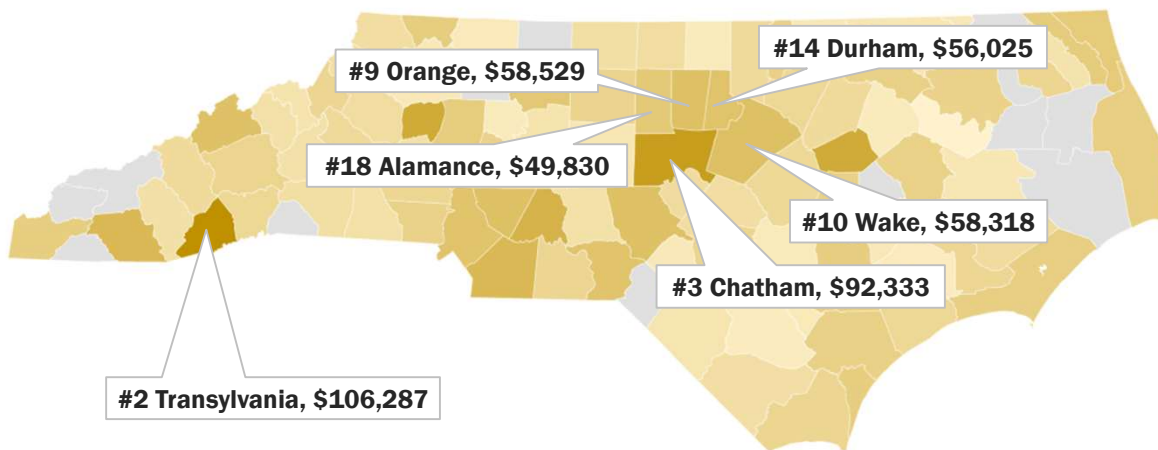

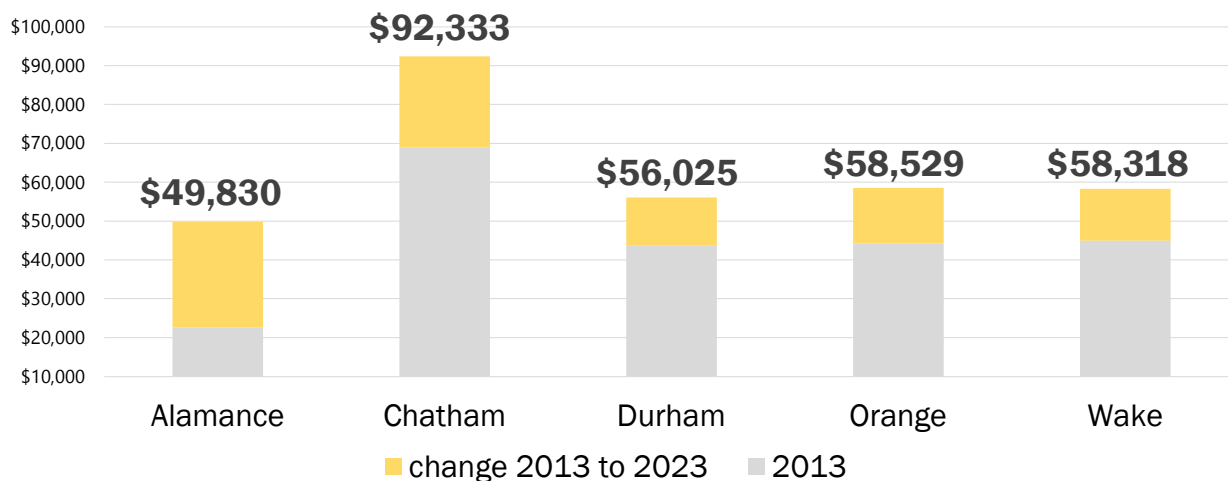

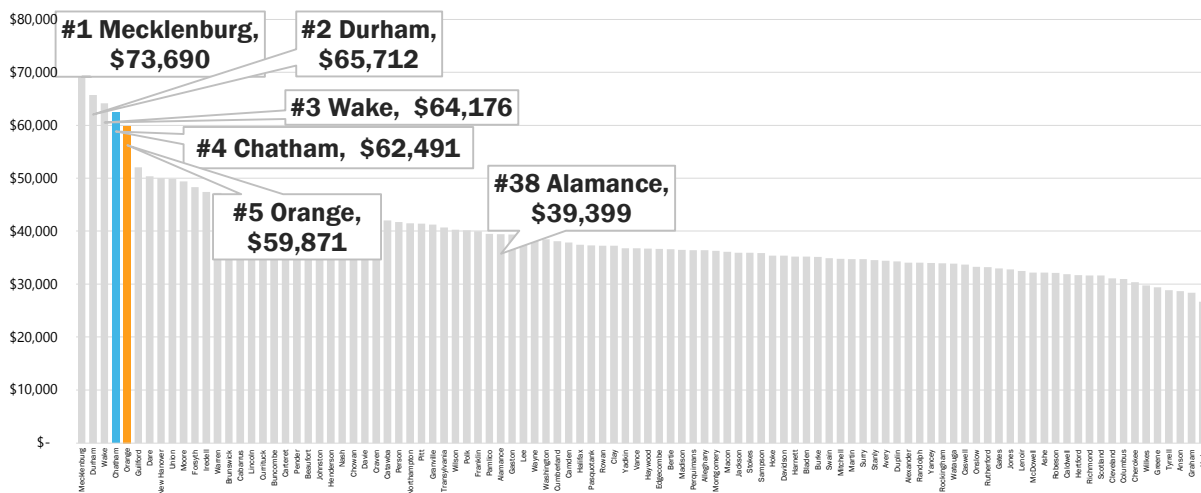

White per capita income is the total income earned by White residents in an area divided by the total number of White residents in that area

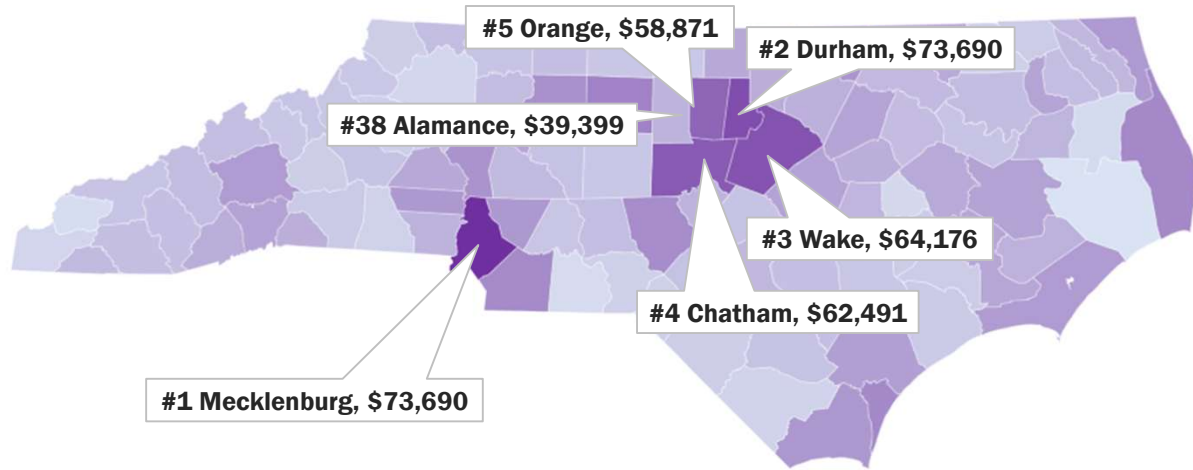

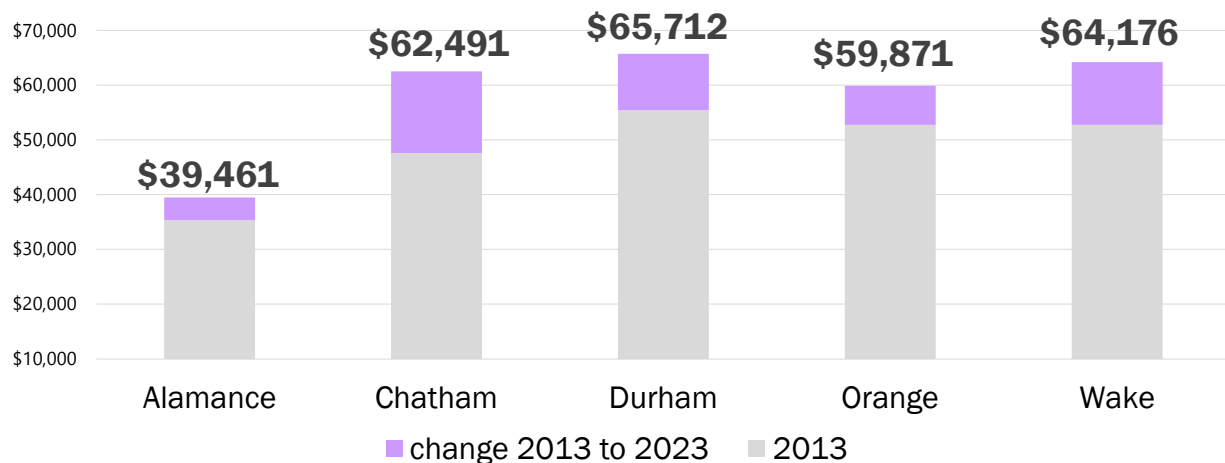

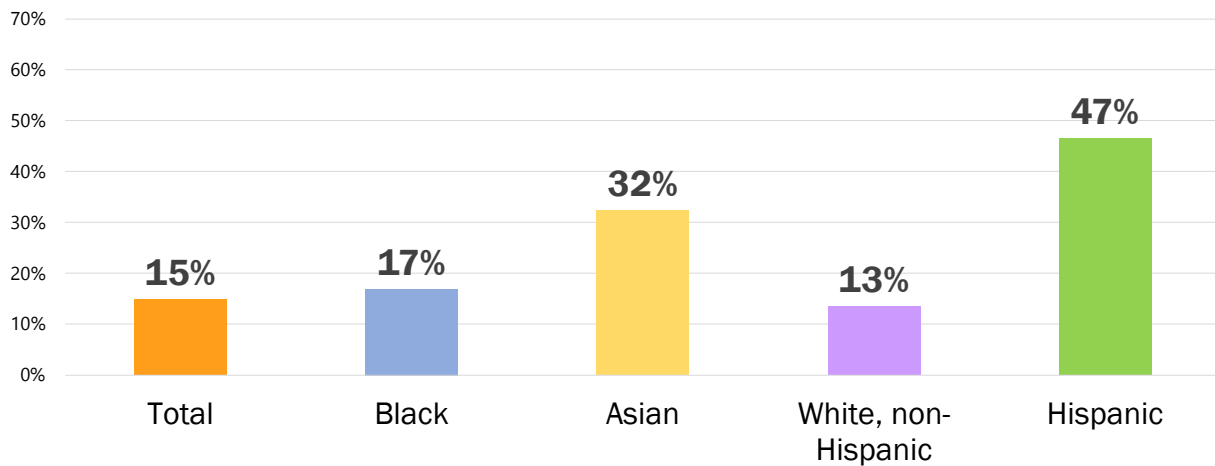

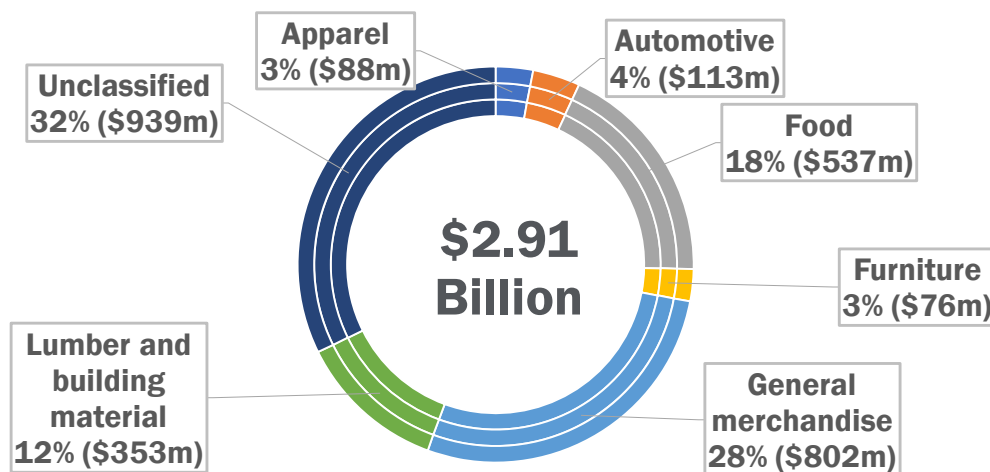

Orange County taxable sales and purchases by major business category, FY2024

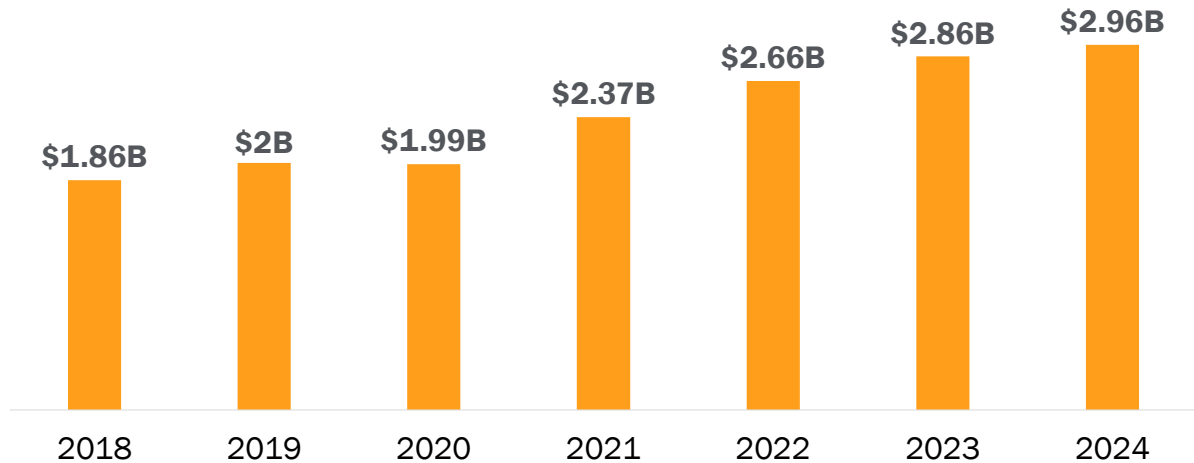

Annual retail sales in Orange County, calendar years 2018 to 2024

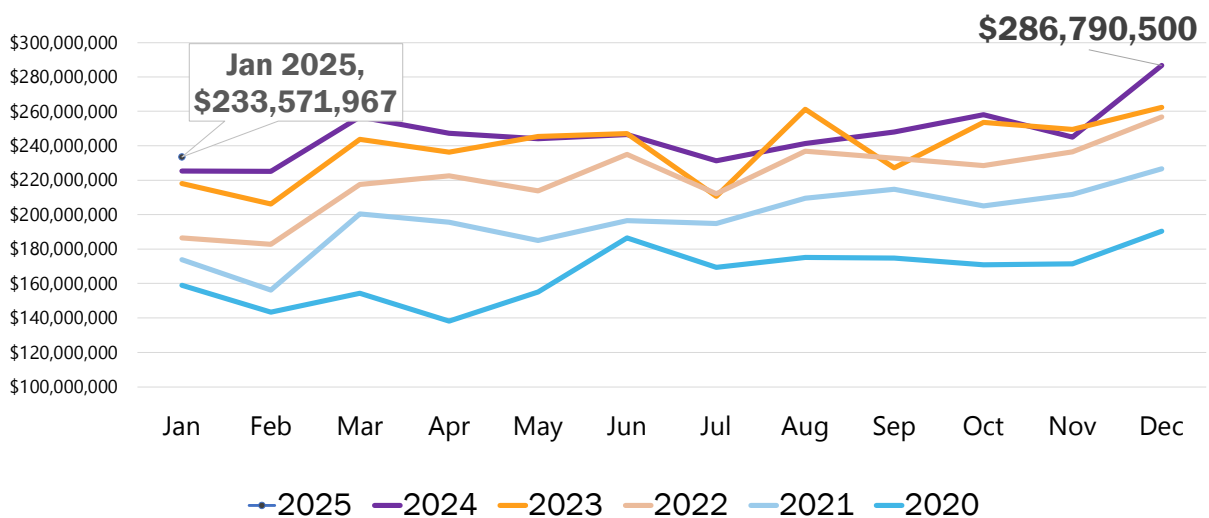

Taxable retail sales by month, 2020 through 2024

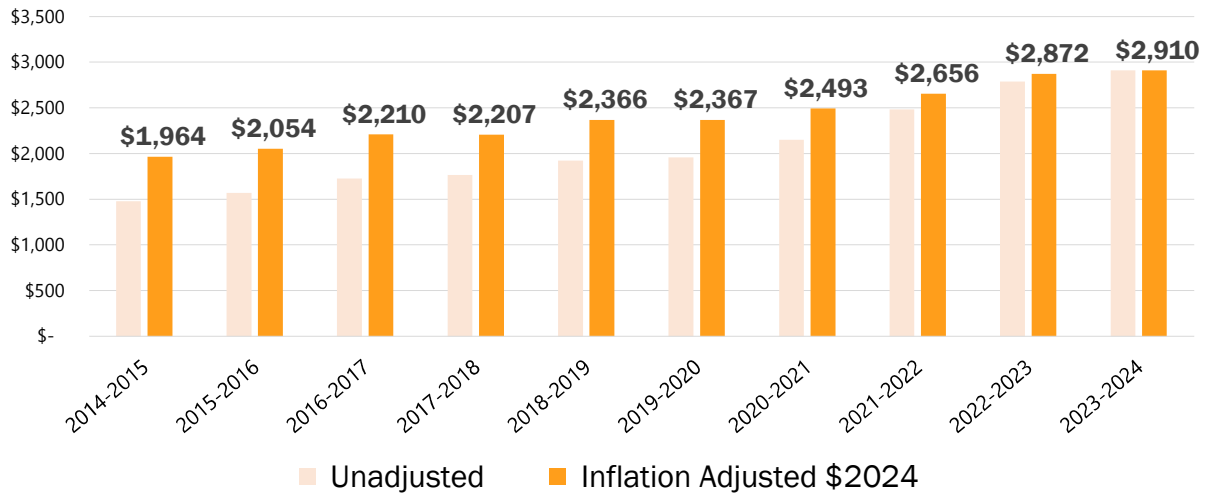

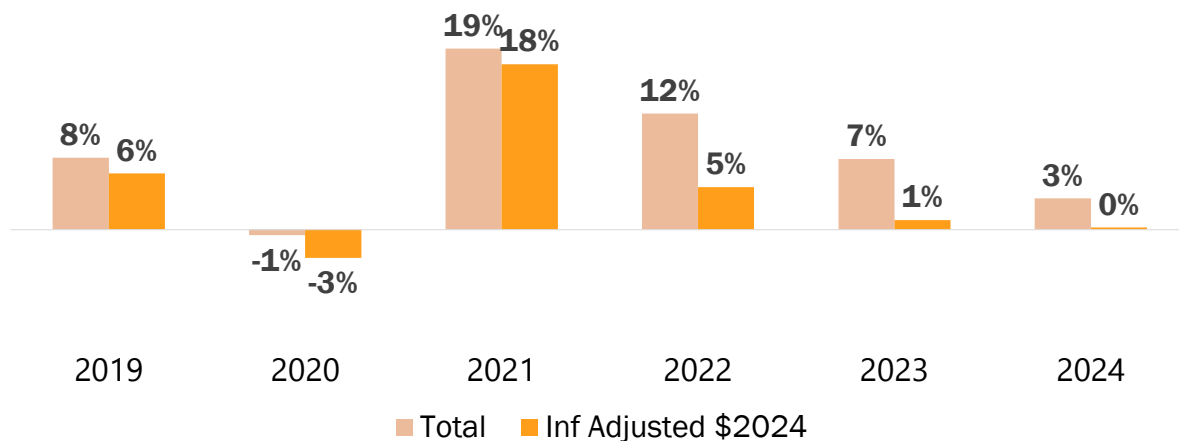
Unadjusted and Inflation Adjusted (\$2024) Orange County taxable sales (in millions) for FY2015 to FY2024

Orange County Annual Percentage Growth In Retail Sales

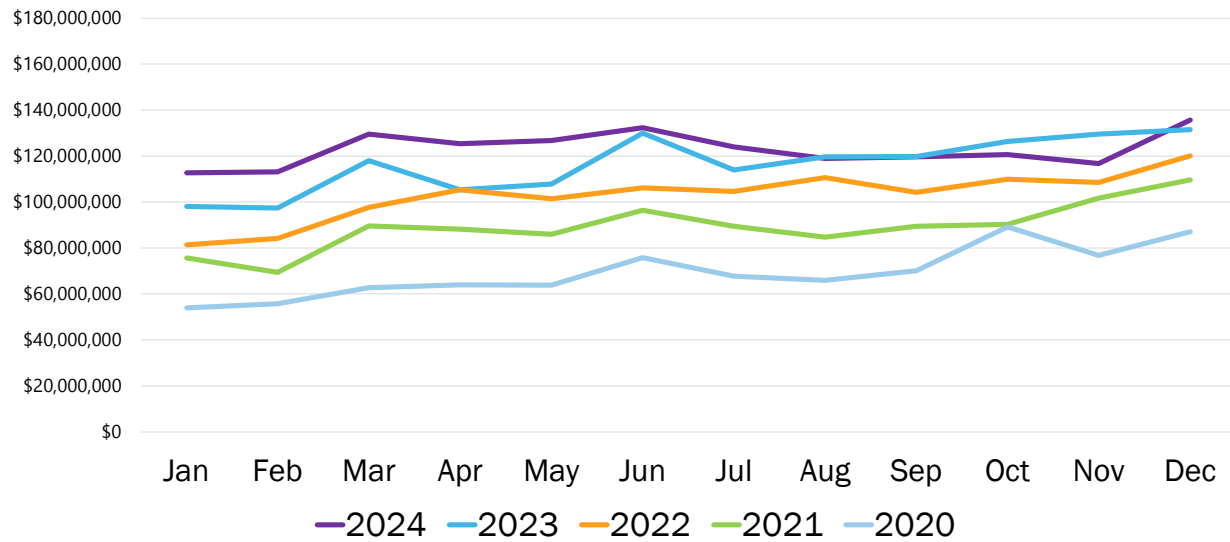

Taxable retail sales by month, 2020 through 2024

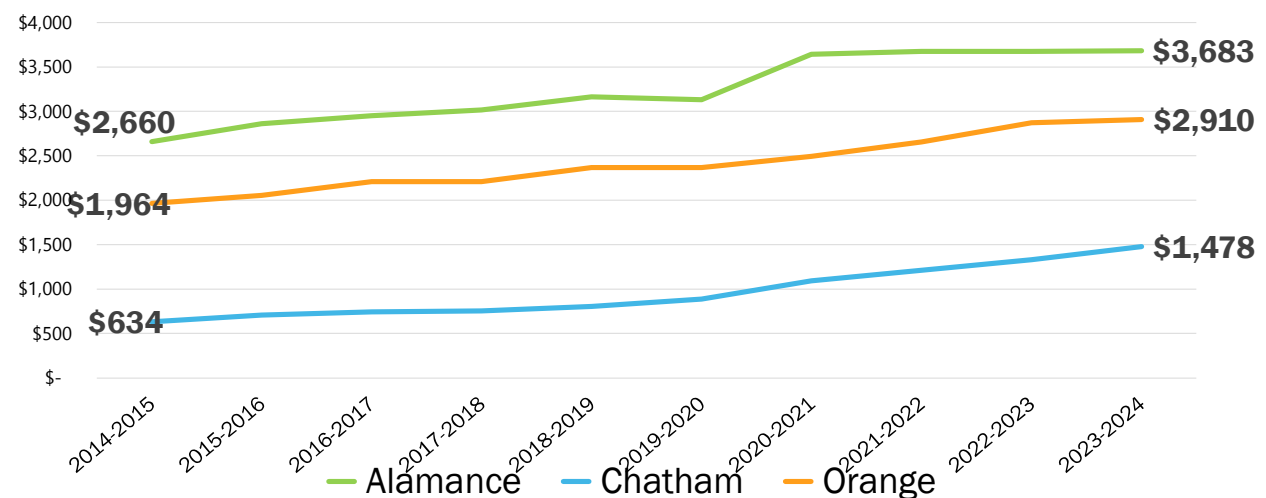

FY2015 to FY2024 (inflation adjusted \$2024)

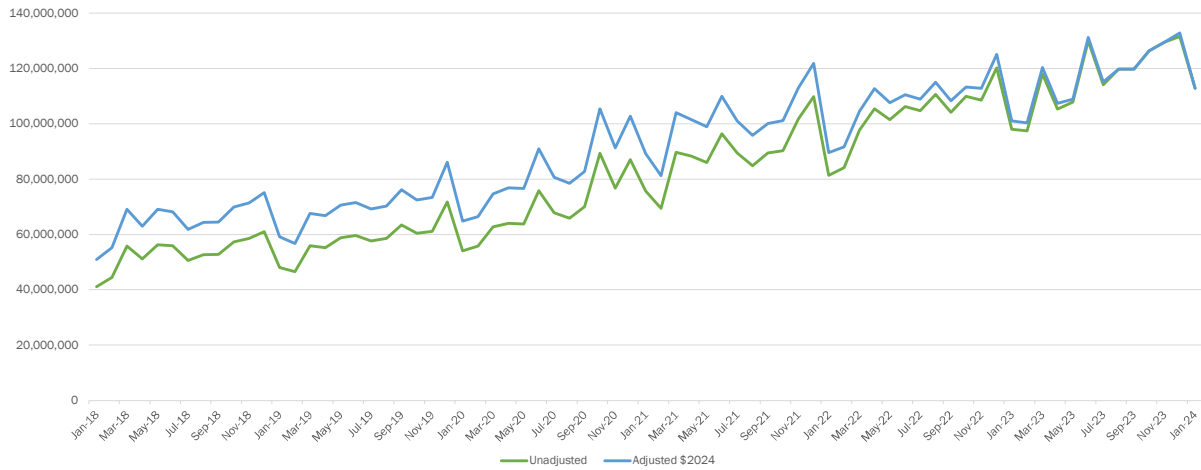

Jan 2018-Jan 2024 (unadjusted and inflation adjusted \$2024)

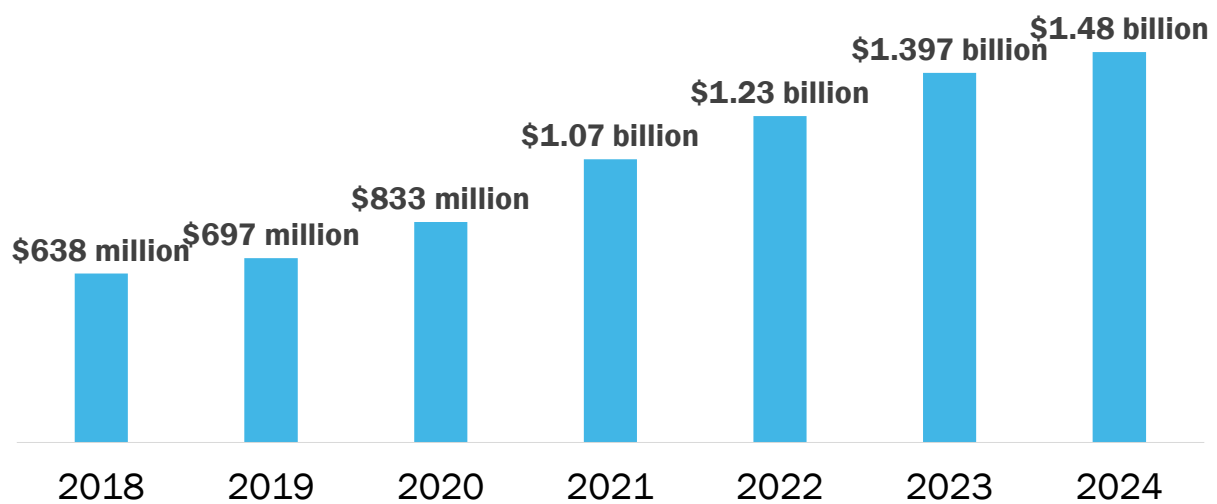

Annual retail sales in Chatham County, calendar years 2018 to 2024

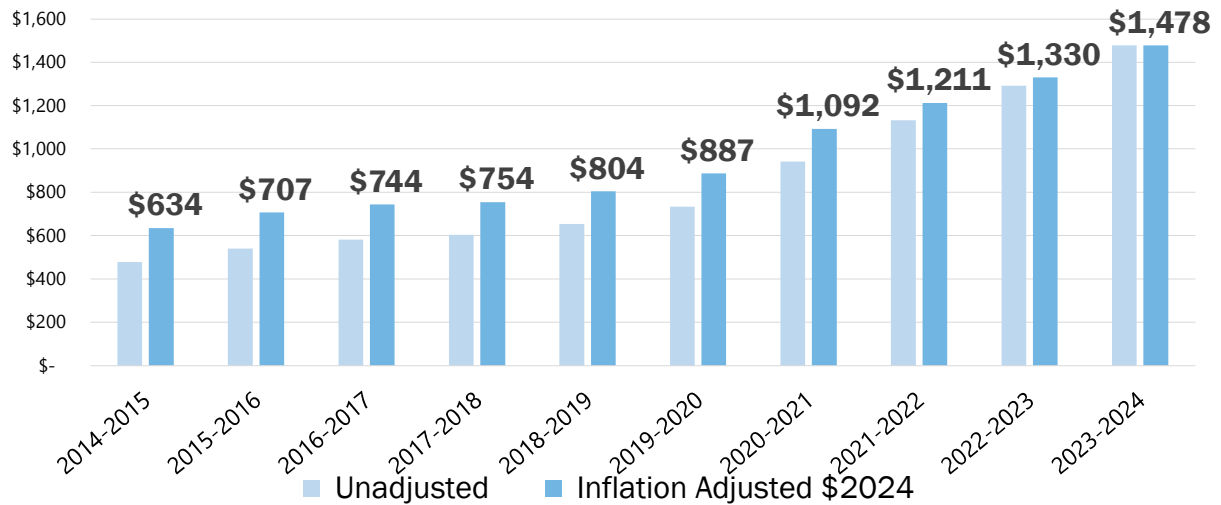

Unadjusted and Inflation adjusted (\$2024) Chatham County taxable sales (in millions) for FY2015 to FY2024

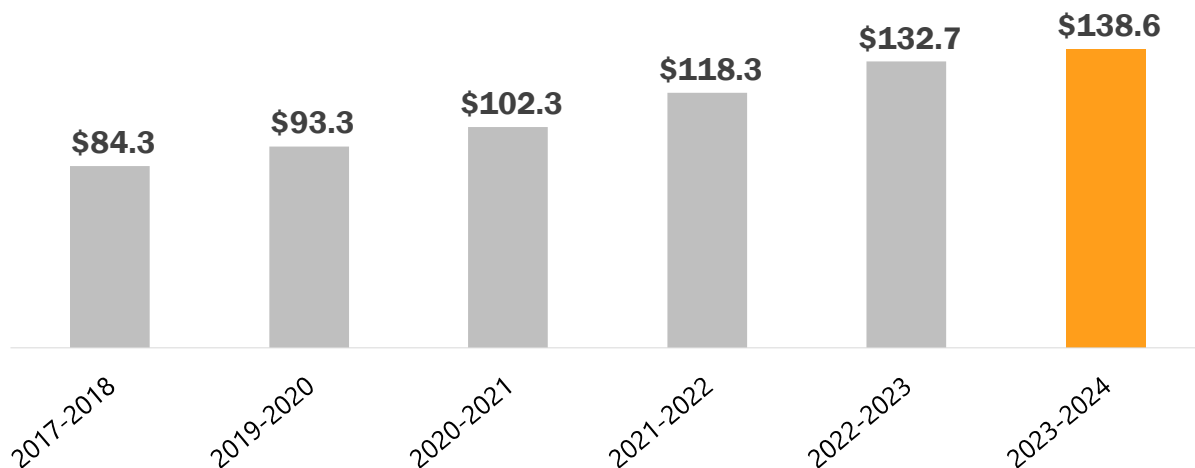

Orange County sales tax collections (in millions), FY2015 to FY2024

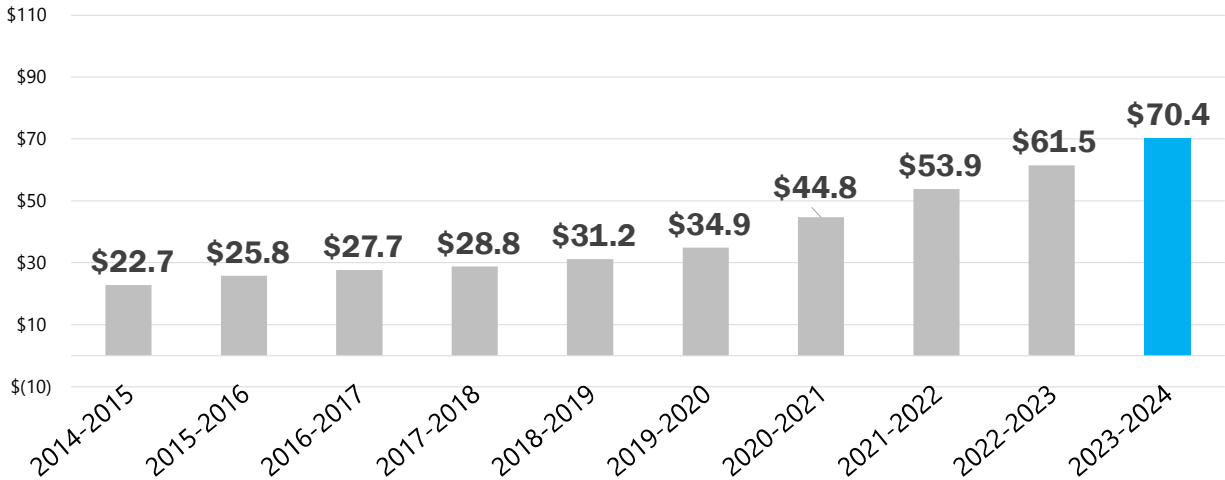

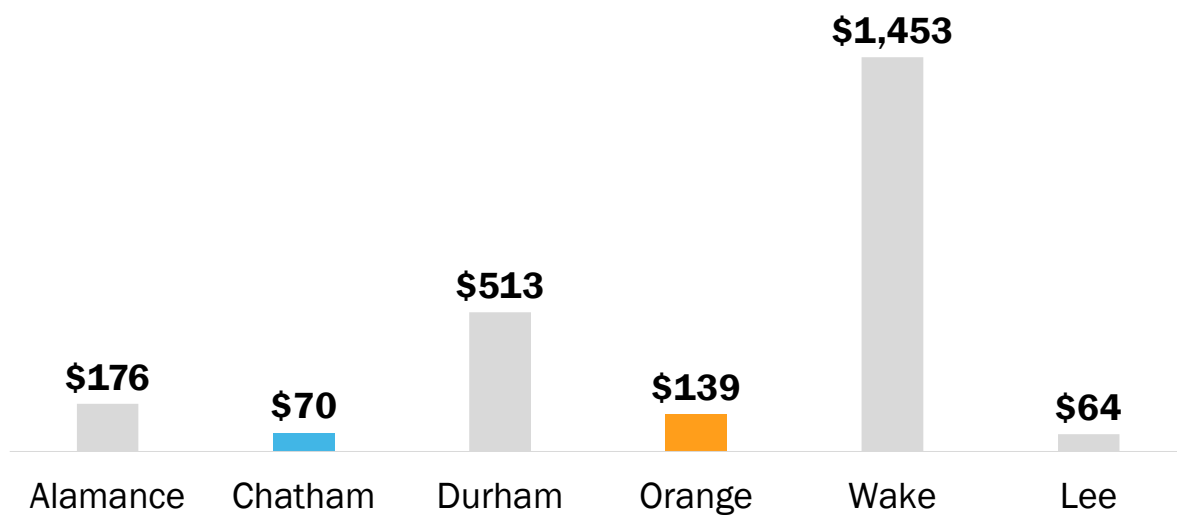
Chatham County sales tax collections (in millions), FY2015 to FY2023

Gross Sales Tax Collection FY2024 (in millions)

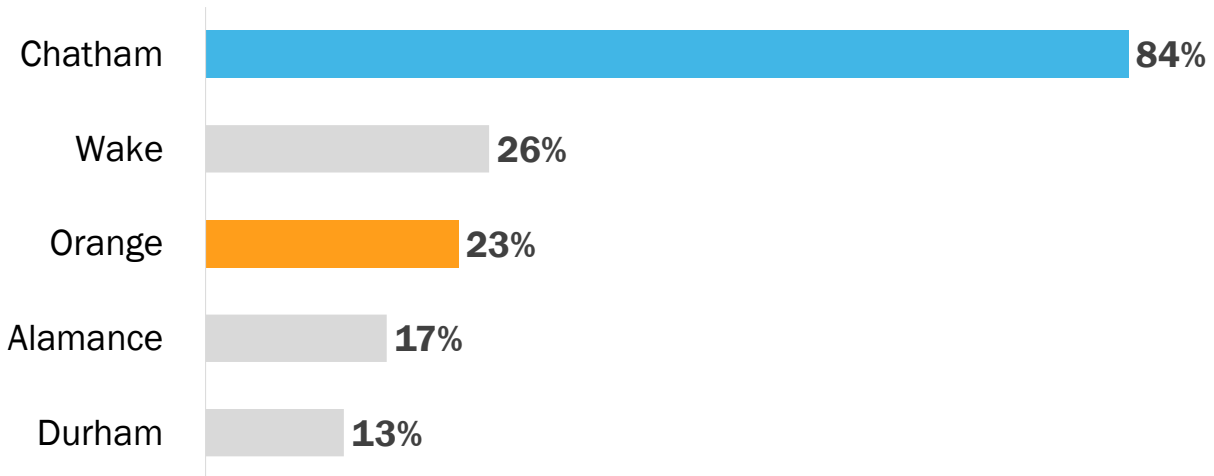

Taxable Sales Growth FY2019 to FY2024 (inflation adjusted \$2024)

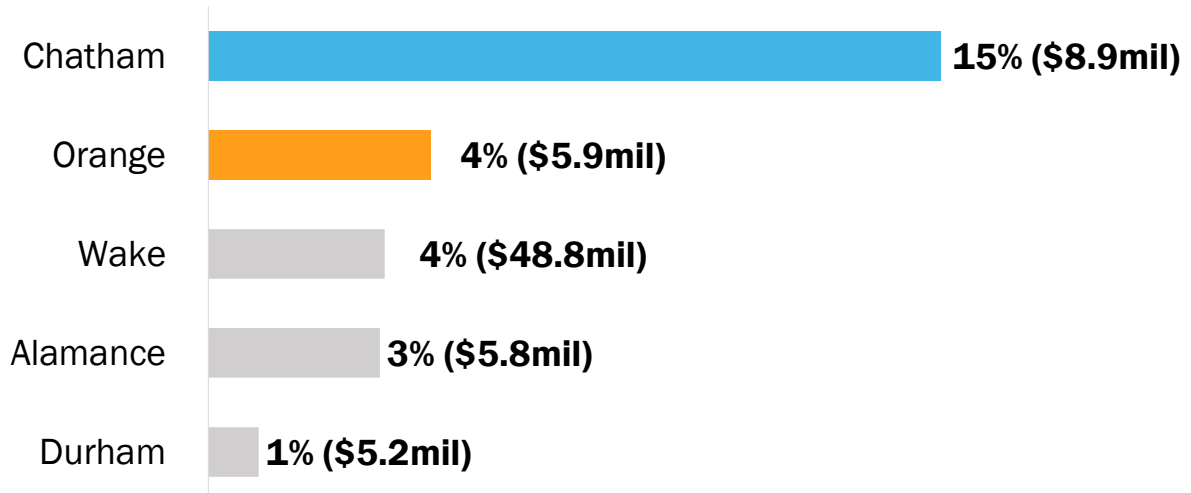

Sales and Use Tax Collections Change FY2023 to FY2024

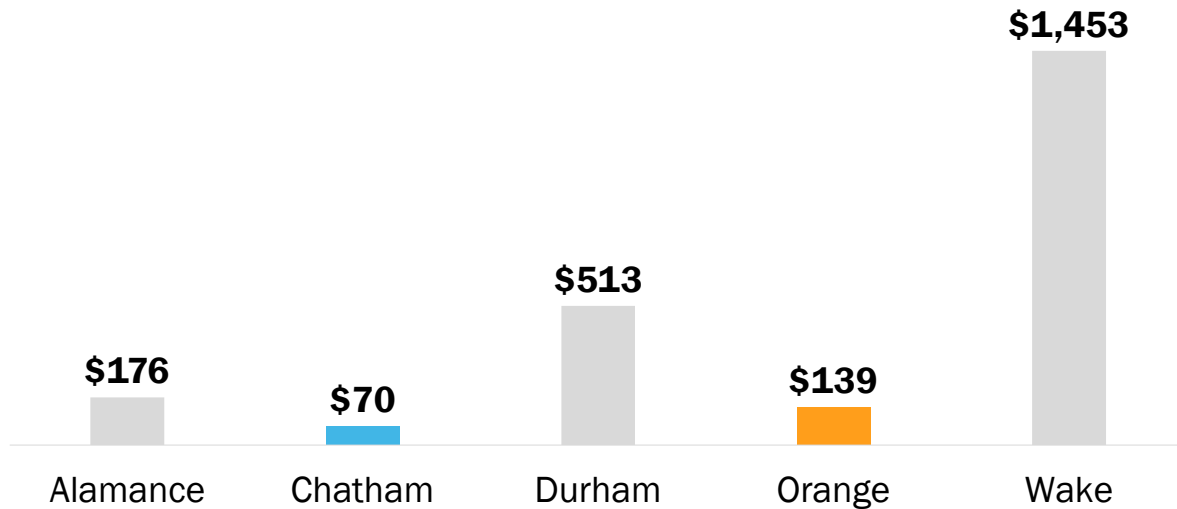
Percent and dollar increase in gross Sales and Use Tax collections, from FY2023 to FY2024

Gross Sales Tax Collection FY2024 (in millions)

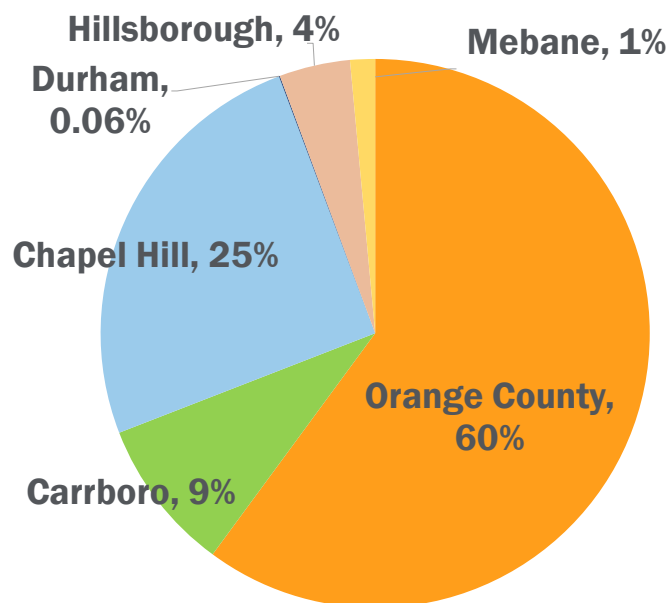

How Orange County's Local Sales and Use Tax is distributed to the county & among its municipalities, FY2024



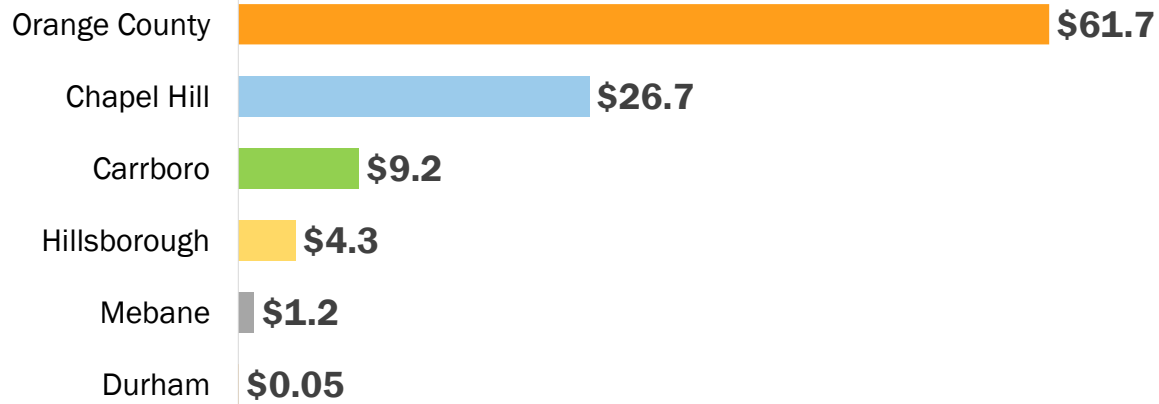

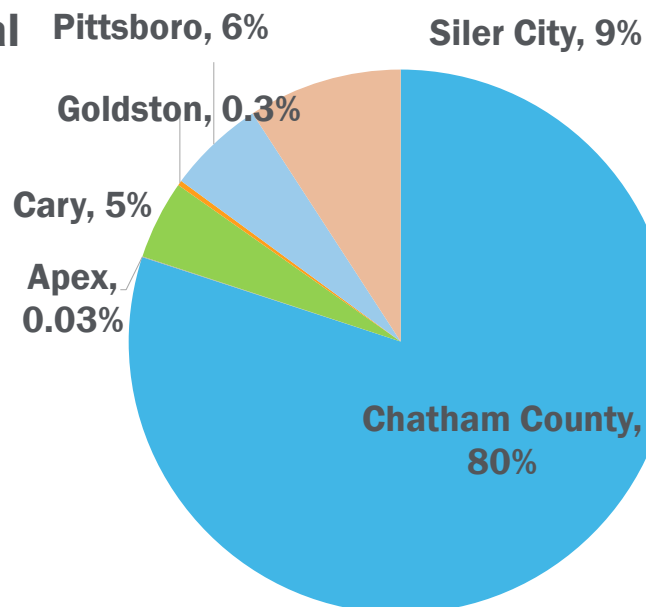

How Chatham County's Local Sales and Use Tax is distributed to the county & among its municipalities, FY2024



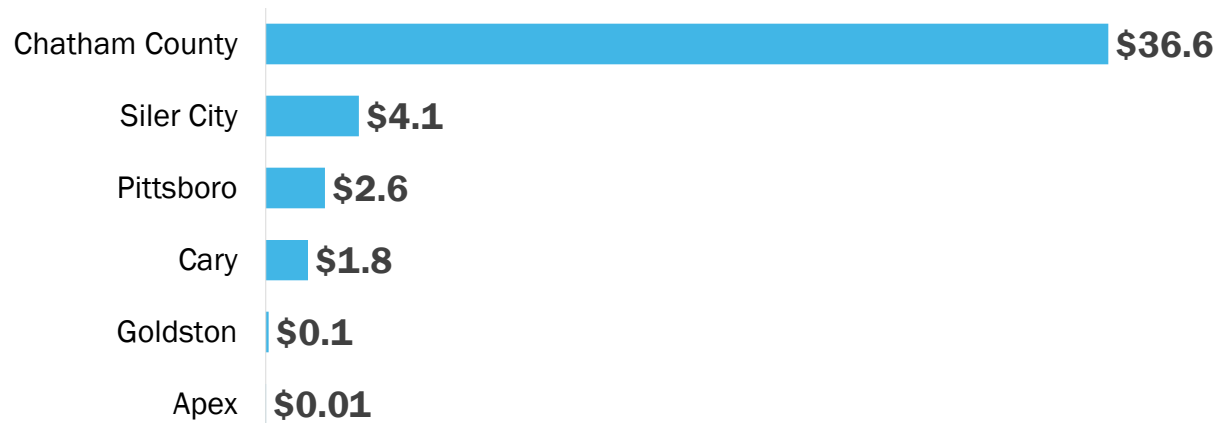

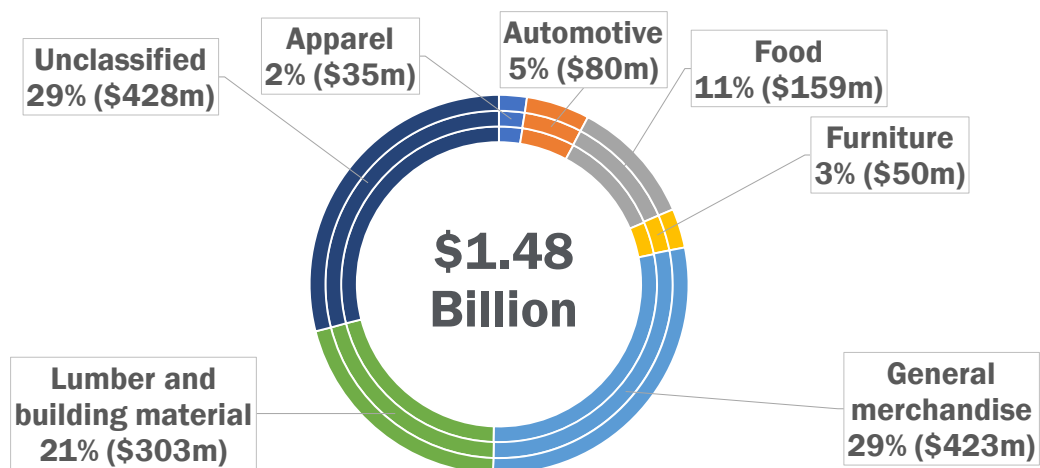

Chatham County taxable sales and purchases by major business category, FY2024

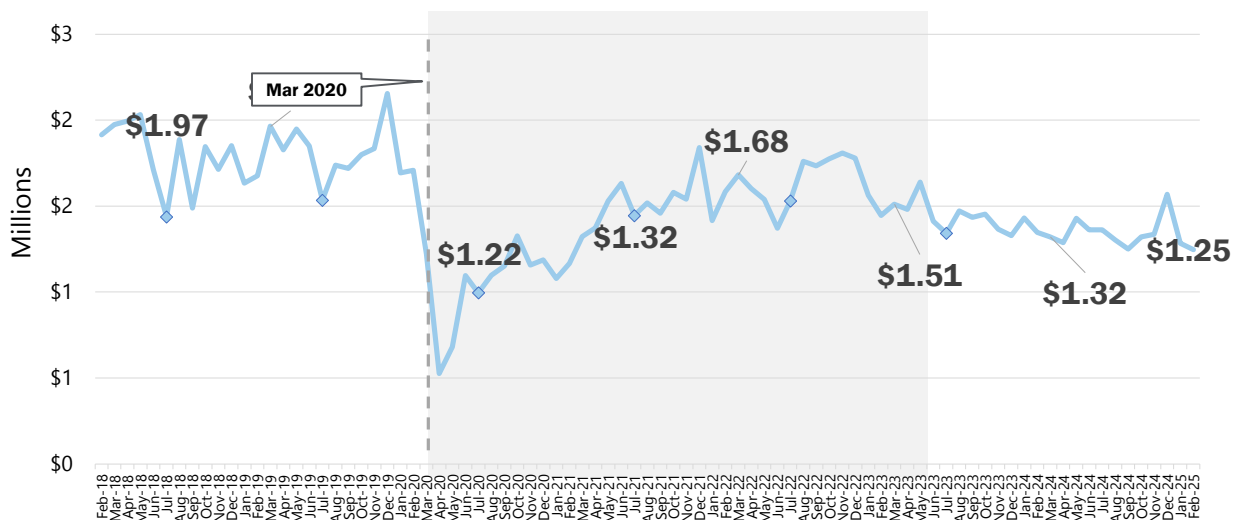

Cohort of 45 local businesses' combined monthly credit card transaction values, Feb 2018 – Feb 2025

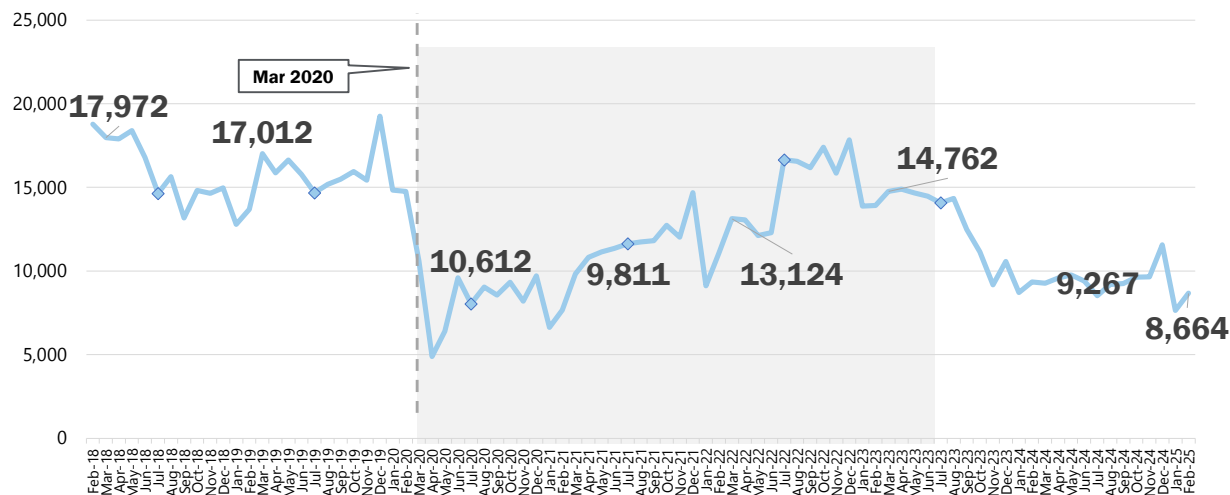

Cohort of 45 local businesses' number of monthly credit card transactions, Feb 2018 – Feb 2025

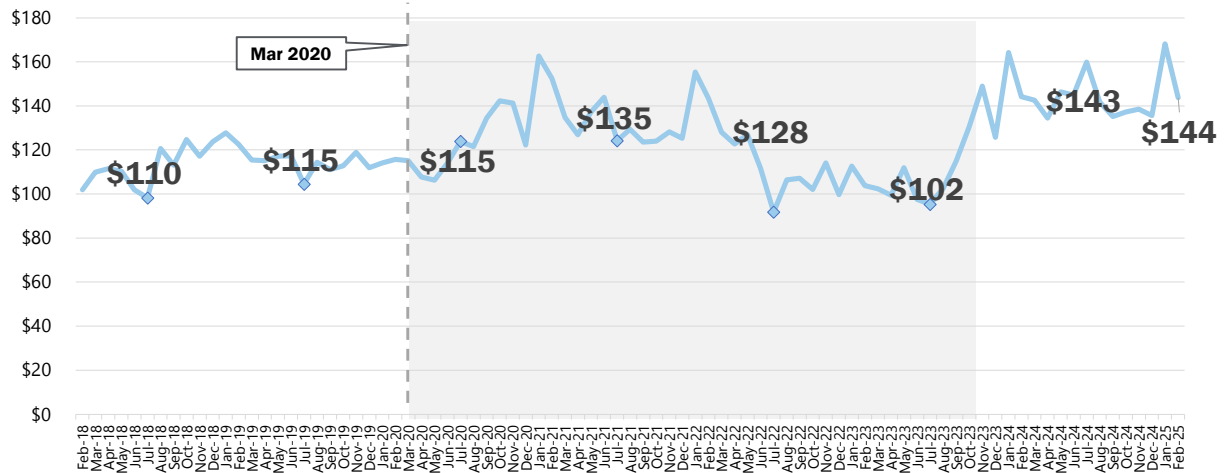

In millions; inflation adjusted \$2023

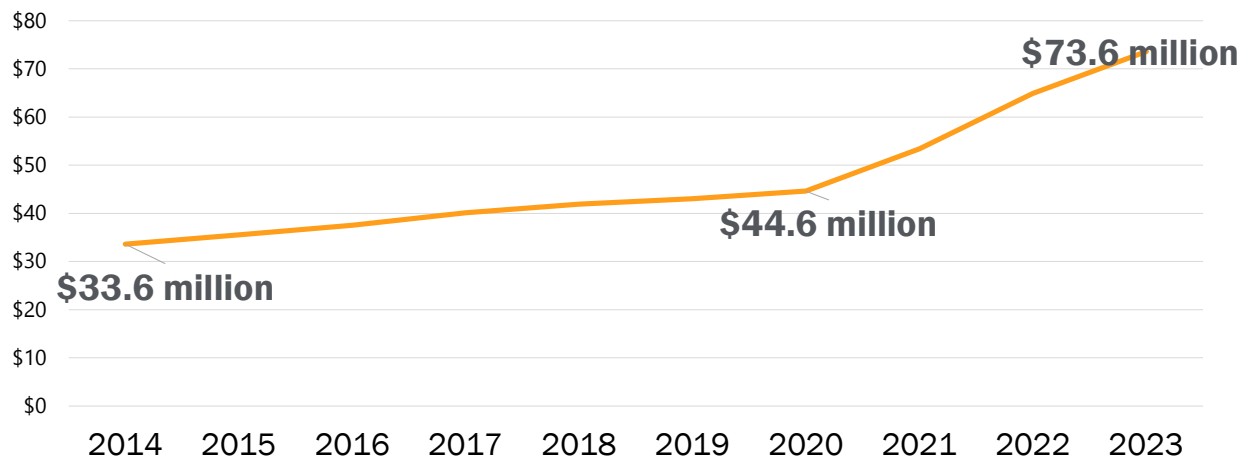

Tourism labor payroll is income supported by tourism spending, FY2014 to FY2023 (inflation adjusted \$2023)

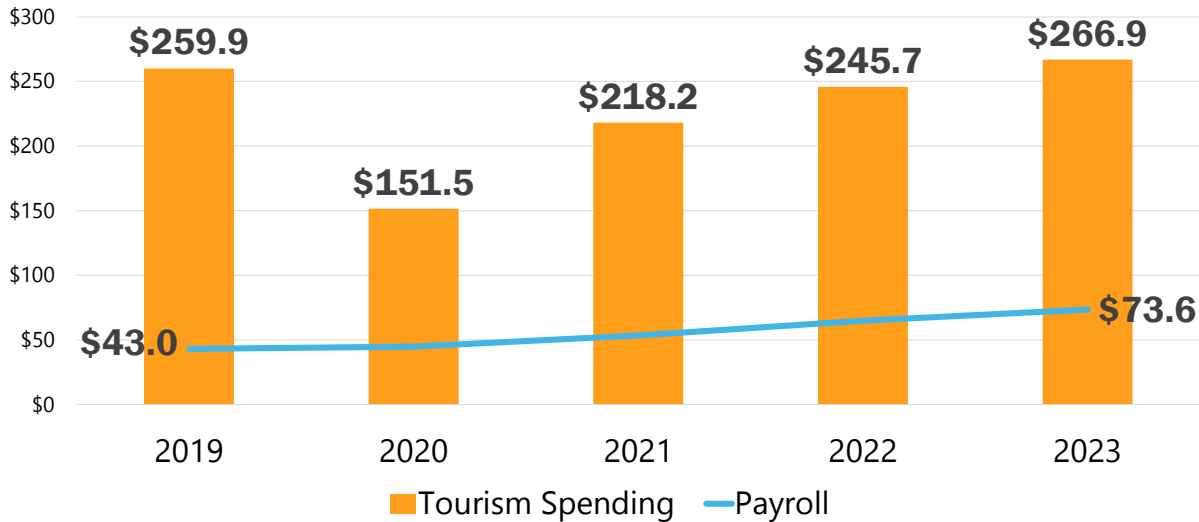

Inflation adjusted \$2023

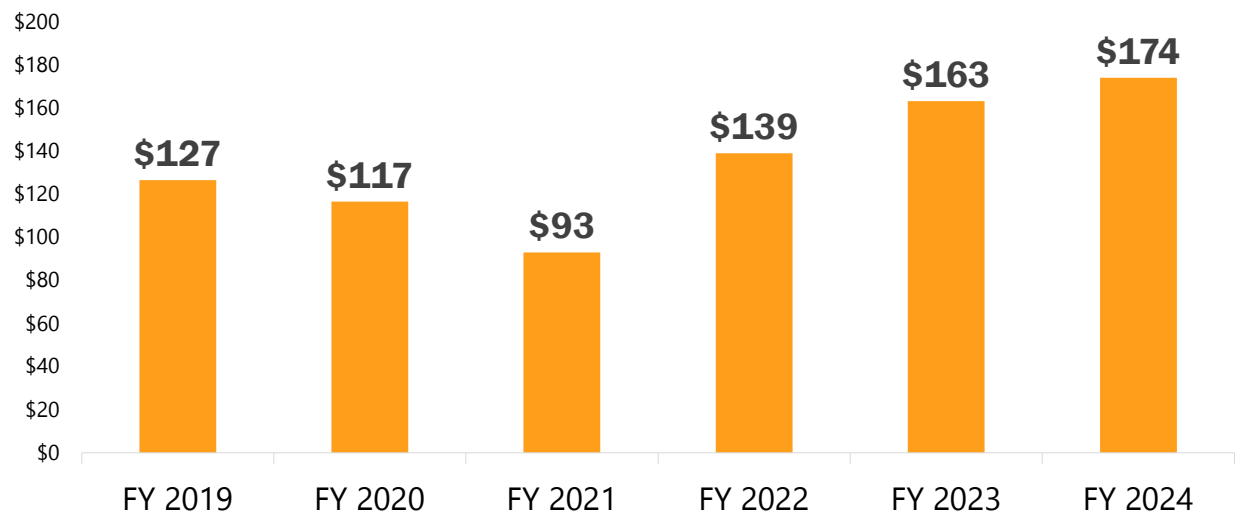

County average daily hotel room rate, FY2019 to FY2024

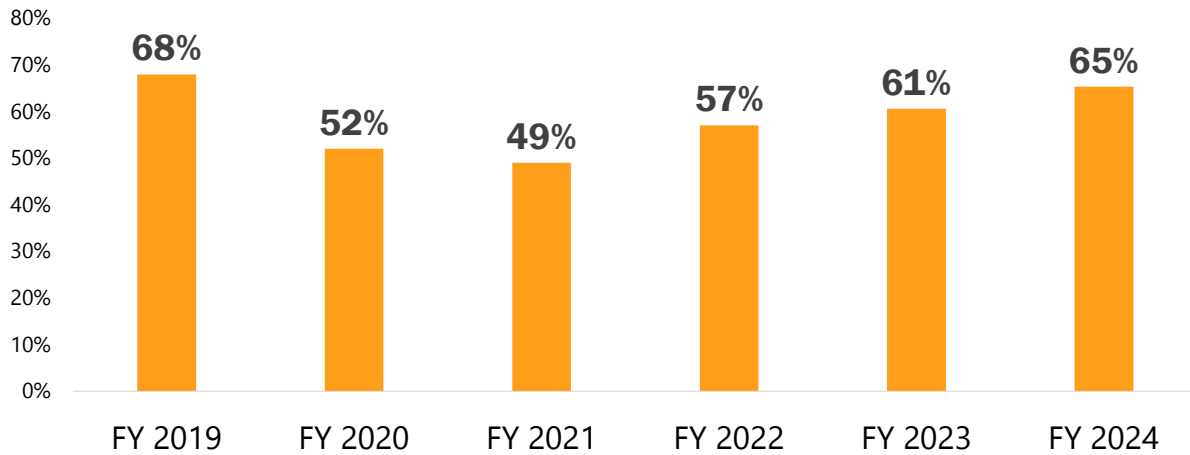

County average daily hotel occupancy rate, FY2019 to FY2024

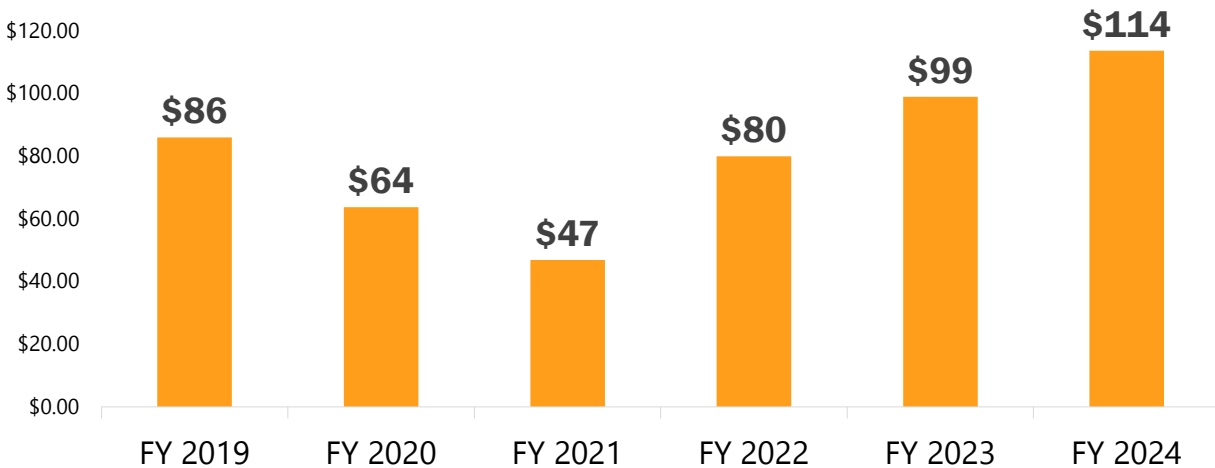

Orange County Average Revenue Per Available Room

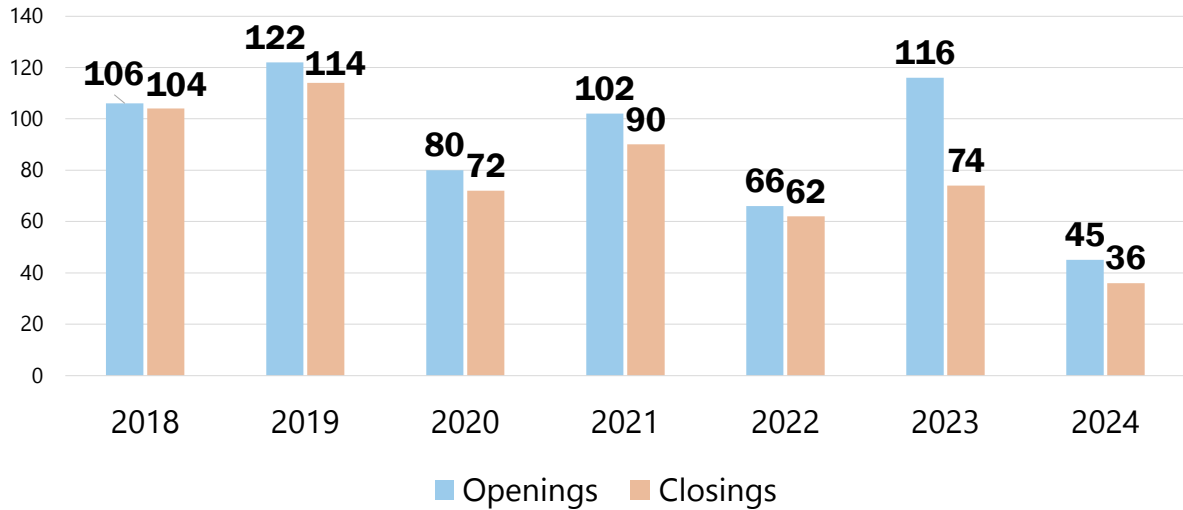
County average Revenue Per Available Room (RevPAR), FY2019 to FY2024

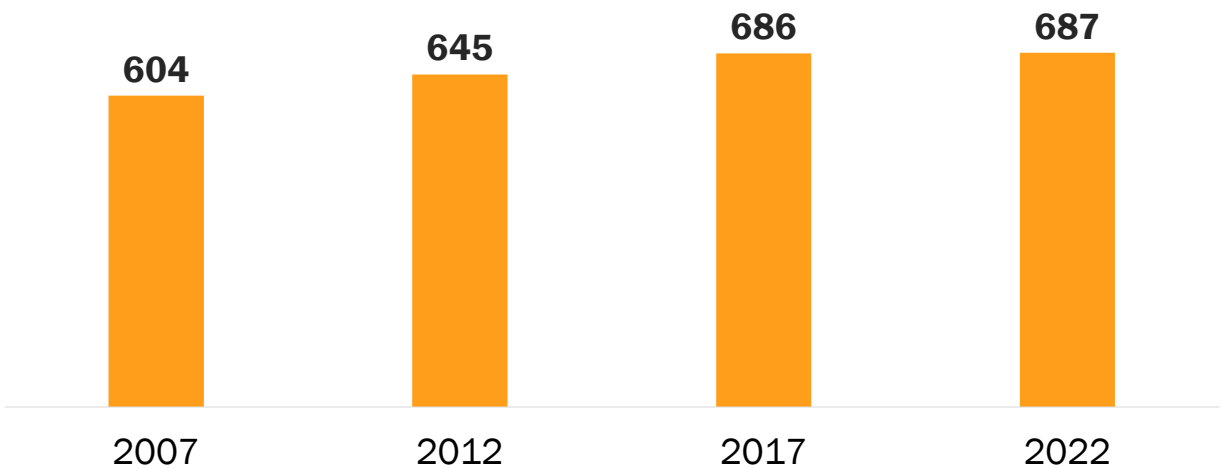

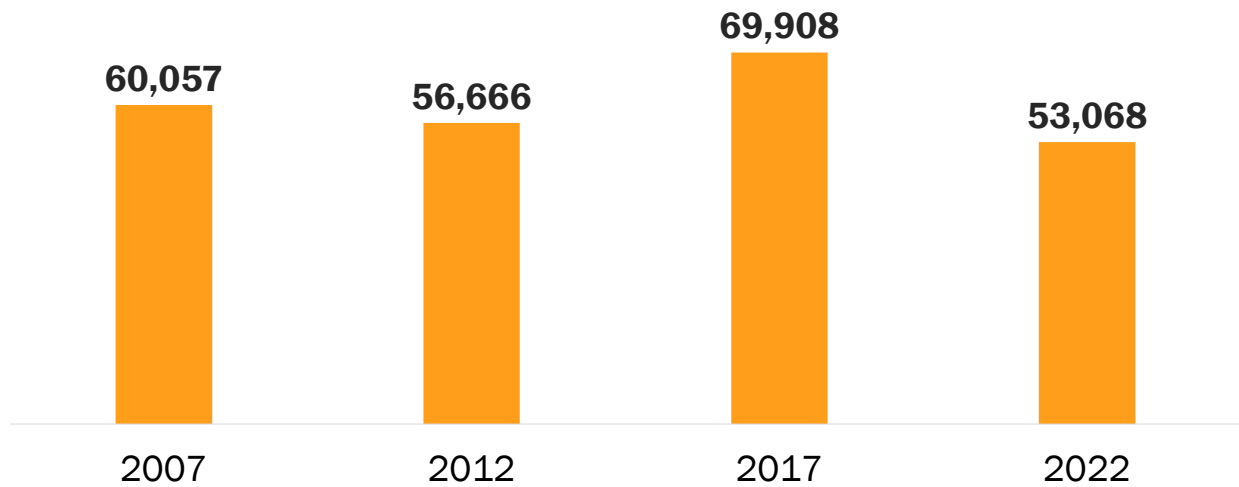

Total acres being farmed as reported in the semi-decennial USDA's Census of Agriculture

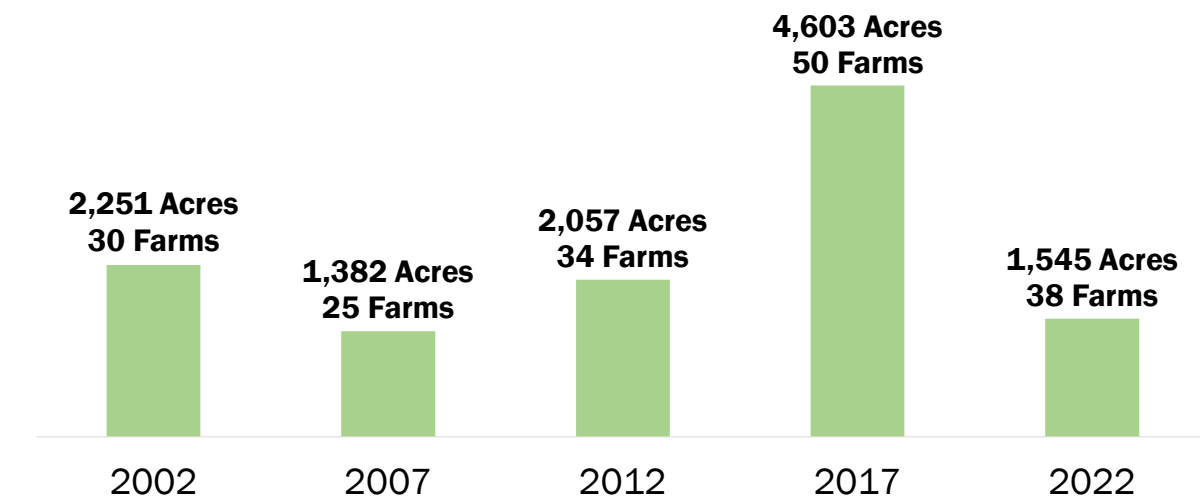

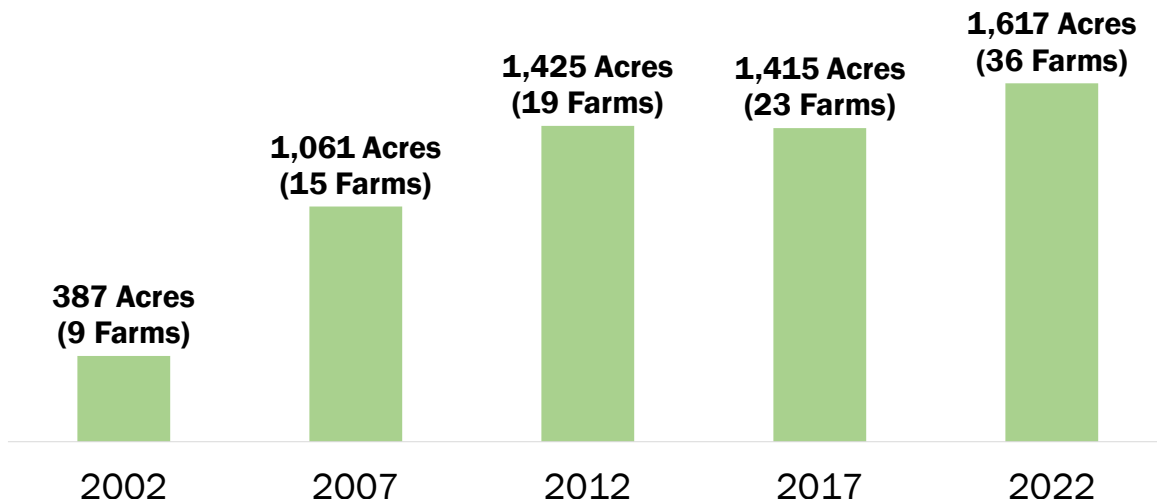

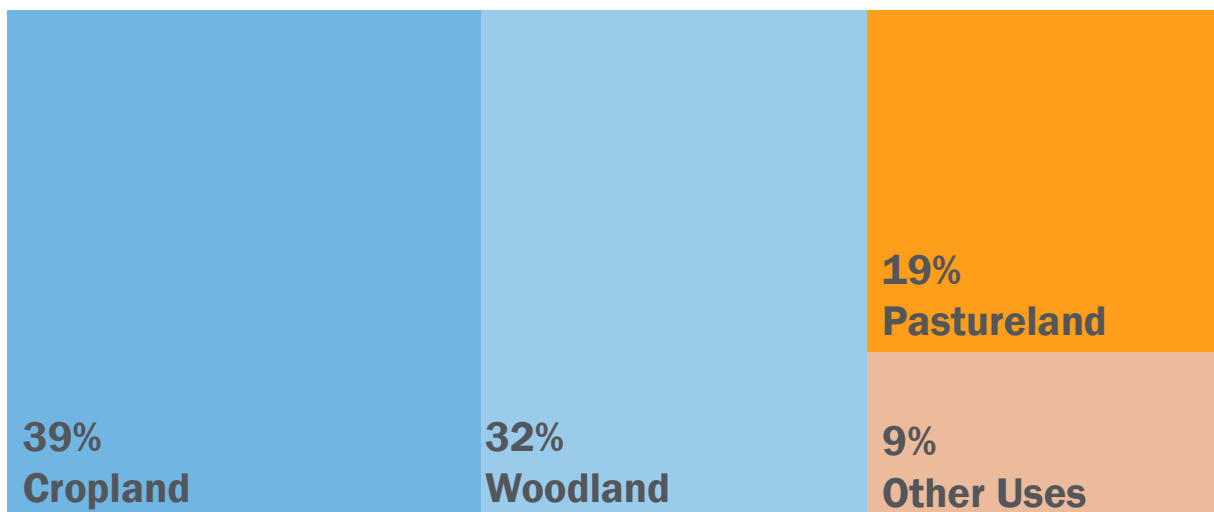

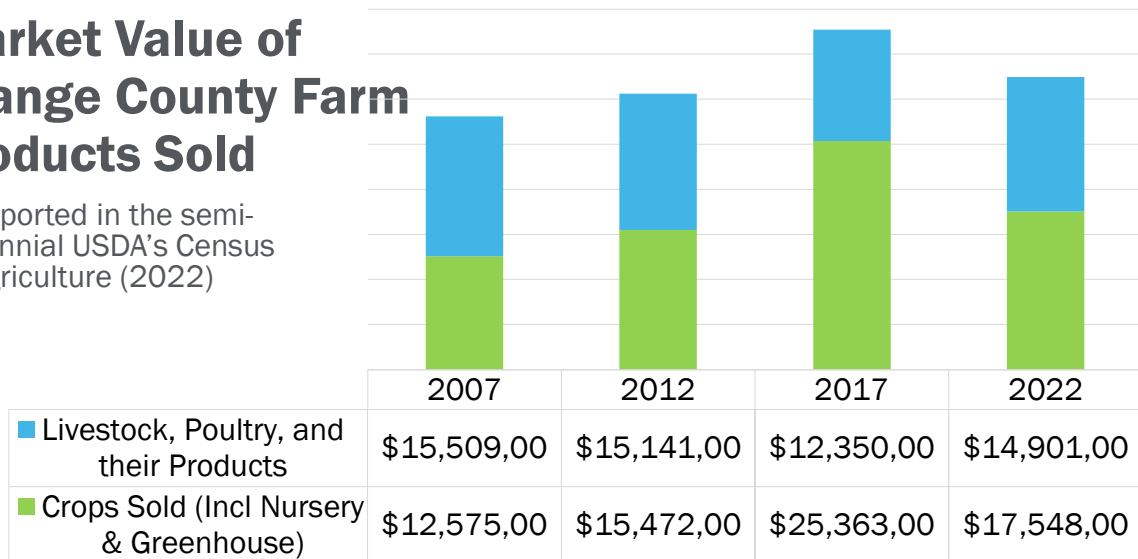

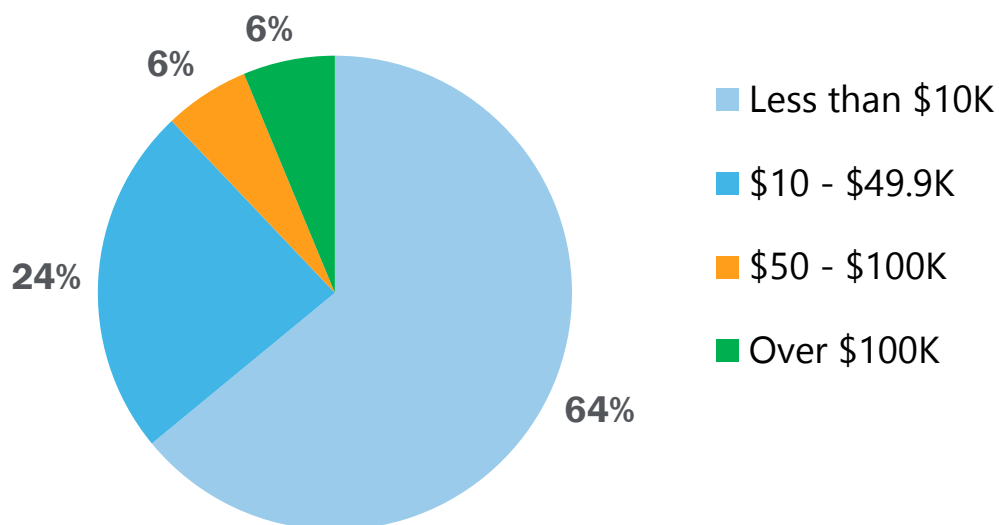

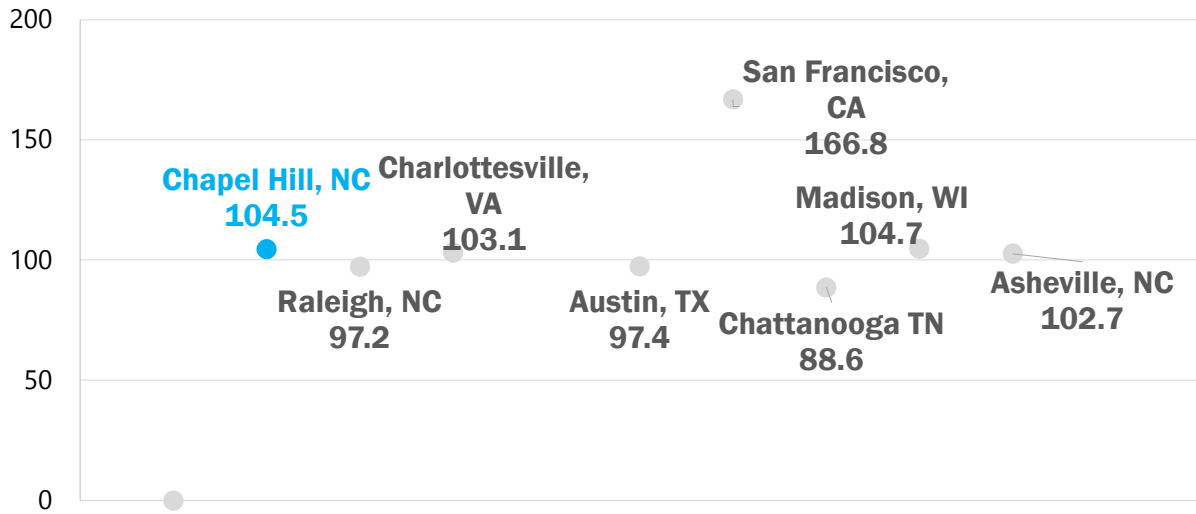

For Quarter 3, 2024. 100 = national average

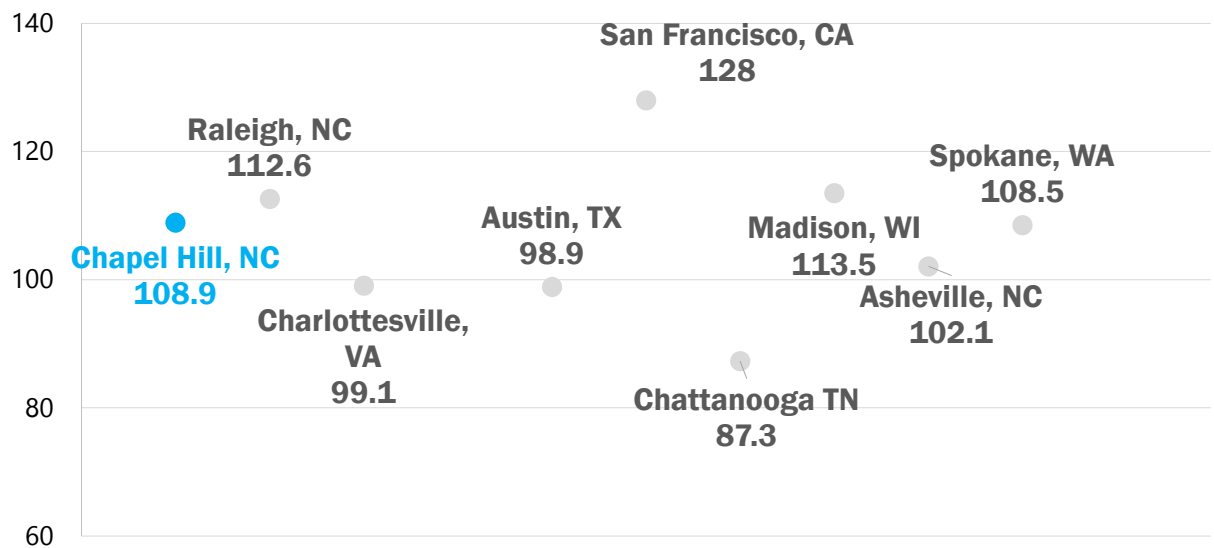

For Quarter 3, 2024. 100 = national average

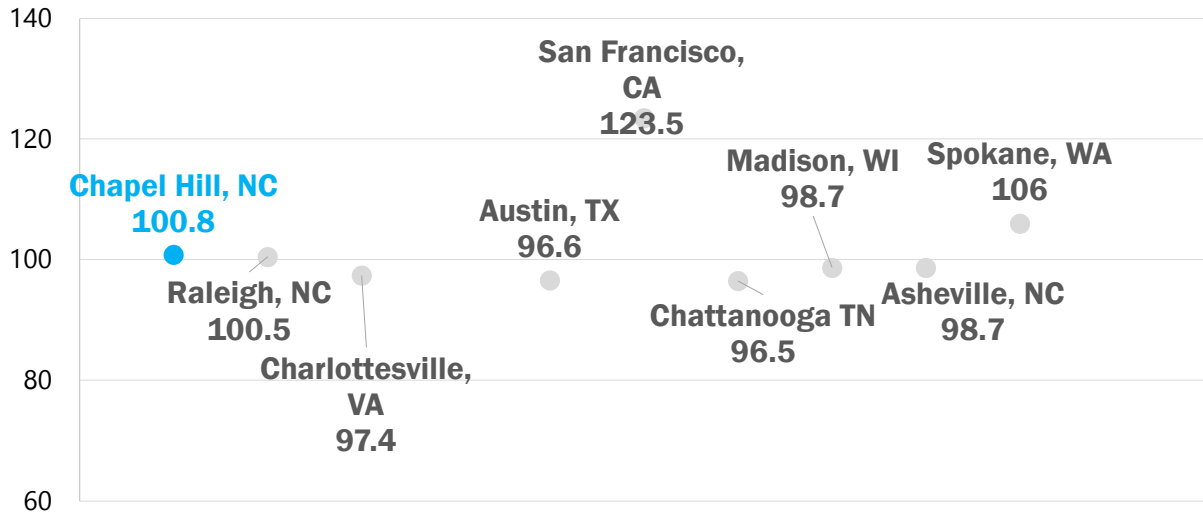

For Quarter 3, 2024. 100 = national average

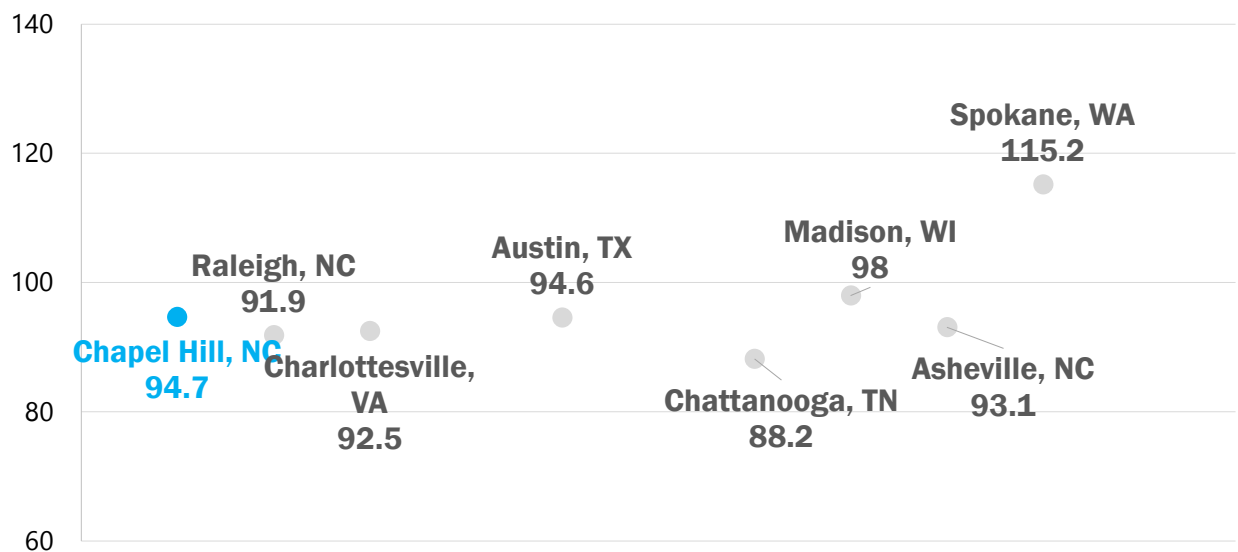

For Quarter 3, 2024. 100 = national average



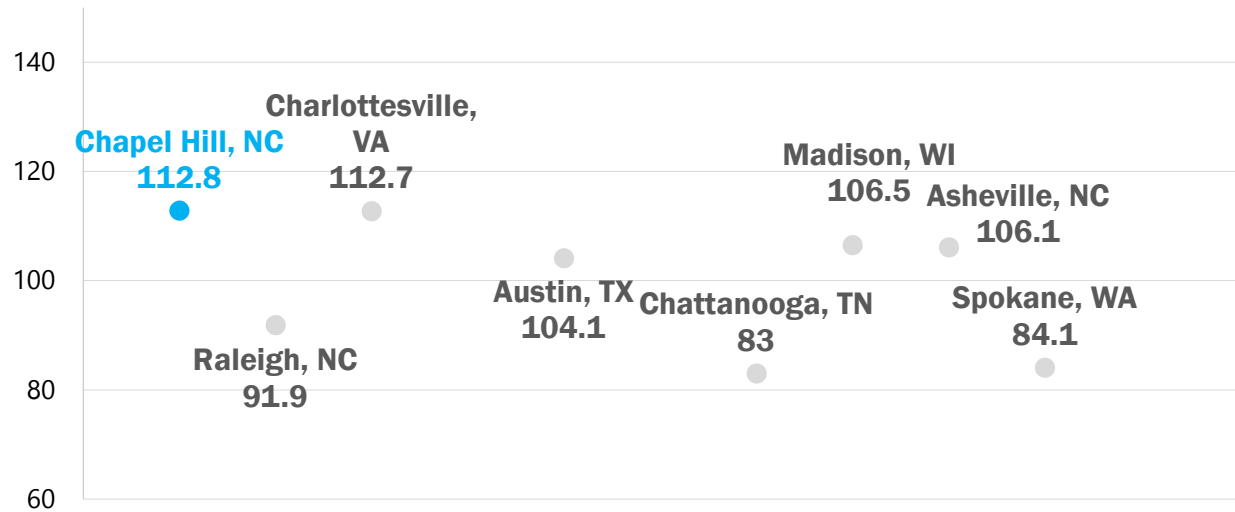

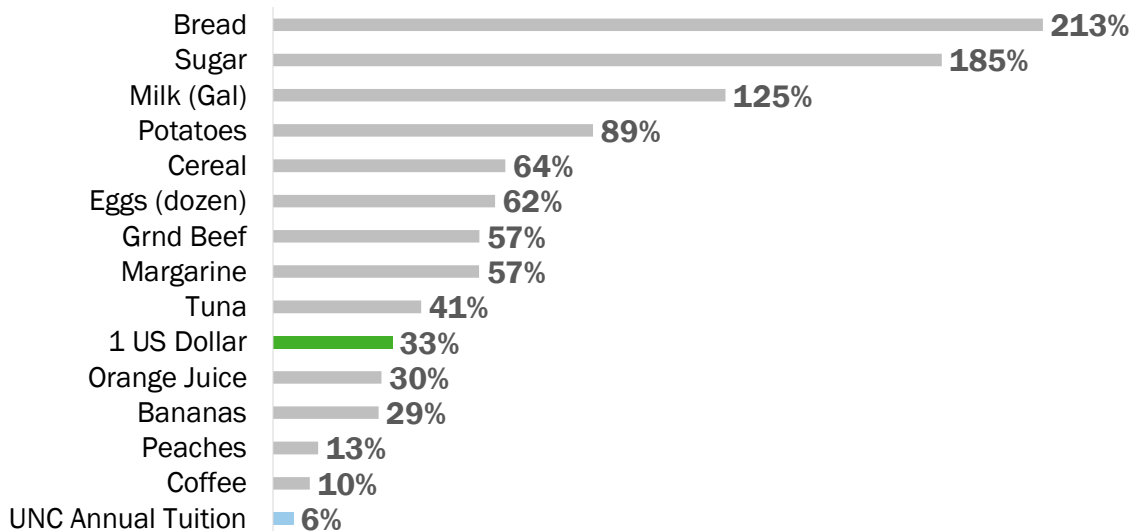

Increase of the price of each item in Greater Chapel Hill 2015-2024, as collected and reported to the Council for Community and Economic Research

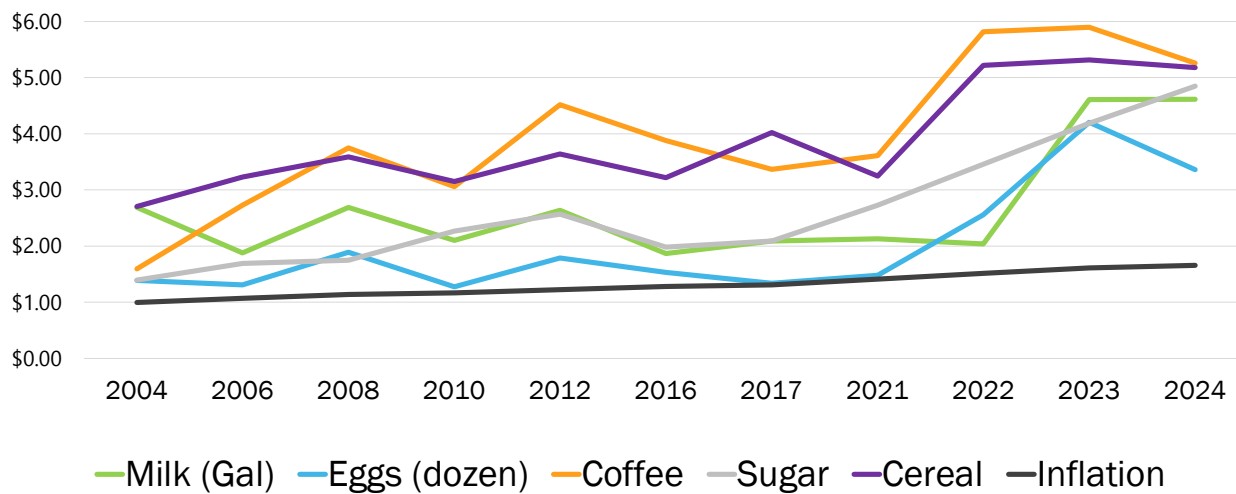

Increase of the price of each item in Greater Chapel Hill 2004-2024, as collected and reported to the Council for Community and Economic Research

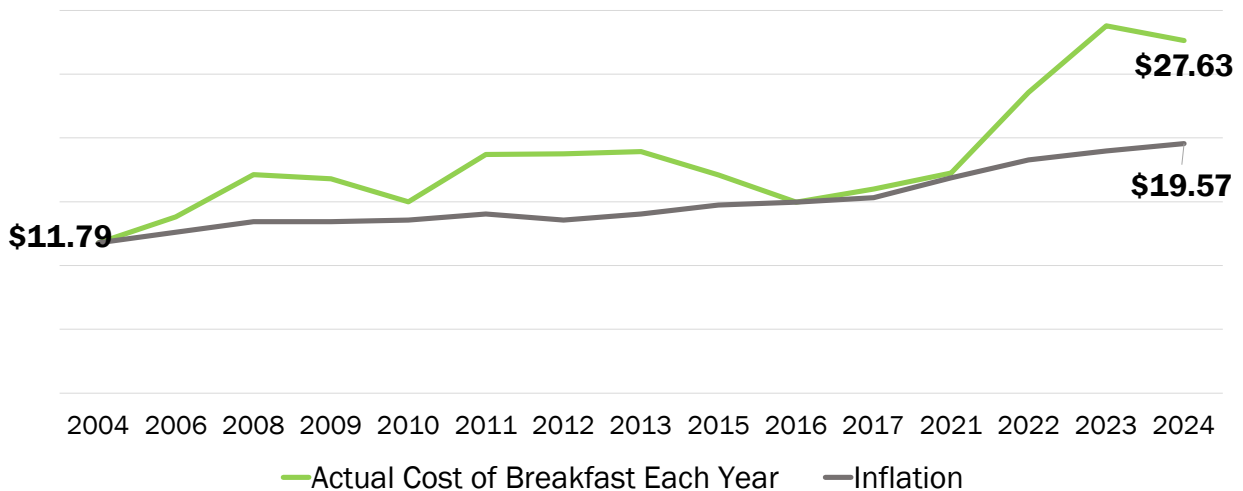

Tracking the cost of milk + eggs + cereal + sugar + coffee from 2004 through 2024, compared with annual rate of inflation during the same period

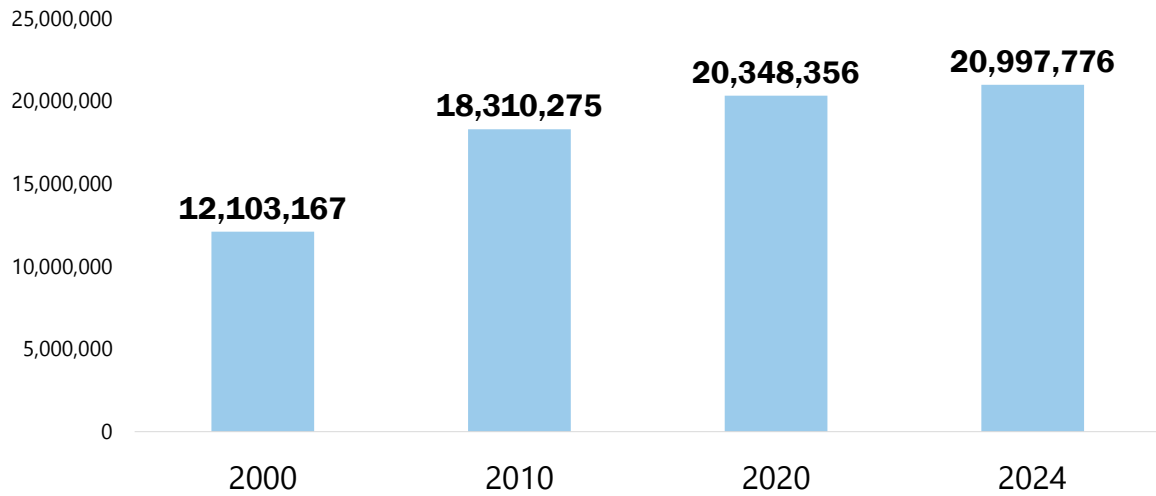

Square footage of UNC Chapel Hill campus facilities 2000, 2010, 2020, 2024

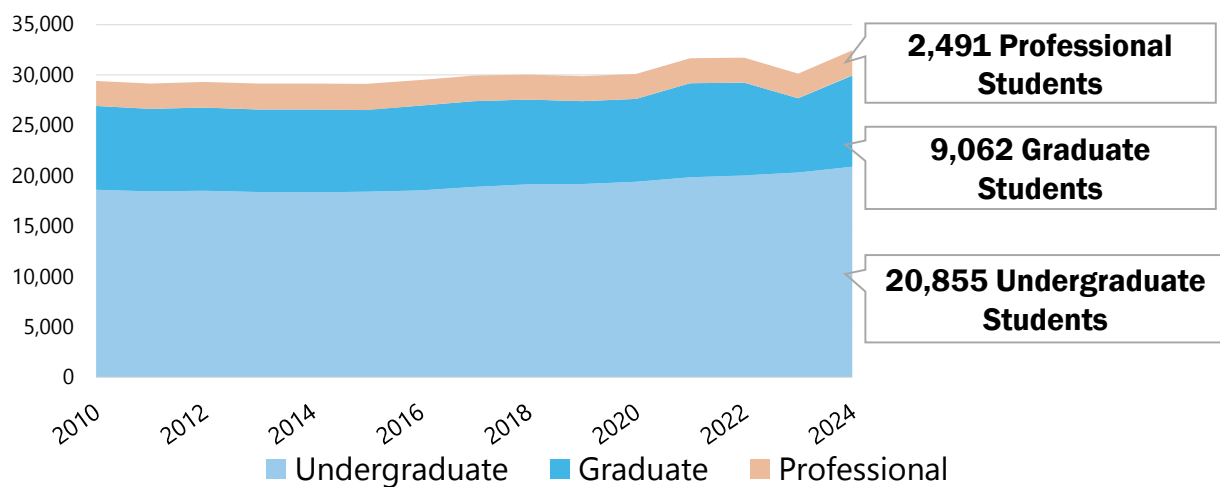

Total student population in Fall 2024

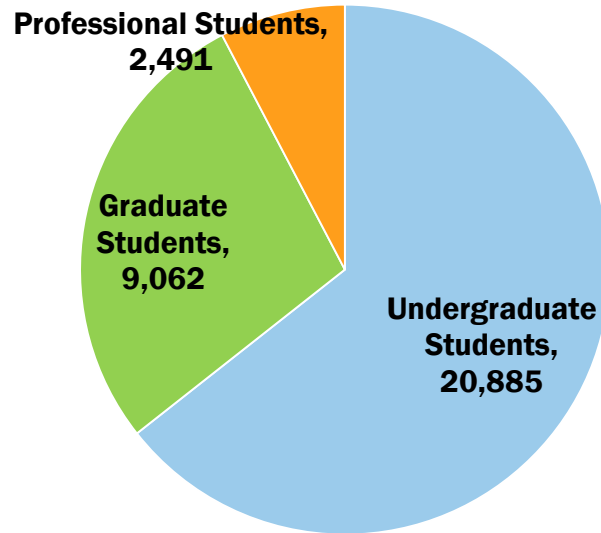

Fall 2024

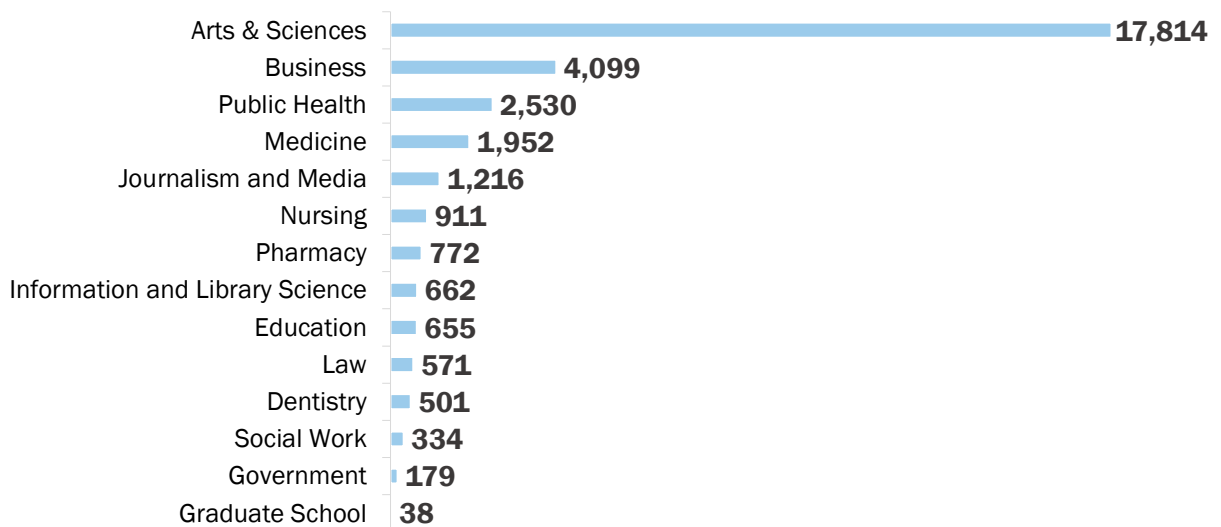

Fall 2023 headcount

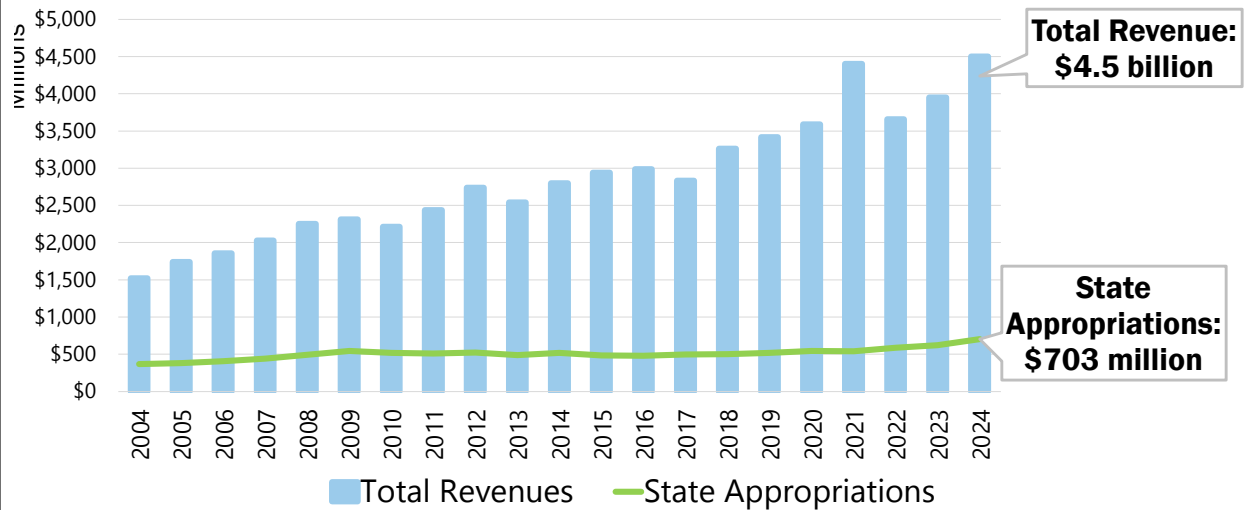

Total annual operating revenue compared with state appropriations between FY2004 and FY2024

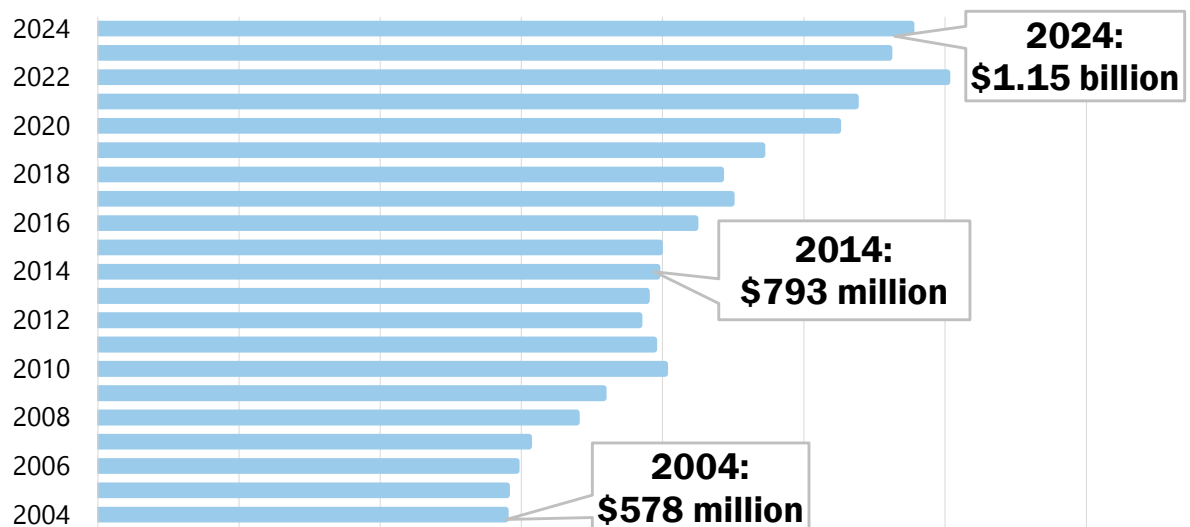

Value of annual research funding FY2004 through FY2024

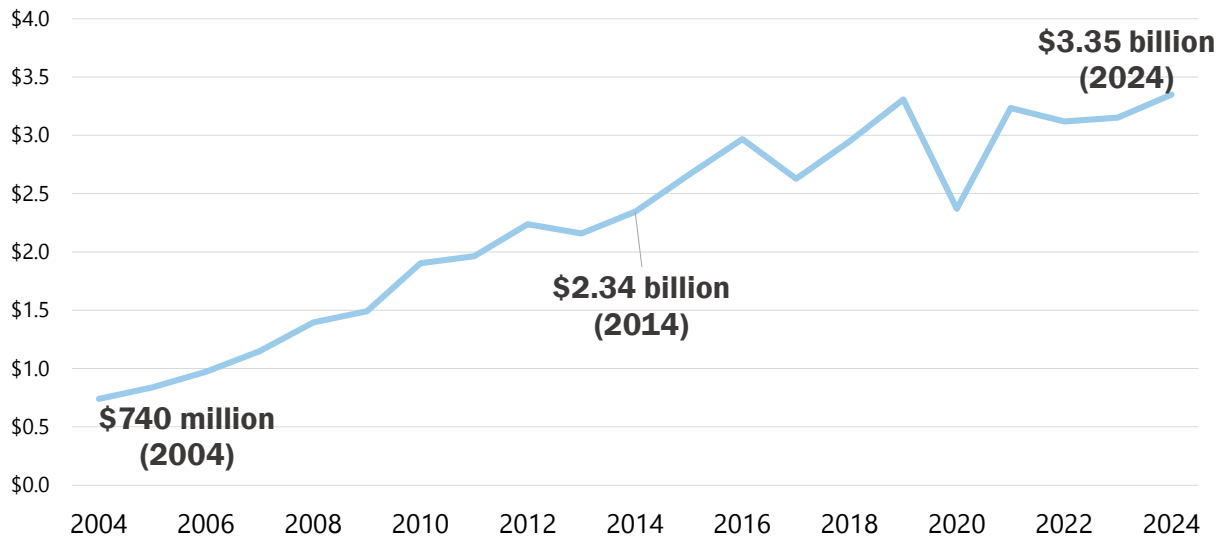

Value of UNC Chapel Hill Endowment (in billions), FY2004 through FY2024

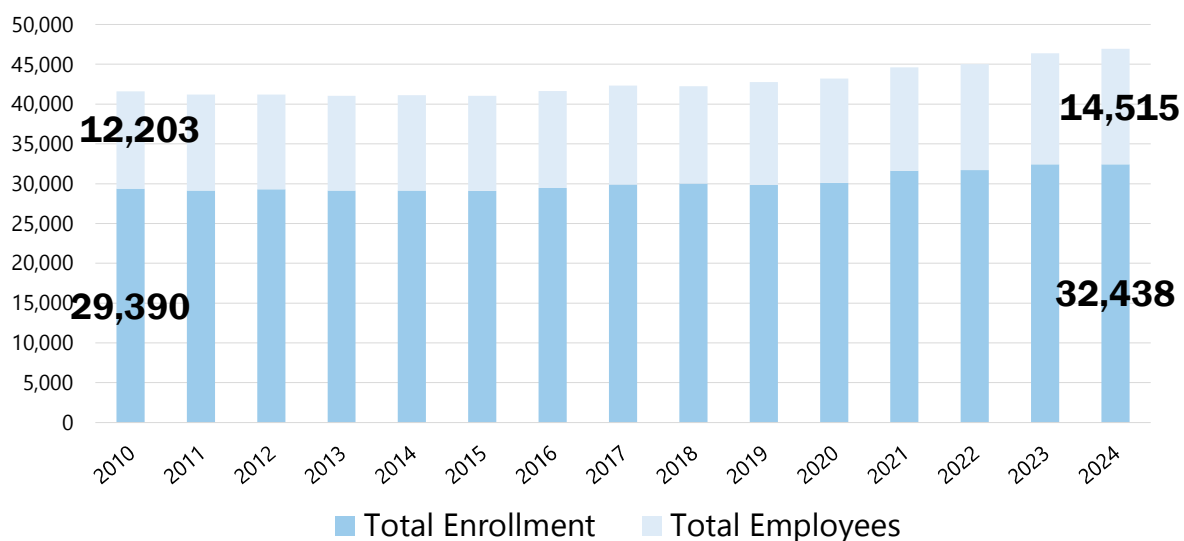

Total student enrollment compared with total employee count from 2010 to 2024

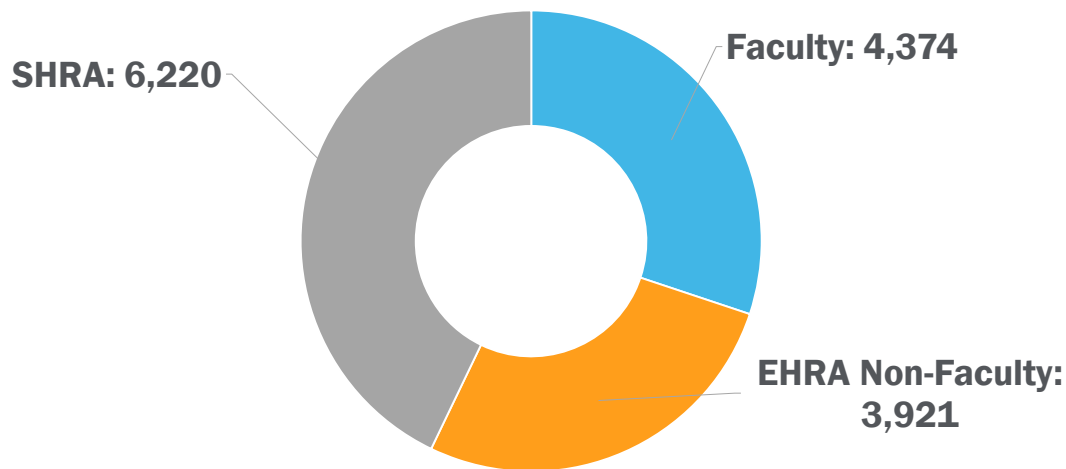

(FY2024) SHRA employees are Subject to the NC Human Resources Act and EHRA are Exempt from the Human Resources Act

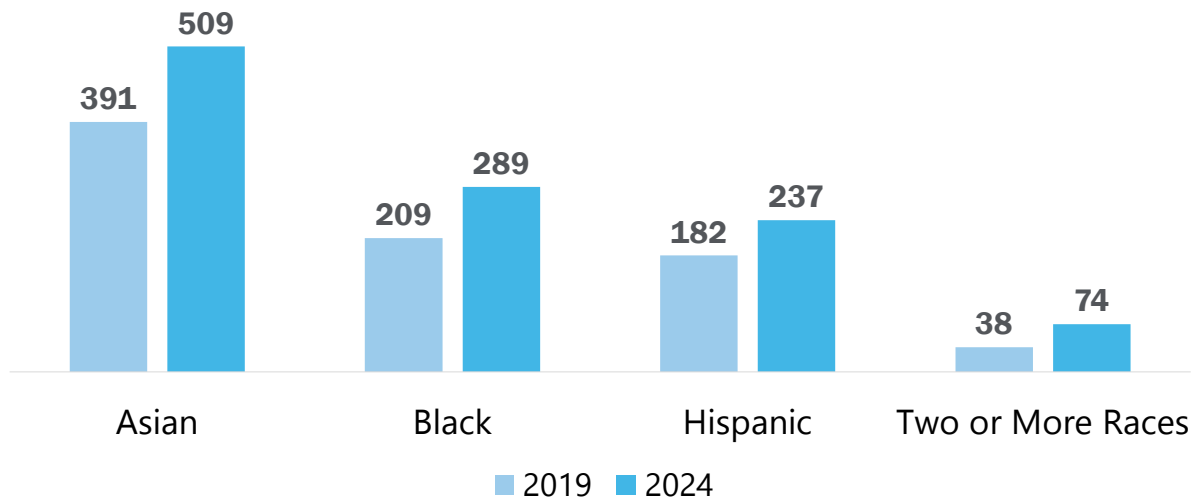

Non-white faculty by race/ethnicity comparing 2019 and 2024

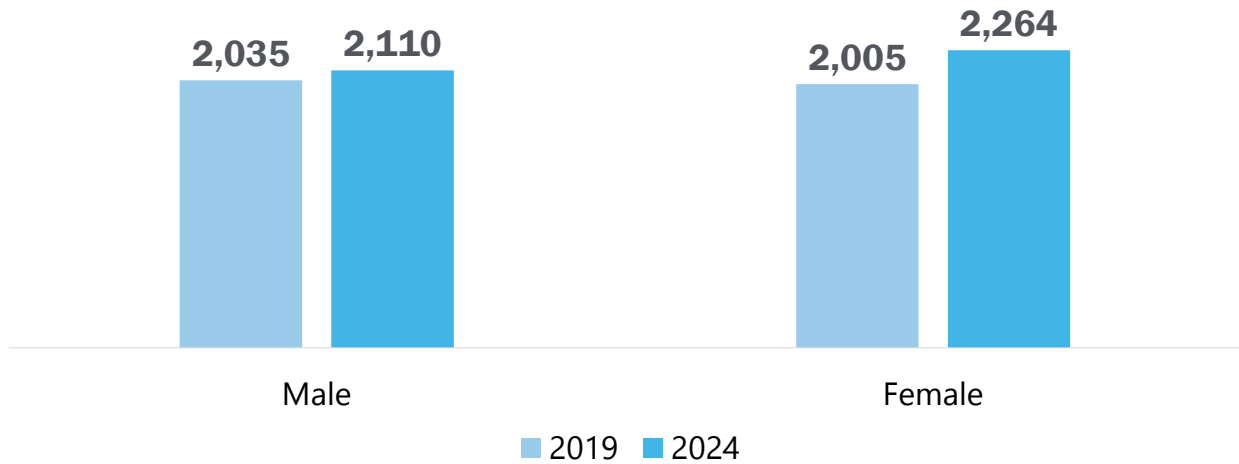

Comparing total faculty county by gender 2019 vs 2024

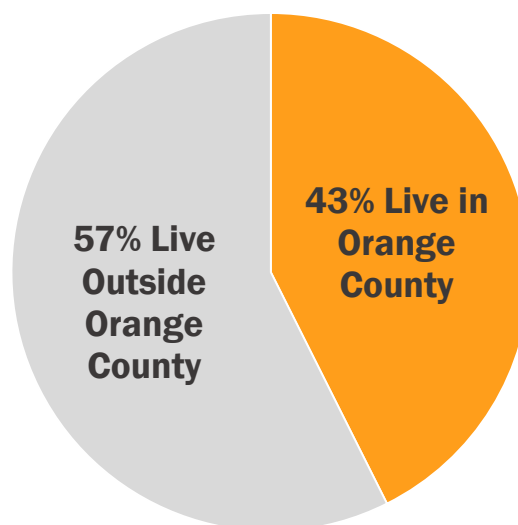

43% of UNC Chapel Hill employees live in Orange County in 2022, down from 46% in 2019

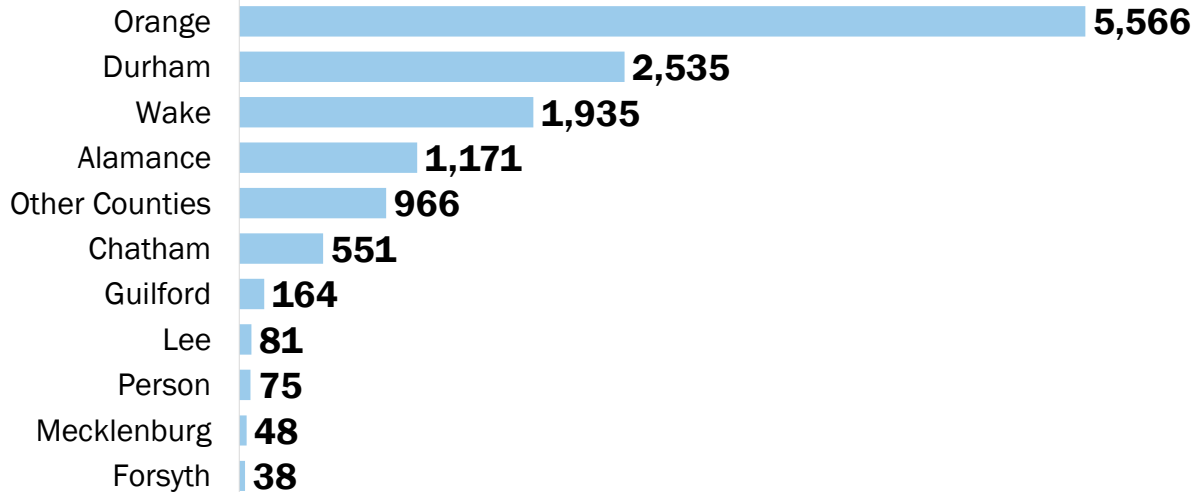

UNC Chapel Hill employees by county of home address, 2022

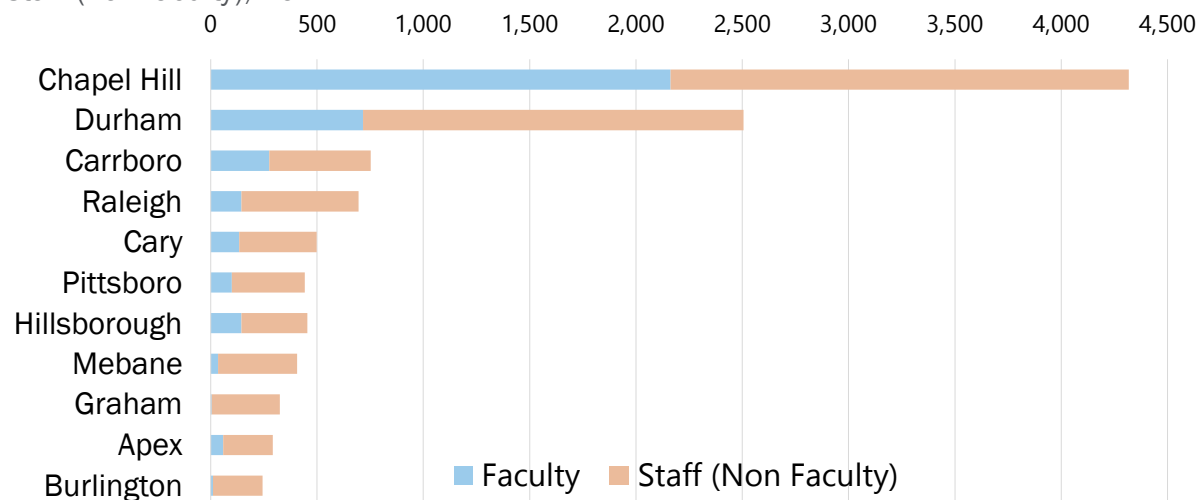

Top eleven cities where UNC Chapel Hill employees live broken down between faculty and staff (non faculty), 2022

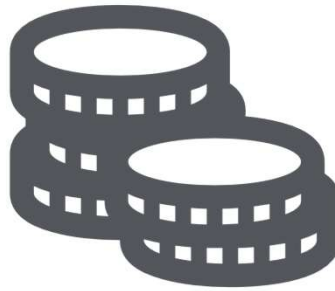

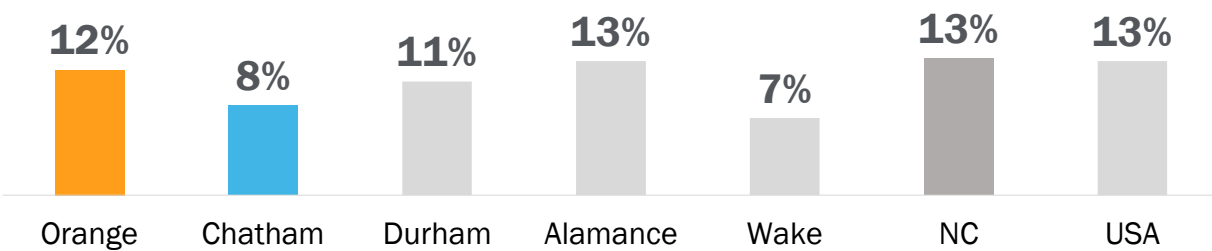

Percent of people (all ages) in poverty, 2023

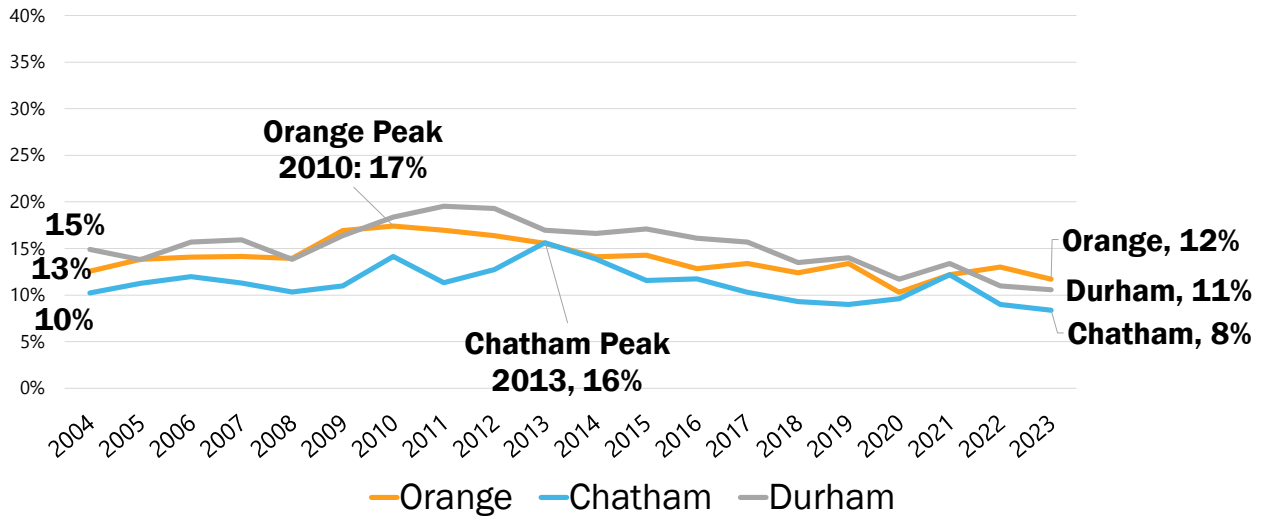

Percent of people (all ages) in poverty

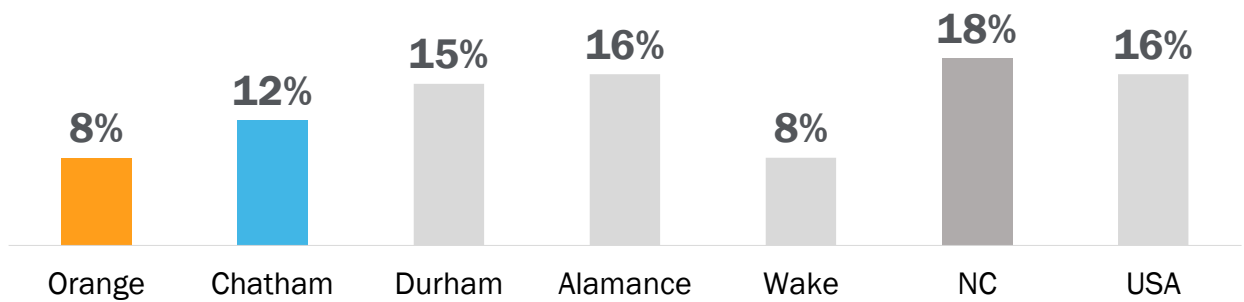

Percent of children (under 18) in poverty, 2023

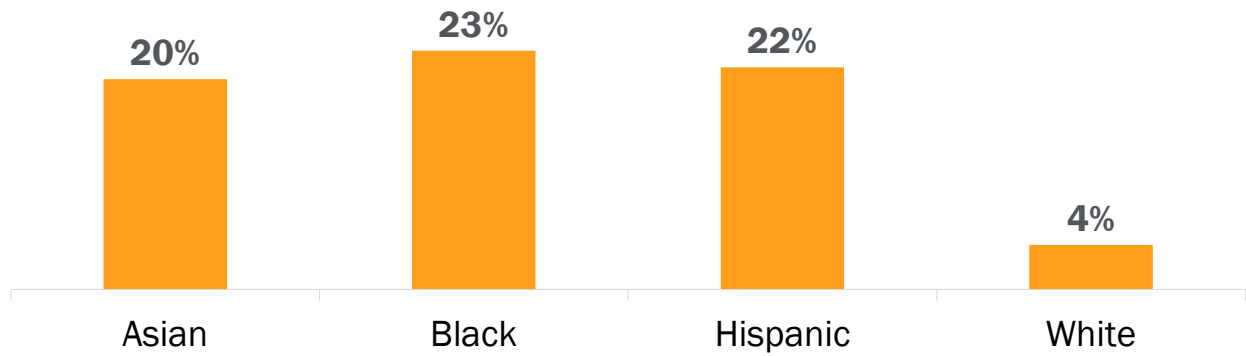

Percent of children (under 18) in poverty

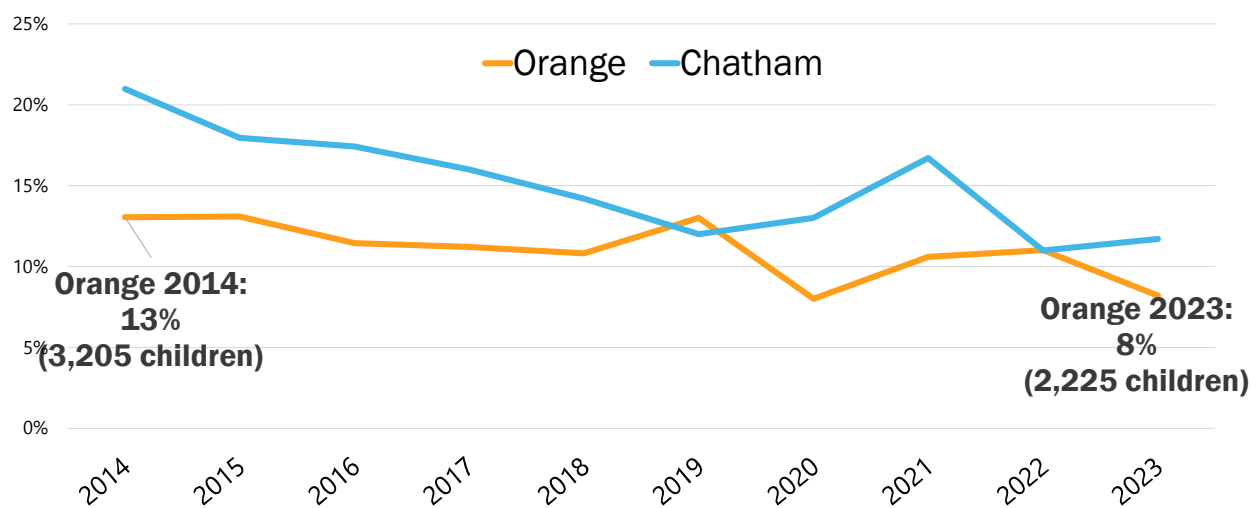

Percent (and number) of children (under 18) in poverty, 2014 through 2023

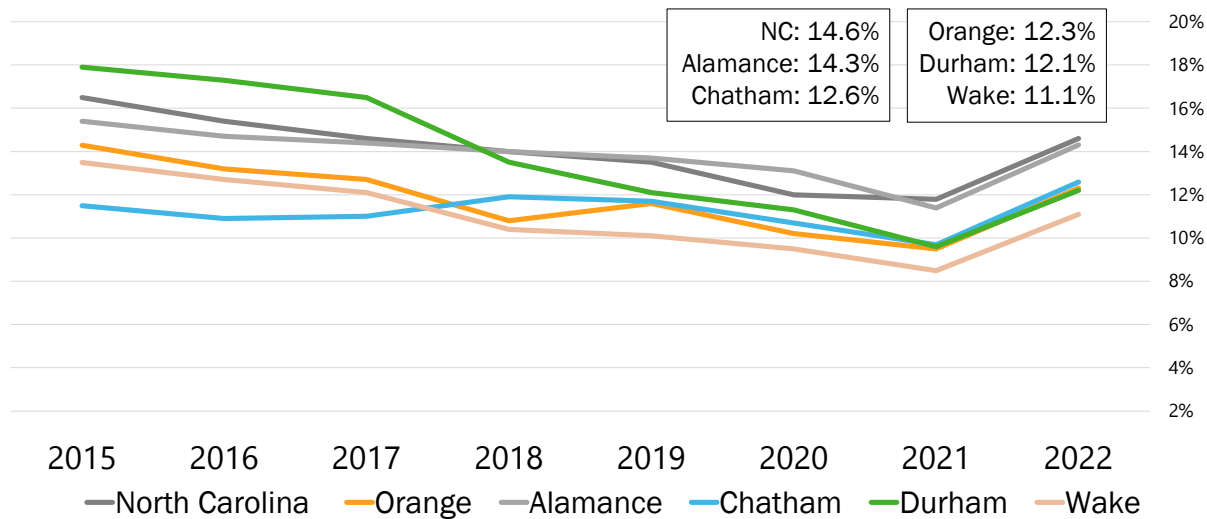

Food insecurity is a lack of consistent access to enough food for an active, healthy life, 2022

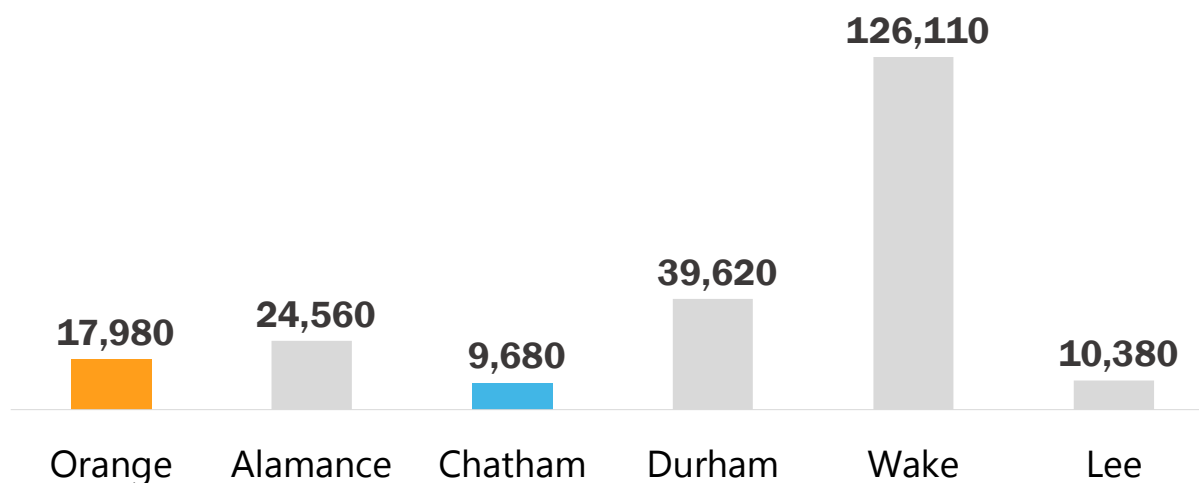

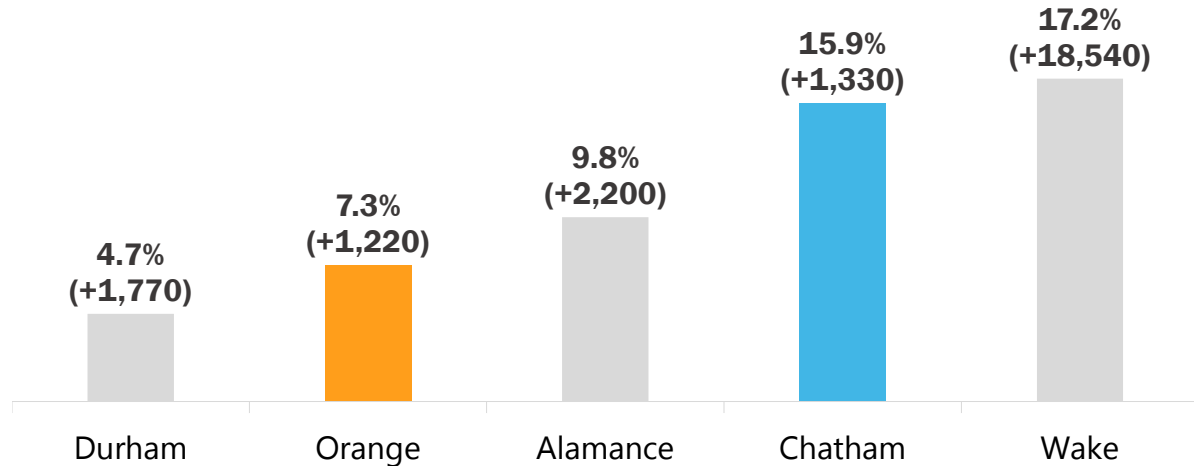

Percentage change in number of food insecure people, 2019 vs 2022. Food insecurity is a lack of consistent access to enough food for an active, healthy life

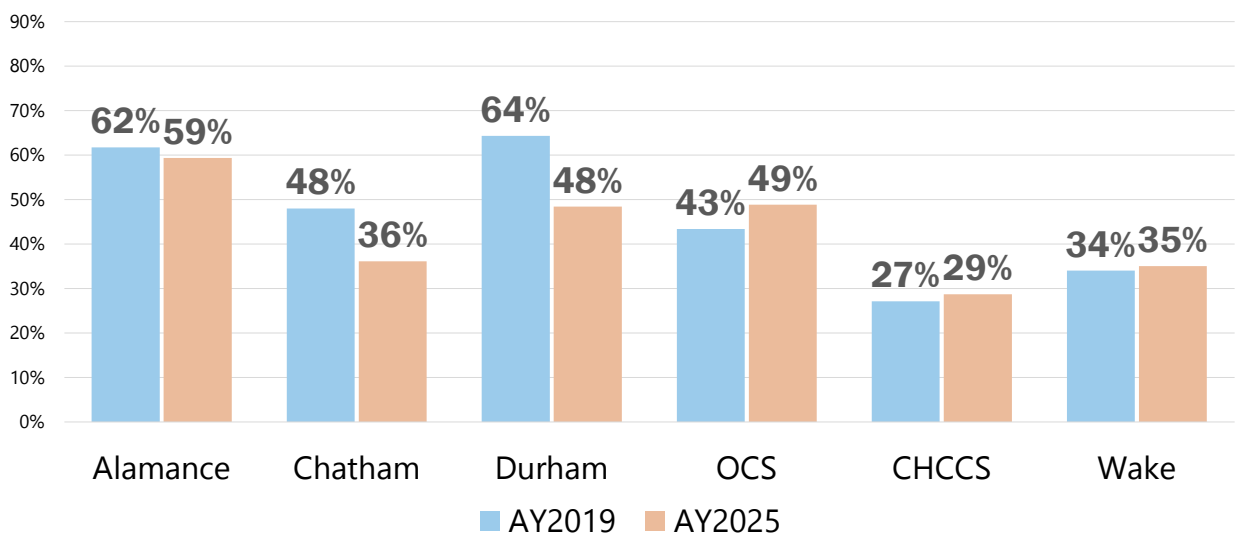

AY2019 vs AY2025

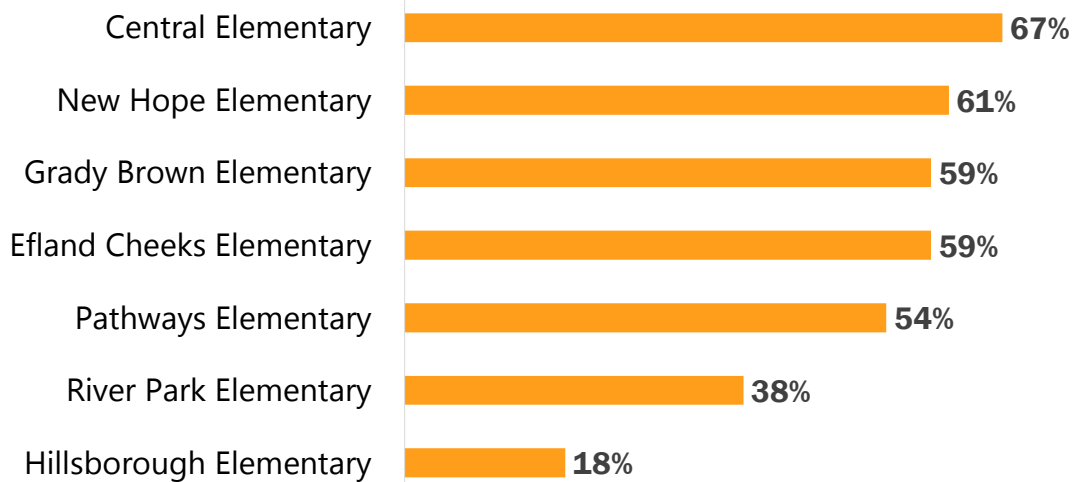

AY2025, Orange County Schools elementary students enrolled in free and reduced lunch program

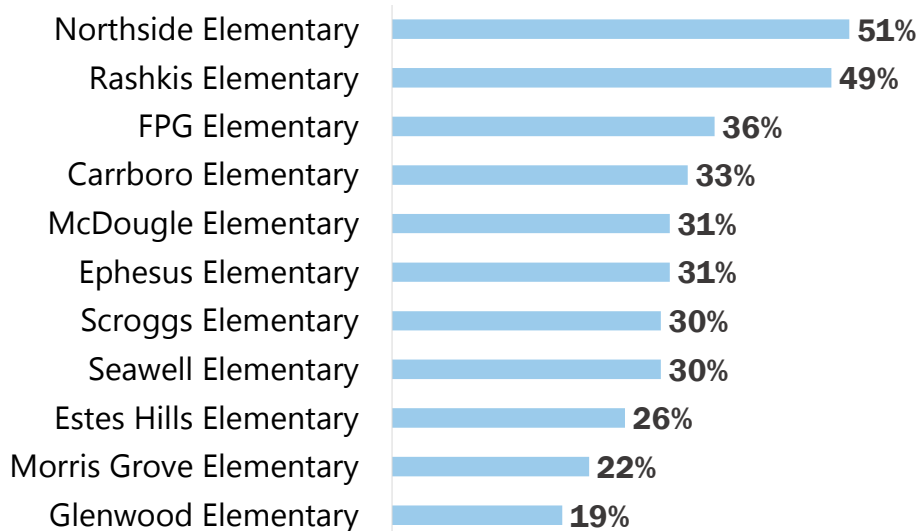

AY2025, Chapel Hill-Carrboro City Schools elementary students enrolled in free and reduced lunch program

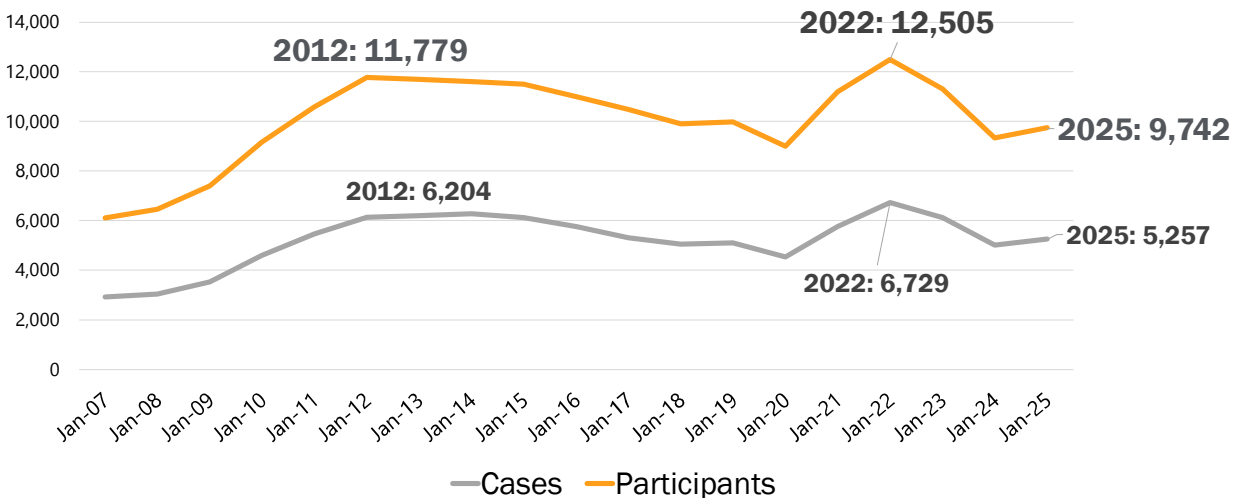

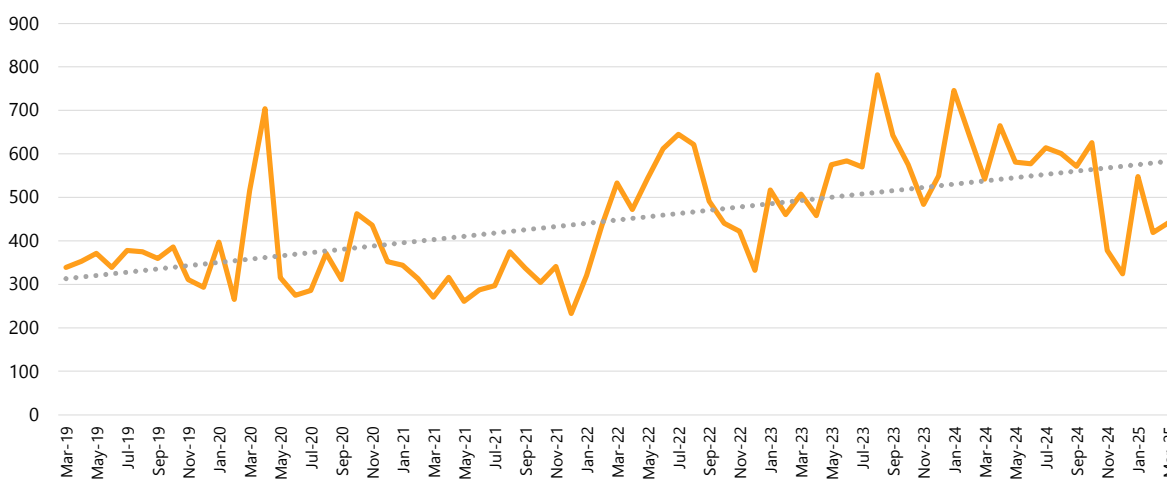

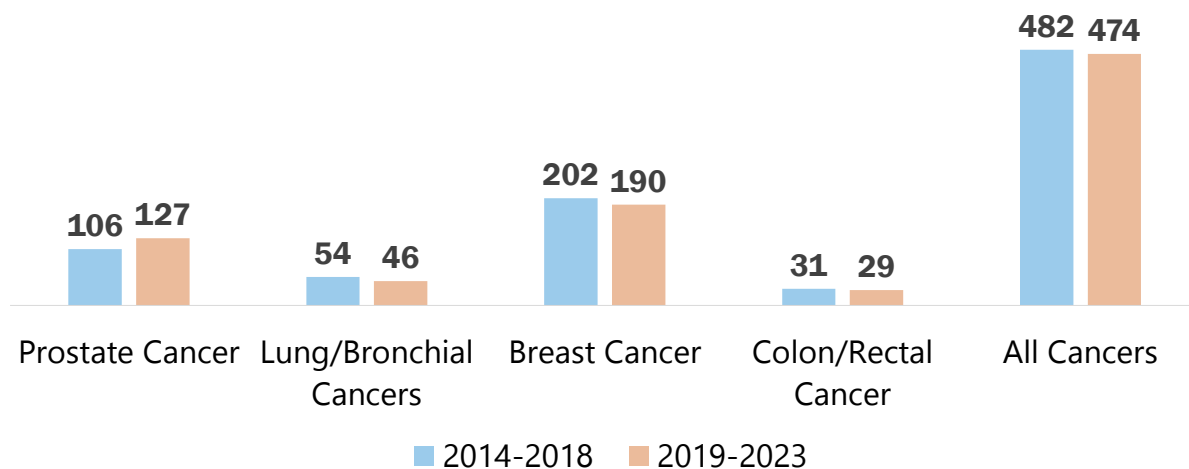

Cancer cases per 100,000 (2014-2018 vs. 2019-2023)

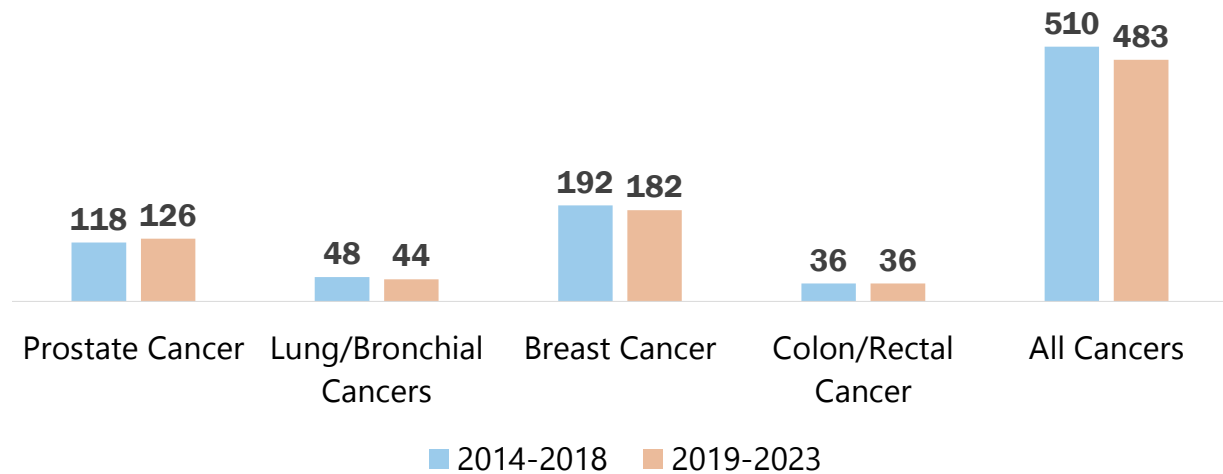

Cancer cases per 100,000 (2014-2018 vs. 2019-2023)

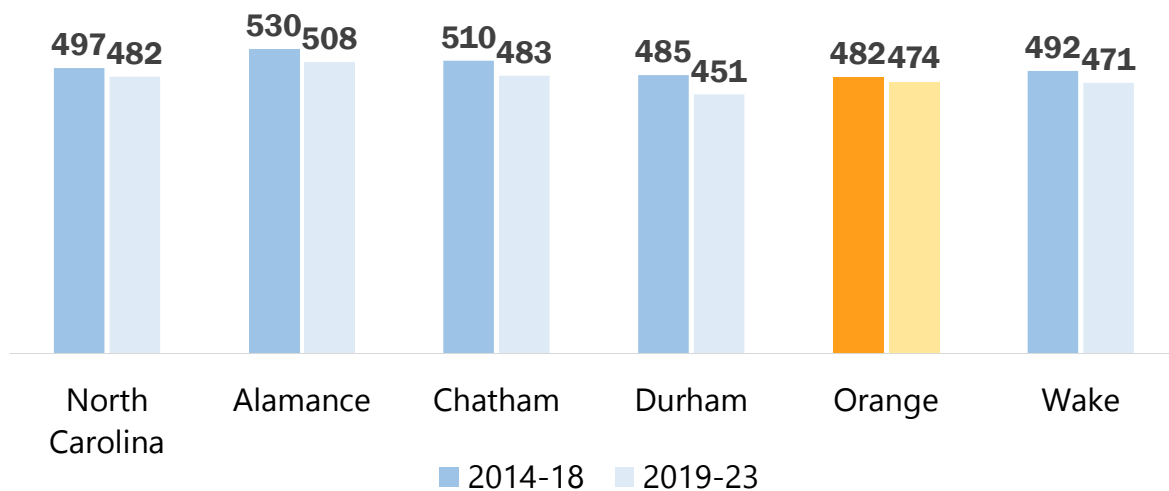

Cancer cases per 100,000 (2014-2018 vs. 2019-2023)

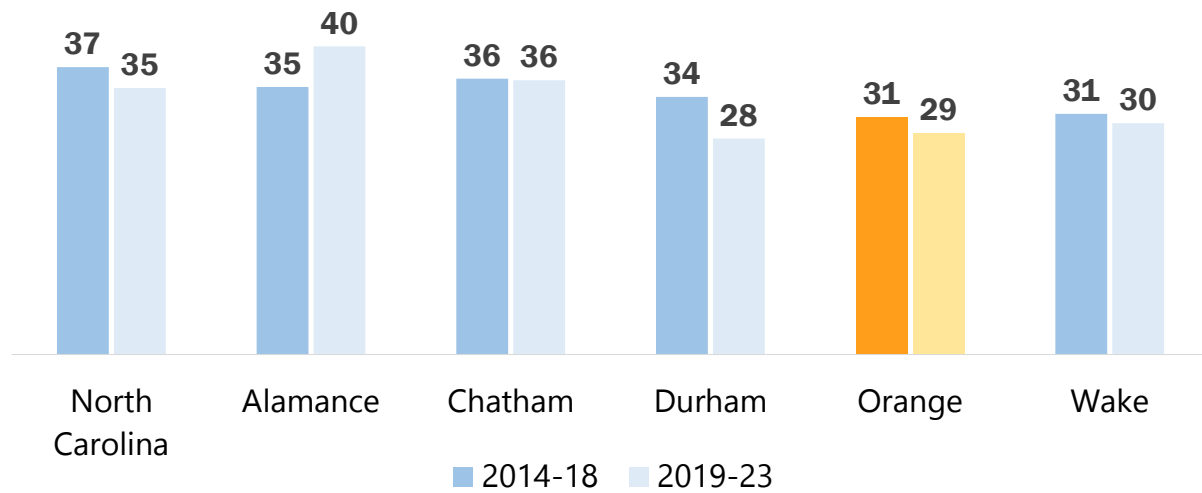

Colon/rectum cancer cases per 100,000 (2014-2018 vs. 2019-2023)

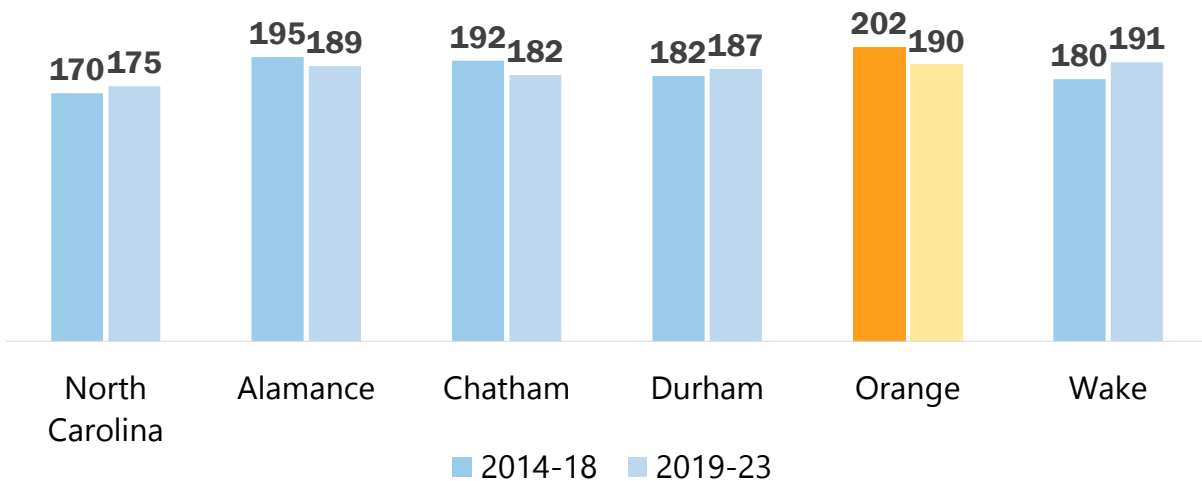

Female breast cancer cases per 100,000 (2014-2018 vs. 2019-2023)

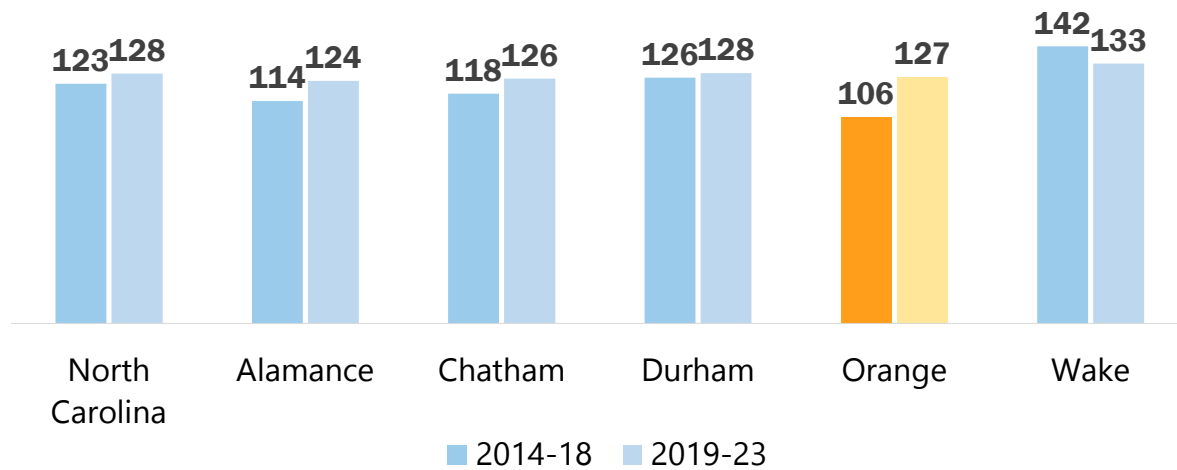

Prostate cancer cases per 100,000 (2014-2018 vs. 2019-2023)

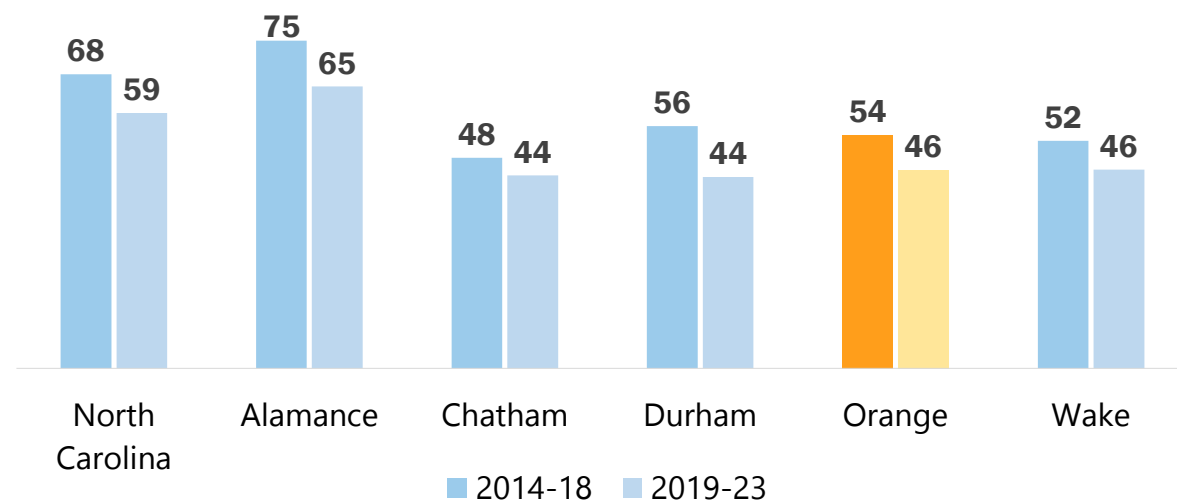

Lung/bronchus cancer cases per 100,000 (2014-2018 vs. 2019-2023)

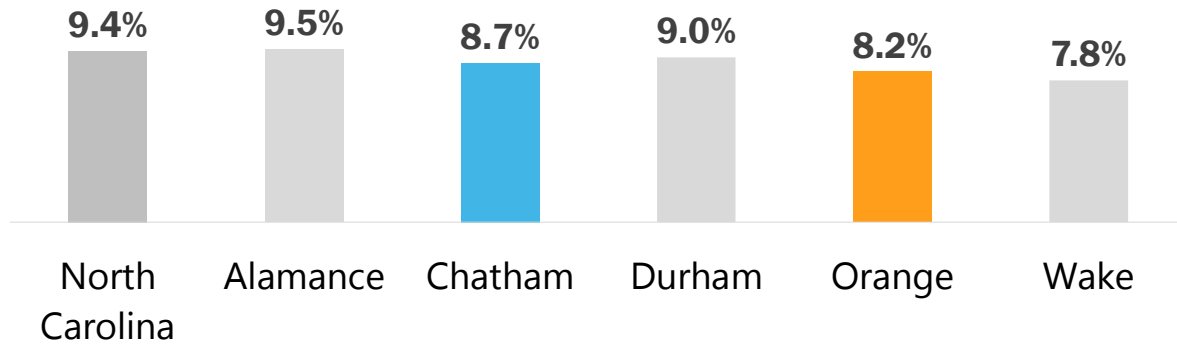

Percent of births with low birthweight (<5.5lbs)

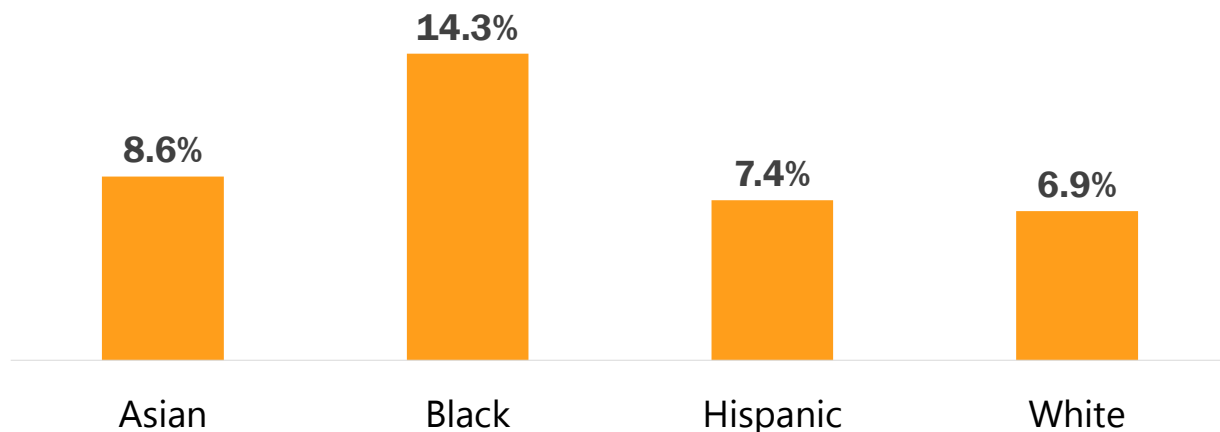

Percent of births with low birthweight by race/ethnicity (<5.5lbs)

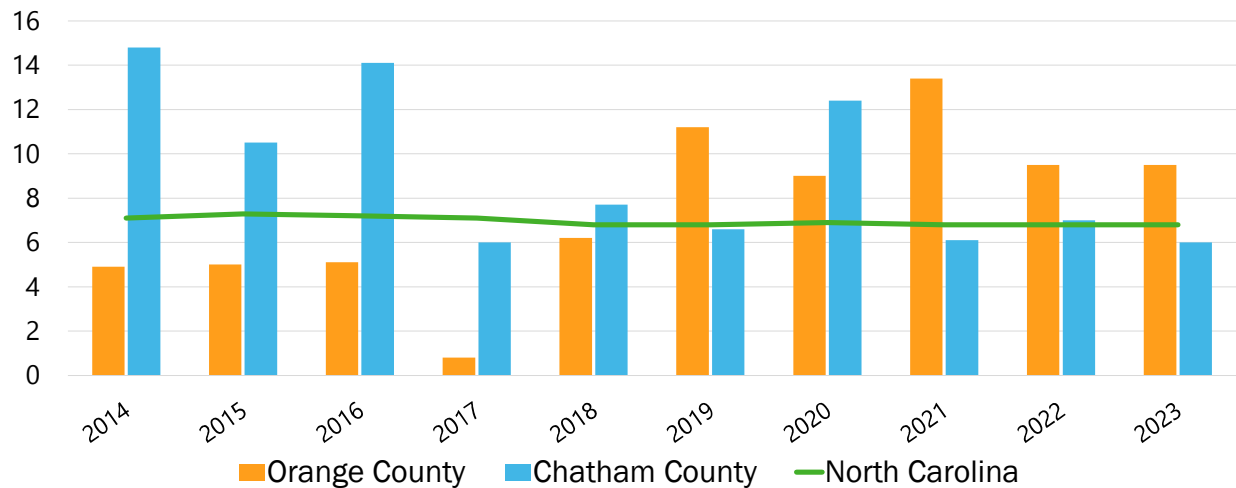

Number of infant deaths (less than 1 year) per 1,000 live births

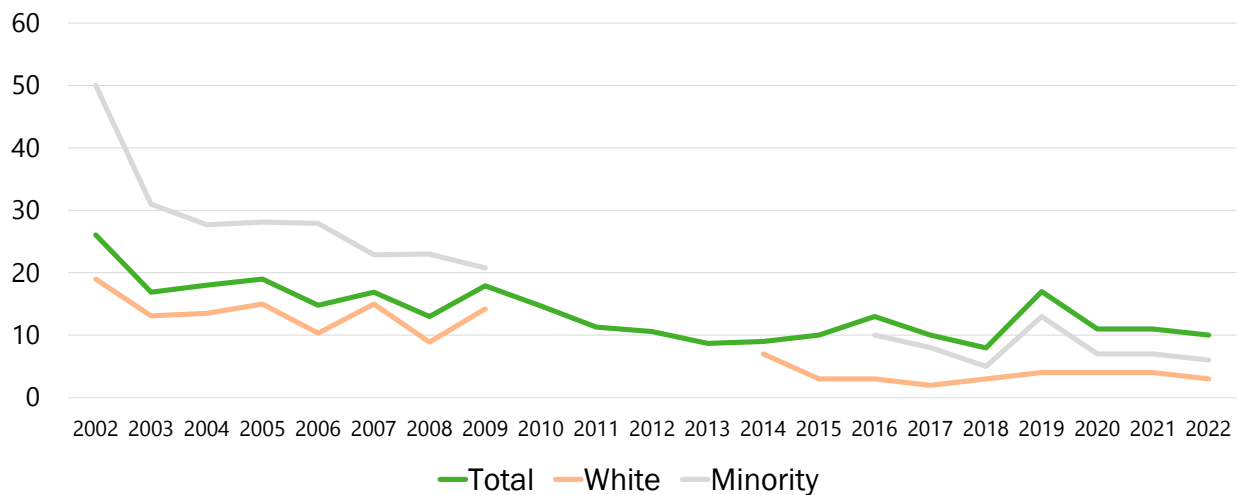

Pregnancies per 1,000 females ages 15-17, from 2002 to 2022

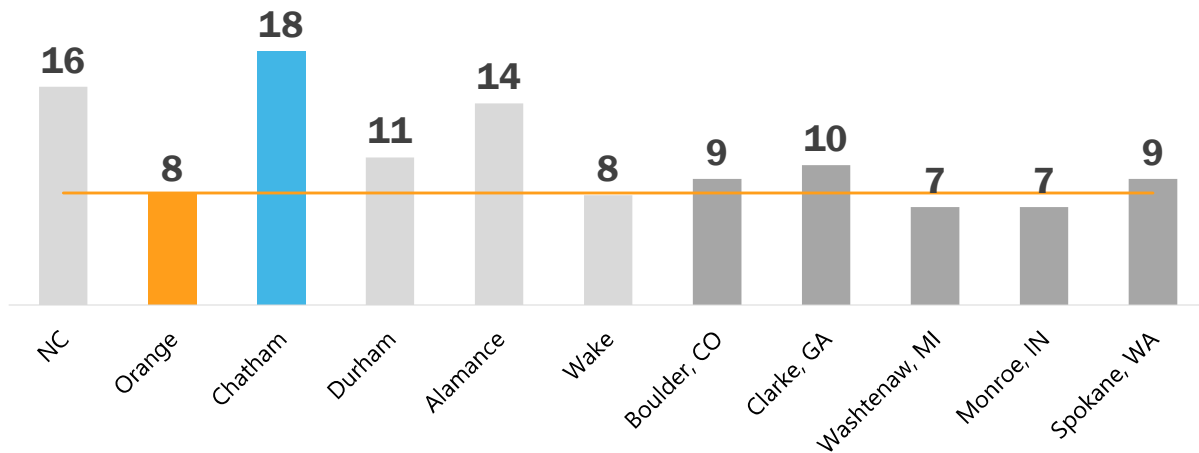

Number of motor vehicle crash deaths per 100,000 population



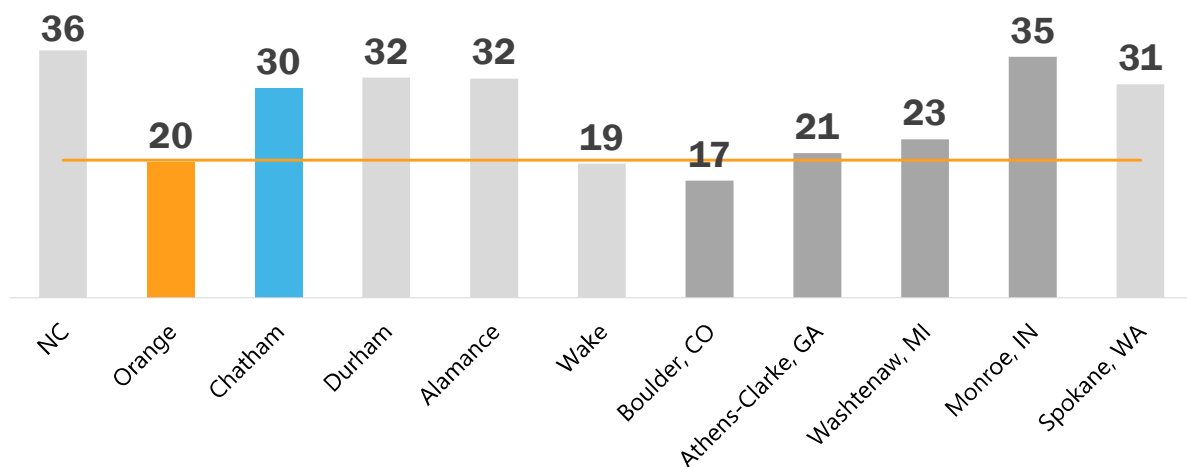

Number of drug poisoning deaths per 100,000 population



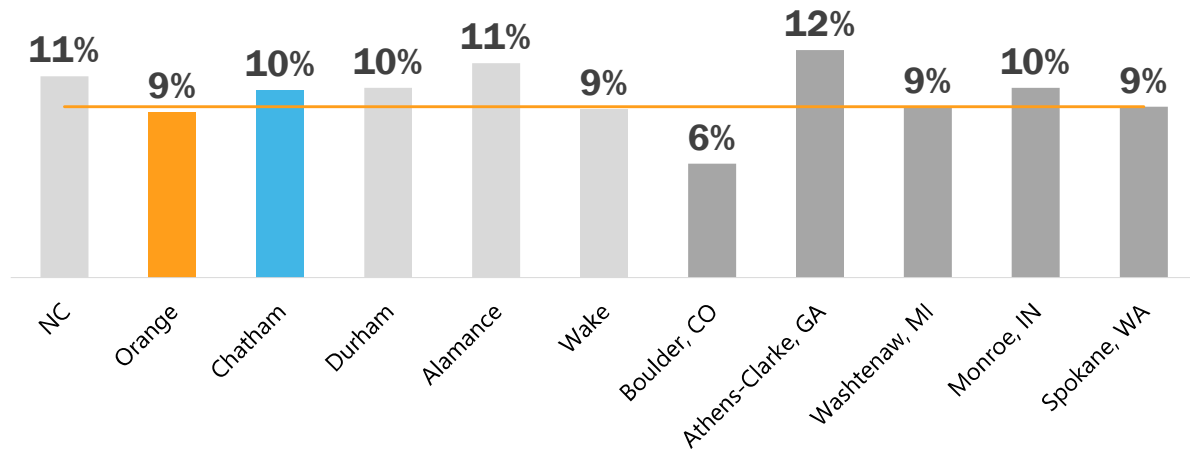

Percentage of adults (20+) with diagnosed diabetes



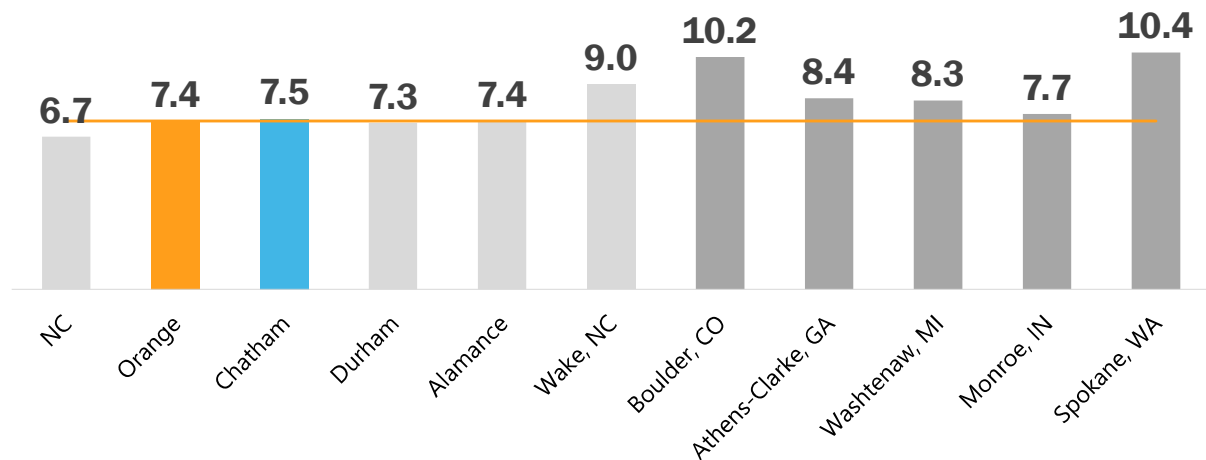

Average daily density of fine particulate matter in micrograms per cubic meter (PM2.5)



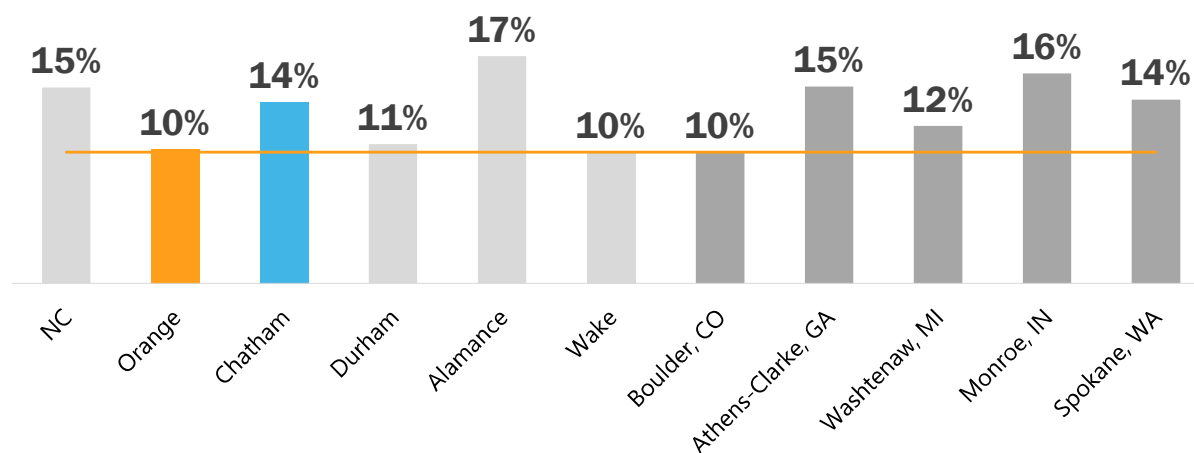

Percentage of adults who are current smokers



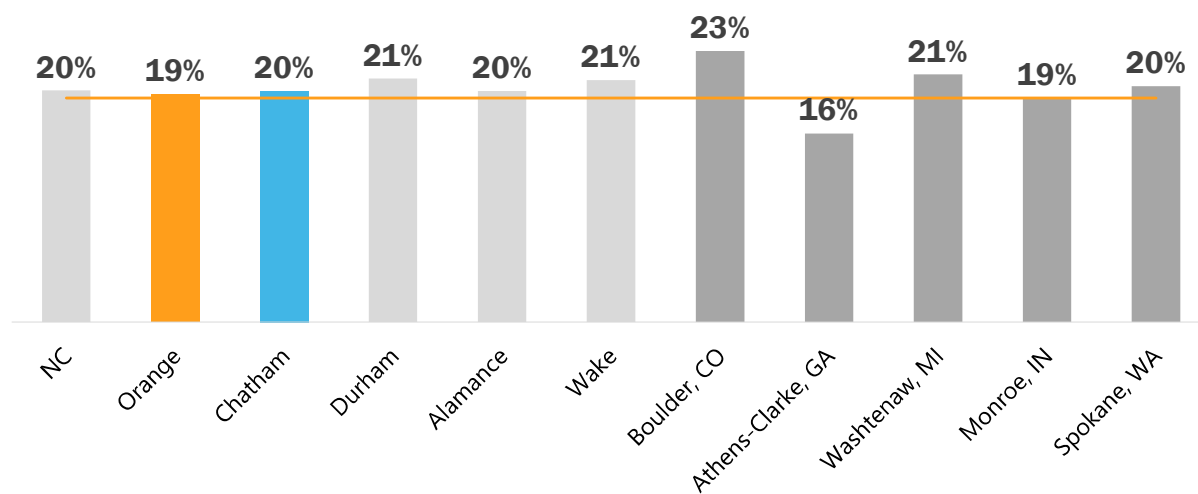

Percentage of adults who report binge or heavy drinking



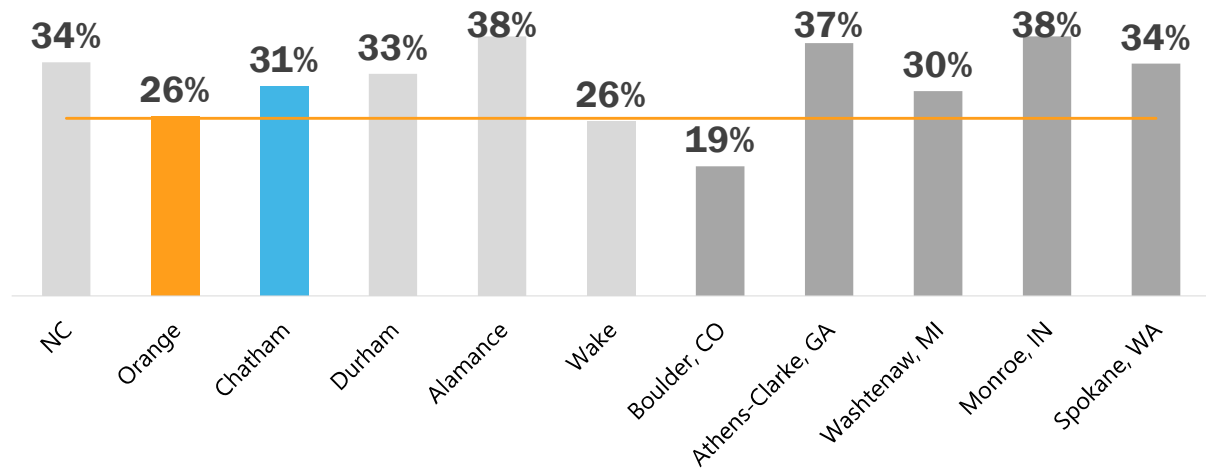

Percentage of the adult population (age 20+) that reports a body mass index (BMI) > 30



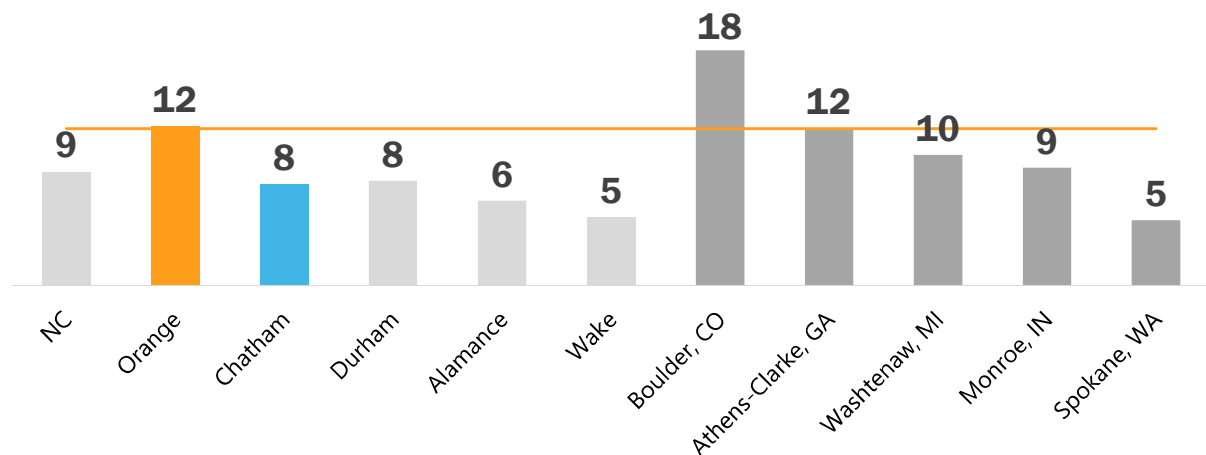

Number of centers per 1,000 children under age 5



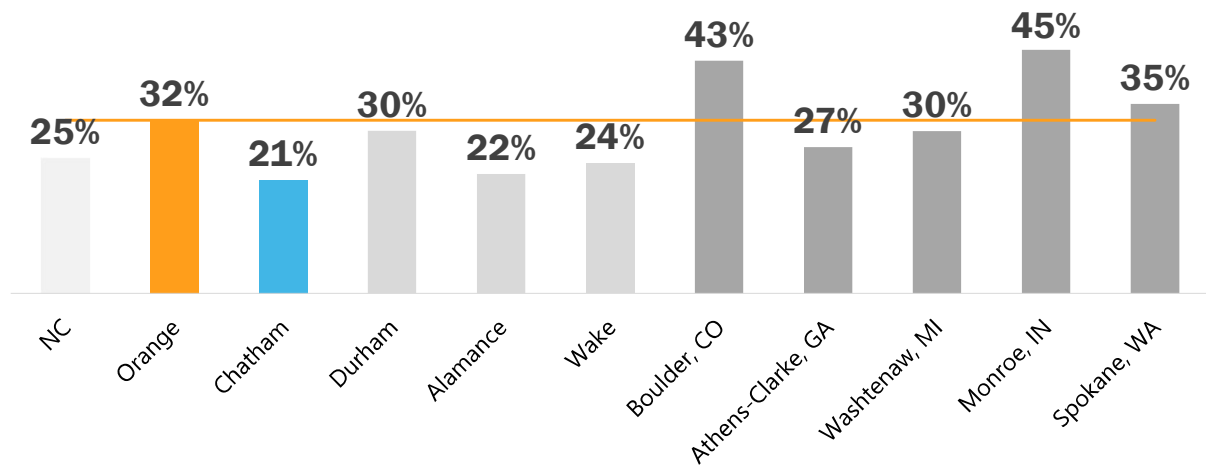

Childcare costs for a household with two children as a percent of median household income



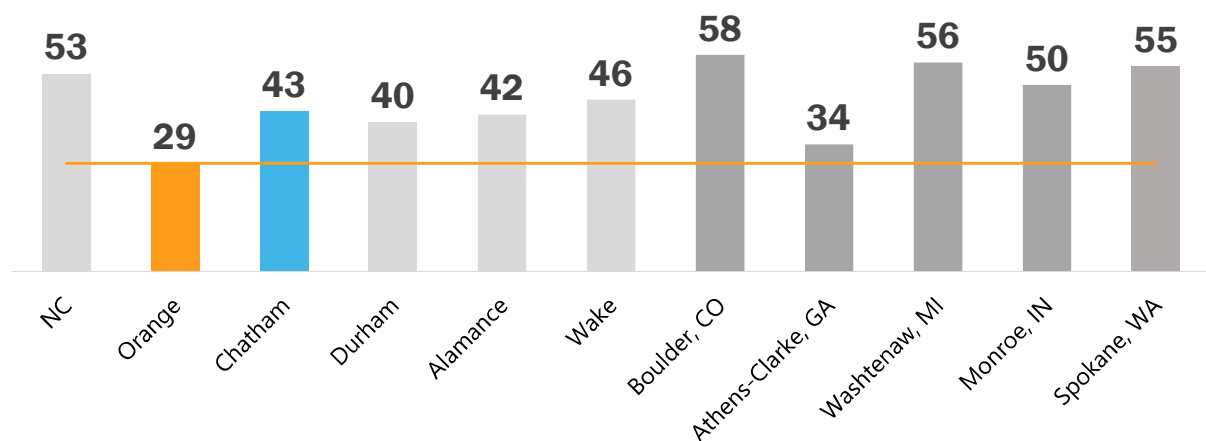

Index of dissimilarity where higher values indicate greater residential segregation between Black and White county residents.



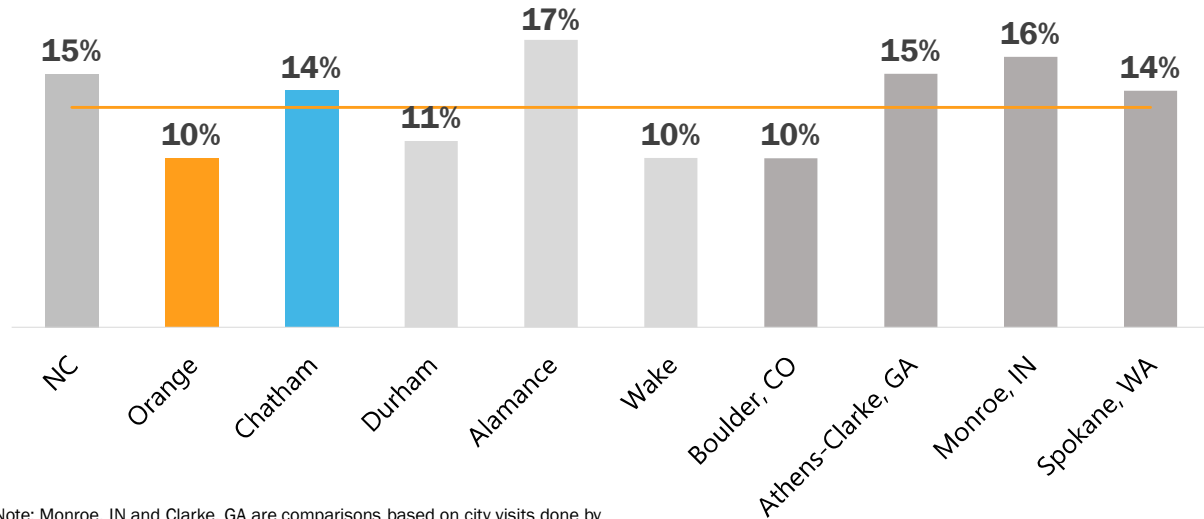

Percentage of adults who are current smokers



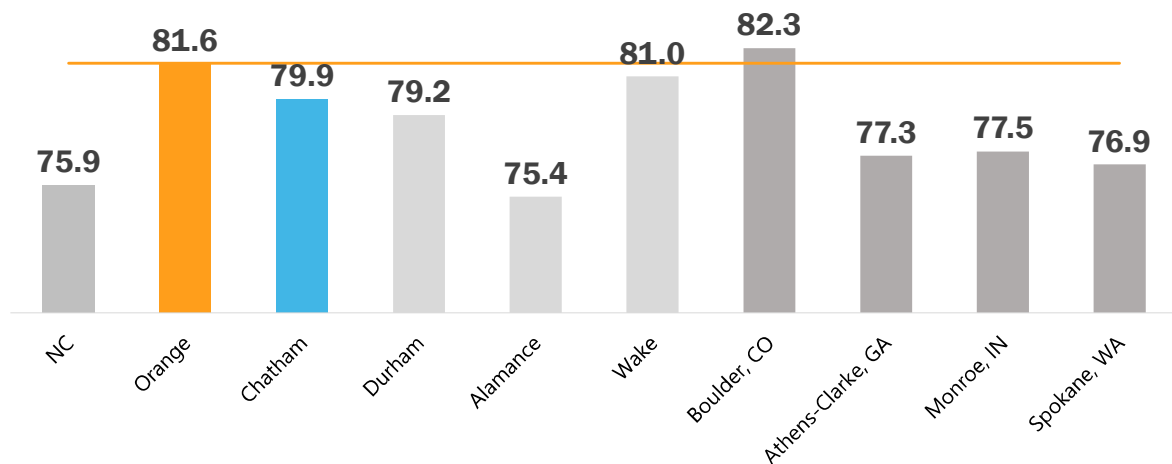

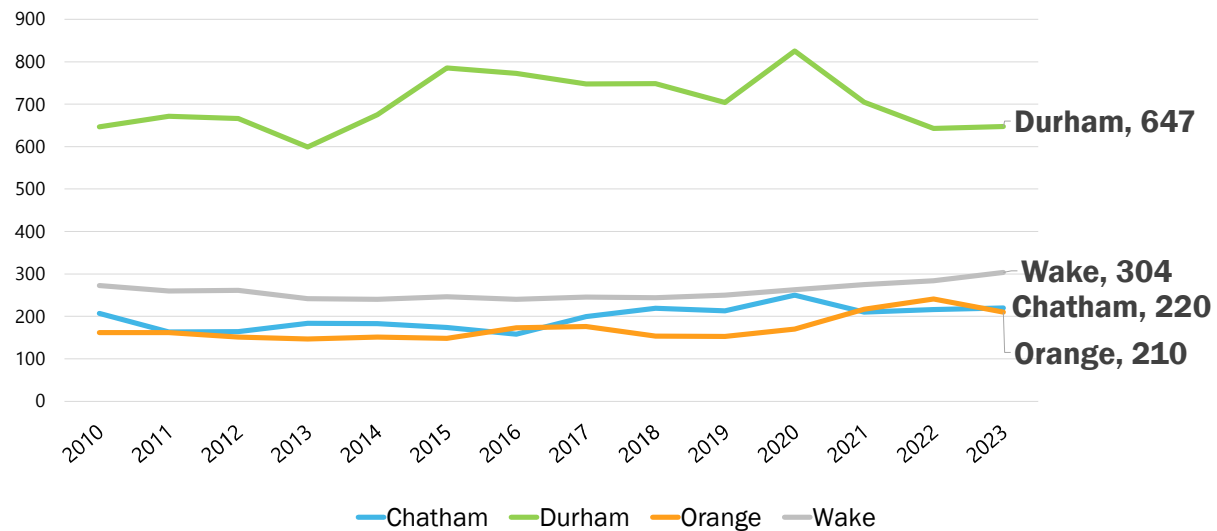

Violent crimes per 100,000 residents (2010 to 2023)

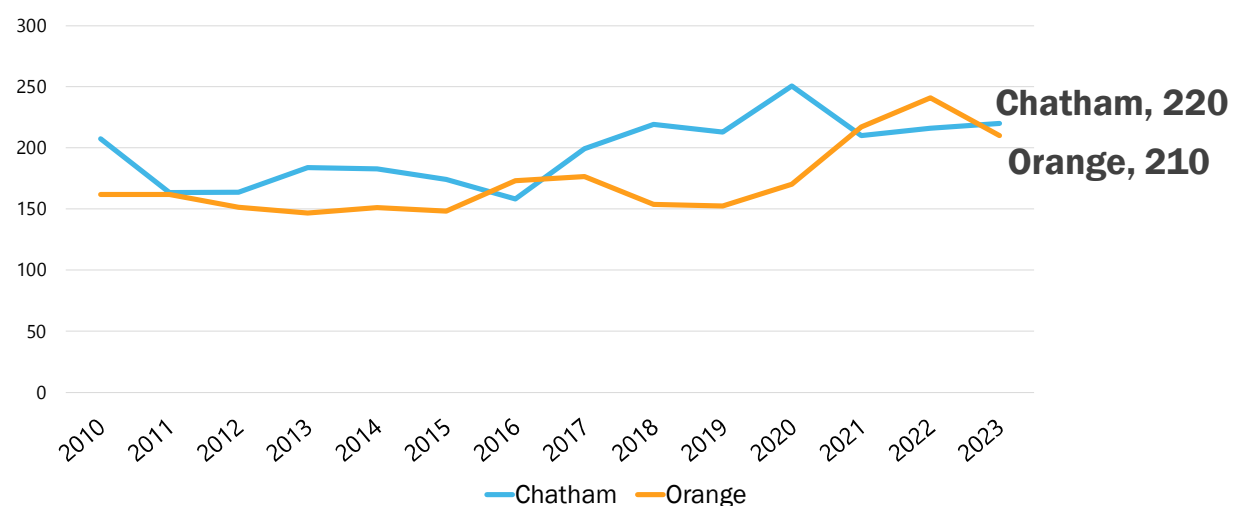

Violent crimes per 100,000 residents from 2010 to 2023

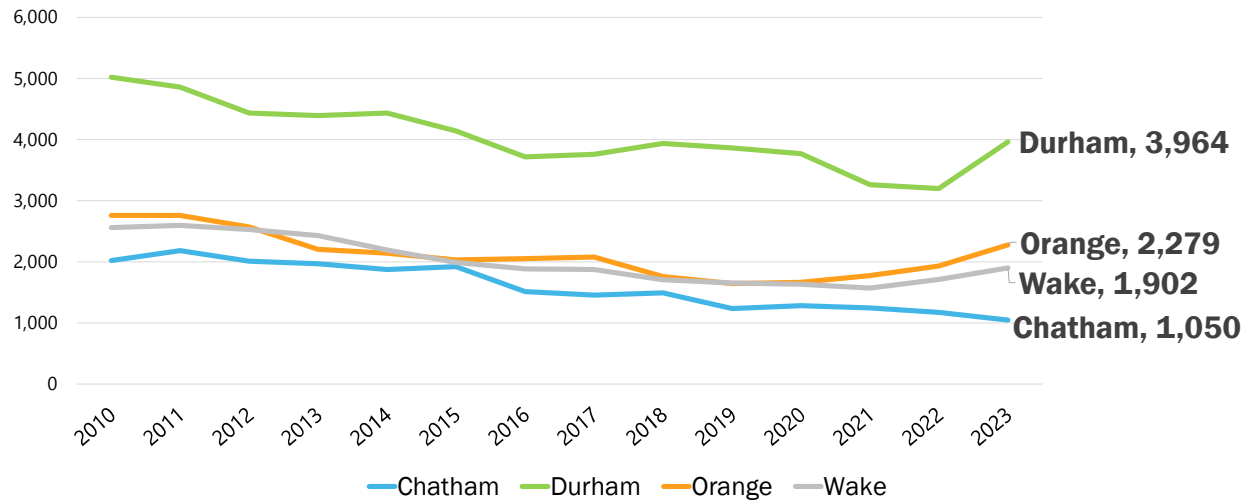

Property Crime Rates

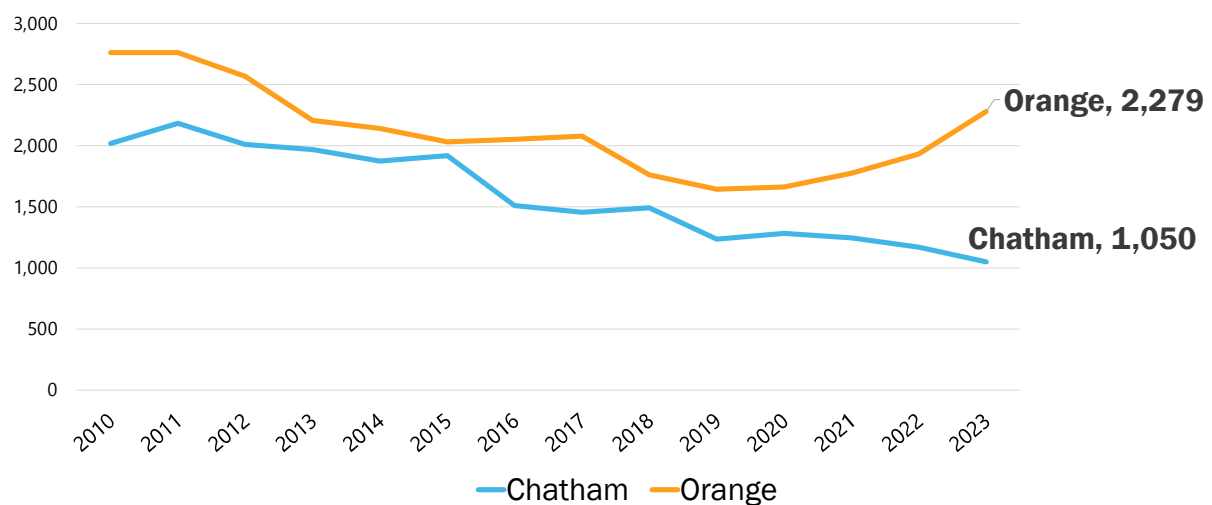
Property crimes per 100,000 residents from 2010 to 2023

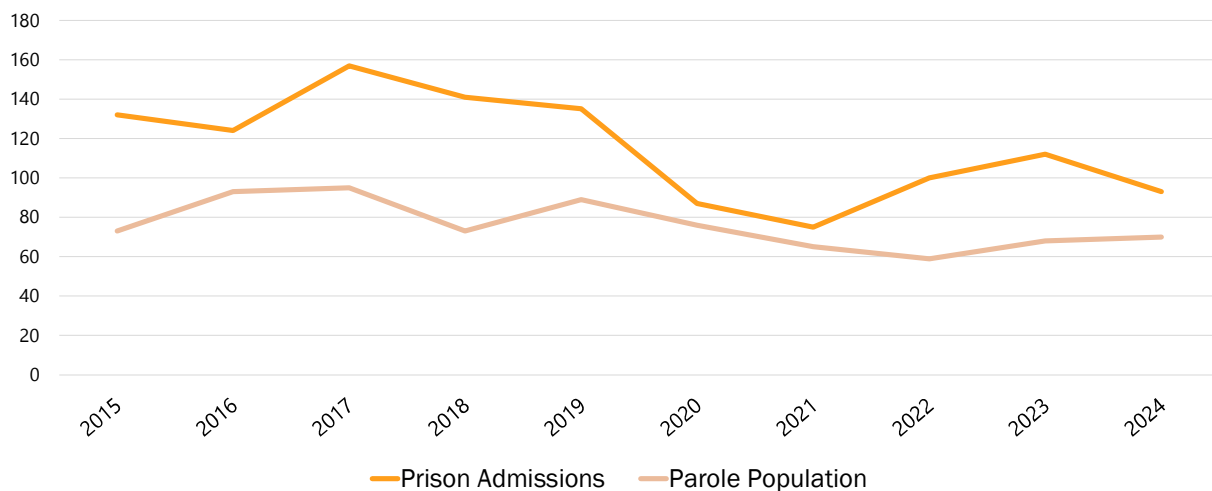
Property crimes per 100,000 residents (2010 - 2023)

Orange County prison admissions and parole populations, 2015 - 2024

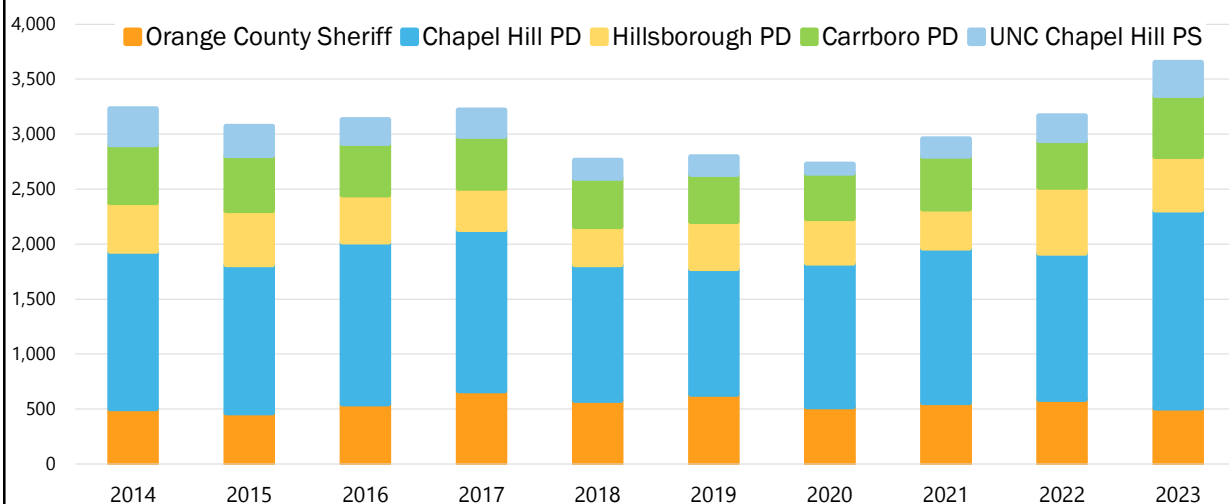

(Murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft)



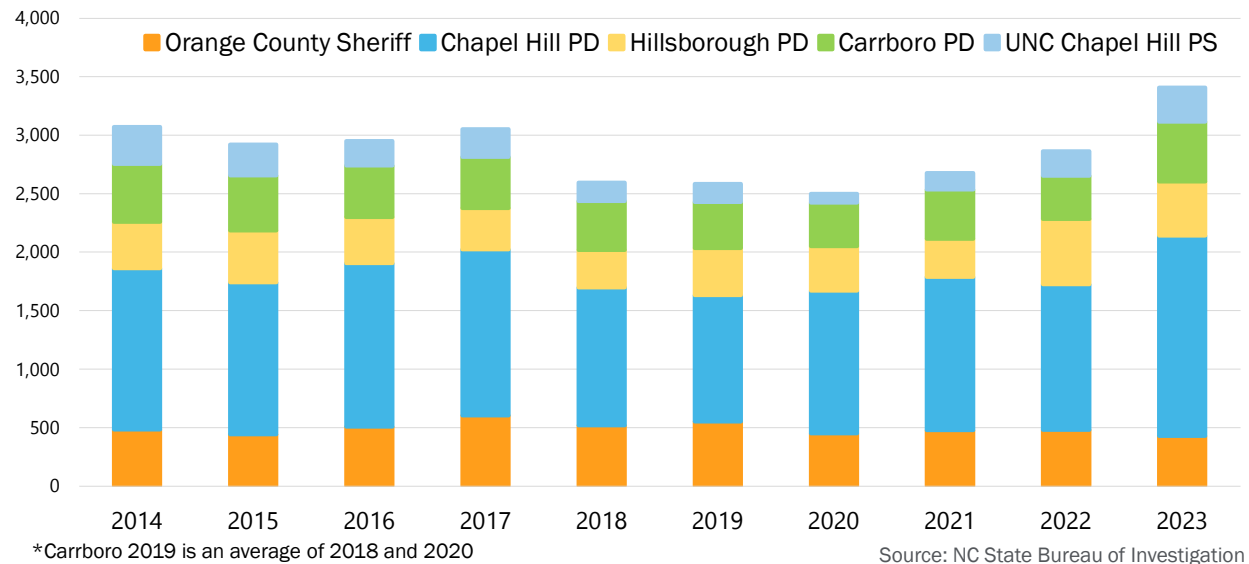

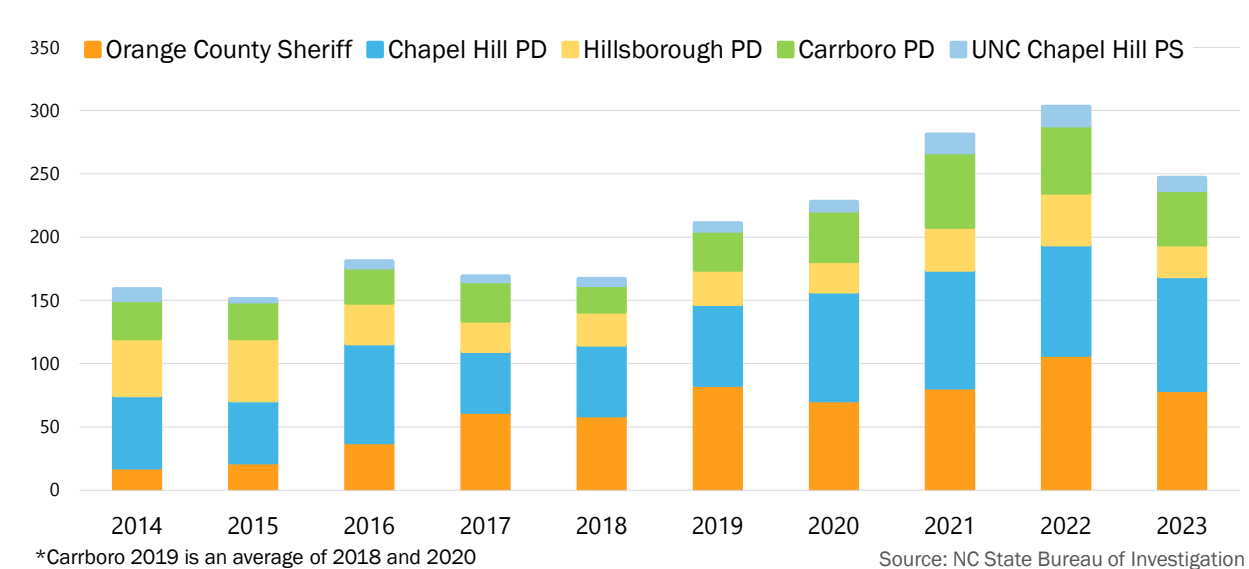

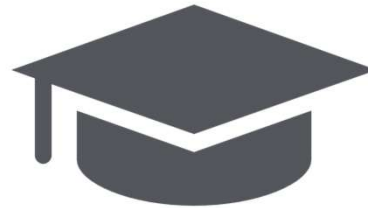

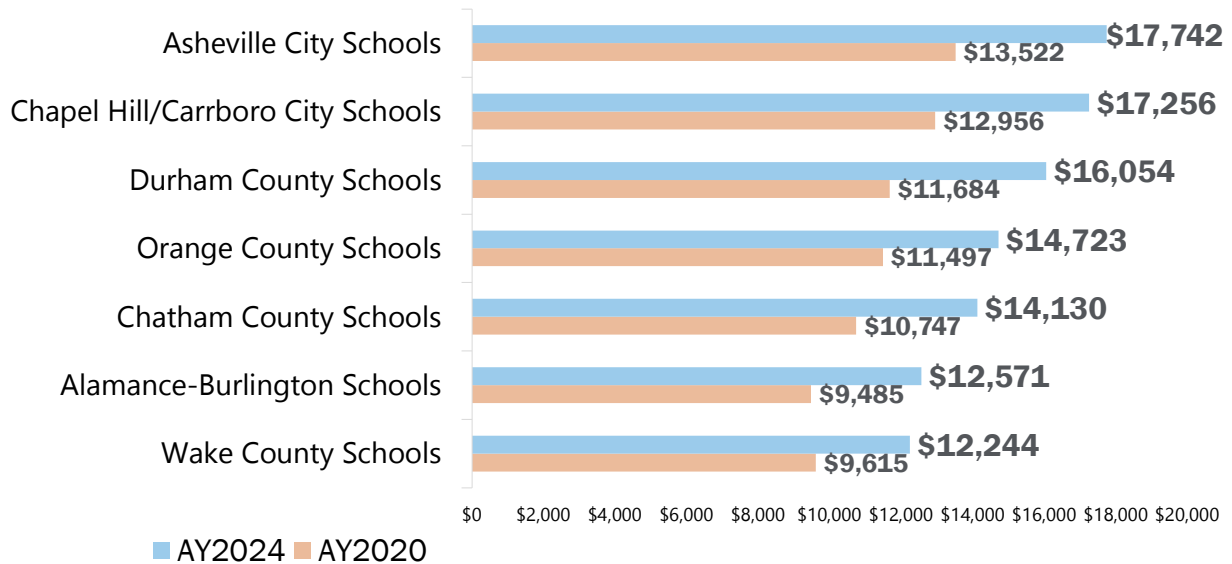

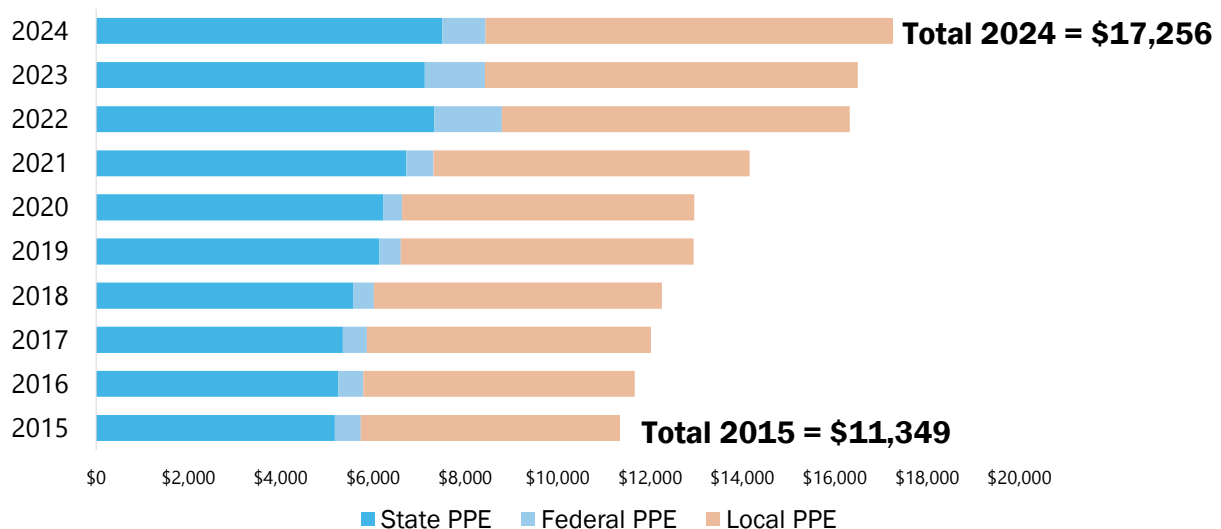
Total Per Pupil Expenditure AY2020 vs AY2024

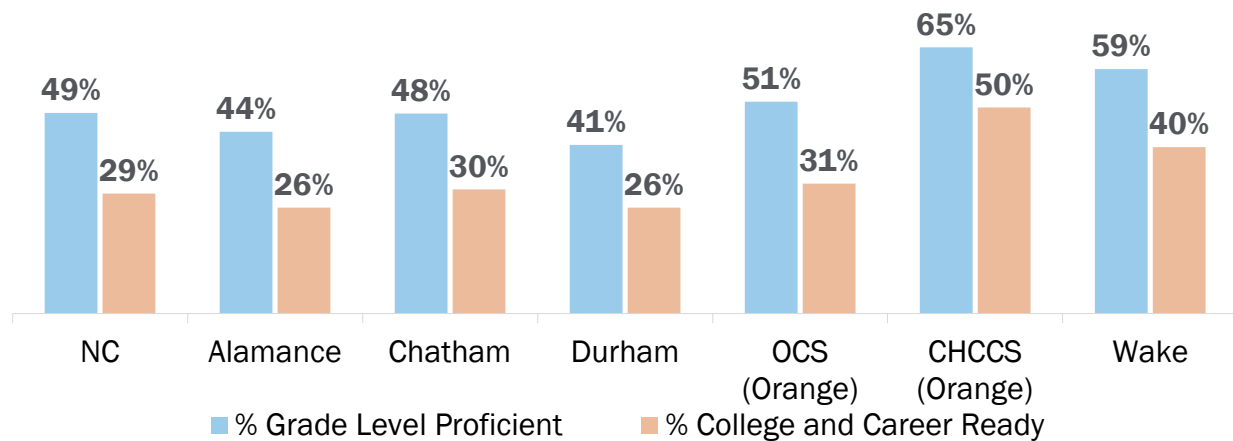
Trends in CHCCS Per Pupil Expenditure (PPE) by source, AY2014 – AY2024

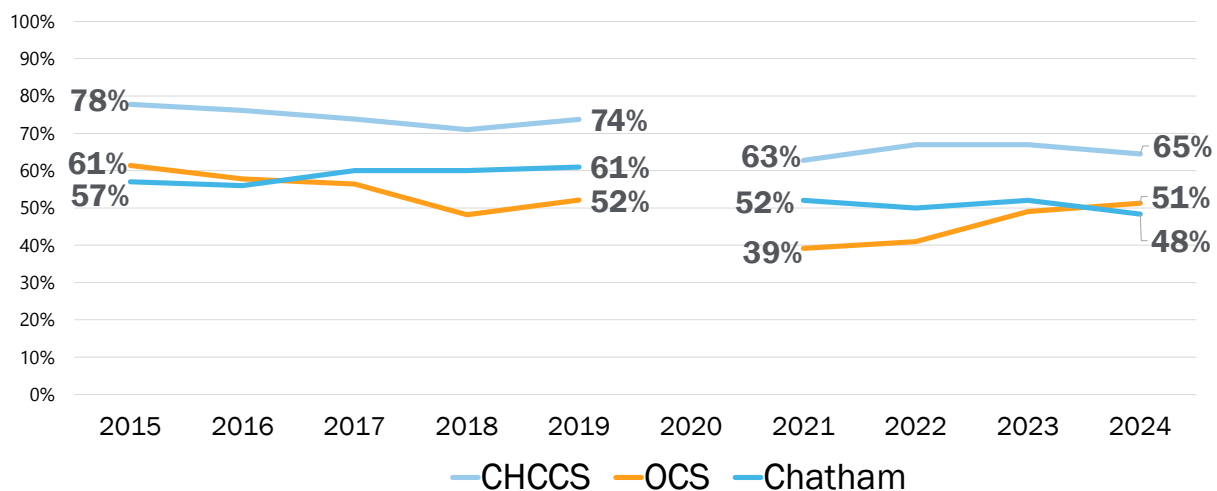

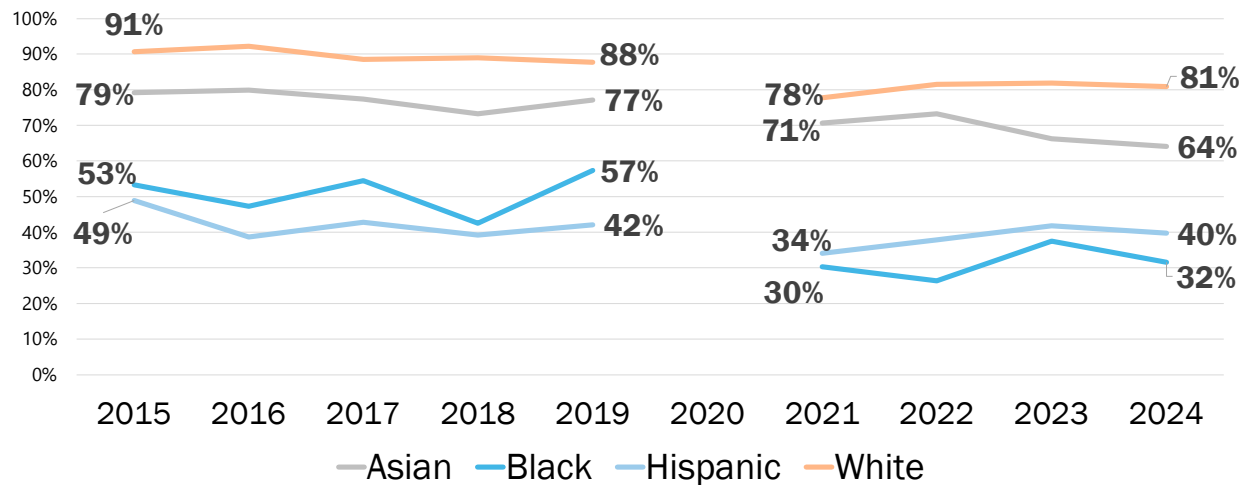

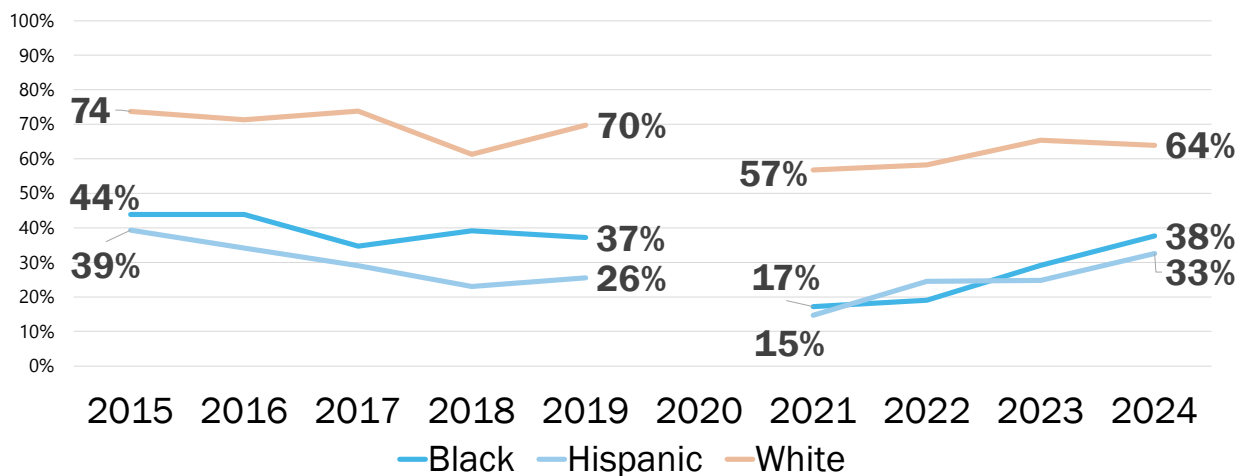

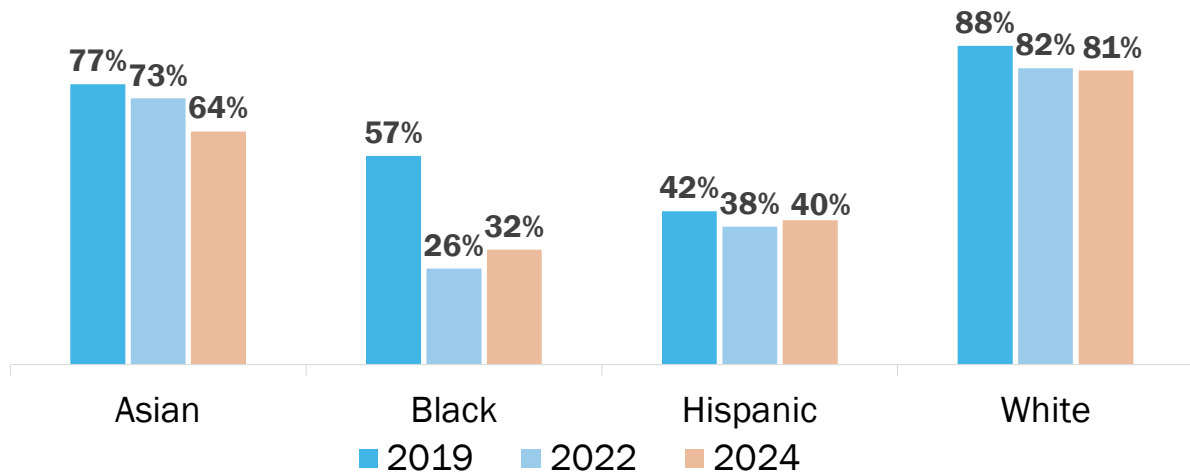

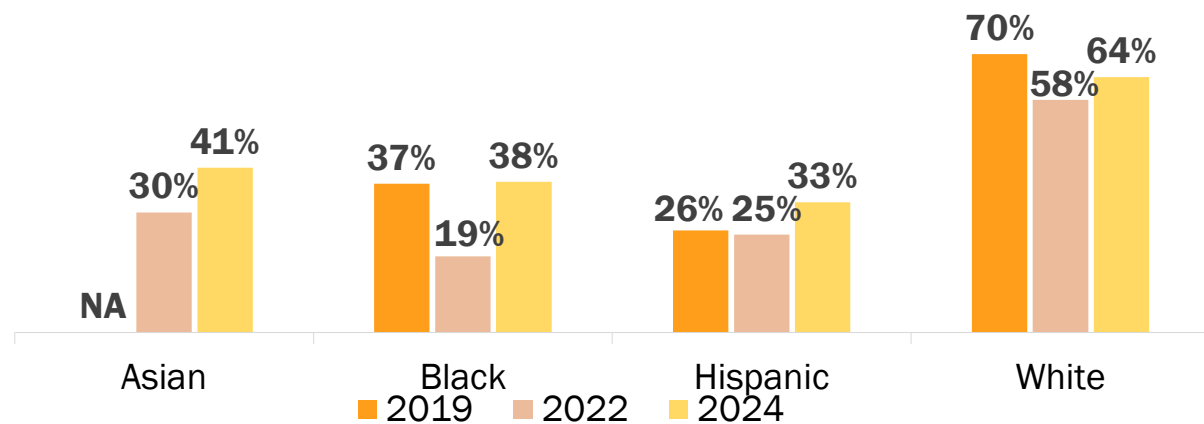

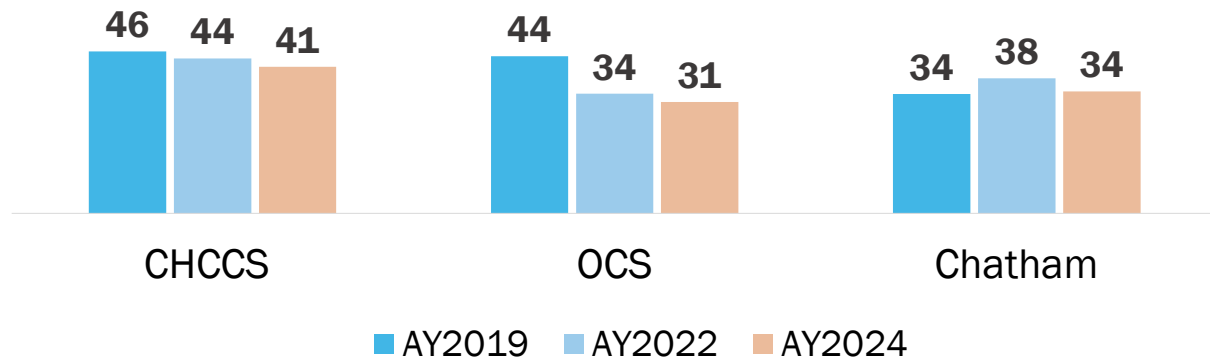

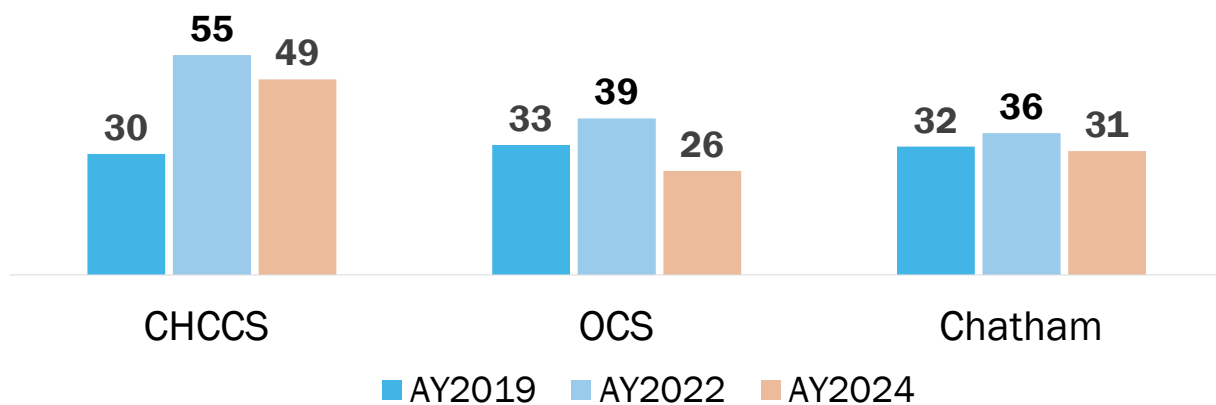

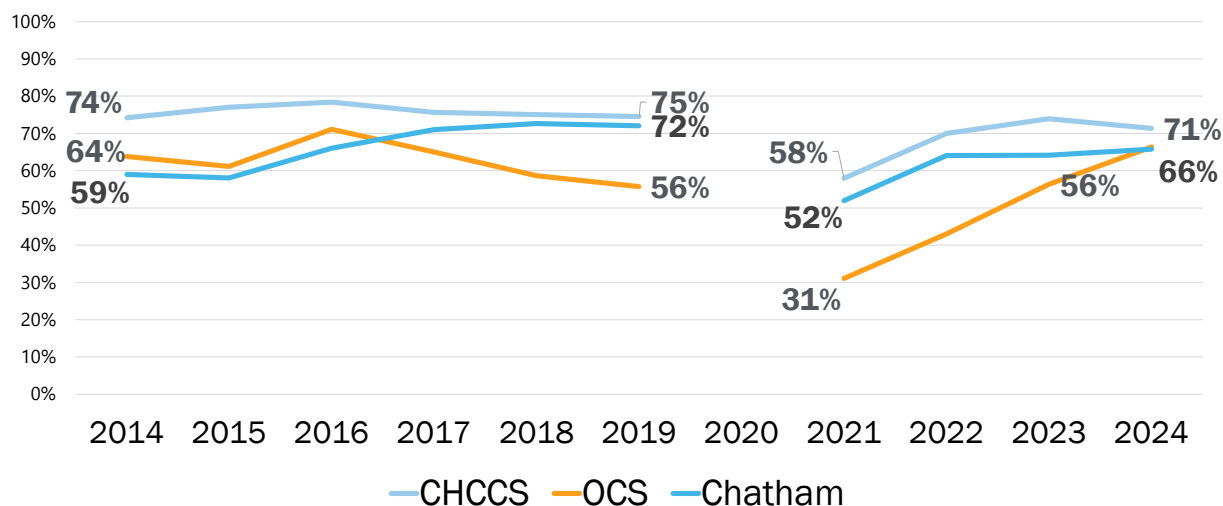

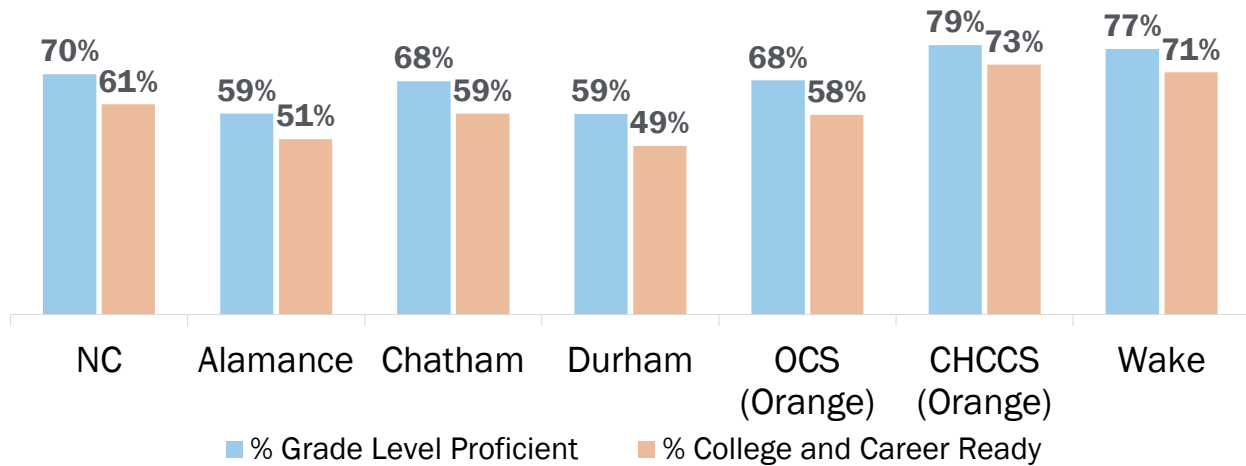

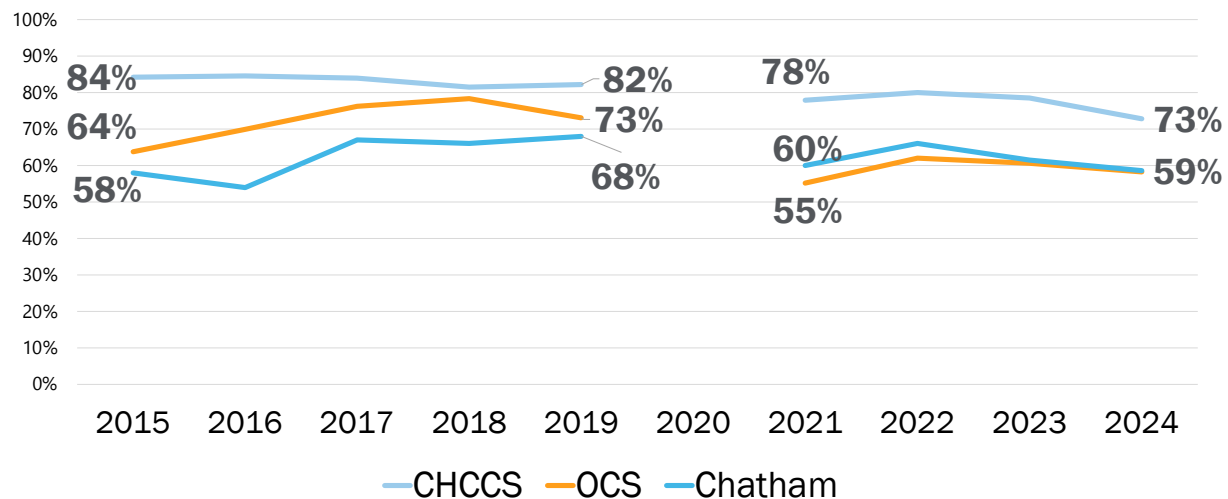

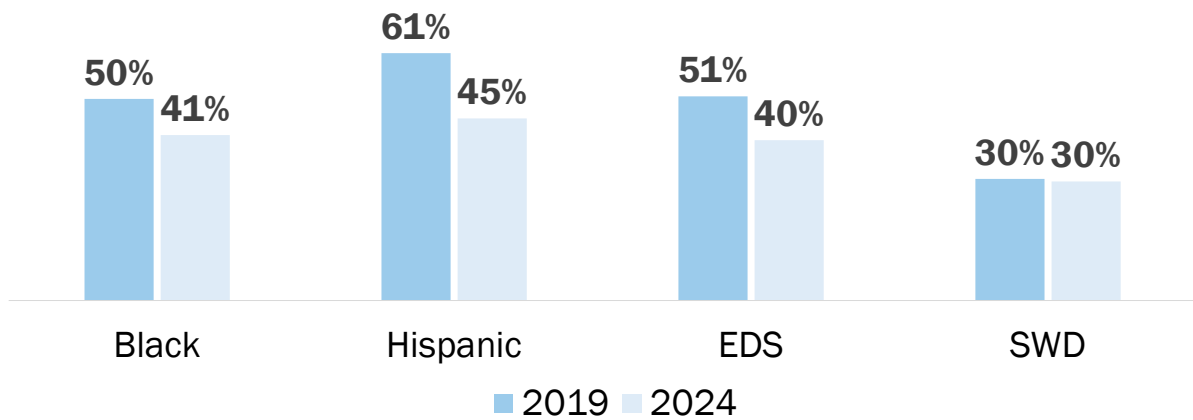

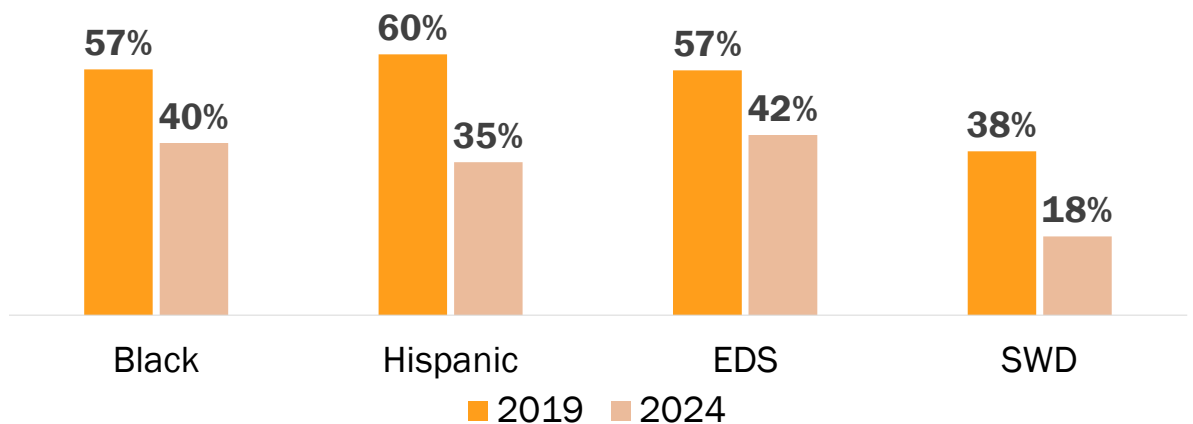

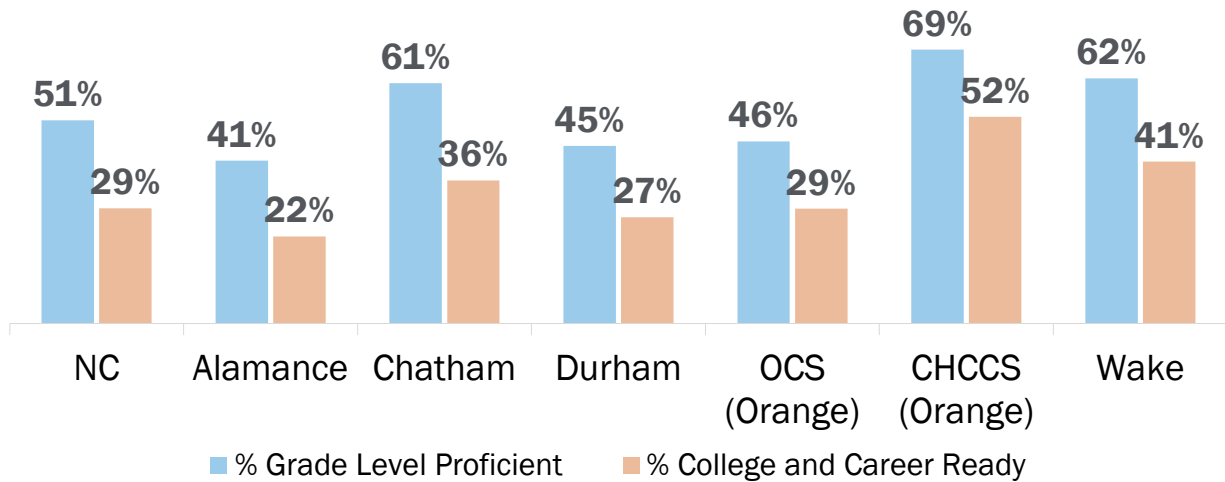

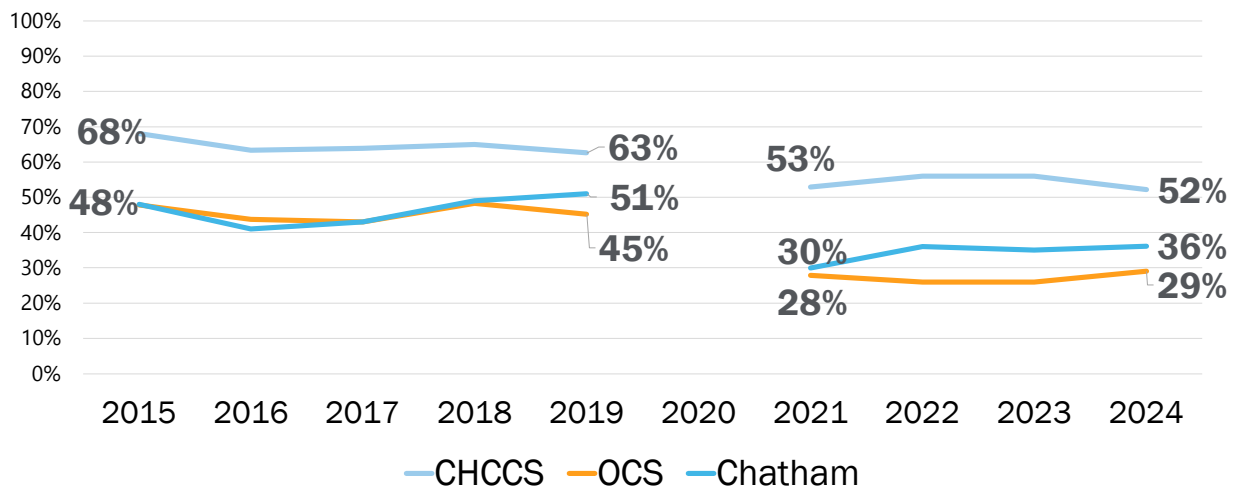

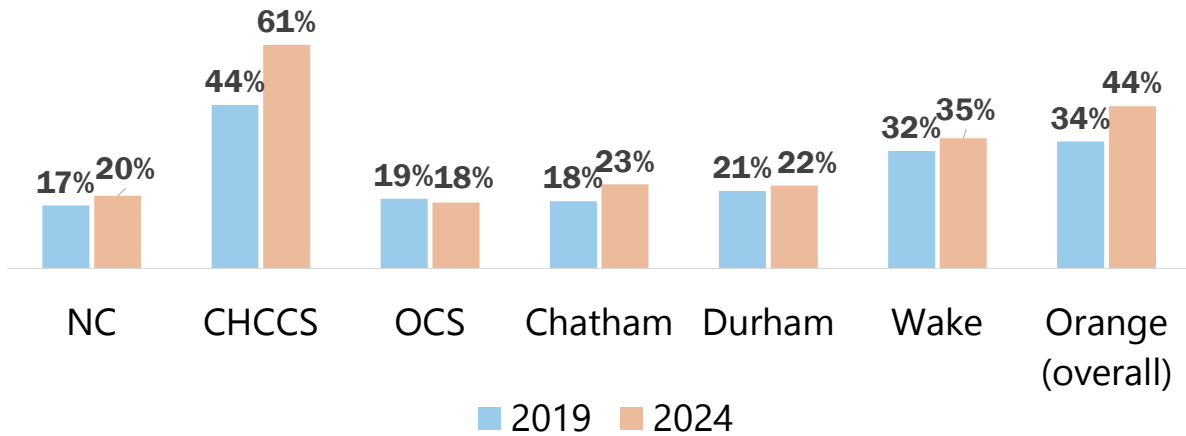

Percent of high school students enrolled in Advanced Placement (AP) courses, AY2019 vs AY2024

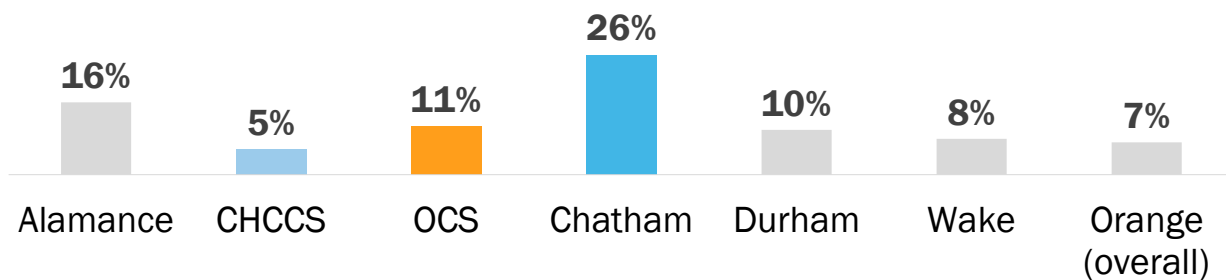

Percent of high school students enrolled in Career & College Promise, North Carolina's dual enrollment program for high school students, AY2024

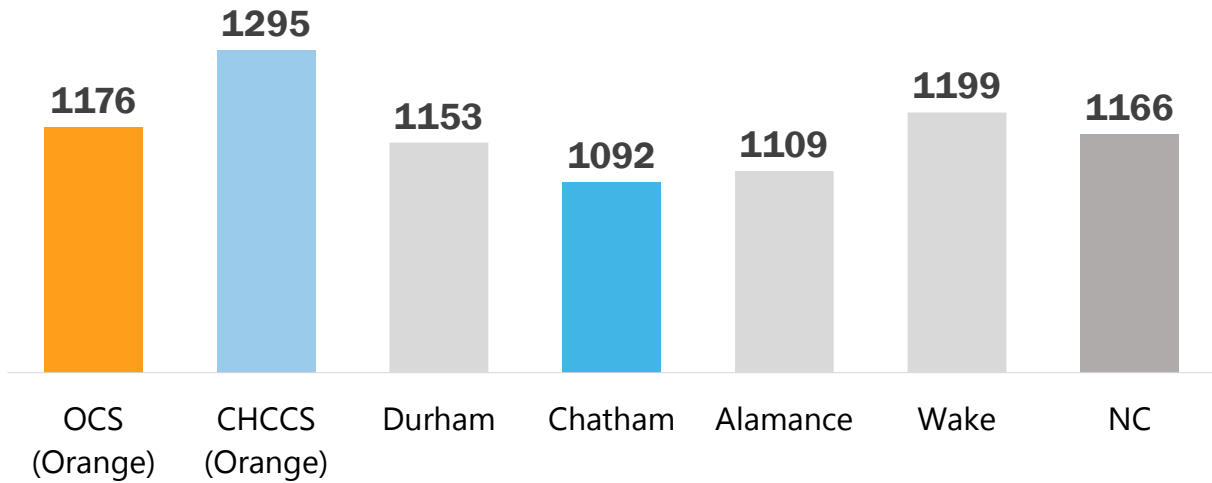

Average SAT Total Scores

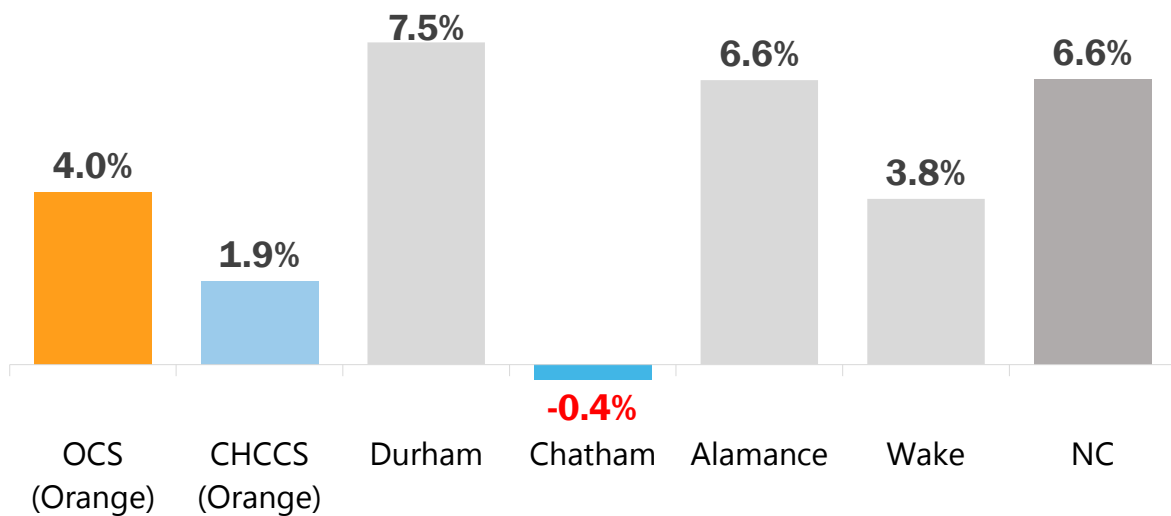
Average scores, AY2024

Change in Average SAT Total Scores 2020 to 2024

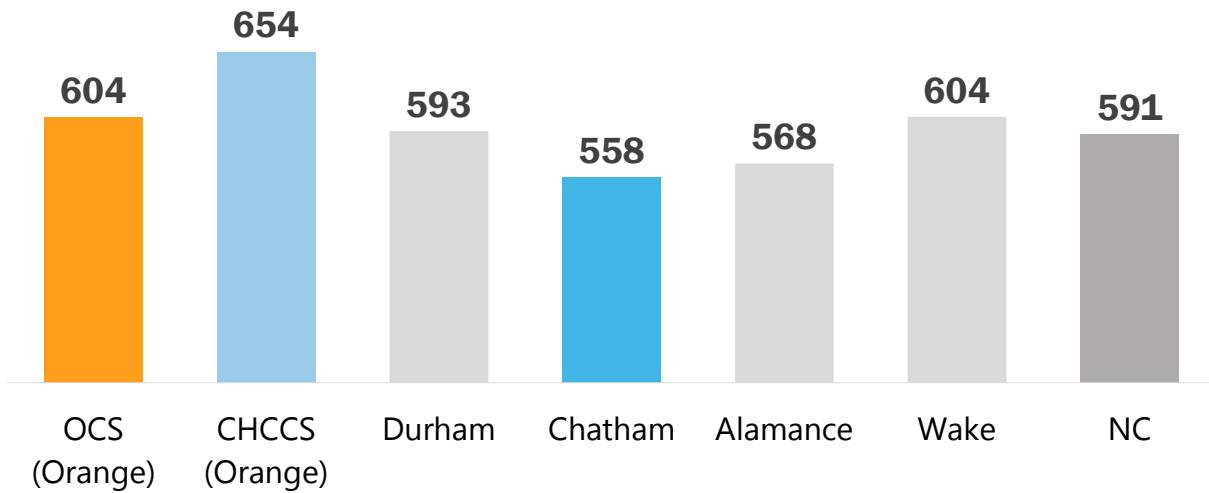

Average scores, AY2024

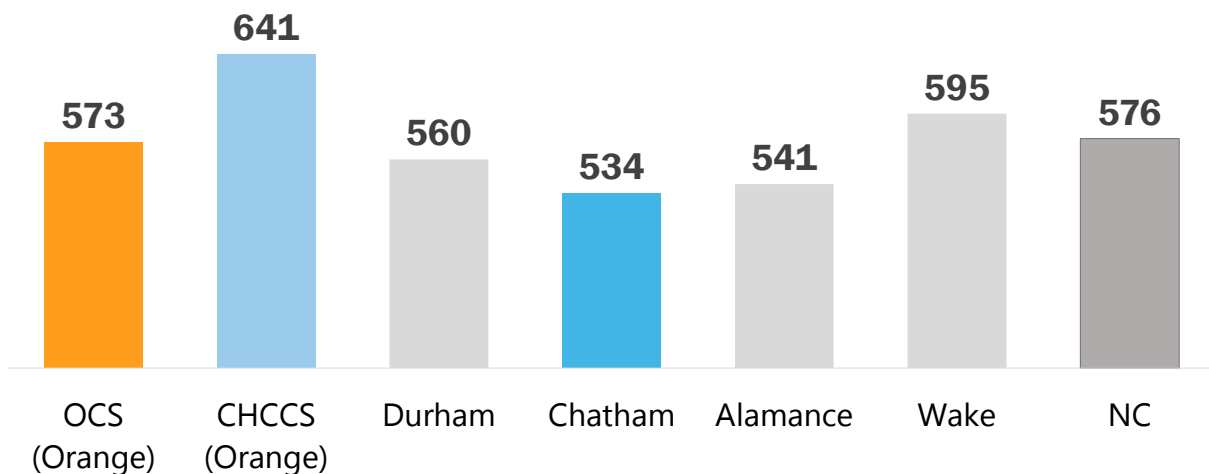

Average scores, AY2024

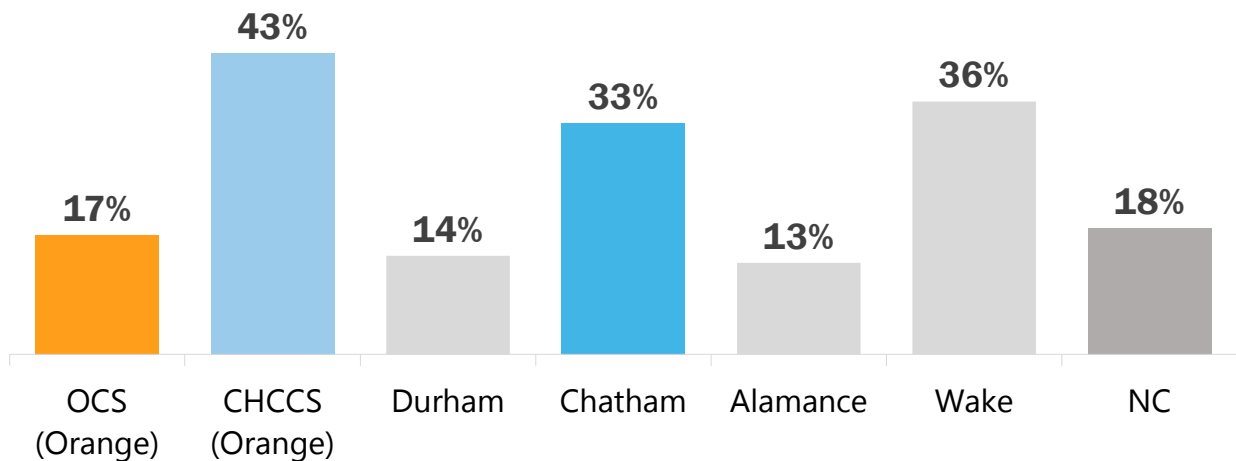

Percent of students tested, AY2024

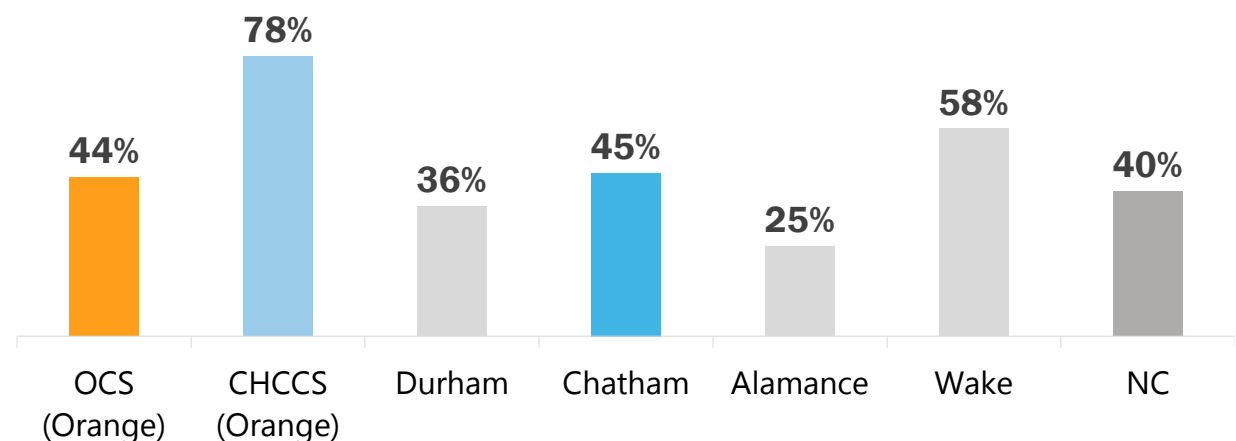

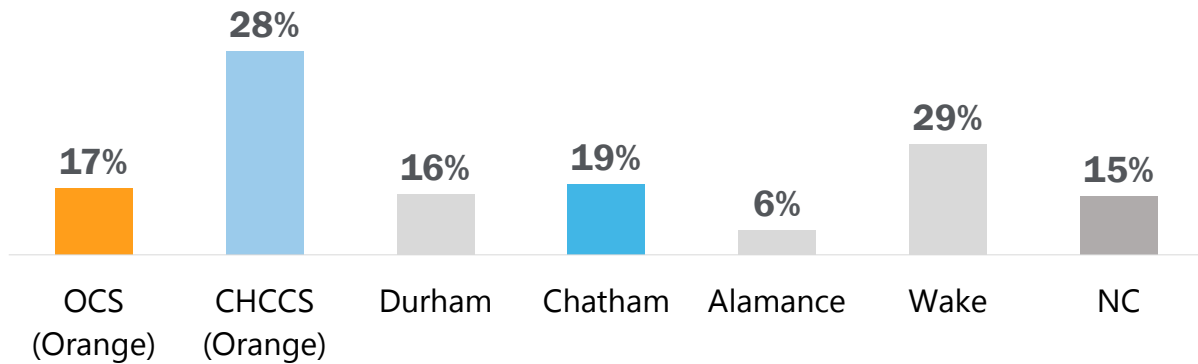

Percent of all Students Meeting all 4 ACT Subtest Benchmarks (English, Math, Reading, Science)

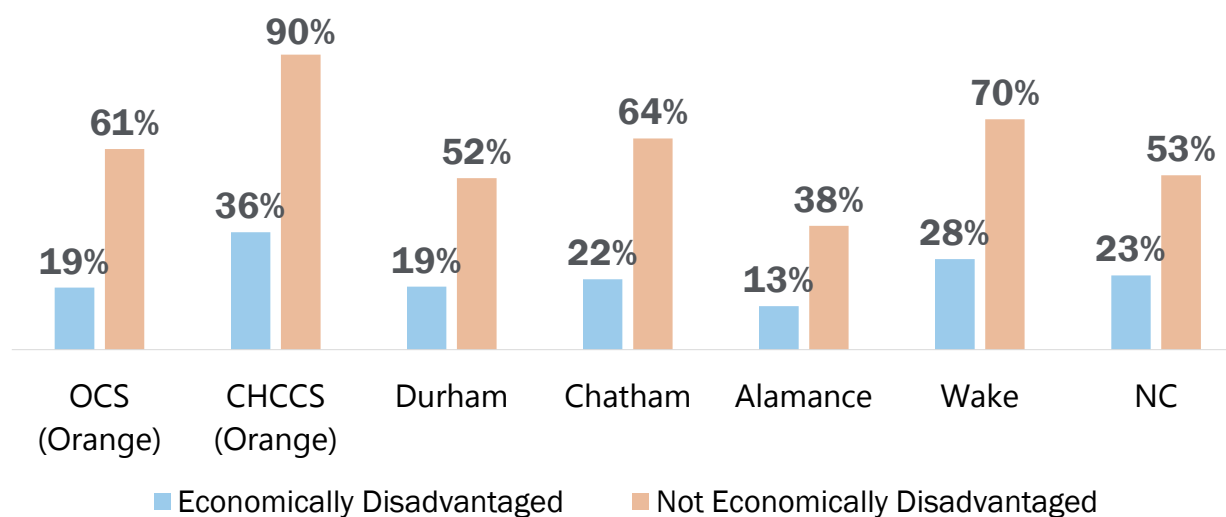

Percent of Students Earning an UNC System-Eligible ACT Composite Score (19+), AY 2024

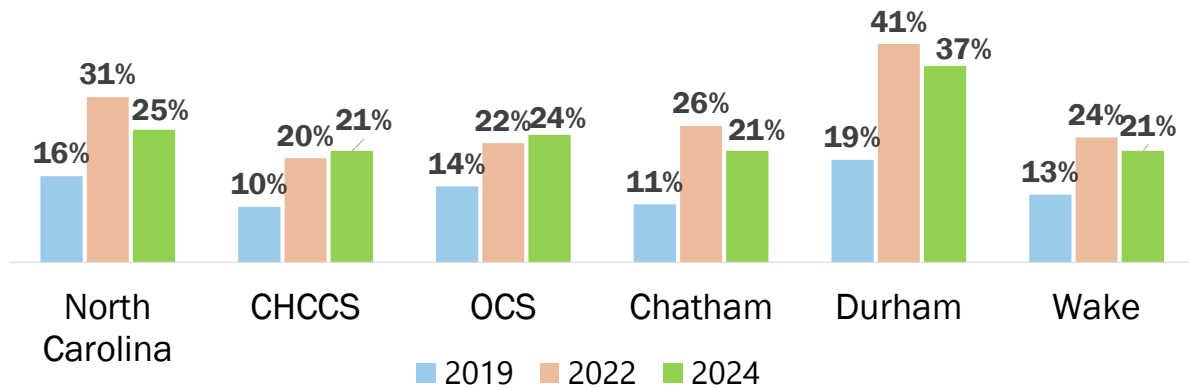

Chronic absenteeism is defined as missing 10% of school days in a year (18+ days if enrolled for the full school year)

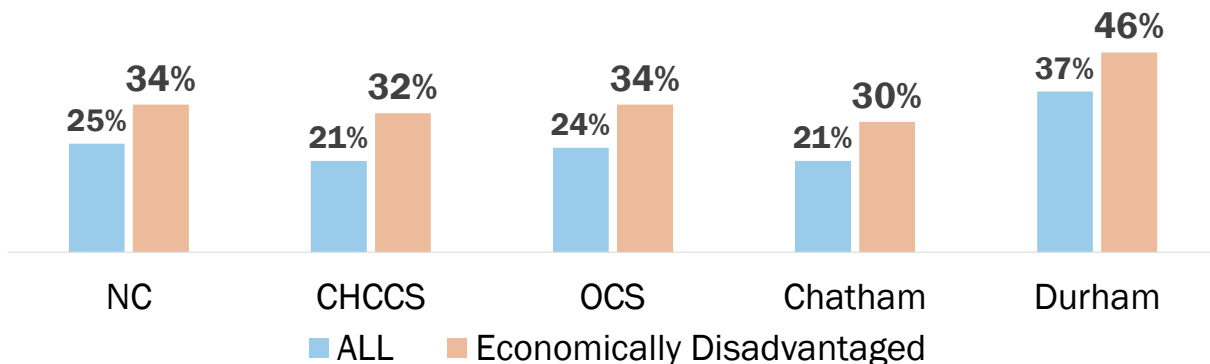

Chronic absenteeism is defined as missing 10% of school days in a year (18+ days if enrolled for the full school year)

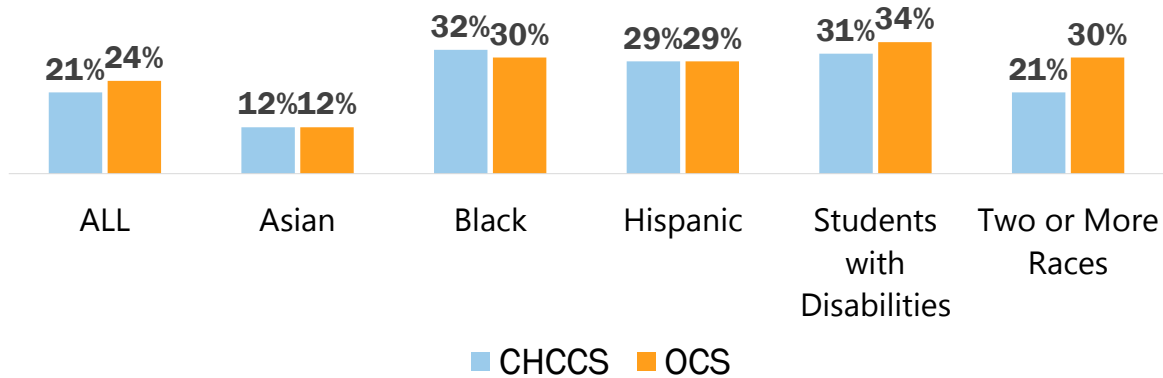

Chronic absenteeism is defined as missing 10% of school days in a year (18+ days if enrolled for the full school year)

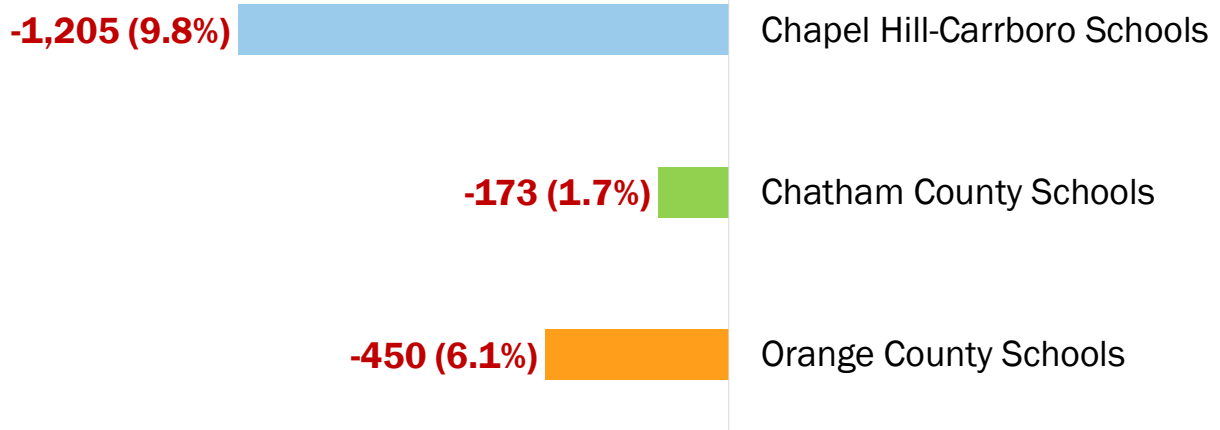

Student increase/decrease Average Daily Members (ADM) AY2020 to AY2025

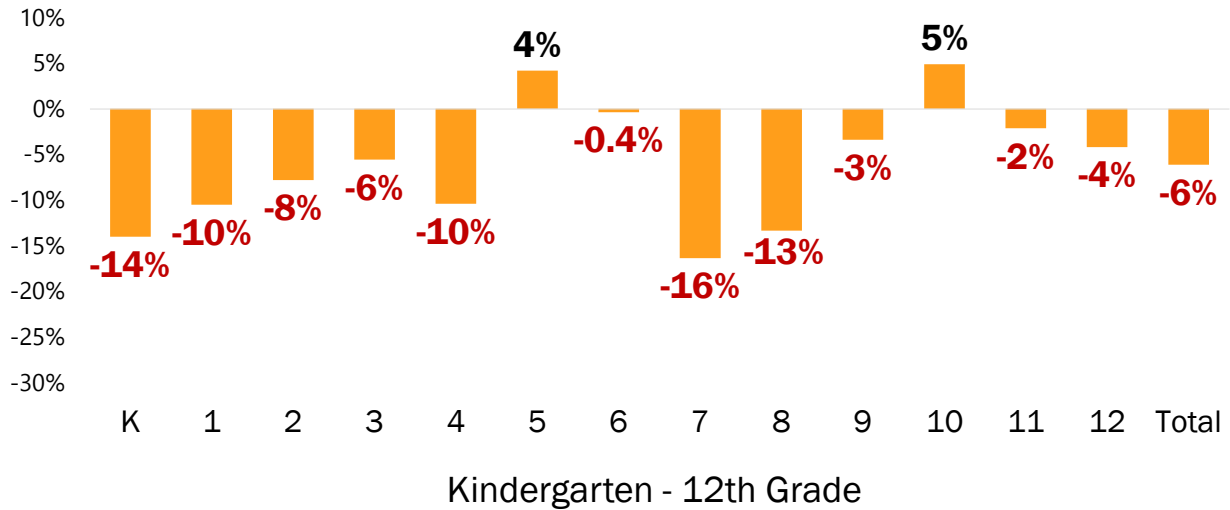

Percent increase/decrease in Average Daily Membership (ADM), AY2020 to AY2025

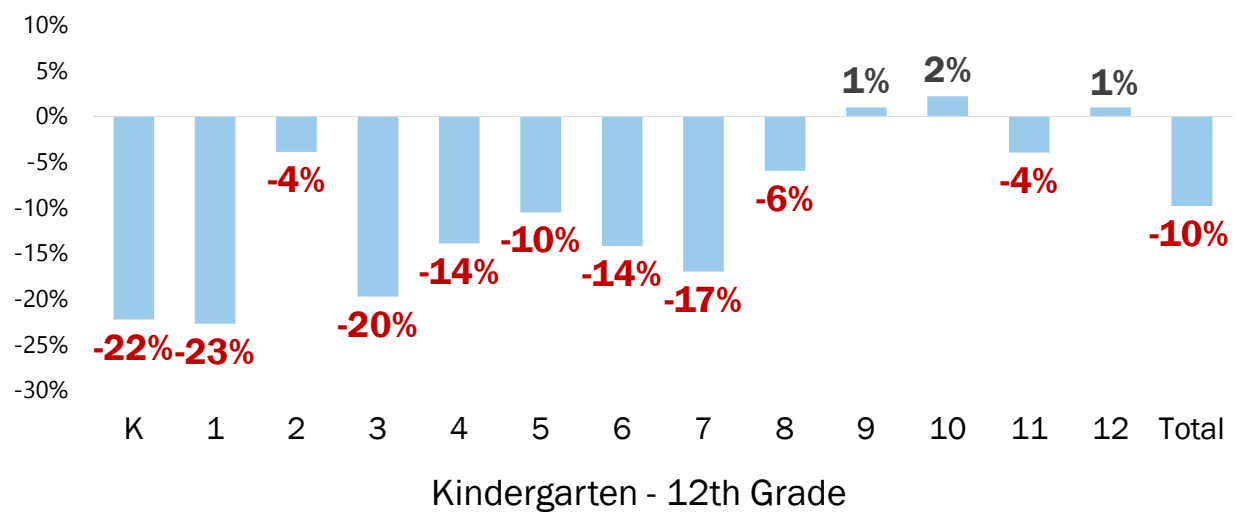

Percent increase/decrease in Average Daily Membership (ADM), AY2020 to AY2025

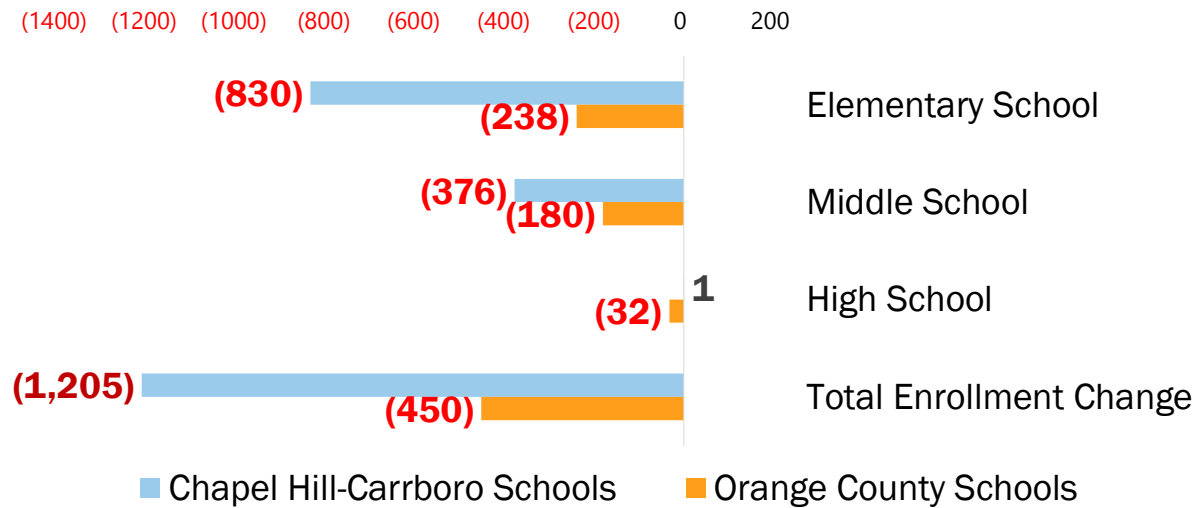

Student increase/decrease in Average Daily Membership (ADM) between AY2020 and AY2025

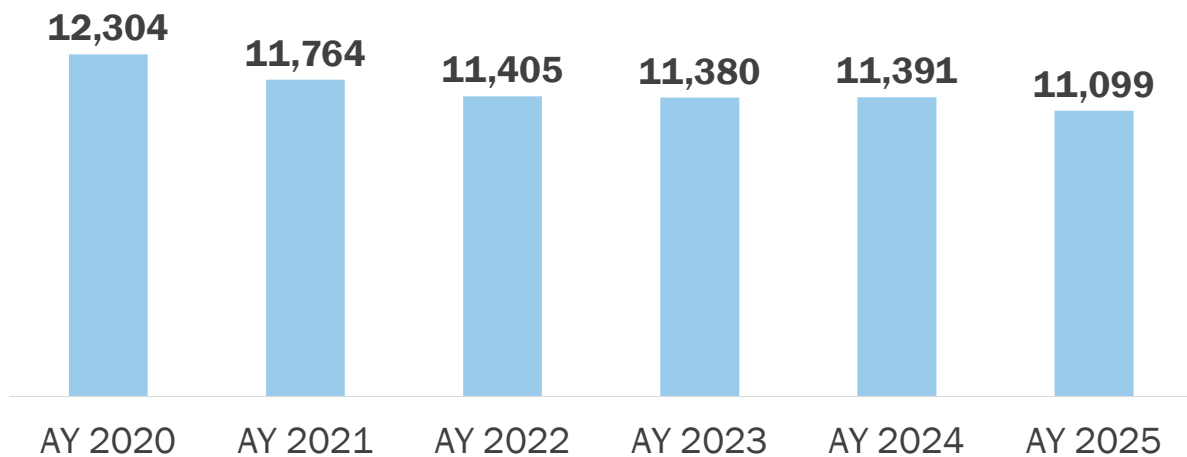

Principal's Monthly Report Month 2, Average Daily Membership (ADM) by Grade

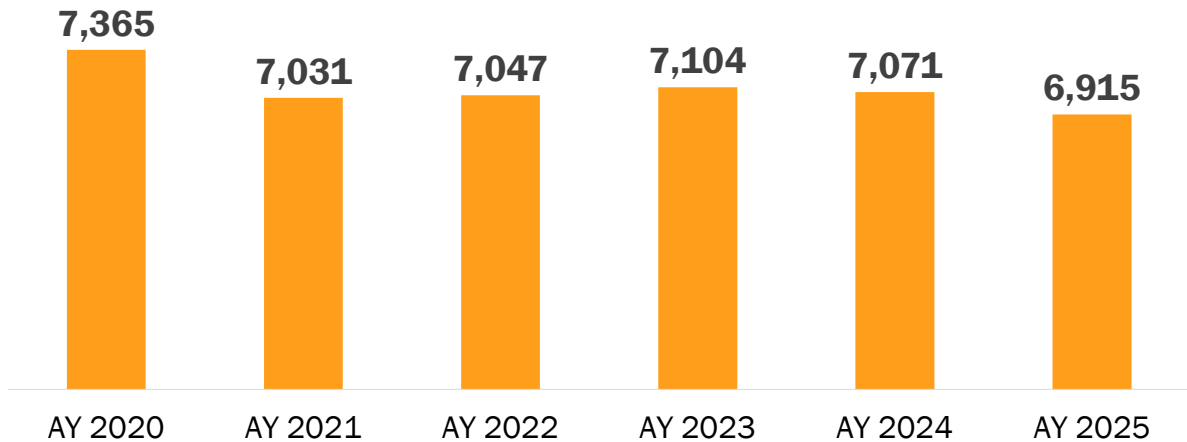

Principal's Monthly Report Month 2, Average Daily Membership (ADM) by Grade

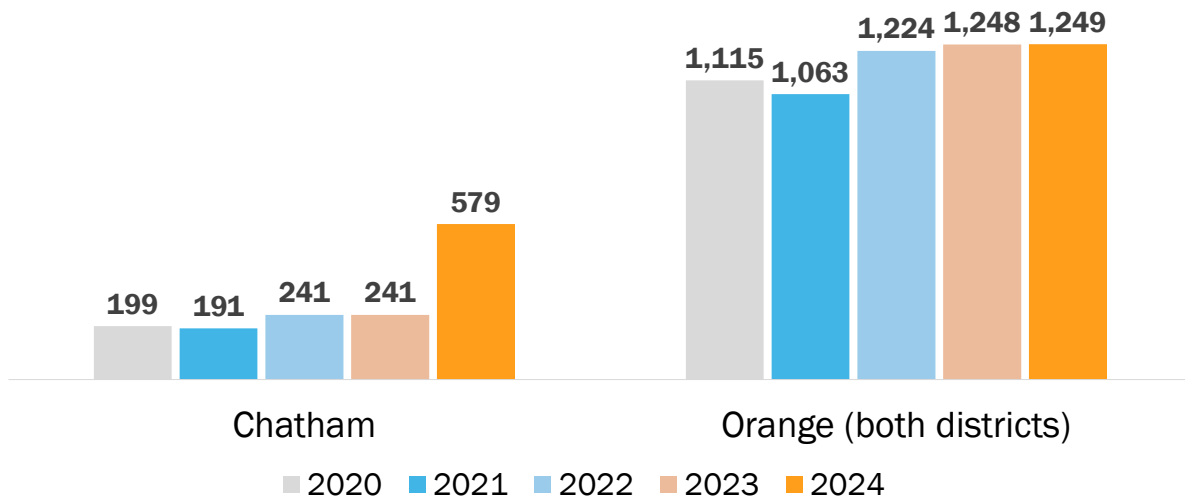

Number of students enrolled in private school, AY2020 – AY2024

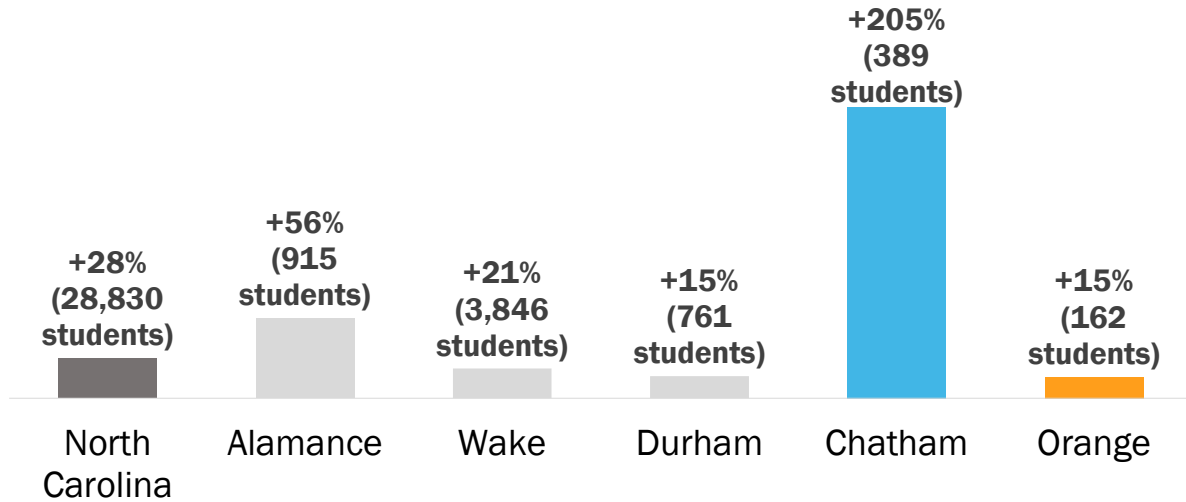

Number and percent change in private school enrollments from AY2019 to AY2024

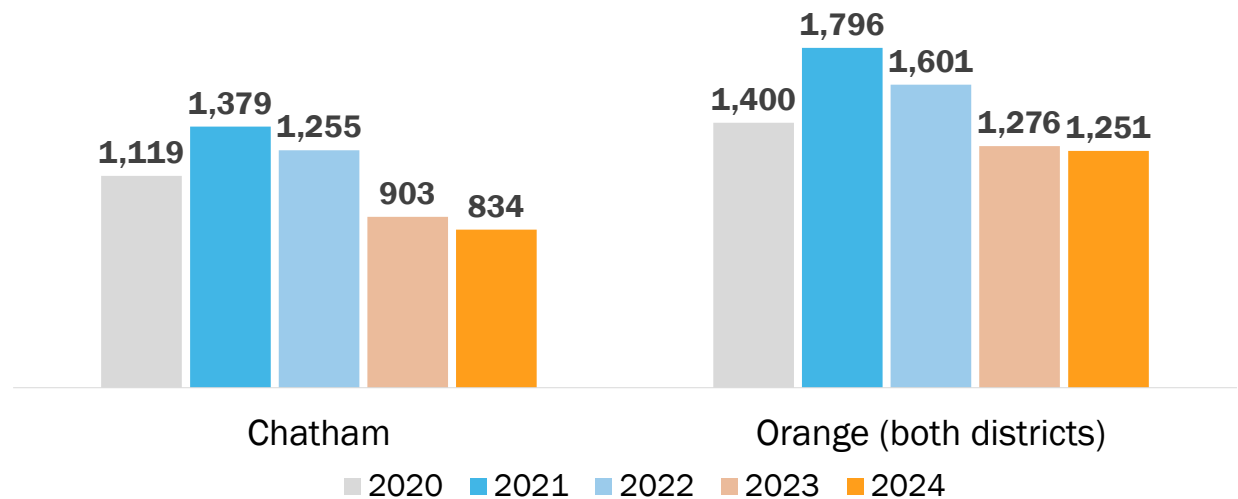

Number of students enrolled in home school, AY2020 – AY2024

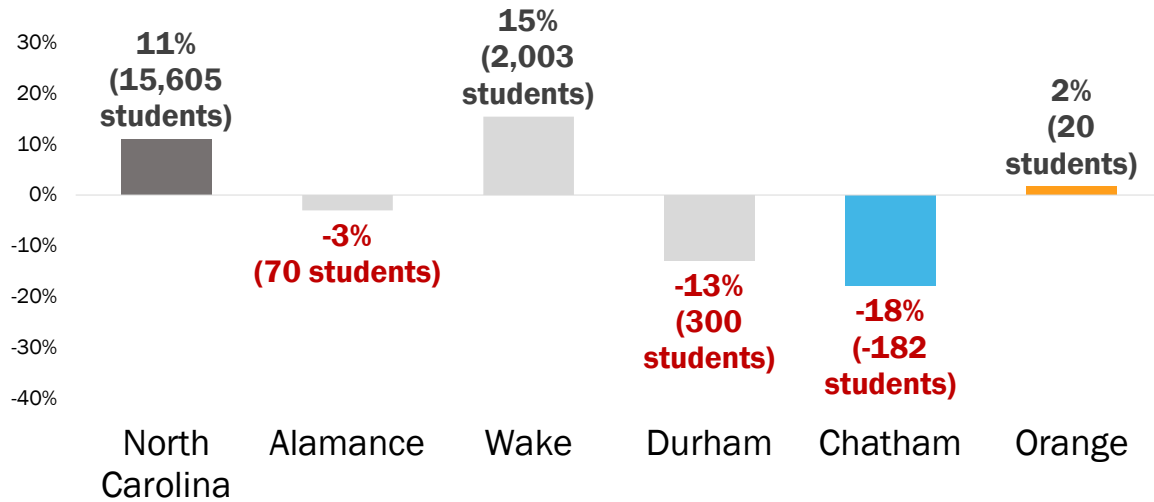

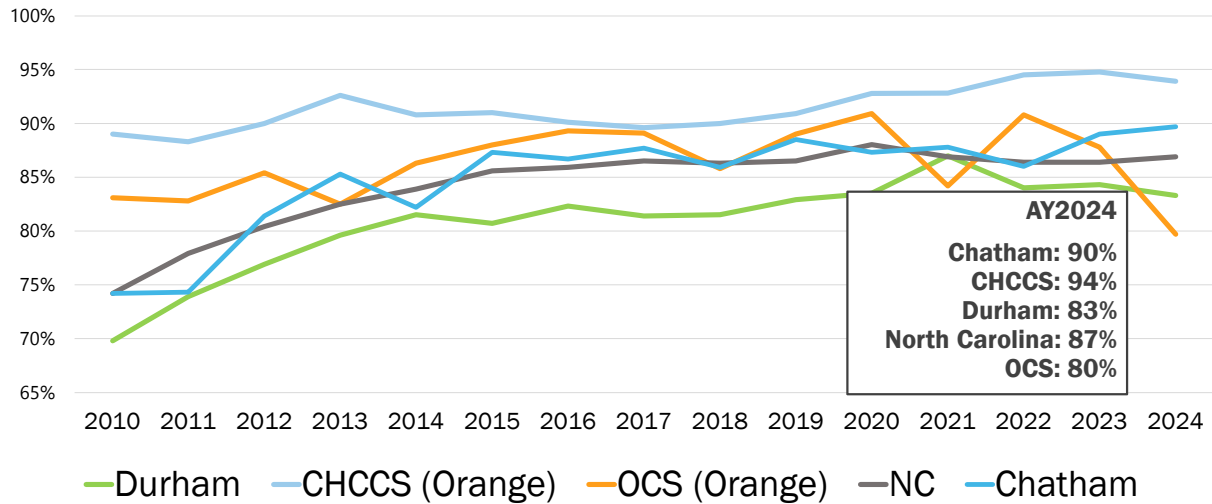

Share of 9th grade cohort that graduated in 4 years, by graduation year

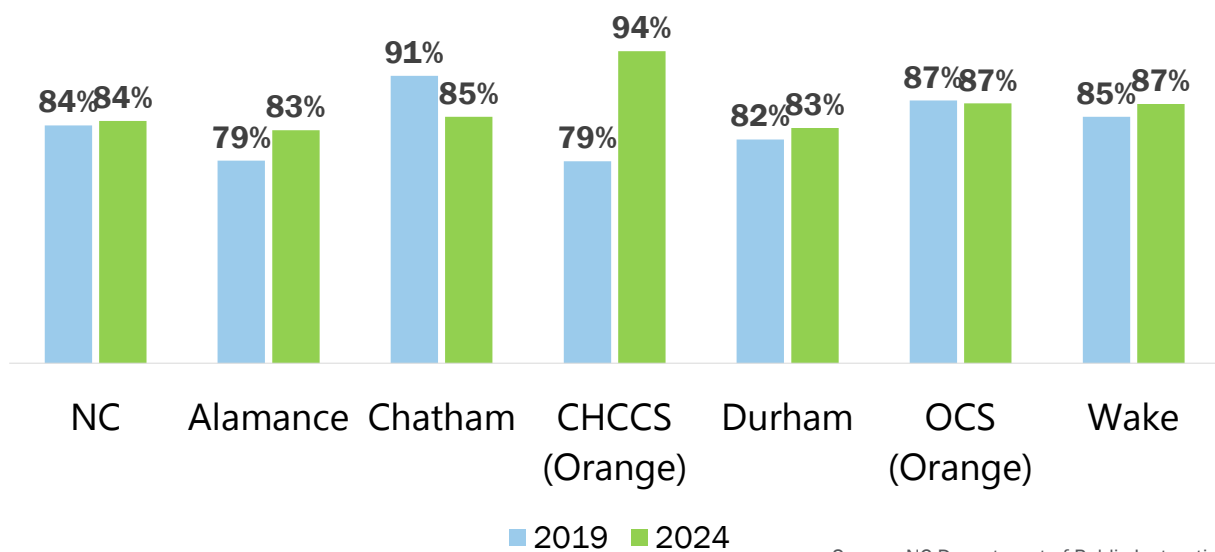

Share of 9th Grade cohort that graduated in 4 Years, by graduation year

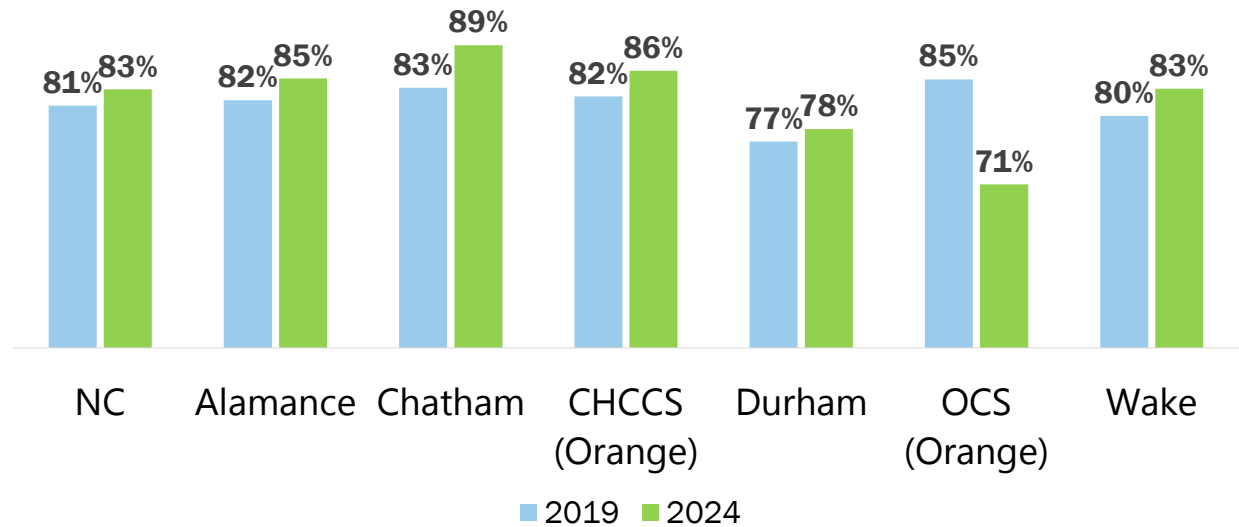

Share of 9th Grade cohort that graduated in 4 Years, by graduation year

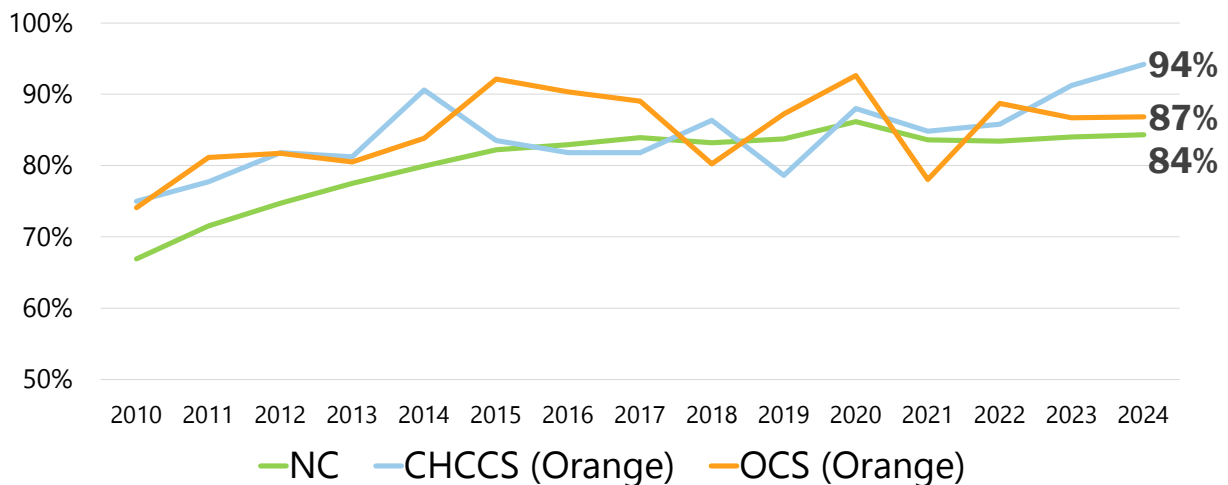

Share of 9th grade cohort that graduated in 4 years, by graduation year (2010-2024)

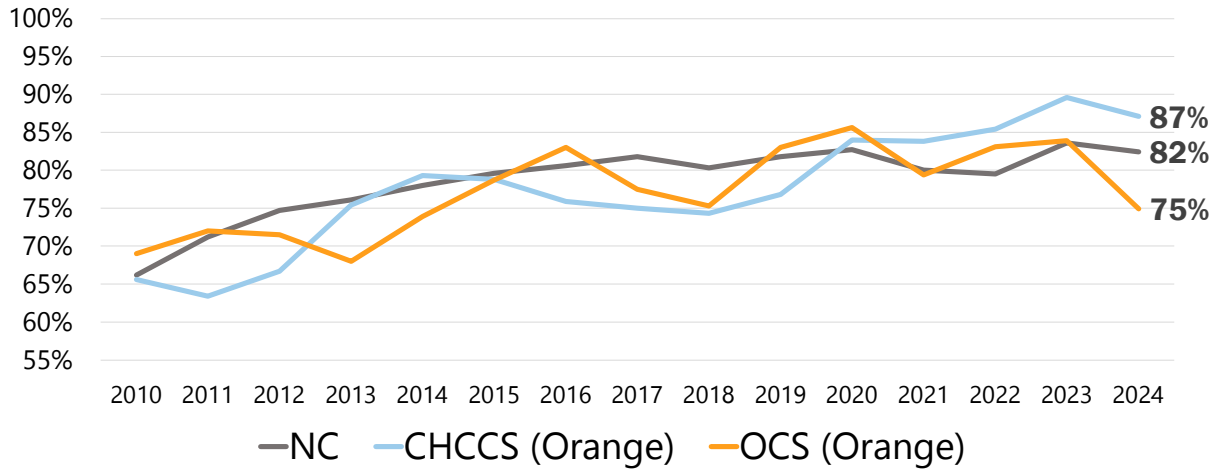

Share of 9th grade cohort that graduated in 4 years, by graduation year (2010-2024)

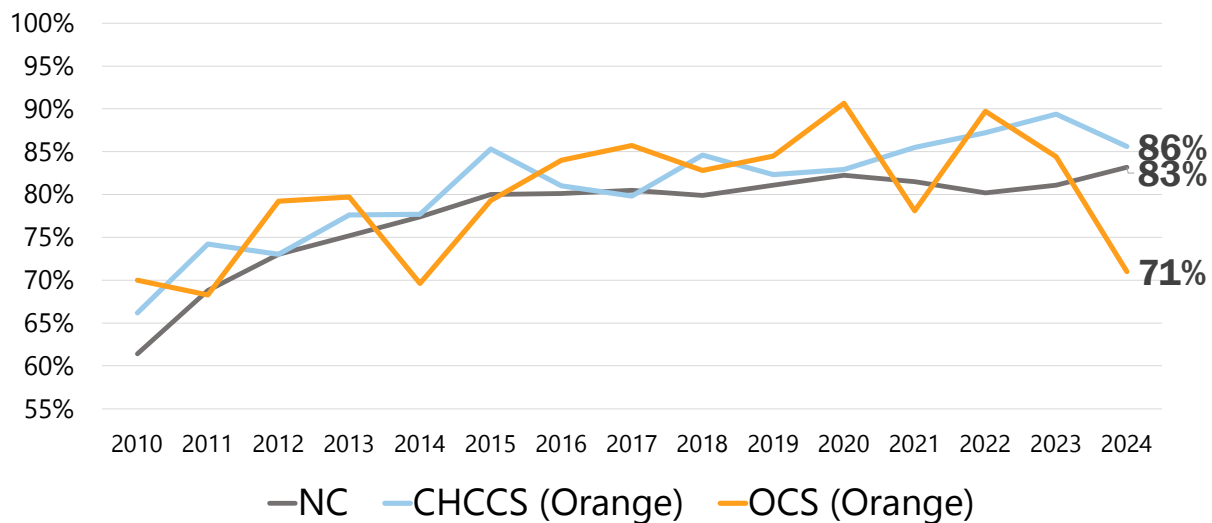

Share of 9th grade cohort that graduated in 4 years, by graduation year (2010-2024)

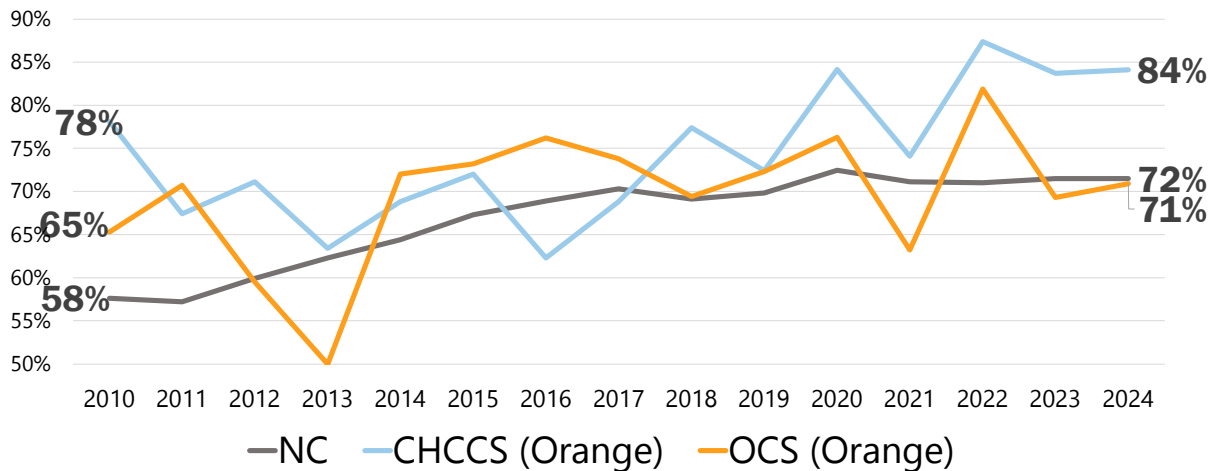

Share of 9th grade cohort that graduated in 4 years, by graduation year (2010-2024)

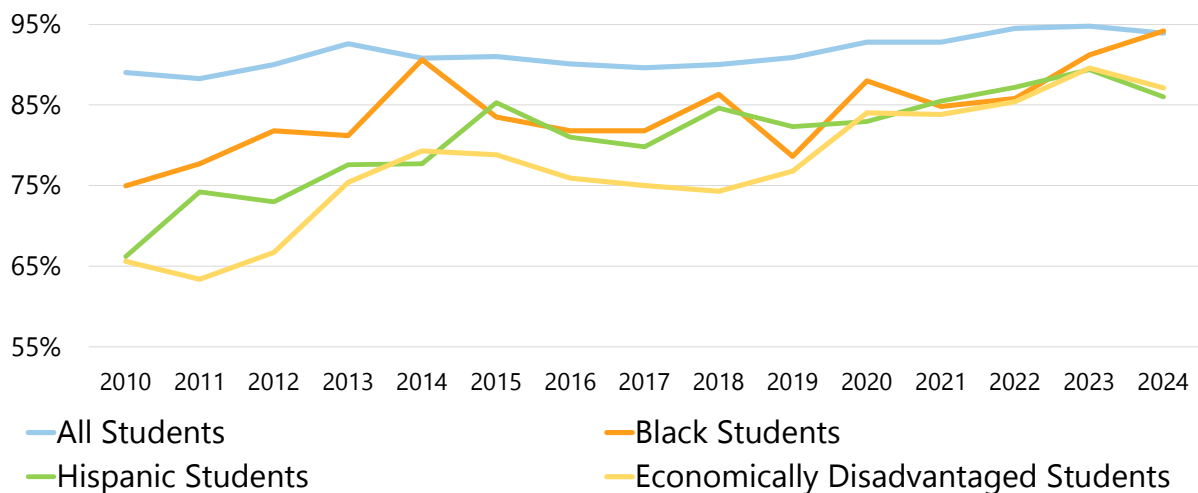

Share of 9th grade cohort that graduated in 4 years, by graduation year (AY2006 to AY2024)

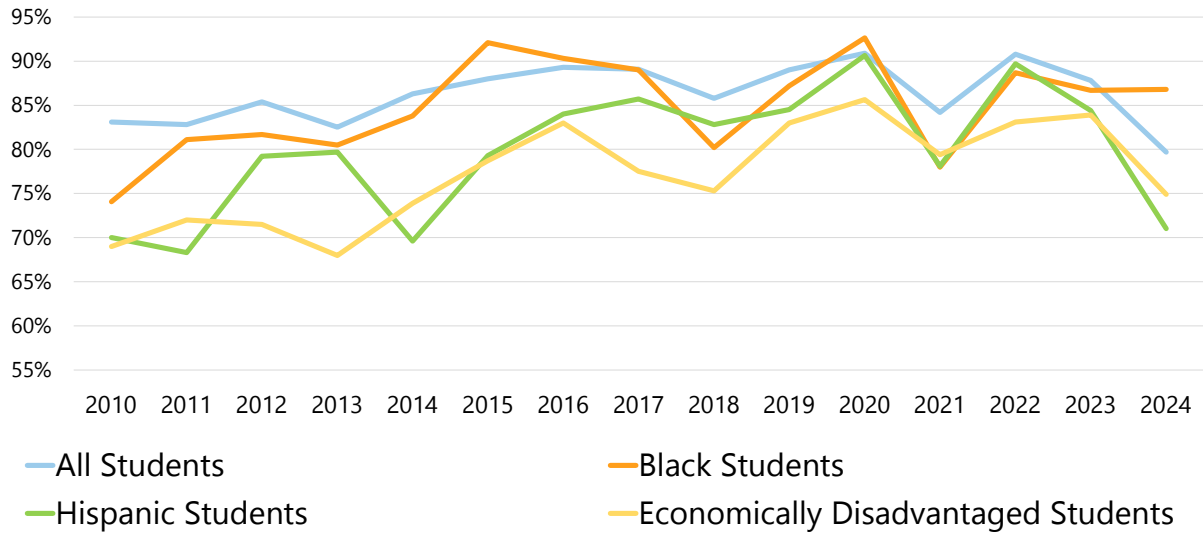

Orange County Schools (OCS) 4-Year Graduation Rates

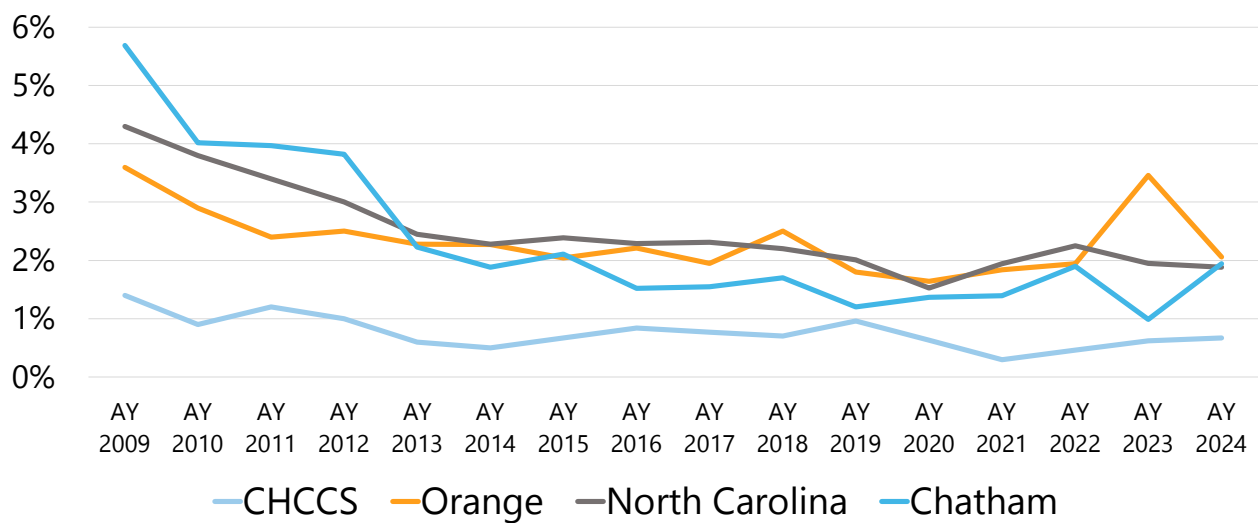
Share of 9th grade cohort that graduated in 4 years, by graduation year (AY2006-AY2024)

High School Dropout Rates

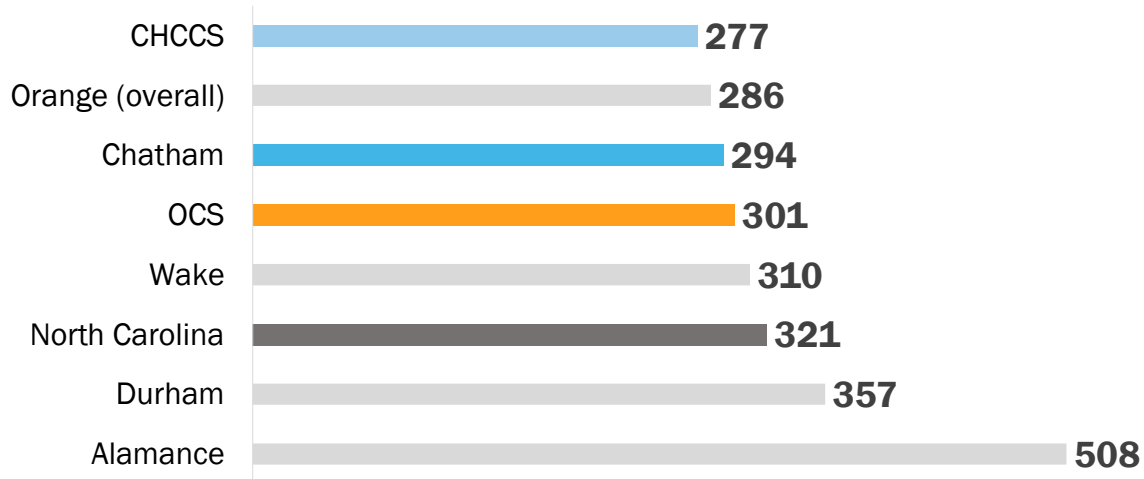

Number of students for every 1 guidance counselor, AY2024

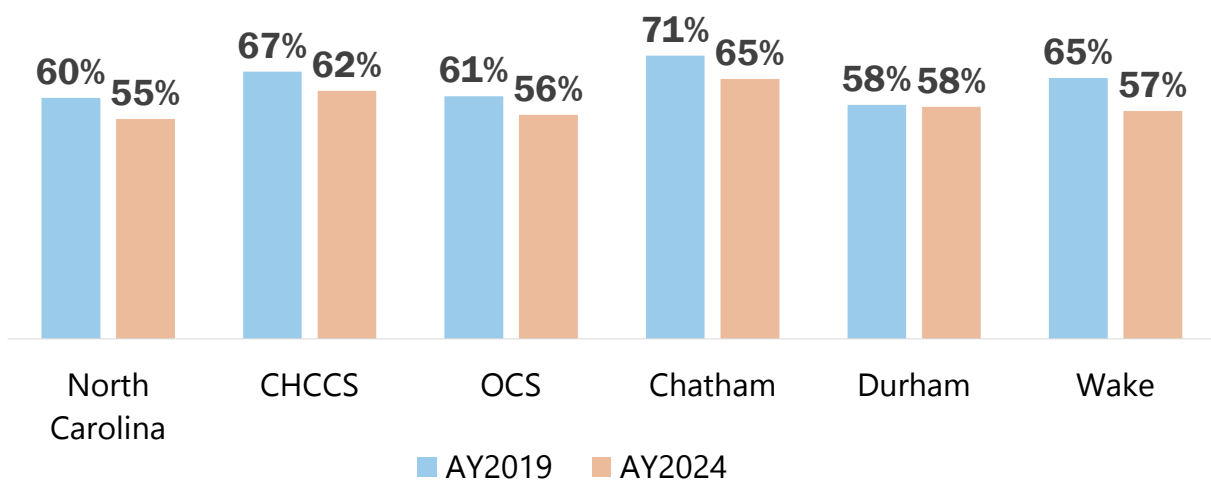

Percent of high school graduates who completed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), AY2019 vs AY2024

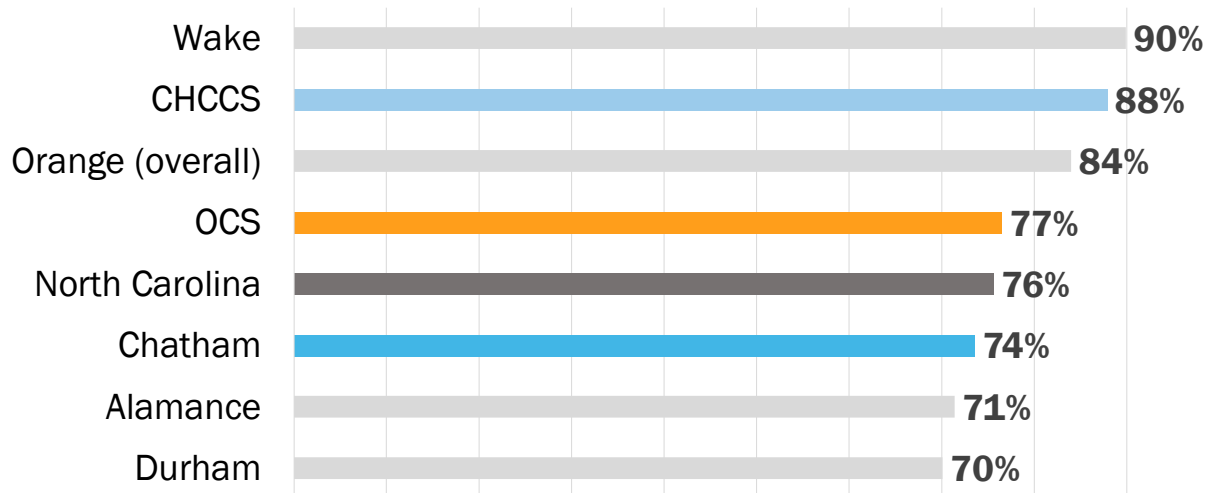

Percent of high school graduates who reported intentions to enroll in post-secondary education, AY2023

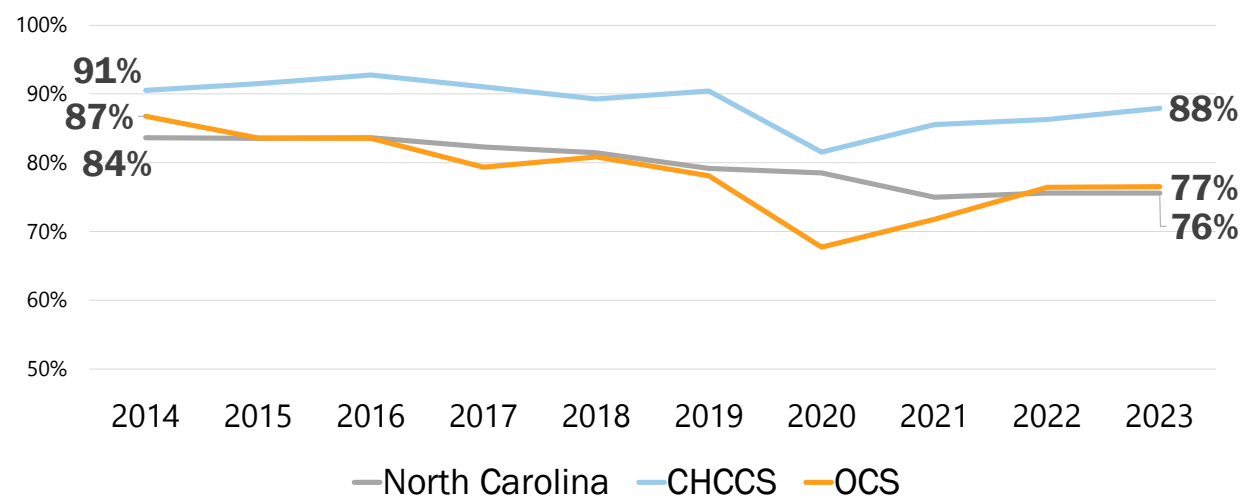

Percent of high school graduates who reported intentions to enroll in postsecondary education, AY2011 to AY2023

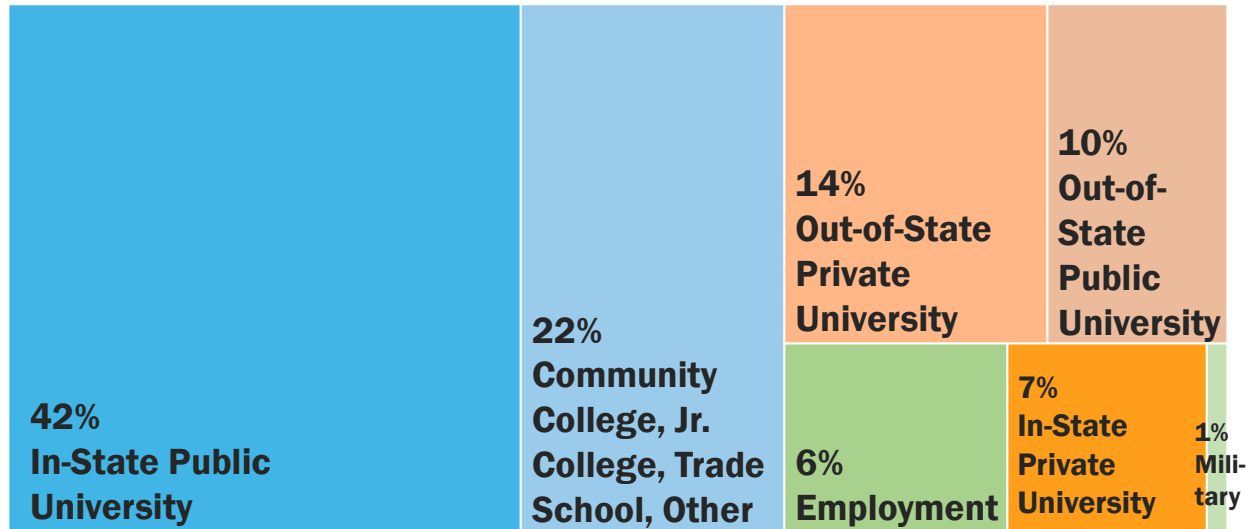

Breakdown of Chapel Hill Carrboro City Schools seniors' reported plans post-graduation, AY2023

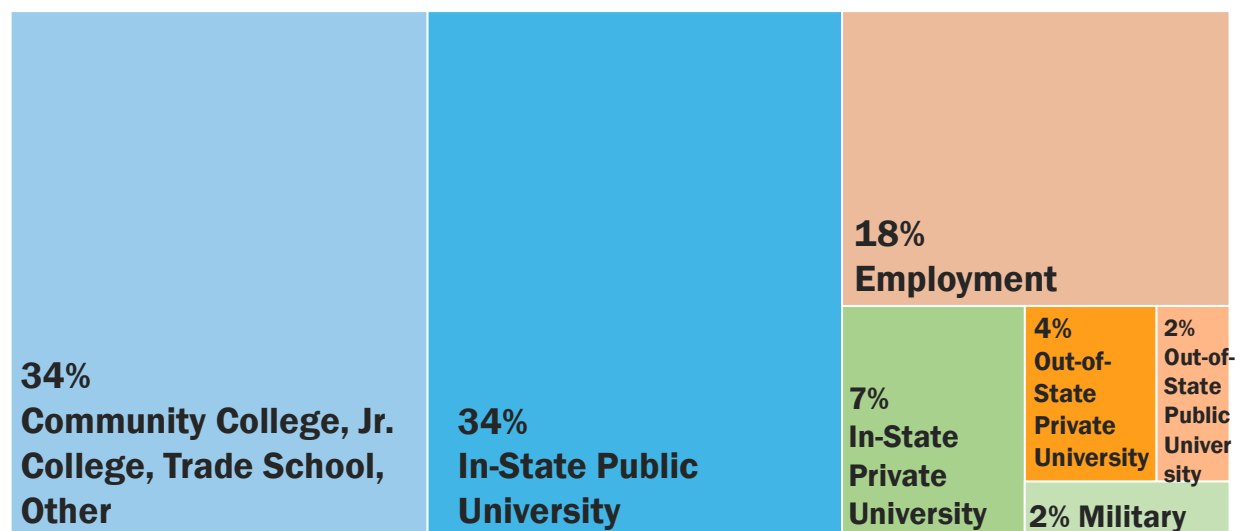

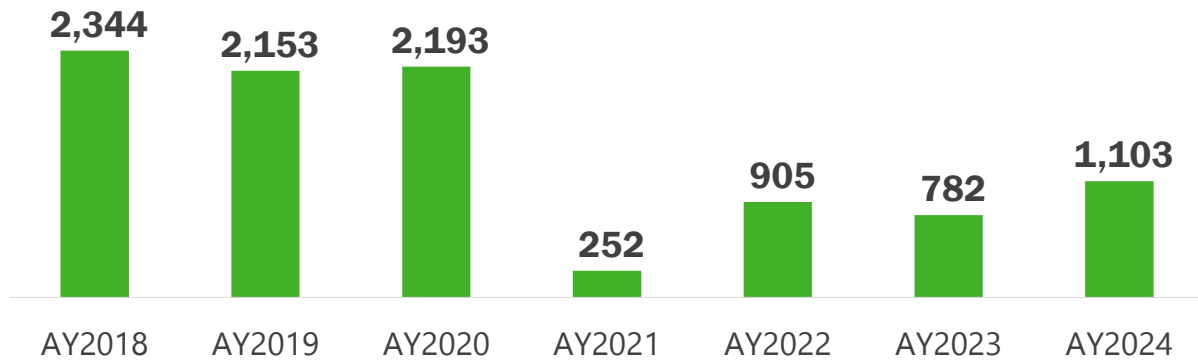
Breakdown of Orange County Schools seniors' reported plans post-graduation, AY2023

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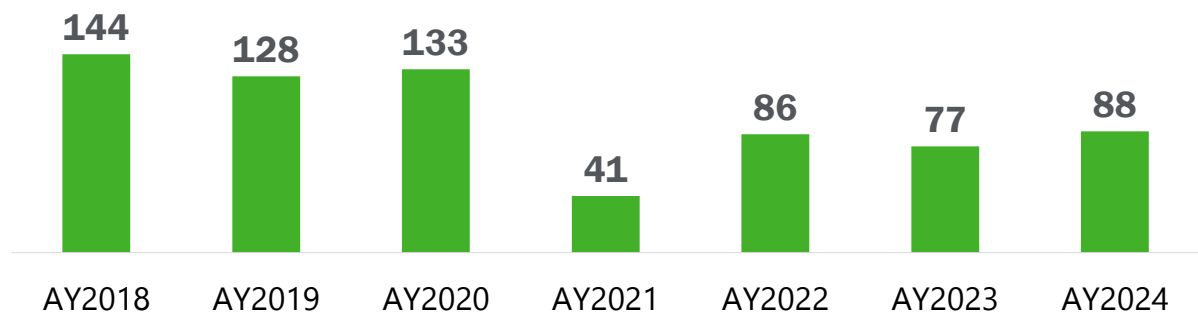
Durham Tech In-Person For-Credit Class Enrollment (Orange County Campus)

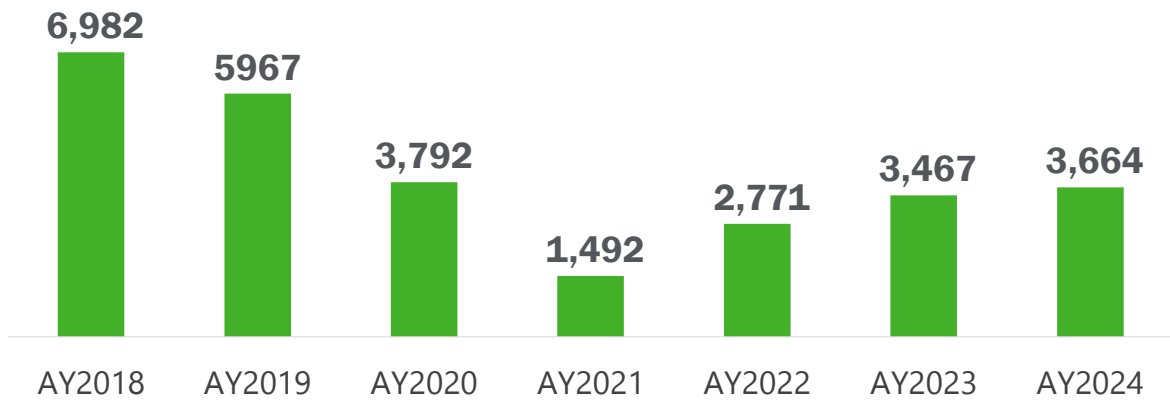
Durham Tech In-Person Credit Classes Offered (Orange County Campus)

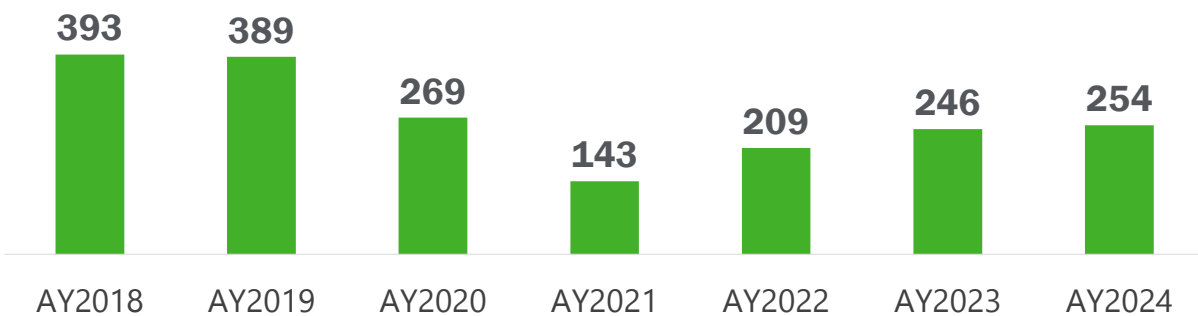
Durham Tech Continuing Education (noncredit) Enrollment (Orange County Campus)

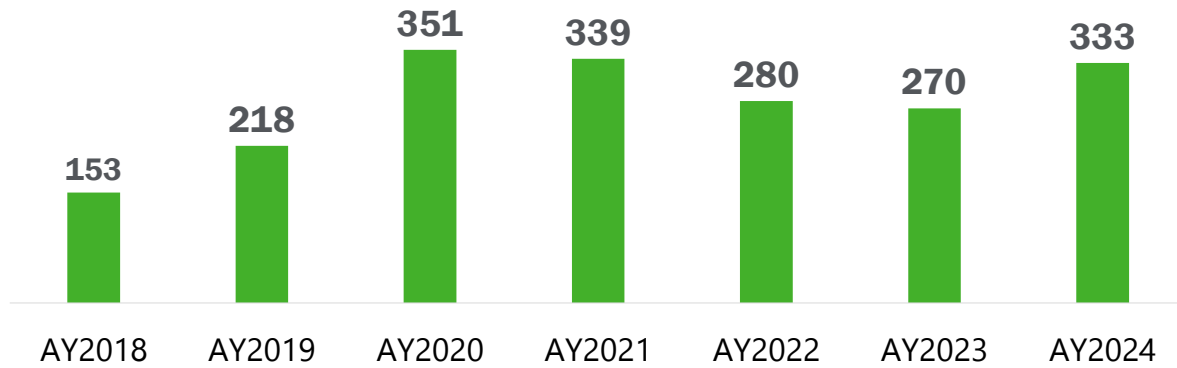
Durham Tech In-Person Continuing Education (noncredit) Classes Offered (Orange County Campus)

Dually Enrolled High School Students Taking Classes at Durham Tech (Orange County Residents)

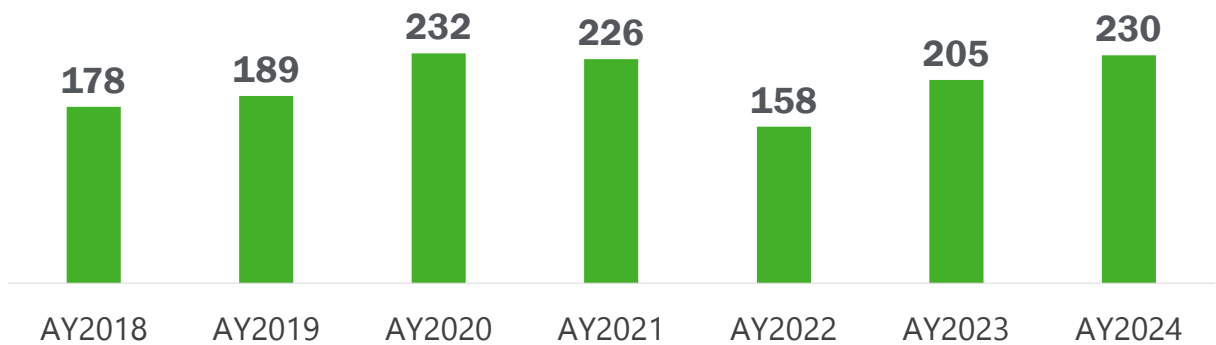

Orange Promise gives eligible graduates of high schools in Orange County \$500 per semester to offset Durham Tech tuition costs.

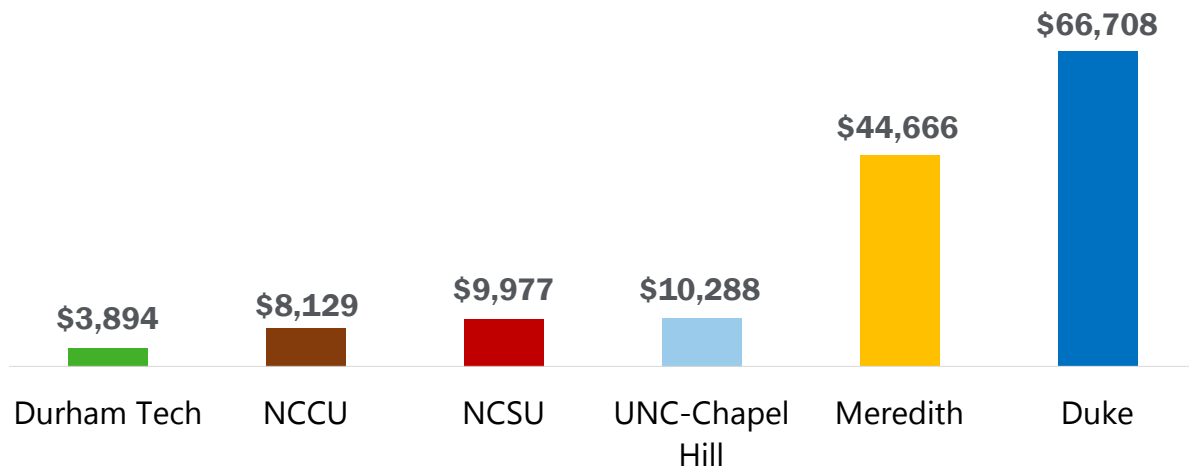

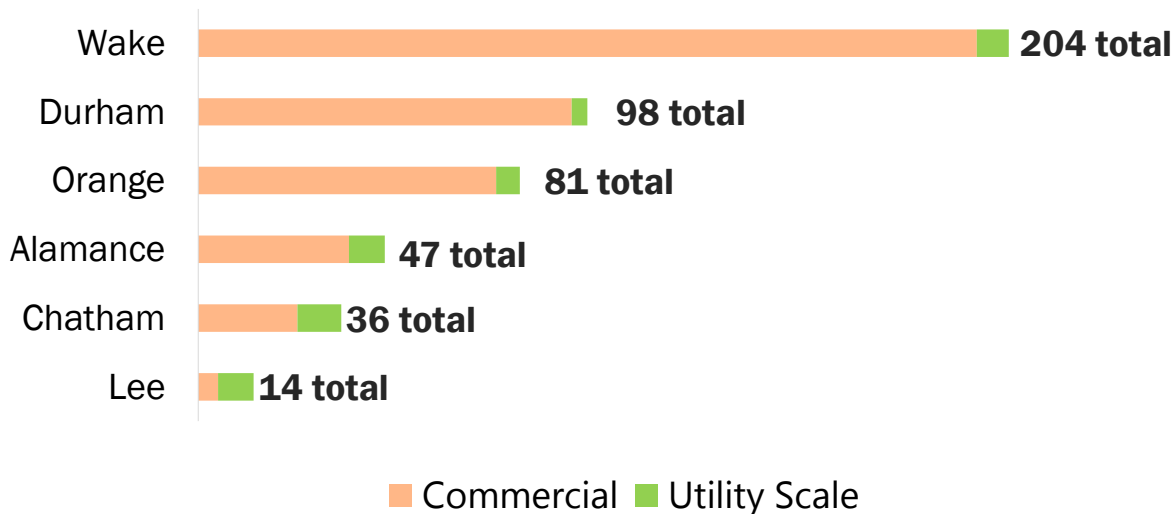

Number of installed solar systems by type, 'Commercial' and 'Utility Scale,' 2024

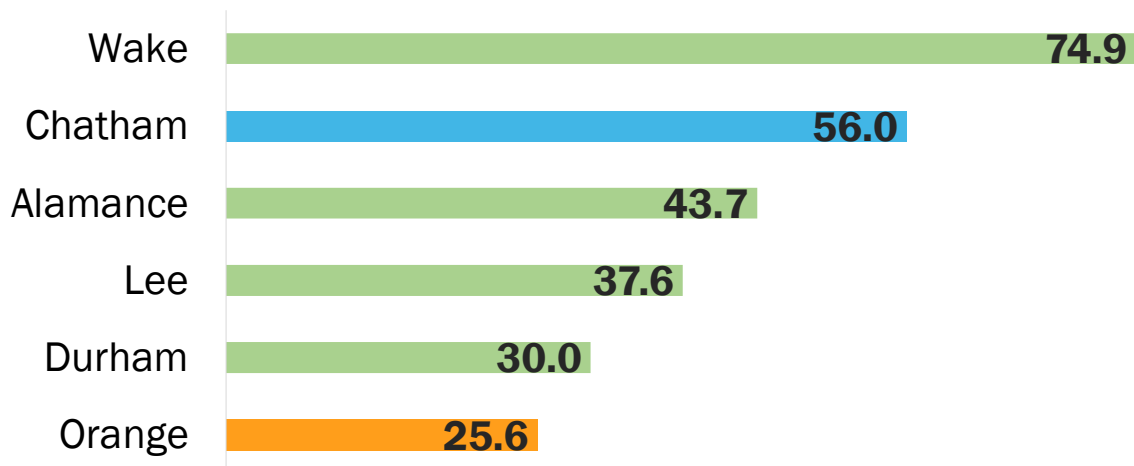

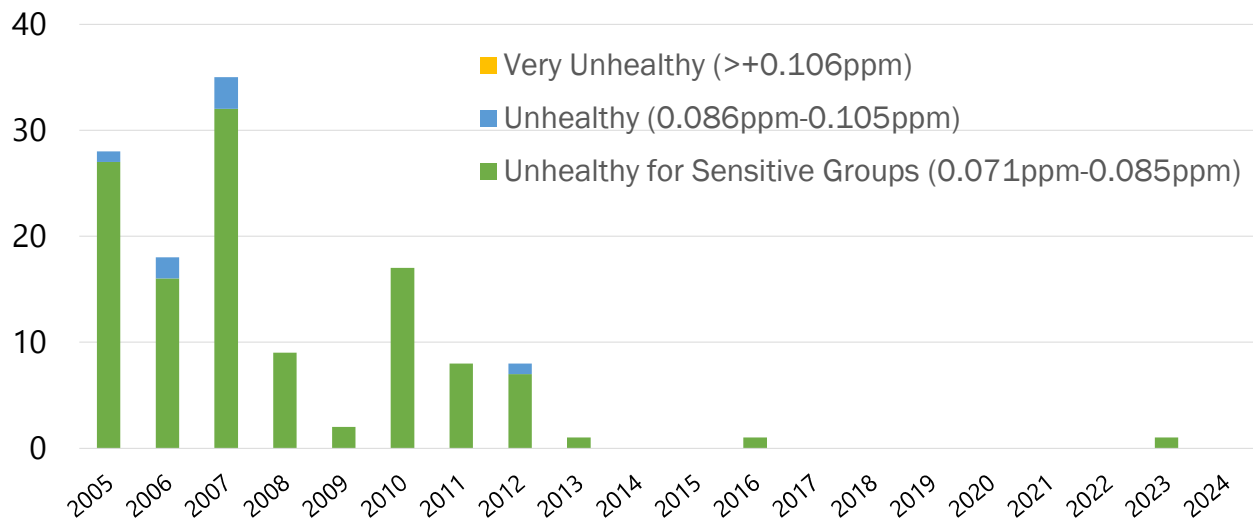

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Ozone Exceedance Days: Durham-Chapel Hill

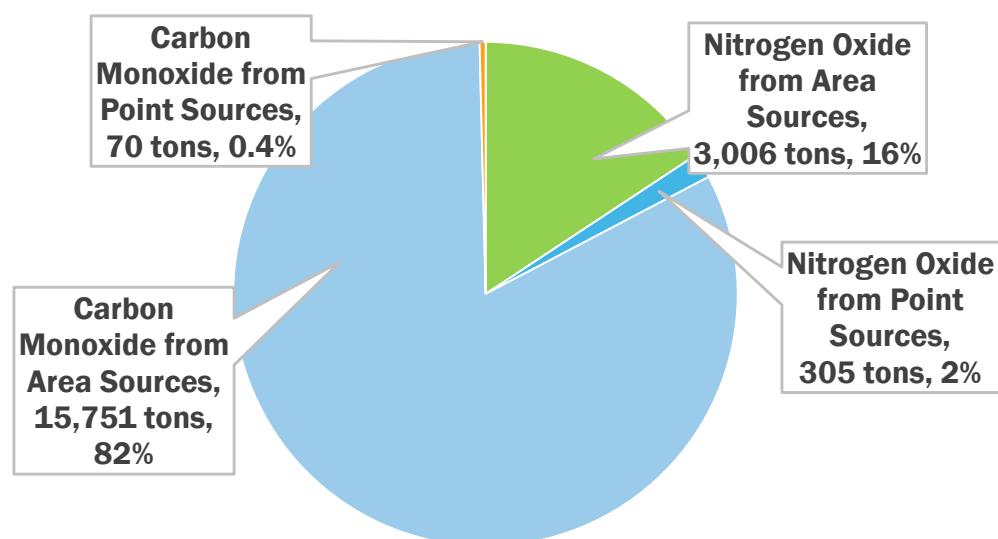
Number of days 8-hour ozone daily max exceeded 0.070ppm, 2005 through 2024

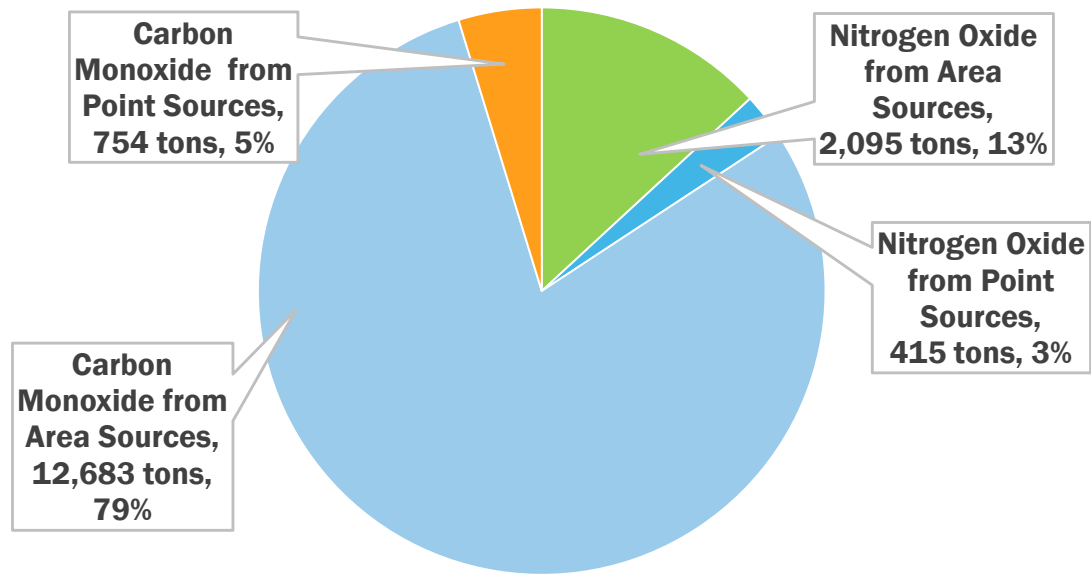

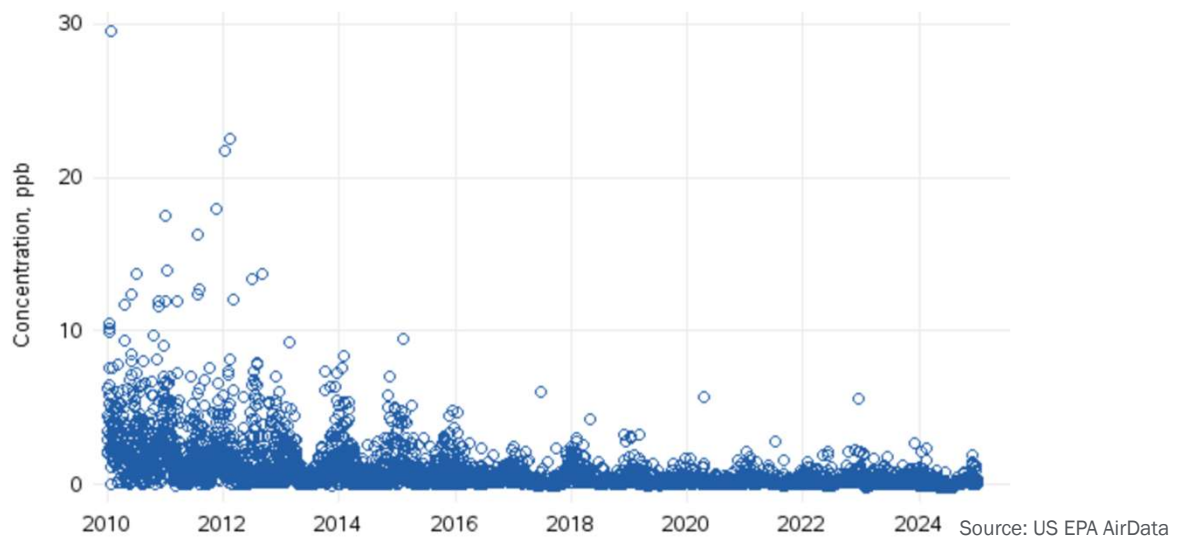

Triangle Area Daily Max 1-Hour SO₂ Concentrations

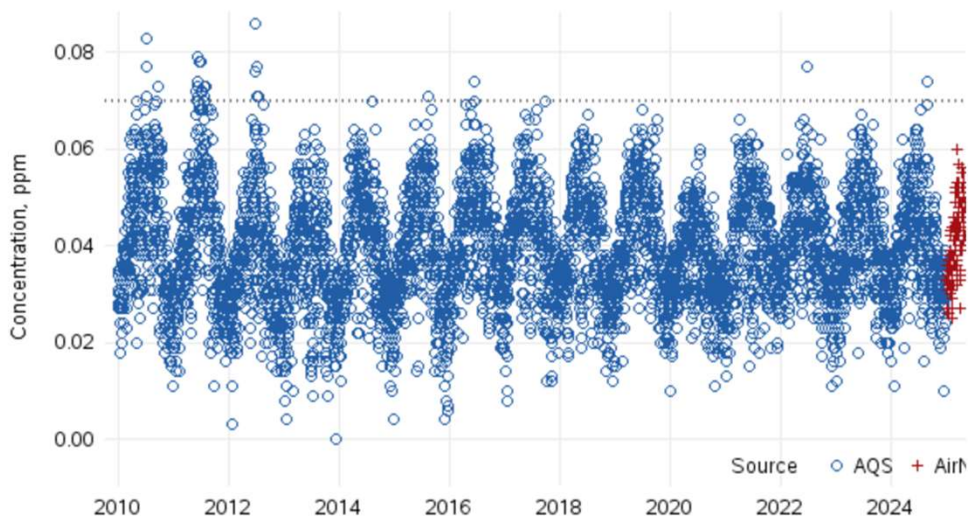

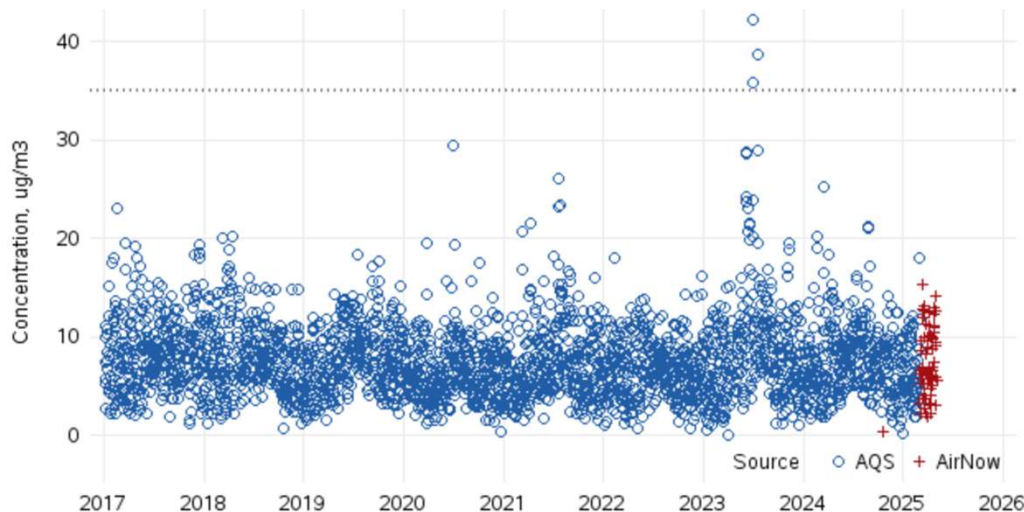

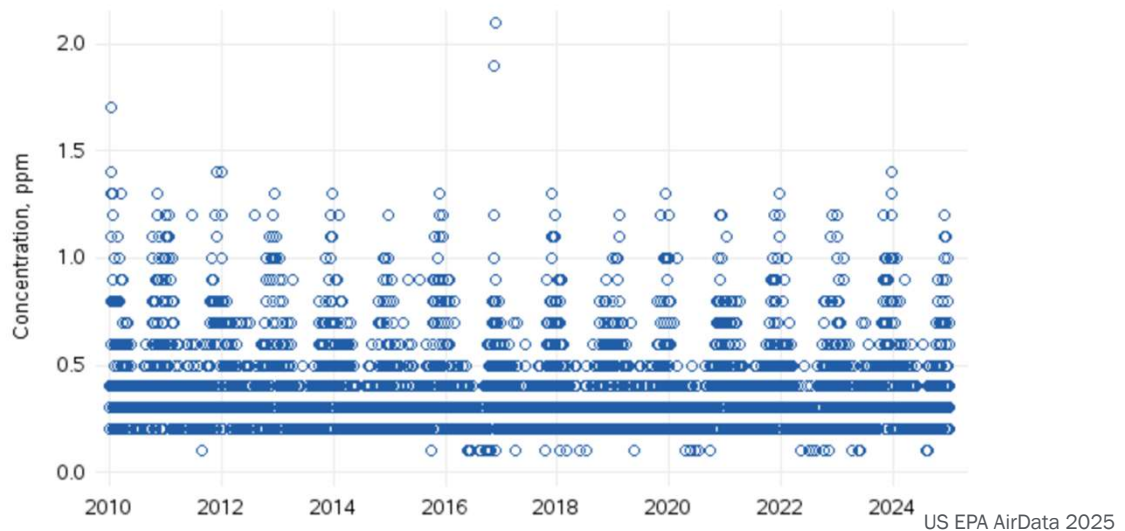

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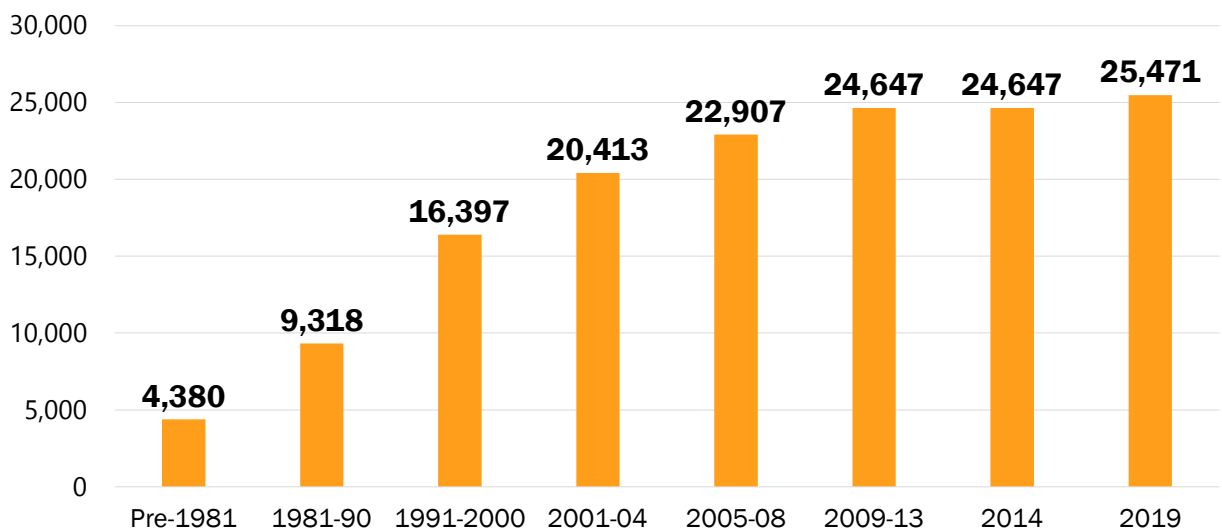
Triangle Area Daily Max 8-Hour CO Concentrations

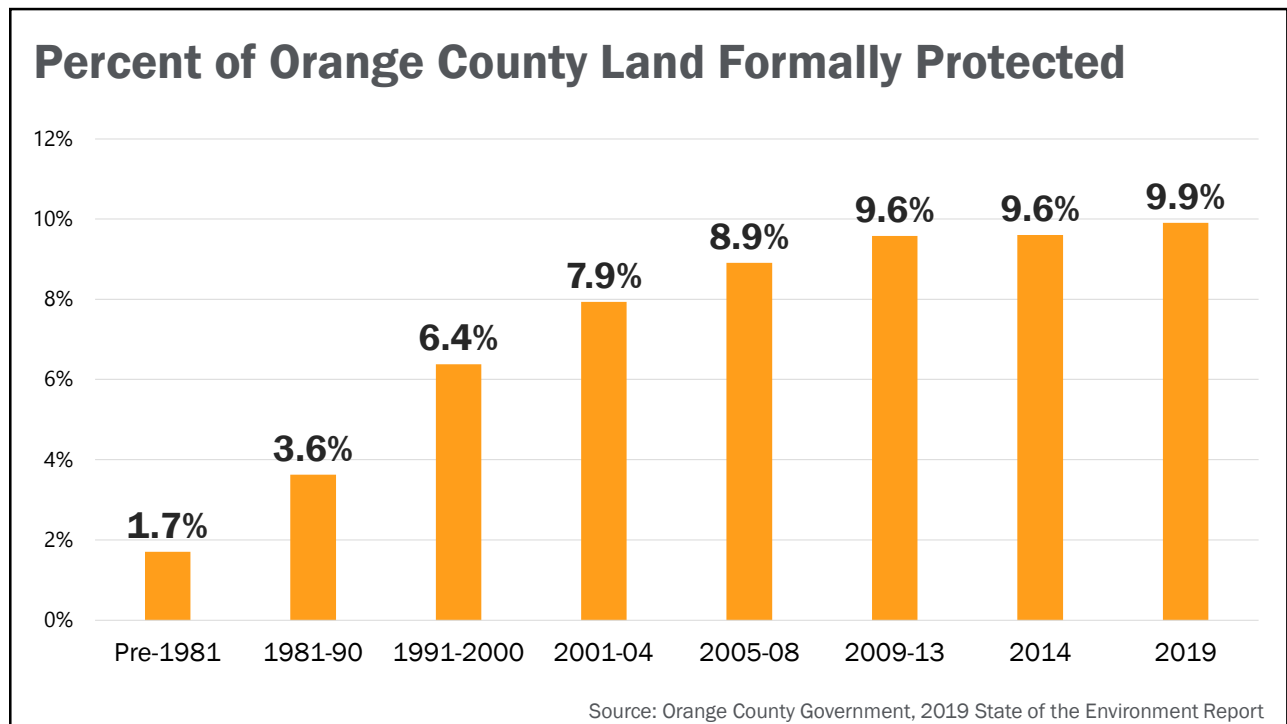

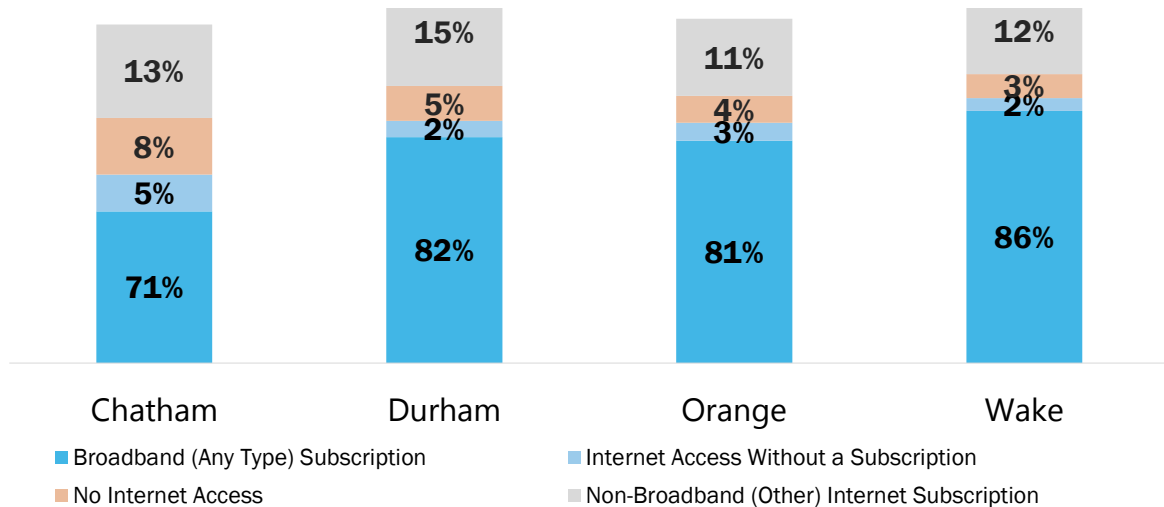

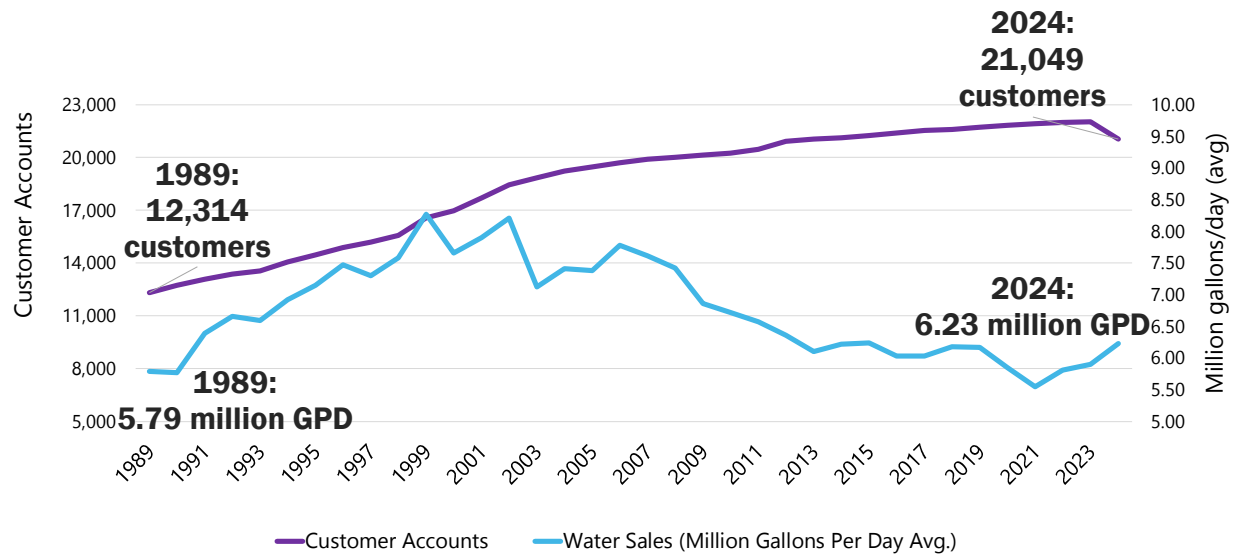
By race/ethnicity – Orange County

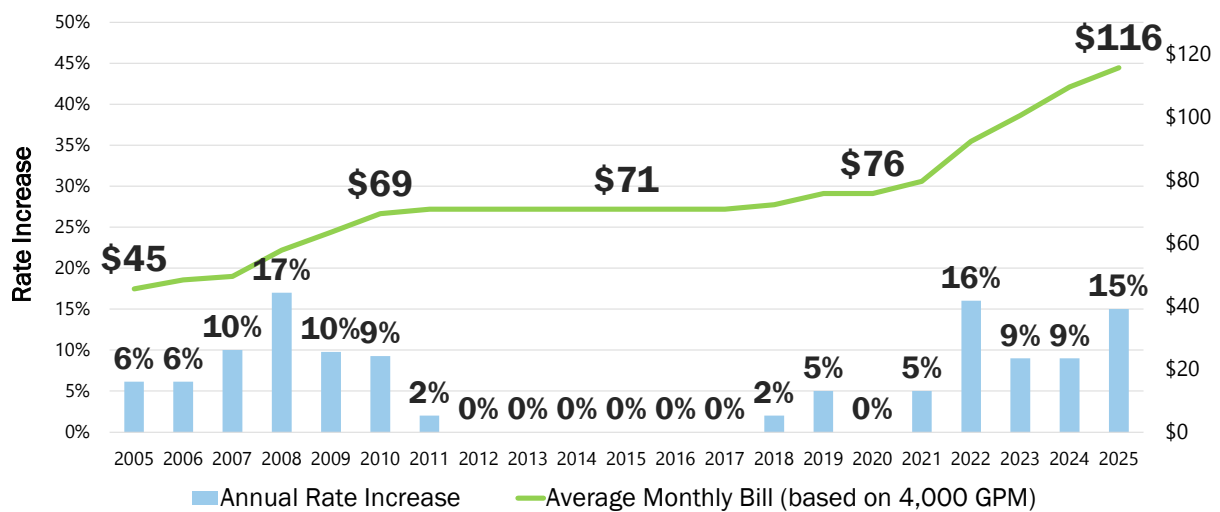

OWASA Average Monthly Bill and Annual Rate Increase

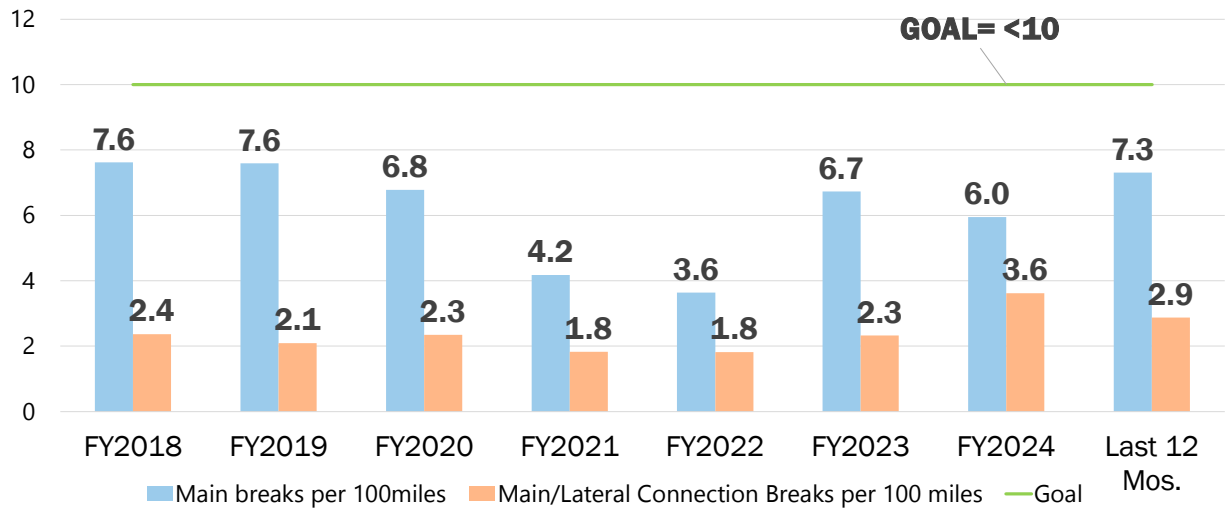

OWASA main breaks and main/connections breaks per 100 miles of water main

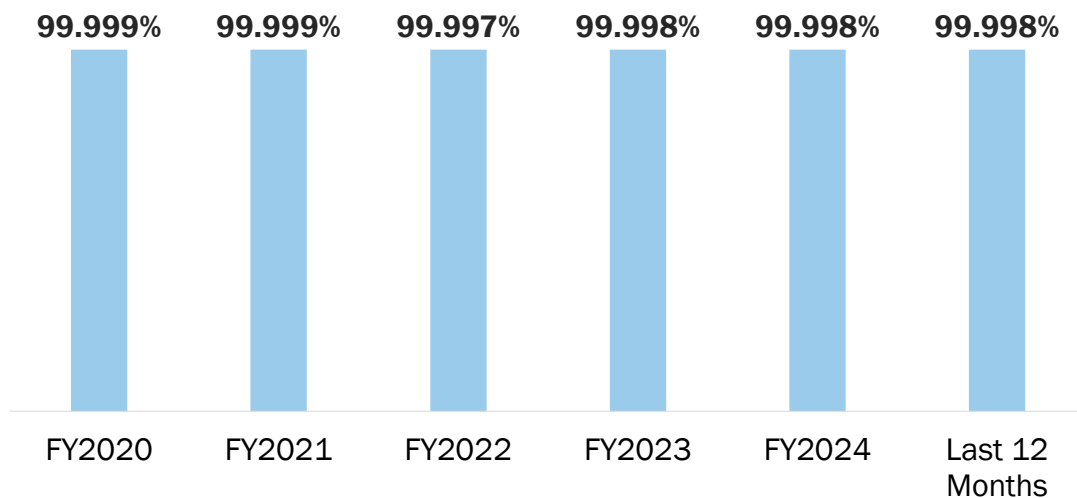

OWASA Service Reliability Exceeds 99.997%

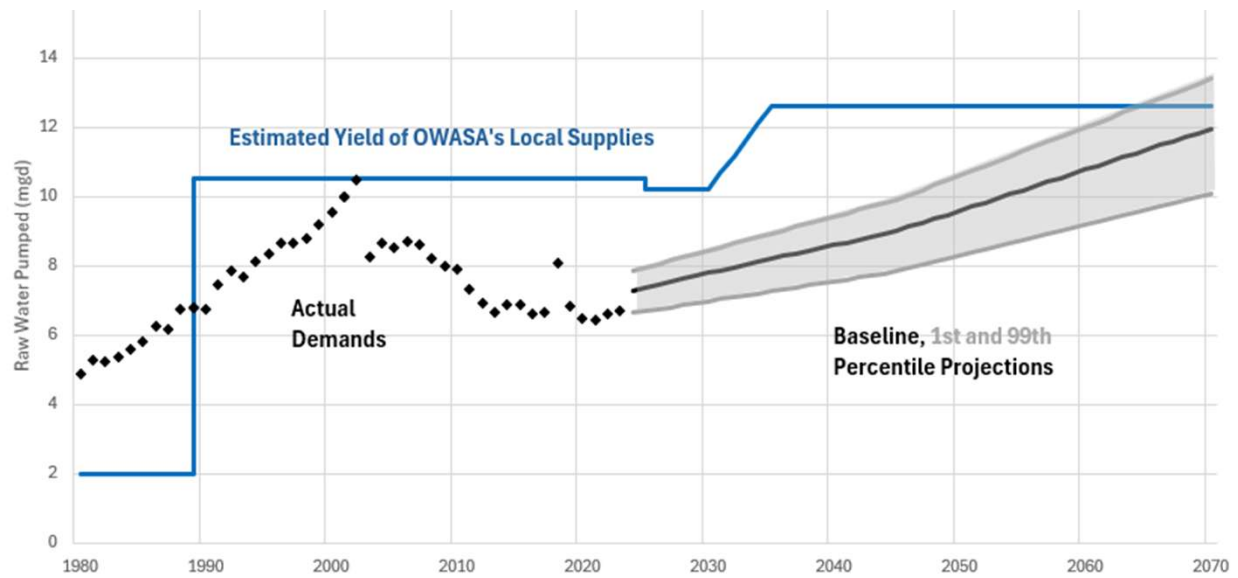
Service Reliability (1 minus 'Interrupted Customer Hours' divided by 'Total Customer Hours')
